

## Fire and COVID-19 Briefing Checklist

### Self-Awareness / Screening

- Immediately separate yourself from others.
- Notify supervisor if you or others experience:
  - Cough, more than expected
  - Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
  - New loss of taste or smell
  - Fever
  - Chills
  - Sore throat
  - Muscle pain
- Review and follow crew and division plans to isolate, triage, and transport symptomatic personnel.

### Hygiene on the Fireline

- Properly wash or sanitize your hands often, especially before and after eating or entering a public place, and after coughing or sneezing.
- Avoid handshakes and communal use items.
- Maintain a supply of hand sanitizer and hand wipes. Inform supervisor of needed resupply.
- Disinfect high touch surfaces often:
  - Radios, phones, doors, pumps, fuel cans, etc.

### Social Distancing and Protective Equipment

- Initiate, practice, and remind others of social distancing.
- Conduct briefings and conversations outdoors and at least 6 feet apart.
- Utilize face coverings as a tool when practical.
- Clean or replace dirty face coverings, equipment, and PPE.

### Communications

- Face coverings and social distancing complicate communications.  
Ensure effective sender/receiver messaging.

This feature may bring a new threat of thunderstorms which may persist through Friday. At this time instability does not look strong enough to promote intense storms or widespread coverage but this will need to be monitored.

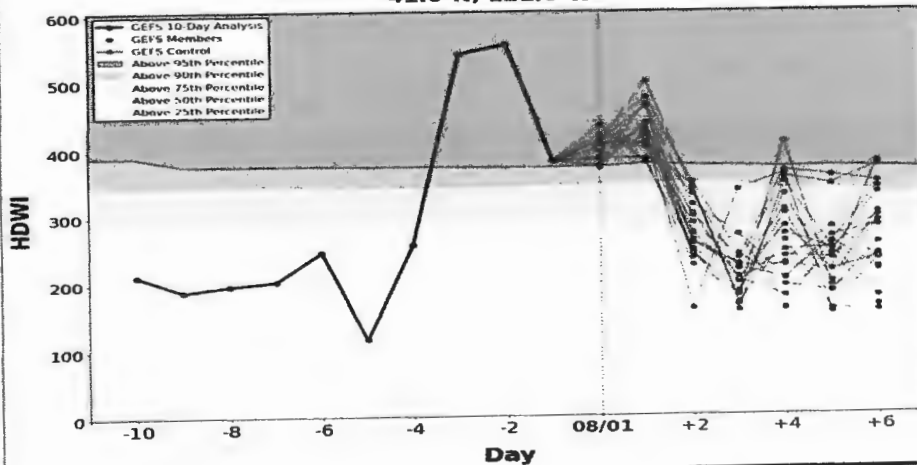

### Chainsaw Felling Accidents

#### IDENTIFY HAZARDS / WORK WITHIN QUALIFICATION / CONSIDER ALTERNATIVES

- Tree hang-ups account for 25% of felling fatalities. When a tree you are working on becomes a hang-up, reconsider the risks to personnel safety and consider alternatives and mitigations.
- Are you qualified and confident with felling assignment?
- All sawyers have the authority to decline a felling assignment if they feel it is unsafe. Or if the assignment exceeds their training, qualification or experience.
- Consider alternatives to felling hazard trees.
  - Utilize heavy equipment to remove the hazard
  - Restrict access
  - Notify and Utilize signs/flagging to communicate the hazard
- Bucking operations can also be hazardous. Alternatives can also be used for bucking operations (e.g. use mitigation measures to restrict access, use heavy equipment, decline assignment if there are no mitigations).

### DANGERS OF BURNING TIME

#### Extended Burning Creates Life and Injury Hazards

#### Watch Out

- Avoid trees that have been burning for long periods of time
- Power poles within and around the fire perimeter

#### Mitigation

- Flag these trees and communicate the dangers of fall and snags
- Stump holes are difficult to identify, use your hand tool to feel for ground depth
