**Weather Discussion:** For today, high pressure will bring another round of warm and very dry conditions. For the Zogg Fire, afternoon temperatures will be in the upper-80s to low 90s, with minimum humidity at or below 15%. Expect cooler and slightly more humid conditions in the West Contingency zone. Winds will generally be light and terrain driven. For tonight, expect a continuation of light, terrain driven winds near the Zogg. Stronger winds are possible in larger drainages of the West Contingency zone, such as Beegum Gorge. Beginning Wednesday, high pressure will weaken and shift eastward initiating a trend toward cooler and more humid weather, with the potential for rainfall as early as Friday.

### OUTPUTS

#### FIRE BEHAVIOR

**GENERAL:** Varied fuels across the incident are extremely dry. A heavy loading of fine fuels will provide a receptive fuel bed for any new ignitions. Live fuel moistures in the area are at a critical level (around 60%) and 1000-hour dead fuel moistures are around 7%. Daily terrain winds may align with slopes and increase activity in smoldering fuels. Fine fuels will be less receptive overnight with the humidity recovery.

Projected fire behavior if the fire escapes the current perimeter, or for nearby initial attack-

Grass – **Rate of Spread** up to 1.5 mi/hr **Flame Lengths** 4-12 ft.

Brush/Timber – **Rate of Spread** up to 1-2 mi/hr **Flame Lengths** 10-30 ft.

**Probability of Ignition:** up to 90% **Spotting Distance:** Spotting up to .25-.5 mile. (Peak gusts)

*Fire behavior predictions are for head fire based on the hottest and driest period of the day. Rates of spread and flame lengths could exceed forecasted values.*

#### SPECIFIC:

**All Divisions** - Minimal fire behavior is expected. The fire will continue to smolder in the down fuels within the perimeter. Expect moderate rates of spread should the fire become established outside of containment lines.

**West Contingency-** Fuel conditions remain at critical low fuel moisture levels, and previous fire spread has shown that fuels can contribute to hard fire runs. Down canyon fire spread towards Hwy 36 should be expected should the fire become established above Beegum Gorge. Eastward down canyon spread would be expected along the Hwy 36 corridor. Upslope runs will be possible in wind sheltered areas, or where the steep slopes overpower the effect of the wind.

**AIR OPERATIONS:** Sunrise: 0714 Sunset: 1839

Limited visibility in the area due to smoky conditions should be expected.

### SAFETY

Fuels outside the line continue to be very receptive. Be prepared to react to rollout or new starts.

Intersecting drainages can create a disruption or concentration in wind flow/eddy effects. Identify areas where unfavorable winds may adversely affect fire behavior

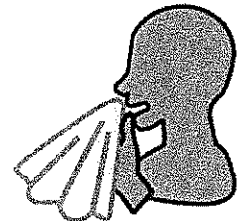

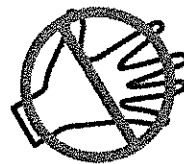

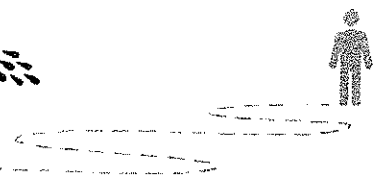

## ZOGG INCIDENT SAFETY MESSAGE

**L**ookouts, **C**ommunications, **E**scape routes, **S**afety zones

**INCIDENT:** Zogg Incident CA-SHU-009978 | **DATE:** October 6, 2020 | **TIME:** 0700-0700

### **Major Hazards / Risks: Fatigue, Trees, Driving, New Fires**

**Personnel:** Monitor yourself and those around you. Consider a 2:1 water to electrolyte drink ratio and eat nutritious food regularly. Stay engaged and make smart decisions.

**Heat Stress and Fatigue:** Be alert for the cumulative effects of fatigue and take breaks as necessary. Effects include slower reactions, lack of attention and forgetfulness. Dehydration contributes to fatigue. As fatigue increases, injuries tend to increase also.

**Hazard trees:** Survey all areas for hazard trees, flag and restrict access, use only qualified personnel for tree felling. Brief personnel on Hazard Tree Safety on page 22 of your IRPG. Assess potential for trees to domino. Post lookouts when there is possible danger.

**Ash pits:** Risk of deep ash pits or root cavities with hot coals. White ash can be an indicator of ash pits. Stumps and roots may be fully consumed by fire. Difficult to identify hazard which likely extends beyond the immediate area along underground root lines. Risk of slips, trips, and falls.

**Driving:** Reduce your speed! Drive defensively on narrow winding roads. Expect the unexpected around every curve. Drive with headlights and seatbelts on and utilize backcrossers. Coordinate your movements on one-lane roads.

**Fire Behavior:** Be prepared for new fires in the area. Fuels are receptive to fire spread. A small amount of wind on this dry fuel changes fire behavior dramatically. Be alert to changes in wind direction and expect changes in fire behavior. Watch for spot fires outside of control lines and embers cast into structures.

**Line Construction:** Conduct a thorough briefing for all personnel. Ensure LCES are in place prior to engagement. Use Downhill Checklist in the IRPG. Maintain proper crew spacing.

**Steep slopes/rolling material:** Watch your footing while hiking in steep terrain. Be careful of rolling debris. Stagger personnel hiking uphill in loose soil. Maintain Situational Awareness.

#### **Covid-19 Precautions:**

- Keep your distance. Wear a mask when less than 6' from other people.
- No group gatherings without masks.
- Wash your hands.
- Don't show up to work sick.
- Do daily health evaluations on your personnel.

#### **Mop Up:**

- Conduct thorough briefing for all personnel.
- Use all required PPE, including eye protection.
- Be alert for stump holes and root cavities.
- Evaluate unburned islands/Increase situational awareness.
- Back haul all trash and equipment off the line.
- Lift equipment with your legs and not your back.





## ZOGG INCIDENT RISK ANALYSIS (ICS 215a)

DIV	HAZARDOUS ACTIONS/CONDITIONS	MITIGATIONS / WARNINGS / REMEDIES
ALL	<b>FATIGUE / HEAT / DEHYDRATION</b>	During periods of hot/dry weather with limited resources be alert for signs of fatigue and take breaks as necessary. Drink water before, during and after shifts, up to 1.5 gal. per shift. Be alert for signs of heat stress in yourself and others; use the buddy system. Eat small meals often and when possible.
ALL	<b>HAZARD TREES</b>	Identify and isolate the area to provide for safety of others. Flag and make the proper notifications. Evaluate all trees prior to working under or near them. Don't fall any tree outside of your qualification. Post lookouts when there is possible danger.
ALL	<b>DRIVING</b>	Drive defensively! Narrow winding roads are hazardous. Slow Down. Drive with headlights on and seatbelts on. Be alert for heavy trucks and high-speed opposing traffic crossing into your lane. Use warning devices when operating near traffic. Watch for downed trees and rocks on roadways.
ALL	<b>MOP UP AND PATROL</b>	Use all required PPE, including eye protection and gauntlet gloves. Maintain proper spacing and overhead clearance. Be alert for ash pits and root cavities. Evaluate unburned islands, and consider re-burn potential.
ALL	<b>FIRE BEHAVIOR</b>	Anticipate new starts. Review Wildland Urban Interface Firefighting in the IRPG. Monitor current weather conditions and forecasts. Make sure all personnel receive a briefing. Work within your capabilities when limited resources are available. Maintain escape routes and safety zones.
ALL	<b>STEEP TERRAIN / ROLLING DEBRIS</b>	Watch your footing while hiking in steep terrain. Be careful of loose rolling debris. Maintain Situational Awareness and separation.
ALL	<b>FIRE SUPPRESSION REPAIR</b>	Maintain accountability of personnel at all times. Monitor appropriate tactical channels. Use caution when operating equipment adjacent to unburned fuels. Consider the need for suppression apparatus.
ALL	<b>ASH PITS</b>	Risk of deep ash pits or root cavities with hot coals. White ash is sometimes an indicator of ash pits. Stumps and roots may be fully consumed by fire. Difficult to identify hazard which likely extends beyond the immediate area along underground root lines. Risk of slips, trips, and falls.
ALL	<b>COVID 19</b>	Maintain 6' distance whenever possible. Wear masks when less than 6' away from people, frequent hand washing/sanitizing, disinfect common surfaces, follow Shasta County Public Health Guidelines. Conduct daily health evaluation of all personnel. Monitor for symptoms, follow reporting procedure.
ALL	<b>LINE CONSTRUCTION</b>	Conduct thorough briefing for all personnel. Ensure LCES are in place prior to engagement. Use Downhill Line Checklist in the IRPG.
ALL	<b>HEAVY EQUIPMENT</b>	Watch for rolling material and avoid working below heavy equipment. Monitor safe working distances. Avoid working below heavy equipment. Utilize communication with the operator (radio or hand signals). Stay out of the dust.
ALL	<b>POWER LINES</b>	Follow <i>Powerline Safety</i> guidelines in the IRPG. Communicate power line hazards to immediate supervisor. Flag area around downed power lines and deny access. Treat all downed power lines as energized.
ALL	<b>AIRCRAFT OPERATIONS</b>	Monitor air-to-ground frequency, they are your eyes in the sky. Use air-to-ground frequency to communicate with aircraft. Use clear, concise statements when directing aircraft.
ALL	<b>PERFORM TAIL GATE SAFETY MEETINGS</b>	Everyone should be briefed on the conditions and circumstances regarding the fire and their assignments per the IRPG. Ensure all personnel have PPE, food, and water.
ALL	<b>BACKHAUL</b>	Use proper lifting techniques. Be aware of stump holes. Watch out for trip hazards and loose footing. Take your time and pay attention.

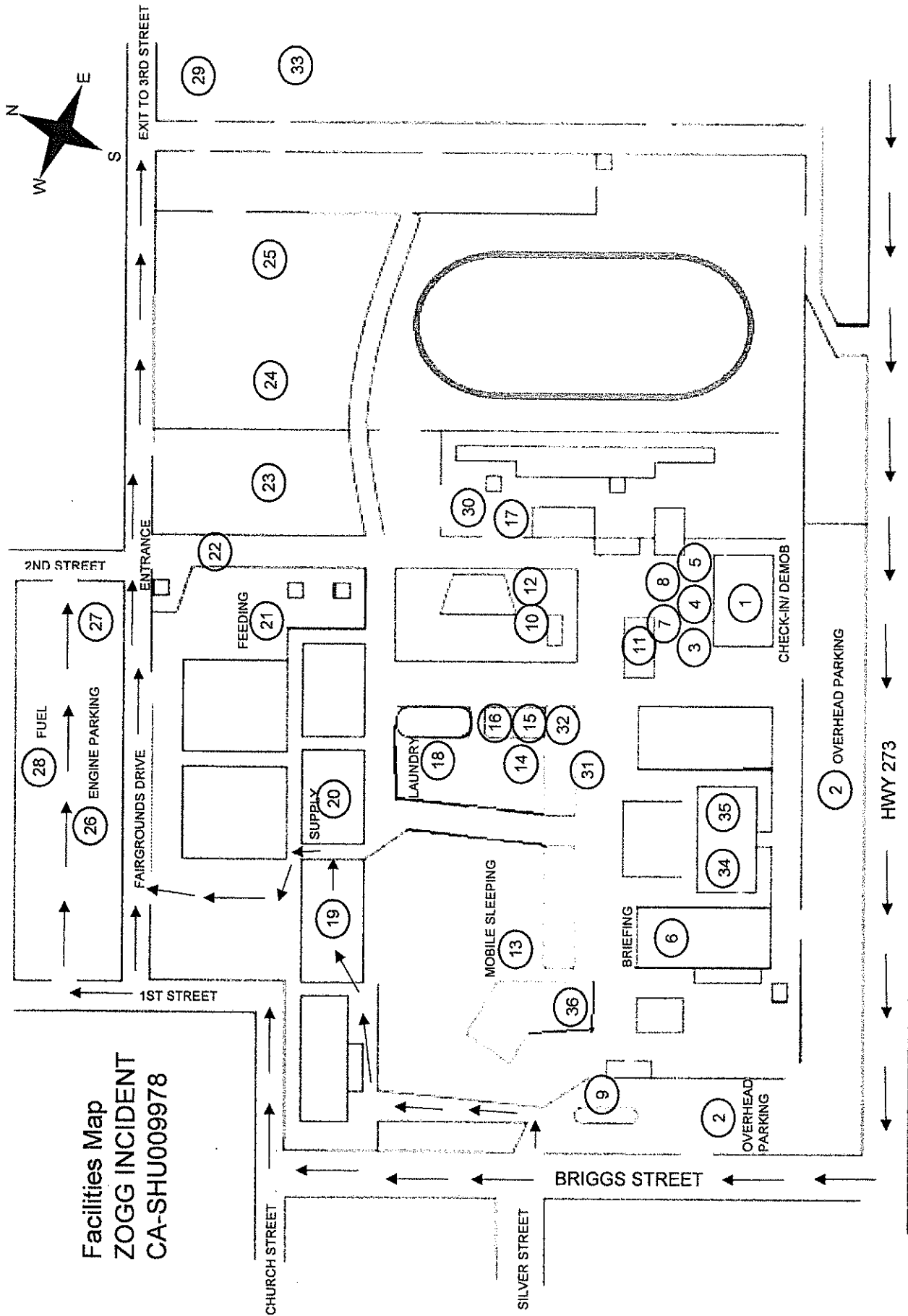

**MEDIA:** California State Penal Code Section 409.5(d) allows the news media to enter scenes of disaster, riot, or civil disturbance. Properly identified members of the news media should not be restricted from entering the locations specified within the code, even if the area presents a danger to them. Media members should be advised of the nature of possible danger. Members of the media do not have the right to access crime scenes or any area where their presence may interfere with incident operations, mitigation or evidence collection. The media may only access private property with the property owner's permission. Fire personnel cannot provide members of the media with authorization to enter private property. If approached and questioned by the media and/or the public, talk about your assignment or task at hand. If need be, direct the questioning party to the incident PIO. Do not speculate or give opinions There is no such thing as an "off the record" comment.

**CAL FIRE SOCIAL MEDIA POLICY (Social Media 0691):** Social Media is increasingly being used by public agencies and the media as well as the public. This form of communication continues to grow rapidly in order to supply the public's desire for instant information gratification. All personnel assigned to a CAL FIRE incident will adhere to the CAL FIRE Social Media Policy. Further information about the CAL FIRE Social Media Policy can be obtained from the Information Officer. If you are uncertain, please ask.

**Do not post:**

- Inappropriate information, pictures or videos. Opinions regarding the incident, policy or endorsements of any kind.

**PICTURES AND VIDEO OF INCIDENT:** We are in a new era of media. Media no longer means the news/broadcast industry but now refers to anyone that has the capability to shoot video and or photographs and post them onto social media in a matter of minutes. Unfortunately, we have seen some instances of video or photographs that have depicted unsafe, unprofessional or embarrassing circumstances which are a serious breach of ethics. When this happens, it reflects poorly on all that are attached to this incident. Posting an inappropriate video, photo or blog comment could have unwanted effects. It may be unsafe to shoot photos or video and a firefighter who is concentrating on a camera can't be looking up, down and all around.

**LOST AND FOUND:** The Information staff will manage Lost and Found items for the incident. If you have lost an item, leave your contact information and what you have lost at the Information trailer. If you have found an item on the incident, bring the item to the Information trailer.
