### OUTPUTS

#### FIRE BEHAVIOR

**GENERAL:** The fire is burning in grass, oak woodland, chaparral, and mixed timber understory. Some areas within recent burn scars have an abundance of dead standing and down fuels with grass understory. Fuels are extremely dry and will provide a receptive fuel bed for any spot fires. The area has an above normal grass crop due to late season rains. Live fuel moistures in the area are at a critical level (around 60%) and 1000-hour dead fuel moistures are around 7%. Complex terrain features and intersecting drainages provide the opportunity for slope reversal and terrain driven runs. Increasing evening winds could pose a challenge to control lines. When the smoke clears out over the fire area, expect the fire activity to increase.

Grass – **Rate of Spread** up to .7-1.5 mi/hr    **Flame Lengths** 4-15 ft.

Brush/Timber – **Rate of Spread** up to .5-1 mi/hr    **Flame Lengths** 10-20 ft.

Rates of spread and flame lengths could exceed forecasted values.

**Probability of Ignition:** up to 90%    **Spotting Distance:** Spotting up to .25-.5 mile. (Peak gusts)

#### SPECIFIC:

**Div A** Residual heat in unburned islands and smoldering fuels will continue to pose a threat to control lines by spotting and rollout. Upslope runs towards Mule Town Road would be possible if the fire spots across the Clear Creek drainage. Rollout of burning materials into Kanaka and South Fork Creek drainages is possible, upslope runs should be expected if this occurs.

**Divs C, E, F, H/M and P-** Minimal fire behavior is expected. Continued smoldering of stumps and larger diameter fuels. Residual interior heat in unburned islands could become active with the evening winds. Active fire behavior should be expected if the fire gets outside the containment lines in receptive fuels.

**Div Y-** The fire will continue to creep and smolder in the understory fuels. Re-burn potential exists within green islands, or where fire intensity/understory fuel bed was not adequate to ignite and consume the overstory. Winds may align with slopes and ignite these areas within the interior. Potential still exists to spread to the north towards Ducket Peak and west into North Fork Cottonwood Creek drainage. Terrain driven upslope runs are possible with slope reversal or spotting.

**AIR OPERATIONS:** Sunrise: 0709 Sunset: 1847

Smoky conditions will persist throughout the day which may limit visibility.

### SAFETY

Hot temperatures, low humidity, and shifting winds provide the potential for rapid fire growth if a fire gets established outside the containment lines, or for local initial attack. Poor humidity recovery overnight.

Heavy fuels and canopy can harbor heat that could become active with increase in wind speed.

# Fuels and Fire Behavior Advisory

## Northern California Geographic Area

September 29, 2020

**Subject:** Dry offshore and northerly winds, followed by high temperatures will rapidly dry out fuels across Northern California. Extreme fire behavior and rapid to dangerous rates of spread has occurred during enhanced breezy periods accompanied with low humidity in areas clear of smoke. Extreme fire behavior will become more common as the fuel drying continues in September.

**Discussion:** Weeks of record temperatures during August and September, coupled with limited precipitation has expanded extreme to severe drought conditions across much of the Geographic Area. All indications show these drought conditions persisting through early October. Light precipitation that passed over the northern part of the region only lowered fire danger for a very brief period. Fires have recently shown or exhibited moderate to rapid rates of spread or generate extreme fire behavior when influence by winds. There is a high potential for extreme fire behavior to persist under a wider range of conditions as fuel continues to dry and gusty north to northeast foehn winds events become more frequent.

**Difference from normal conditions:** Winter precipitation was below to well below normal with 55% of normal mountain snowpack. Late spring moisture during the heart of the low-mid elevation growing season led to **above normal fine fuel loading**. Typical dry summer conditions coupled with above normal temperatures has dramatically effected fuel dryness and fire danger indices. ERC's will climb back up to between 90th to 97th percentile the next 2 weeks with some PSA's experiencing seasonal record values in temperatures. This time of year, live brush has typically low moisture levels due to normal seasonal drying but recently sampled live brush are at the at historic lows for many sampling sites.

#### Concerns to Firefighters and the Public:

- Cured fine fuel loading below 3,000' elevation is above normal, exhibiting very rapid fire spread.
- Firefighters should be prepared for potential extreme fire behavior and dangerous or otherwise rapid rates of spread at any time of day, especially during foehn wind events.
- The potential for extreme fire activity will likely continue until enough precipitation occurs to significantly increase and maintain higher fuel moisture readings for an extended period.
- Rapid rates of spread could have a significant impact on public safety and make evacuations difficult.

#### Mitigation Measures:

- All local and visiting firefighters need to remain aware of current and expected weather and burning conditions and consider such information while making strategic and tactical decisions.
- Employ LCES principles (Lookouts, Communications, Escape Routes, Safety Zones).
- Review current fire potential products from Predictive Services at <https://gacc.nifc.gov/oncc/predictive/weather/index.htm> or potential Red Flag conditions from the National Weather Service and weather at <https://www.wrh.noaa.gov/fire2/cafw/>.

**Area of Concern:** All areas across Northern California could see very active fire behavior. The PSA numbers associated with those areas are NC01, NC02, NC03A-6-03B, NC04, NC05, NC06, NC07 and NC08.

### **Major Hazards and Risks: Fatigue, Fire behavior, Hot dry weather, Wind**

**Fire Behavior:** Fuels are receptive to fire spread. A small amount of wind on this dry fuel changes fire behavior dramatically!! Be alert to changes in wind direction and expect changes in fire behavior. Watch for spot fires outside the control lines. Plan for long-range spotting.

**Driving:** Slow Down! Drive defensively. Narrow winding roads. Expect the unexpected around every curve. Drive with headlights and seatbelts on. Coordinate your movements on one-lane roads.

**Personnel:** Manage yourself and those around you for fatigue. Drink fluids frequently and eat nutritious food regularly. As fatigue increases, injuries tend to increase also. Keep an eye on your crew and partner. Stay engaged and make smart decisions.

**Fatigue:** Limited resources and hot, dry, windy weather for the next several days. Be alert for signs of fatigue and take breaks as necessary. Be alert for signs of fatigue in yourself and others.

**Downed powerlines:** Follow Powerline Safety guidelines in the IRPG, watch out for burned out power poles.

**Hazard trees:** Survey your work areas for hazard trees, flag and restrict access, use only qualified personnel for tree felling. Dead trees from bug kill. Review and follow Hazard Tree Safety in your IRPG.

**Steep slopes/rolling material:** Watch your footing while hiking in steep terrain. Be careful of loose rolling debris. Maintain Situational Awareness.

**Be ready for any incident-within-an-incident by reviewing your ICS 206.**

### **Maintain Situational Awareness**

#### **Covid-19 Precautions:**

- Keep your distance. Wear a mask when less than 6' from other people.
- Wash your hands
- No group gatherings without masks
- Don't show up to work sick
- Do daily health evaluations on your personnel.

#### **Firing Operations**

- Follow the Firing Operations Checklist in the IAP.
- Conduct thorough briefing for all personnel (IRPG).
- Qualified personnel for all assignments.
- Utilize Risk Management Process (IRPG)
- Required PPE to be worn by all personnel involved.
- Establish and maintain LCES during the operation.

ALL	<b>FIRE BEHAVIOR</b>	Review Wildland Urban Interface Firefighting in the IRPG. Monitor current weather conditions and forecasts. Make sure all personnel receive thorough briefings every shift. Work within your capabilities when limited resources are available. Maintain adequate escape routes and safety zones. Set trigger points when appropriate. Plan for long-range spotting. Adhere to the 10 Fire Orders, mitigate 18 Situations. Maintain Situational Awareness.
ALL	<b>STEEP TERRAIN / ROLLING DEBRIS</b>	Watch your footing while hiking in steep terrain. Be careful of loose rolling debris Maintain Situational Awareness and separation.
ALL	<b>BACKFIRING and BURNOUT OPERATIONS</b>	Before beginning a backfiring or burnout operation, ensure that: Lookouts are posted, communications are established with both firing and holding teams, escape routes and safety zones are established and not compromised by the firing operations. Ensure approval and relay to all adjoining forces. Follow the Firing Operations Checklist. Wear full PPE.
ALL	<b>FATIGUE / HEAT / DEHYDRATION</b>	During periods of hot/dry weather with limited resources be alert for signs of fatigue and take breaks as necessary. Monitor incoming resources for level of fatigue. Drink water before, during and after shifts, up to 1.5 gal. per shift. Be alert for signs of heat stress in yourself and others; use the buddy system. Eat small meals often and when possible.
ALL	<b>POWER LINES</b>	Follow <i>Powerline Safety</i> guidelines in the IRPG. Communicate power line hazards to immediate supervisor. Flag area around downed power lines and deny access. Treat all downed power lines as energized.
ALL	<b>DOZER SAFETY</b>	Watch for rolling material. Monitor safe working distances. Avoid working below a Dozer. Utilize communication with the operator (radio or hand signals) Watch for signs indicating buried high-pressure gas lines, stay out of the dust.
ALL	<b>DRIVING</b>	Drive defensively! Narrow winding roads are hazardous. Slow Down. Drive with headlights on and seatbelts on. Be alert for heavy trucks and high-speed opposing traffic crossing into your lane. Use warning devices when operating near traffic.
ALL	<b>AIRCRAFT OPERATIONS</b>	Monitor air-to-ground frequency, they are your eyes in the sky. Use air-to-ground frequency to communicate with aircraft. Use clear, concise statements when directing aircraft.
ALL	<b>HAZARD TREES</b>	Identify snags and hazard trees and isolate the area to provide for safety of others. Flag and make the proper notifications. Evaluate all trees prior to working under or near them. Watch out for snags. Don't fall any tree outside of your qualification.
ALL	<b>LINE CONSTRUCTION</b>	Conduct thorough briefing for all personnel. Ensure LCES in place prior to engagement. Establish adequate safety zones. Use Downhill Line Checklist. Utilize Risk Management Process (IRPG).
BR1	<b>MINE SHAFTS</b>	Be alert for abandoned mine shafts in fire area. They may not be marked on maps. If found, flag area, notify all line personnel, DIVS, OPSC, & SOFR, keep personnel out of area. Do not enter.
ALL	<b>COVID 19</b>	Maintain 6' distance whenever possible. Utilize masks, frequent hand washing/sanitizing, disinfect common surfaces, follow Shasta County Public Health Guidelines. Monitor for symptoms, follow reporting procedure.

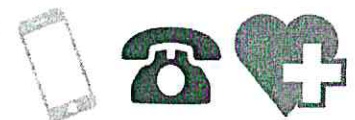

**MEDIA:** California State Penal Code Section 409.5(d) allows the news media to enter scenes of disaster, riot, or civil disturbance. Properly identified members of the news media should not be restricted from entering the locations specified within the code, even if the area presents a danger to them. Media members should be advised of the nature of possible danger. Members of the media do not have the right to access crime scenes or any area where their presence may interfere with incident operations, mitigation or evidence collection. The media may only access private property with the property owner's permission. Fire personnel cannot provide members of the media with authorization to enter private property. If approached and questioned by the media and/or the public, talk about your assignment or task at hand. If need be, direct the questioning party to the incident PIO. Do not speculate or give opinions There is no such thing as an "off the record" comment.

**CAL FIRE SOCIAL MEDIA POLICY (Social Media 0691):** Social Media is increasingly being used by public agencies and the media as well as the public. This form of communication continues to grow rapidly in order to supply the public's desire for instant information gratification. All personnel assigned to a CAL FIRE incident will adhere to the CAL FIRE Social Media Policy. Further information about the CAL FIRE Social Media Policy can be obtained from the Information Officer. If you are uncertain, please ask.

**Do not post:**

- Inappropriate information, pictures or videos. Opinions regarding the incident, policy or endorsements of any kind.

**PICTURES AND VIDEO OF INCIDENT:** We are in a new era of media. Media no longer means the news/broadcast industry but now refers to anyone that has the capability to shoot video and or photographs and post them onto social media in a matter of minutes. Unfortunately, we have seen some instances of video or photographs that have depicted unsafe, unprofessional or embarrassing circumstances which are a serious breach of ethics. When this happens, it reflects poorly on all that are attached to this incident. Posting an inappropriate video, photo or blog comment could have unwanted effects. It may be unsafe to shoot photos or video and a firefighter who is concentrating on a camera can't be looking up, down and all around.

**LOST AND FOUND:** The Information staff will manage Lost and Found items for the incident. If you have lost an item, leave your contact information and what you have lost at the Information trailer. If you have found an item on the incident, bring the item to the Information trailer.

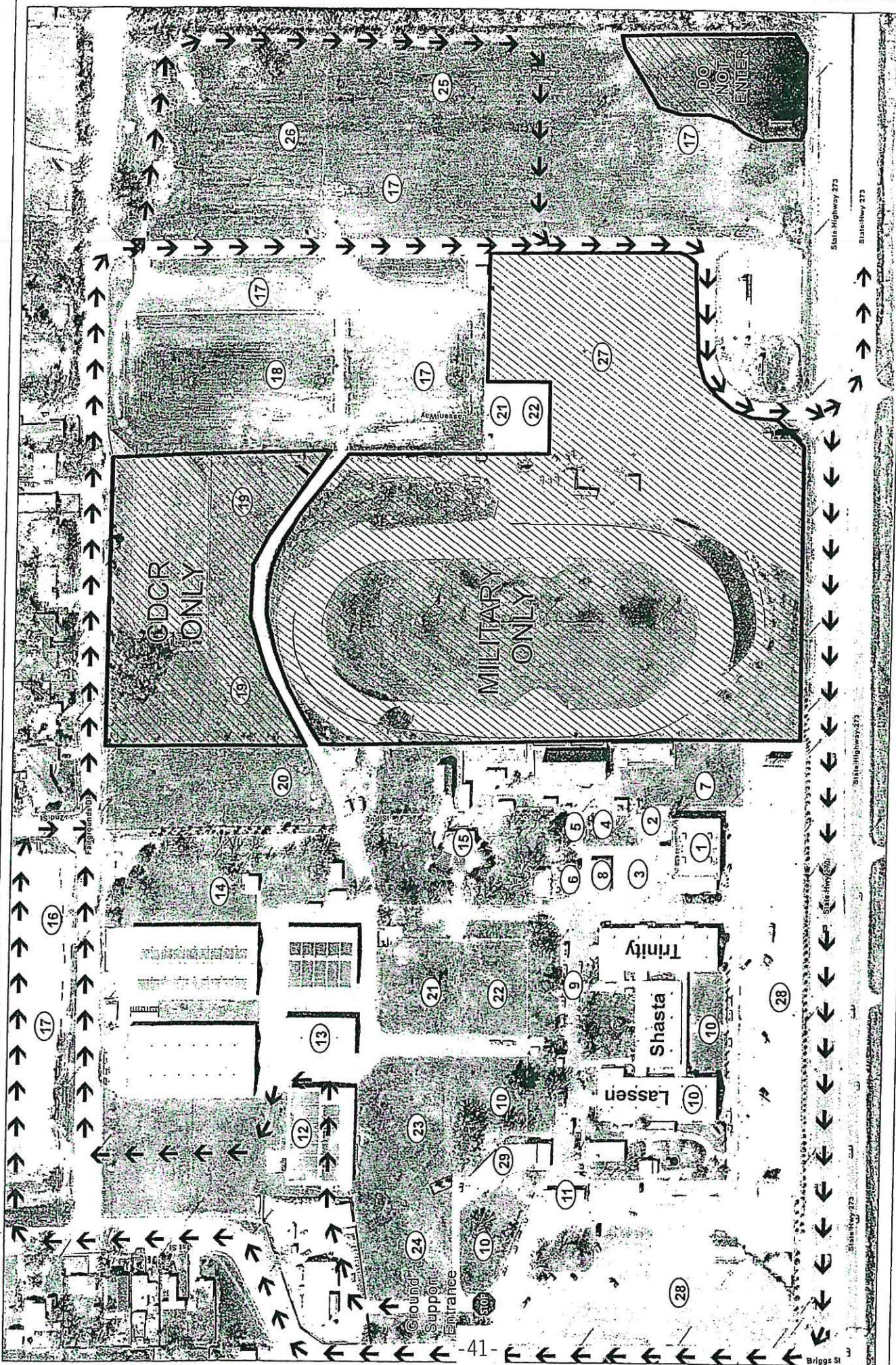
