*** RED FLAG WARNING FOR DRY LIGHTNING AND ERRATIC WINDS UNTIL 1700 TODAY ***

DISCUSSION: Moisture and instability from old hurricane Genevieve remain over central California today and may result in isolated to scattered thunderstorms including over the LNU Complex. Very dry air exists in the low levels, so any storms that occur are unlikely to produce any rain. Strong, erratic outflow winds are expected near any thunderstorms but may also occur from distant storms. Critical weather conditions continue to exist today, so pay close attention to changing weather and be ready to act on any weather updates that are issued.

MONDAY: *** RED FLAG WARNING FOR DRY LIGHTNING AND ERRATIC WINDS UNTIL 1700 ***

- WEATHER: Partly cloudy. Isolated thunderstorms. Little to no rain with any storms.
- WIND (20 FT): Valleys: Light and variable through 1100 then becoming south 5-10 MPH with gusts to 15 MPH.
 Gusts to 25 MPH possible in the valleys of divs KK, GG, CC. Ridges and gaps: southwest 4-8 MPH through 1100 then becoming west-southwest 8-13 MPH with gusts to 18 MPH. Erratic downdraft wind gusts to 40 MPH possible near any thunderstorms.
- MAX TEMPERATURES: bottom: 90-95, top: 85-90.
- MIN RH: 20-25% all areas.

Branch X: Winds: West-southwest 5-10 MPH with gusts to 15 MPH. Min RH: 25-35%. Highs 80-85...

MONDAY NIGHT:

- WEATHER: Partly cloudy. A slight chance of thunderstorms early in the evening.
- WIND (20 FT): Valleys: becoming light and variable. Ridges: southwest 4-8 MPH. Erratic downdraft wind gusts to 40 MPH possible near any thunderstorms.
- MIN TEMPERATURES: 60-65 bottom, 65-75 top.
- MAX RH: Valleys: 40-60%, ridges: 25-40%.

FIRE BEHAVIOR

GENERAL: Fuels are still holding around the 90th percentile for ERC and are available to burn, continuing through the next 7 days. Fuels will be highly receptive to ignition from embers, or new ignitions. Expect any ignitions outside control lines to be highly resistive to control. Larger diameter fuels will continue to consume causing a threat when near control lines. Thunderstorm activity later today brings the chance of strong outflow winds. Wind direction will be determined by the location of the thunderstorm cell. Monitor active fire in drainages as these will be likeliest places to be affected by outflow winds.

Rates of Spread- up to 1.3 mi/hr Flame Lengths up to 22 ft

*Greater rates of spread and flame lengths are possible when wind or slope are in alignment.

Probability of Ignition: up to 80% Spotting Distance: Spotting up to 1/2 mile.

SPECIFIC:

West Zone Meyers – This fire is burning in heavy timber broken up by grassy meadows. Fire behavior is minimal with creeping and smoldering. Interior islands will continue to consume.

Walbridge – Expect the fire to be active on the eastern flank again today. Heavy fuels and difficult terrain will challenge control efforts. In the Northeast, the fire is backing and flanking into Pena creek. The Pena creek drainage is in alignment with today's Southwest wind. The fire is also backing and flanking into Dorman Canyon. In the South, the fire is backing into Sweetwater creek, under clear air this portion of the fire became active yesterday around 1400 hours. Fire burns in the understory until it gets in alignment with terrain and makes runs upslope.

East Zone-

Branch XX- With the continued Southwesterly flow, potential for fire movement to North-northeast. Northwest movement is possible, where local terrain funnels the wind. Expect continued spread around Bohn Lake with the local terrain winds in the afternoon. Fire spread to the South towards Three Peaks and Angwin is still possible in the timber and understory fuels on the North slopes if the fire crosses the control lines.

Branch XXX- Smoldering of residual fuels and pockets of heat near the perimeter can carry into unburned fuels. Potential for fire movement to the North along Hwy 16, funneled by terrain winds. Grass and shrub fuels have burned recently, with some dead shrub skeletons available to burn.

Branch XL- Interior fuels will continue to consume. Some backing fire spread is expected in areas with uncontrolled line and in drainages. Roll out into unburned fuels can cause uphill runs with the terrain or wind.

AIR OPERATIONS: Drift smoke may limit aircraft operations.

SAFFTY

With forecasted possibility of dry lightning over or near the complex, outflow winds can adversely affect the existing fires. Be alert for sudden wind shifts and expect fire behavior to increase. Identify your escape routes and safety zones, have a plan in place, and ensure all personnel are briefed on it.

Maintain Situational Awareness

INCIDENT: Lightning Complex CA-LNU-013407 DATE: August 24, 2020 TIME: 0700-0700

Major Hazards / Risks: Lightning, Extreme fire behavior, Limited Resources

Extreme Fire Behavior: Fuels are receptive to fire spread. A small amount of wind on this dry fuel changes fire behavior dramatically!! Be alert to changes in wind direction and expect changes in fire behavior. Watch for spot fires outside the control lines and embers cast into structures.

Lightning/Thunderstorms: Thunderstorms bring sudden wind shifts. Lightning can start new fires. Take precautions and shelter when you hear thunder or see lightning. Find a low spot away from tall trees and don't group together. Follow *Thunderstorm Safety* guidelines in IRPG.

Driving: Slow Down! Drive defensively. Narrow winding roads. Expect the unexpected around every curve. Drive with headlights and seatbelts on. Coordinate your movements on one-lane roads.

Personnel: Manage yourself and those around you for fatigue. Drink fluids frequently and eat nutritious food regularly. As fatigue increases, injuries tend to increase also. Keep an eye on your crew and partner. Stay engaged and make smart decisions.

Fatigue: Limited resources and hot, dry, windy weather for the next several days. Be alert for signs of fatigue and take breaks as necessary. Be alert for signs of fatigue in yourself and others.

Hazard trees: Survey the areas for hazard trees, flag and restrict access, use only qualified personnel for tree felling. Dead trees from bug kill. Review and follow Hazard Tree Safety in your IRPG.

Steep slopes/rolling material: Watch your footing while hiking in steep terrain. Be careful of loose rolling debris. Maintain Situational Awareness.

Downed powerlines: Follow Powerline Safety guidelines in the IRPG, watch out for burned out power poles.

Lookouts, Communication, Escape routes, Safety zones

Covid-19 Precautions:

- Keep your distance. Wear a mask when less than 6' from other people.
- No group gatherings without masks
- Wash your hands
- Don't show up to work sick
- Do daily health evaluations on your personnel.

New Incidents:

- Remain flexible and mobile.
- Identify available resources ahead of time
- Utilize PACE planning. Have a primary, alternative, contingent, and emergency plans.
- Establish LCES in the beginning of a new start.

Safety Alert

Thunderstorm Safety

Approaching thunderstorms may be noted by a sudden reverse in wind direction, a noticeable rise in wind speed, and a sharp drop in temperature. Rain, hail, and lightning occur only in the mature stage of a thunderstorm.

Situational Awareness

Observe the 30/30 rule: If you see lightning and hear the thunderclaps following in less than 30 seconds take the storm precautions identified below. Do not resume work in exposed areas until 30 minutes after storm activity has passed.

Hazard Control

- Take shelter in a vehicle or building if possible.
- If outdoors, find a low spot away from tall trees, wire fences, utility lines and other elevated conductive objects. Make sure the place you pick is not subject to flooding.
- If in the woods, move to an area with shorter trees.
- If only isolated trees are nearby, keep your distance twice the tree height.
- If in open county, crouch low with feet together, minimizing contact with the ground. You can use a pack to sit on, but never lay on the ground.
- If you feel your skin tingle or your hair stand on end, immediately crouch low to the ground. Make yourself the smallest possible target and minimize your contact with the ground.
- Don't group together.
- Don't stay on ridge tops, wide open areas, or near ledges or rock outcroppings.
- Don't operate landlines telephones, machinery, or electric motors.
- Don't handle flammable materials in open containers or metal hand tools.

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

"LNU Lighting Complex" Incident Fire Suppression Repair Plan

I. Objectives

The purpose of this plan is to establish expectations for the orderly and cost effective mitigation of fire suppression damage. Given the magnitude of the LNU Lightning Complex, the Fire Suppression Repair (FSR) technical specialists will use this plan as a general guide but will also have to be as adaptive as possible in ensuring the most expedient and effective measures are implemented given the range of the FSR-related conditions they will likely encounter throughout the Sonoma Lake Napa Unit.

II. General Repair Guidelines

A. Helispots/Staging Areas/Safety Zones

- 1) Re-contour to the original slope as requested by the Repair Specialist.
- Remove soil, and/or breach berms so that runoff can be dissipated. Cross drain these areas to effectively dissipate water runoff.
- 3) Place disturbed vegetation, brush and trees, piled during line construction, on the surface of safety zones and open areas. This may be done with equipment or hand crews.

B. Roads

- 1) Re-establish existing berms where applicable.
- 2) Breach berms to facilitate drainage, where applicable.
- 3) Clean culverts plugged with soil and rock resulting from fire suppression actives.
- 4) Blading or grading of roads may be necessary.

C. Firelines; Hand and Dozer

Install waterbars as needed. Waterbars are designed to intercept, slow and spread the precipitation run-off in order to reduce sediment transport and soil erosion. The idea is to move water off the fireline before it can build up enough energy to erode and transport sediment. Re-establish waterbars and rolling dips using prefire locations. Flatten berms along fire lines to match natural contours. Utilize cut vegetation for erosion control on steep dozer and hand lines.

D. Watercourses

- 1) Watercourse crossings shall be dipped to original configuration. Waterbreaks shall be installed on each side of channel to divert flow off of trails prior to entering watercourse channel.
- 2) Remove all soil and debris that was placed in any stream channel. A Repair Specialist will review the site for acceptability. If all foreign material cannot be removed with heavy equipment, the material shall be removed by hand. The approaches to the crossing may be sloped back to prevent future stream bank failure.

E. Other Repair Concerns

- 1) Remove all trash from fire lines and other affected areas.
- 2) Repair, broken, damaged fences, and/or gates damaged as the result of the fire control operations will be repaired. (Note: Extent and condition of damage should be documented prior to repairs.)

Archaeological and Historic Properties: General Fire-line Guidance.

Do not compromise safety for the protection and preservation of archaeological and historic properties. When possible and prudent:

- 1. Be on the lookout for prehistoric and historic archaeological sites. These sites typically occur adjacent to streams and springs, confluences are often especially sensitive. However, sites can occur in other areas too. The most common indicators of prehistoric sites in this area (North Coast Ranges) are scatters of shiny black obsidian flakes from tool making activities and dark midden soils. Historic-era sites include homesteads that contain foundations, rock chimneys, and stone / brick-lined wells. Historic-era mining sites are possible as well.
- 2. Note, that not much of the area has ever been surveyed for archaeological resources and many sites out there have yet to be discovered.
- 3. If you observe archaeological resources, flagged or unflagged, attempt to avoid with ground disturbing activities altogether.
- 4. If avoidance is not possible, minimize ground disturbance. Use a hand crew rather than a dozer to remove fuels from control lines that must cross site areas if possible.
- 5. Leave all artifacts in place as some may have been intentionally placed for religious or ceremonial reasons.
- 6. Note locations of discovered resources on a map, better yet, take site coordinates with a GPS. Leave information for the archaeologist so that the sites can be relocated and protected during Fire Suppression Repair. Flag the site in red if possible.
- 7. If you encounter a burial or other human remains, cease work in that area and contact the archaeologist immediately.

Your help preserving California's non-renewable cultural resources is appreciated. It is our responsibility as federal and state employees to help in the protection of our heritage – preserving these places, and artifacts for scientific, cultural, educational, spiritual, and religious uses.

MEDIA

<u>California State Penal Code Section 409.5(d)</u> allows the news media to enter scenes of disaster, riot, or civil disturbance. Properly identified members of the news media should not be restricted from entering the locations specified within the code, even if the area presents a danger to them. Media members should be advised of the nature of possible danger. Members of the media do not have the right to access crime scenes or any area where their presence may interfere with incident operations, mitigation or evidence collection.

- The media may only access private property with the property owner's permission. Fire
 personnel cannot provide members of the media with authorization to enter private
 property.
- If approached and questioned by the media and/or the public, talk about your assignment or task at hand. If need be, direct the questioning party to the incident PIO.
- Do not speculate or give opinions
- There is no such thing as an "off the record" comment.

CAL FIRE SOCIAL MEDIA POLICY (Social Media 0691)

Social Media is increasingly being used by public agencies and the media as well as the public. This form of communication continues to grow rapidly in order to supply the public's desire for instant information gratification. All personnel assigned to a CAL FIRE incident will adhere to the CAL FIRE Social Media Policy. Further information about the CAL FIRE Social Media Policy can be obtained from the Information Officer. If you are uncertain, please ask. **Do not post**:

- Inappropriate information, pictures or videos
- Opinions regarding the incident or policy
- Endorsements of any kind

PICTURES AND VIDEO OF INCIDENT

We are in a new era of media. Media no longer means the news/broadcast industry but now refers to anyone that has the capability to shoot video and or photographs and post them onto social media in a matter of minutes. Unfortunately we have seen some instances of video or photographs that have depicted unsafe, unprofessional or embarrassing circumstances which are a serious breach of ethics. When this happens it reflects poorly on all that are attached to this incident. Posting an inappropriate video, photo or blog comment could have unwanted effects. It may be unsafe to shoot photos or video and a firefighter who is concentrating on a camera can't be looking up, down and all around.

LOST AND FOUND

The Information staff will manage *Lost and Found* items for the incident. If you have lost an item, leave your contact information and what you have lost at the Information trailer. If you have found an item on the incident, bring the item to the Information trailer.






