General Situational Awareness:



Fire and COVID-19 Briefing Checklist

Self-Awareness / Screening

- ▣ Immediately separate yourself from others.
- ▣ Notify supervisor if you or others experience:
 - Cough, more than expected
 - Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
 - New loss of taste or smell
 - Fever
 - Chills
 - Sore throat
 - Muscle pain
- ▣ Review and follow crew and division plans to isolate, triage, and transport symptomatic personnel.

Hygiene on the Fireline

- ▣ Properly wash or sanitize your hands often, especially before and after eating or entering a public place, and after coughing or sneezing.
- ▣ Avoid handshakes and communal use items.
- ▣ Maintain a supply of hand sanitizer and hand wipes. Inform supervisor of needed resupply.
- ▣ Disinfect high touch surfaces often:
 - Radios, phones, doors, pumps, fuel cans, etc.

Social Distancing and Protective Equipment

- ▣ Initiate, practice, and remind others of social distancing.
- ▣ Conduct briefings and conversations outdoors and at least 6 feet apart.
- ▣ Utilize face coverings as a tool when practical.
- ▣ Clean or replace dirty face coverings, equipment, and PPE.

Communications

- ▣ Face coverings and social distancing complicate communications. Ensure effective sender/receiver messaging.

...Fire Weather Watch for Lightning and Strong Outflow Winds Monday....

WEATHER DISCUSSION: The air-mass over the entire region becomes unstable again as an upper level low moves over head. Thunderstorm chances increase today and tonight...then peak tomorrow. Cells may be initially dry today but should moisten up tonight and Monday. Main impacts will be potentially gusty outflow winds and lightning. Storms are expected to form to the south and move northward over the perimeter.

TODAY (SUNDAY DAYTIME):

WEATHER: Sunny and hazy early...increasing cumulus with a 30% chance of thunderstorms in the afternoon.

MAX TEMPERATURES: 87 - 91

MIN HUMIDITY 4500 ft: 14 - 19 %

WIND: East and southeast 4 to 7 mph with Gusts to 12 mph until 1400...then winds becoming more variable and dominated by outflow...mainly south with Gusts 25 to 35 mph possible.



WEATHER SUMMARY: SLIGHTLY DRIER AND WARMER TODAY. SEE IMET FORECAST

GENERAL: SUNRISE 0555, SUNSET 2027—14 HOURS 29 MIN DAYLIGHT

FUELS:

- FIRE IS MOST ACTIVE IN TIMBER WITH GRASS AND BITTERBRUSH UNDERSTORY.
- WINTER PRECIPITATION WAS 50% OF NORMAL. LATE RAINS DELAYED FIRE ACTIVITY BUT CAUSED ABUNDANT GRASS CROP. THESE FUELS ARE VERY SENSITIVE TO SMALL CHANGES IN WIND SPEED AND SUNLIGHT. RAPID RUNS POSSIBLE.
- ENERGY RELEASE COMPONENT OF THE NFDRS IS SLIGHTLY ABOVE AVERAGE FOR THIS TIME OF YEAR. BUT THIS IS THE PEAK OF FIRE SEASON IN THIS AREA, SO AVERAGE IS CLOSE TO THE 90TH PERCENTILE.
- 1000 HOUR FUELS ARE AT THE 10TH PERCENTILE AND APPROACHING HISTORIC MINIMUMS.
- ON 7/15 MANZANITA AND BITTERBRUSH LIVE FUEL MOISTURE WAS 120% NEARBY, WELL ABOVE CRITICAL OF 80%.
- THE FIRE AREA HAS NO SIGNIFICANT FIRE HISTORY

TOPOGRAPHY:

- MOST OF THE FIRE IS BETWEEN 4000-6000' ELEVATION.
- MOSTLY PLATEAUS WITH DEEP DRAINAGES. THE MAIN DRAINAGES ARE THE BUTTE CREEK/FOSTER DRAW, ASH CREEK AND WILLOW CREEK.

ZOUTPUT

BRANCH I

SCORCHED AND UNBURNED CANOPY IN THE BURN HAS THE POTENTIAL TO RESULT IN TORCHING AND CAST SPOT FIRES INTO THE GREEN. AS THE FIRE PROGRESSES EAST, FUELS CONVERT TO GRASS AND BRUSH.

BRANCH III

EXTENSIVE SCORCHED CANOPY IN DIV D AND E IS A HAZARD THAT IS A RISK TO THE LINE. WITH RISK OF OUTFLOW WINDS IN THE NEXT OPERATIONAL PERIOD THIS CONCERN IS AMPLIFIED. FUELS IN DIV O CONVERT TO GRASS AS THE FIRE PROGRESSES FURTHER SOUTH TO SPOONER TROUGH CYN.

BRANCH V

ACTIVITY IS DECREASING IN THIS BRANCH. ROLL OUT AND UNBURNED ISLANDS INSIDE THE LINE ARE A HAZARD, MEADOWS ALONG THE "GREEN" SIDE OF HWY 139 COULD CARRY A SPOT FIRE AT A RAPID RATE OF SPREAD.

AIR OPERATIONS:

VISIBILITY DECREASES IN LATE AFTERNOON UNTIL MID MORNING.

SAFETY

- **"TAKE 5 @ 2"** THIS FIRE HAS COME BACK TO LIFE SEVERAL DAYS IN A ROW AT 1400. TAKE TIME TO REASSESS YOUR OBJECTIVES AND SUCCESS, AND REEVALUATE YOUR ESCAPE ROUTE AND SAFE ZONES.
- POST A LOOKOUT NOT ONLY FOR FIRE BEHAVIOR BUT FOR FIRE WEAKENED TIMBER.
- IT IS POSSIBLE THAT A NOCTURNAL THUNDERSTORM COULD FORM OVER NIGHT. MAINTAIN A WEATHER WATCH THROUGH THE NIGHT.



- Thunderstorms could occur Sunday night into Monday morning
- Potential for increased night time fire behavior
- Changes in wind direction and fire behavior as storms move through

Mitigation

- Keep informed on predicted fire weather conditions and forecasts
- Base all actions on current and expected fire behavior
- Identify escape routes and safety zones, and ensure they are known

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OPERATE WITHIN YOUR LIMITS

WORK / REST, QUALIFICATIONS, DRIVING

Watch Out

- **Hot weather** can lead to dehydration, heat illness, serious medical emergencies
- **Working beyond capabilities** can lead to a failure to identify risks
- **Unsafe vehicle operation** can lead to accidents and serious/catastrophic injury

Mitigation

- Proper nutrition, rest and hydration reduces fatigue and exhaustion emergencies
- Know your qualification level and be honest about capabilities
- Slow down, maintain a safe distance, turn on lights, allow for extra travel time

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COVID-19

REDUCE THE EXPOSURE AND SPREAD BY:

- Wearing a face covering when you're less than 6 feet from others
- Washing your hands frequently, for at least 20-seconds at a time



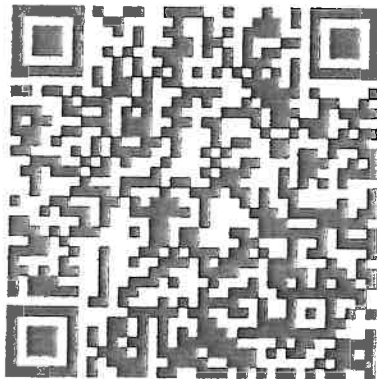

WATER USAGE PLAN

California Drought Emergency

The following shall be considered and implemented by all fire resources as a means to provide maximum efficiencies when utilizing water resources, while minimizing the impacts to private and public water supplies. Accountability shall be maintained for all water supplies that are utilized and care should be applied to ensure proper replacement and/or reimbursement to the supplier/ owner.

Fireline personnel- (During mop up operations)

- Use of Pencil Hose and Garden Nozzles with Shut-Offs.
- Use of Back pumps.
- Dry Mop-up and consolidation of heavy fuels to areas where they can burn out safely
- Locate/ Relocate Firelines to lighter fuels or natural barriers when safe.
- Set up and use portable tanks in anticipation of longer transport times for Water Tenders.
- Use of foams, gels and other water enhancers.
- Evaluate need to mop up in excess of 200 feet from fireline

Road Maintenance and Repair-

- Monitor and water roads only when and where needed.
- Water when most effective (evening and nights).
- Use chemical treatments when available (Magchloride, Omni bind ect).
- Consider use of tertiary or treated water (sp)

Aviation Operations-

- Use of Gels, Foams and Retardants. Set up portable plants.
- Consider Blivits and Pencil hose for interior mop up operations as opposed to numerous bucket drops.
- Establish and use pre-use agreements for existing and known water sources.
- Use large watershed dip sites when able. Minimize use of small, static ponds and lakes.
- Maintain accountability of water used and locations of dip sites.
- Evaluate need for interior bucket drops

Private Water Supplies-

- Notify property owner as early as possible.
- Minimize usage and develop alternative water supplies when and where appropriate.
- Track usage (meter, 214 form) and develop a plan to replace water.
- Make arrangements for reimbursement and damage claims if needed.

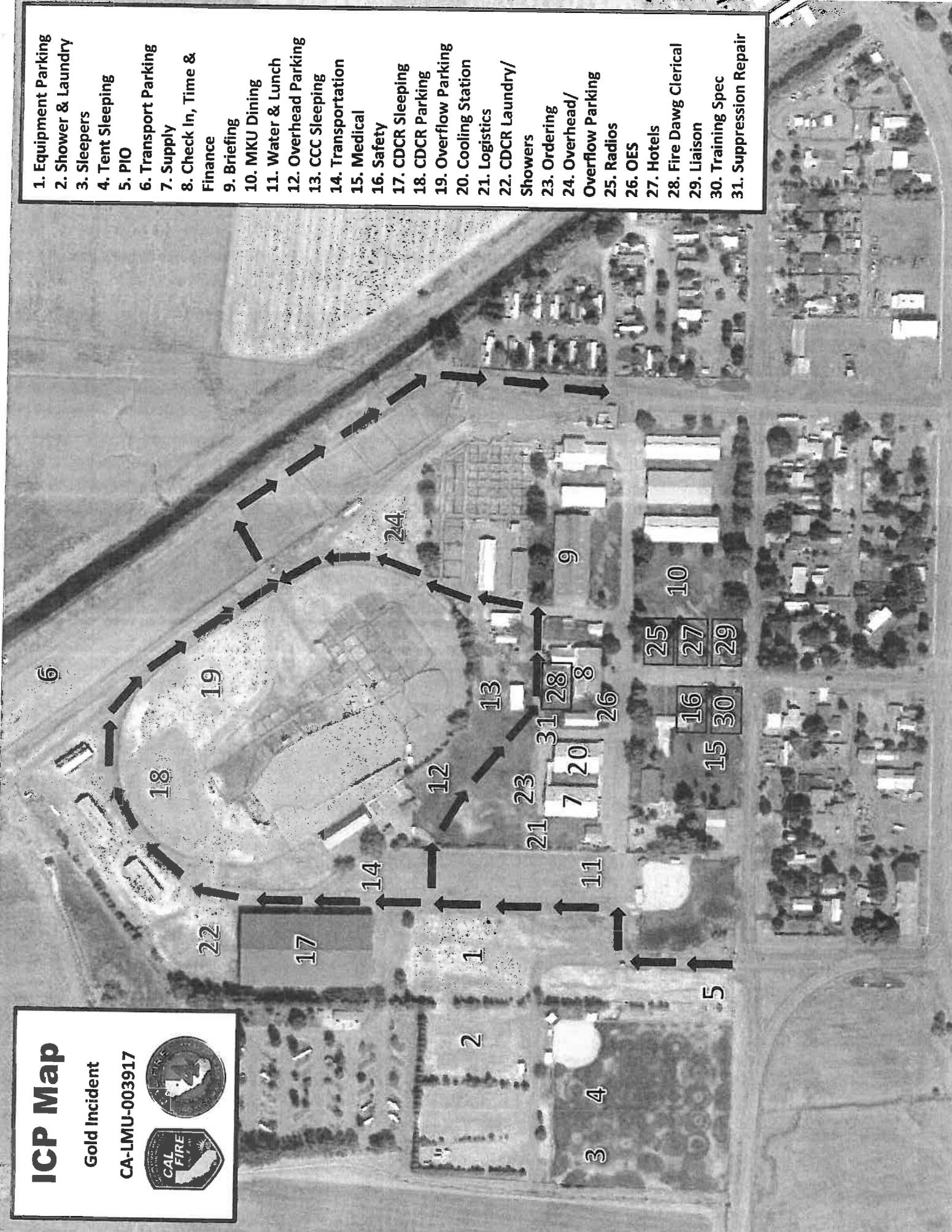
Public/ Municipal Water Supplies-

- Notify Agency as soon as possible and request a representative to the incident.
- Identify fill areas and request metering devices. Place on incident map.
- Use alternative or reclaimed water sources when available. Place on incident map.
- Make arrangements for reimbursement and damage claims if needed.

Management and Supervision-

- Use leaders intent and establish Water Conservation as an Management Objective.
- Consider complexity of water use on incidents. Establish a Water Supply Group Supervisor to coordinate additional resources to support the incident needs.
- Complete the Water Usage Report daily and turn in to Finance
- Review this check list and brief daily.

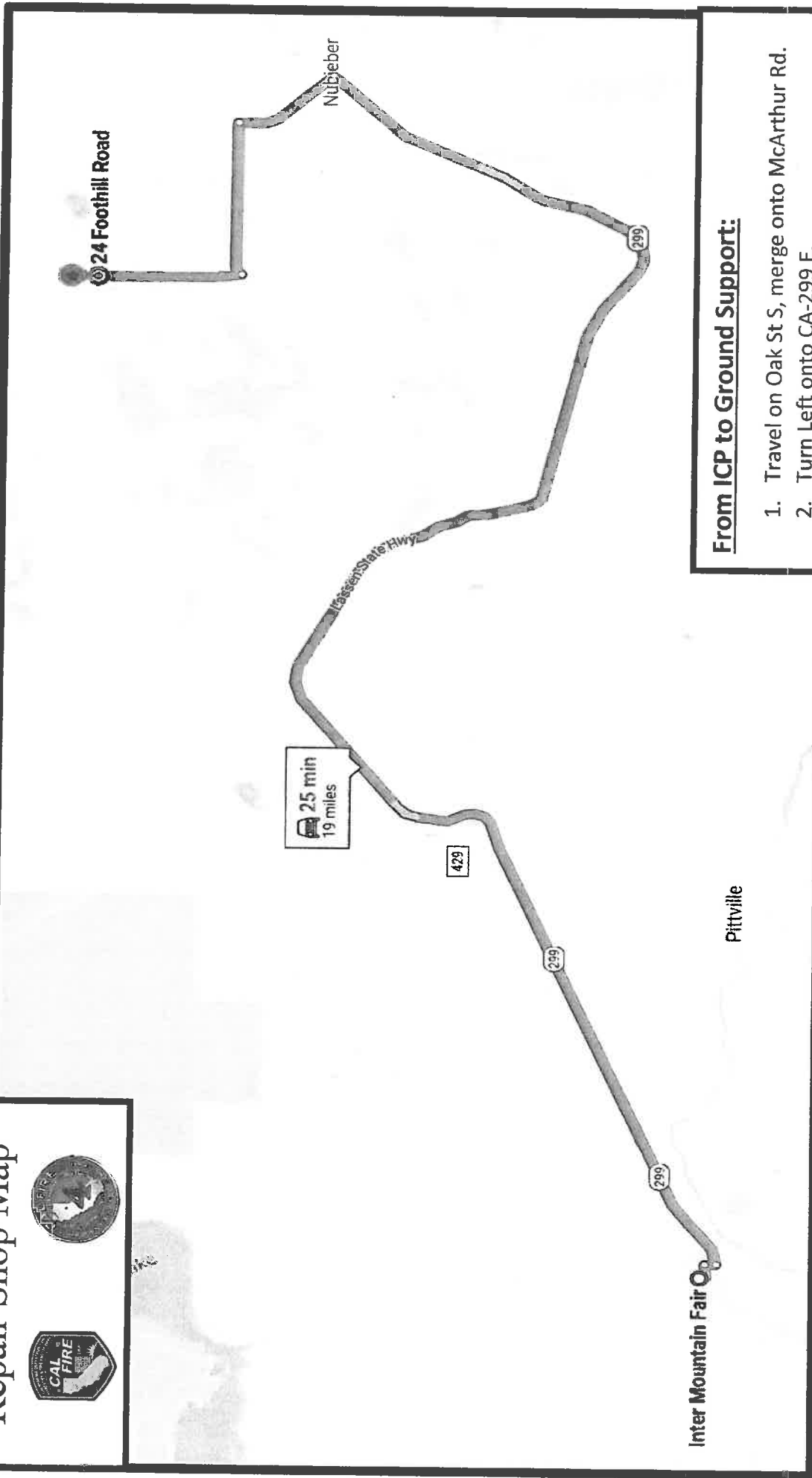

Intermountain Ground Support Repair Shop Map

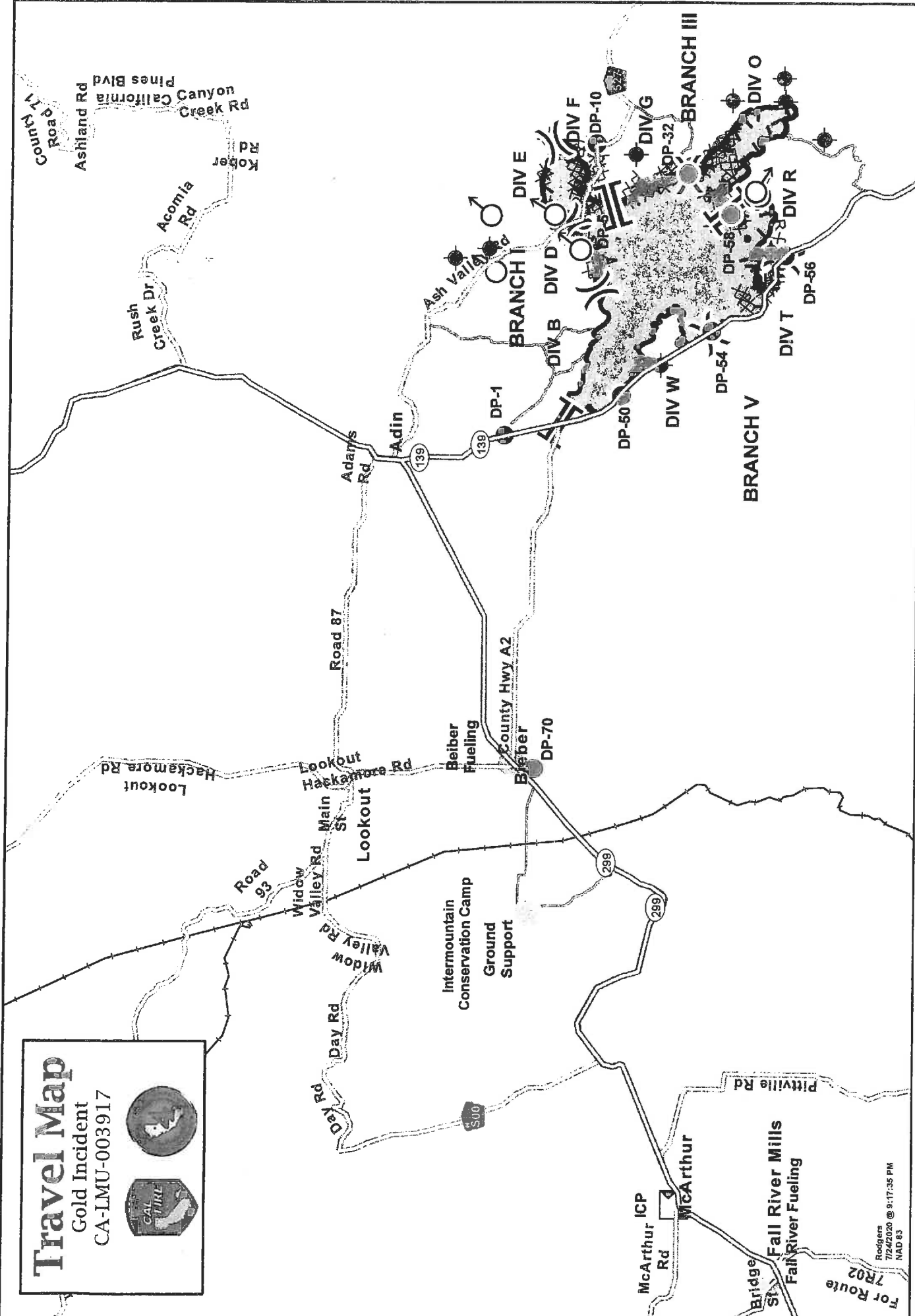
