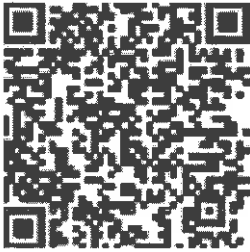

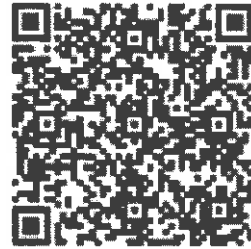

**Three Day Transition Forecast – Branch 11**

*Please refer to updated weather information through Spot forecasts or other means as soon as possible.*

Discussion: Relative humidity will be elevated over Division 11 Tuesday as moisture from a high level front moves through the area. There will be no precipitation with this front, only higher relative humidity and some clouds. Then very dry, north and northeasterly winds overtake the region late Tuesday night and Wednesday bringing in potentially critical fire weather conditions. Hot, dry and breezy at times conditions will linger into Friday. The weekend has less wind still dry conditions. The Fire Weather Watch Wednesday through Friday has a good chance of being elevated to a Red Flag Warning on Tuesday.

**Tuesday (10/12):** Partly cloudy. Any clouds clearing in the evening. Patchy smoke.

**Temperature:** 45-52 morning, 73-80 afternoon. **Haines:** 4.

**Maximum Relative Humidity:** 45-55% Ridges and 70-85% valleys.

**Minimum Relative Humidity:** 27-35%.

**Wind (20 Foot):** Down slope and valley 2 to 4 mph in the morning turning up slope and valley 4 to 6 mph.

Ridges: Northwest 5 to 8 mph turning north after 2100 hours.

**Wednesday (10/13):**

**\*\*\* Fire Weather Watch Wednesday to Friday for Low Relative Humidity, Gusty Wind and Hot Temperatures\*\*\***

**Temperature:** Warmer. 50-60 morning, 78-85 afternoon. **Haines:** 5.

**Maximum Relative Humidity:** 20-35% Ridges and 45-65% valleys.

**Minimum Relative Humidity:** 18-25%.

**Wind (20 Foot):** Down slope and valley 1 to 3 mph in the morning turning northeast 5 to 10 mph gusting to 20 mph after 1000. Ridges: Northeast 10 to 15 mph gusting to 25 mph.

**Thursday (10/14):**


**Temperature:** Warmer. 55-65 morning, 83-90 afternoon. **Haines:** 5.

**Maximum Relative Humidity:** 15-25% Ridges and 25-35% valleys.

**Minimum Relative Humidity:** 9-15%

**Wind (20 Foot):** Valleys: Northeast to east 5-9 mph in aligned drainages aligned with easterly ridge wind. Gusty valley winds to 18 mph. Ridges: East 10-15 mph gusting to 23 mph.

### FIRE BEHAVIOR

#### GENERAL:

Fuels range from annual grasses, light to heavy brush and timber. This area of California is under a Fuels and Fire Behavior Advisory (dated 9/29/20) for extremely dry fuels and resulting increases in fire behavior.

We start the week of October 10<sup>th</sup> on the heels of a short-lived measurable rain. This rain did little for wide scale fuels modification and the 1 hour and 10-hour fuels will recover by Tuesday afternoon. BI on 10/10 was 38 and the low value is due to the rain event, ERC is 52, also because of rain. 100hr fuels recovered slightly to 10% but the average for this time period is 13%. 1000hr fuels are at 9% and is above the 95<sup>th</sup> percentile for dryness. Live fuels are still critically dry and there is little hope for recovery before finally bottoming out as dormant until next spring.

A high-pressure system moved into the West coast on Sunday and will over the coming days establish itself in the region. This will bring high temperatures and low humidities as well as a chance for a moderate to strong North / Northeast wind event later this week. This wind event will blow dry winds through dry fuels and will increase the potential for large fire growth. In this area we have seen even mild events (less than 10mph) exhibit extreme fire growth and behavior.

October looks to be warmer and drier than average with a continuation of active burning conditions through the month and likely into November. In the last week much of Northern California including the Mendocino region was elevated from severe to extreme drought.

#### Branch – 11

Under a warming and drying trend pockets of heat within the control lines may become active. Lightly burned areas are always a concern for reburn, especially in Autumn when leaves begin to fall and cover established control lines. Needle cast in timber fires will also be a concern until all heat has been removed.

#### Weather and Fire Behavior tools for Firefighters:

Northern California Gacc; <https://gacc.nifc.gov/oncc/> has useful information on weather, fuels, analysis and Monthly & Seasonal outlooks.

Wildfire Analyst Pocket App (WFA Pocket); Available as a free Android or IOS application that was developed to provide firefighters with fire behavior calculations and outputs that are viewed in a 3d map interface allowing firefighters to change parameters and see real time results on the map.

Wind Ninja: This is a product of the USFS Rocky Mountain Research Station that computes varying wind fields for wildland fire application. Wind Ninja Mobile is a free phone application available on Android and IOS devices.

#### **Safety**

Being a Fire Behavior Analyst is simply observing and communicating the interactions between the Fuel, Weather and Topography. But we are all responsible for these observations and communications. Supervisors have a duty to evaluate the fire environment and pass them along to their resources. Take the time to become situationally aware of the fire environment around you and anticipate what fire on the landscape will do under current and expected weather, fuel type changes and changes in topography.

**HAZARD TREES AND SNAGS**

***EVERY DIVISION POTENTIAL FOR ROLLOUT AND WIND STRESSED TREES***

**Watch Out** - The Great Basin team on the North East section had a major injury tree vs vehicle a few days ago. Today's shift will see an increase in winds. Hazard trees, both dead snags and live green trees, are one of the most common risks encountered on the fireline. All firefighters should frequently survey their work area for potential hazard trees. Numerous incidents in the last few months of snags and falling trees have caused damage and or injury to firefighters.

**Mitigation** – Watch where you are walking, working, parked and driving. Eliminate the hazards with qualified sawyers or heavy equipment. Avoid hazards by designating “No Work Zones” (flag and map), limit nighttime operations. Modify suppression tactics or fireline location to avoid high risk trees. Post lookouts to help secure high-risk areas. Provide feedback regarding hazard trees. **Keep clear of bucket drops near trees/snags.**

**COMPLACENCY**

***THE FIRE IS WINDING DOWN – DON'T GET COMPLACENT***

**Watch Out** - Now is when some personnel may begin to forget the basics. With less fire activity we lose sight of being on the lookout for other hazards and risks. Patrol and aggressive mop-up can seem routine. Many accidents occur during overhaul – this is not the time to get hurt!

**Mitigation**- **Stay alert and maintain situation awareness.** Maintain high levels of line leadership and coach members of your team to take care of one another. Slow down and take breaks during exhaustive work. Stay hydrated, eat healthy and don't forget the basics.

**WEATHER/FUELS**

***INCREASED WINDS and WIND SHIFTS IN FIRE AREA***

**Watch Out** – **This fire can wake up due to winds over the next 3 shifts.** Live and dead fuels are extremely dry across Northern California. Extreme fire behavior and rapid rates of spread are occurring in these areas, even when winds are light. Fire behavior changes due to current fire weather indices resulting in explosive fuels. Working in and around above normal fine fuel loading. Expect slope reversal anytime fire is backing into a drainage. Fire behavior will remain elevated across the mountains across the region, until significant rainfall occurs. Weather will be getting hotter and dryer.

**Mitigation** - Remain aware of current and expected weather and burning conditions and consider such information while making strategic and tactical decisions. **Fight fire aggressively but provide for safety first.**

- **Conduct a daily briefing with all personnel**
- **Briefing checklist can be found on the inside back cover of the IRPG**
- **Review the 215a and take tactical pauses to conduct hazard and risk assessments throughout the shift**





## August Complex West Zone - HUU RISK ANALYSIS (ICS 215a)

DIV	HAZARDOUS ACTIONS/CONDITIONS	MITIGATIONS / WARNINGS / REMEDIES
ALL	<b>FATIGUE/DEHYDRATION</b>	Be alert for signs of fatigue and take breaks as necessary. Monitor incoming resources for level of fatigue. Drink water before, during and after shifts, up to 1.5 gal. per shift. Be alert for signs of heat stress in yourself and others; use the buddy system. Eat small meals often and when possible. Find shade when you can. Drink electrolyte drinks at a 2 water to 1 sport drink ratio.
ALL	<b>HAZARD TREES/TREE FELLING SAFETY</b>	Look up, look down, look around when entering timber. Identify and isolate the area to provide for the safety of others. Flag and make proper notifications. Do not leave incomplete falling operations. Monitor when mopping up. Watch where you park. Size up and mitigate concerns, work within your qualifications.
ALL	<b>COMPLACENCY</b>	Don't underestimate the task at hand. Wear full PPE while on the line. Everyone should be briefed on the conditions and circumstances regarding the fire and their assignments per the IRPG. Today is different than last shift, even if in the same area.
ALL	<b>INCREASING FIRE BEHAVIOR</b>	Know your LCES and maintain Situational Awareness. Use experienced Lookouts. Monitor weather for changes in the wind, temp, and RH during the shift. Have a contingency plan with established decision points and safety zones.
ALL	<b>AIRCRAFT OPERATIONS</b>	Monitor air-to-ground frequency, they are your eyes in the sky. Use air-to-ground frequency to communicate with aircraft. Use clear, concise statements when directing aircraft. Clear the area for incoming water and retardant drops.
ALL	<b>HEAVY EQUIPMENT</b>	Watch for rolling material avoid working below heavy equipment. Monitor safe working distances provide adequate working space. Utilize communication with the operators, stop if poor visibility (radio or hand signals).
ALL	<b>WEATHER CHANGES</b>	Monitor for possible wetting rain and increased temperatures on the fireline. Expect erratic winds. Communicate weather changes on fireline Monitor engine placement for access and egress. Roads will have oils rising to the top, account for increased stopping distances.
ALL	<b>DRIVING HAZARDS</b>	Complete appropriate DOT daily vehicle inspection. <b>Slow Down!</b> Long travel times to the line, stay alert. Stop if fatigued. Drive defensively! Expect the unexpected around every curve. Drive with headlights and seatbelts on. Narrow roads with limited passing room. Expect roads to deteriorate over the shift.
ALL	<b>COMMUNICATIONS</b>	Confirm correct tactical and command channel. No unassigned radio channels. Check your Air to Ground to make sure it is correct for your branch. Check your command frequency if you have moved branches or divisions. Ensure correct communication with neighboring federal zones.
ALL	<b>COVID 19</b>	Wear a mask when applicable; Utilize hand sanitizer and wash hands frequently. Maintain social distancing; Disinfect apparatus and coolers frequently; Adhere to local, state and federal Covid-19 guidelines.
ALL	<b>ENVIRONMENTAL HAZARDS</b>	Maintain situational awareness for illegal activity and hunters. Wash poison oak off hands and clothes. Be aware of wild animals. (Bears, Mountain Lions, Bees, etc.)


