WEATHER DISCUSSION: A mostly clear sky will both allow for a chilly start in the 30s with some cold spots dipping into the upper 20s, but also for temperatures during the day to climb into the 60s and even lower 70s in the warm valley spots. Look for afternoon humidity values to fall to around 25% - a little lower in the valleys, and a little higher at elevation. A cold front sweeps through tonight, veering winds northerly and beginning a surge of cold, dry air. Expect strong winds tomorrow, with the strongest gusts in well-aligned valleys to around 40 mph. Considerably colder temperatures are expected after the front, with lows falling into the lower 20s and even the upper teens in the coldest spots.

TODAY: Mostly sunny and slightly warmer than Saturday.

High Temperatures: Valley/Drainages: 68-74° Mid-Slope (4500-5500 FT): 63-69° Ridges (> 5500 FT): 61-67°
Minimum Relative Humidity: Valley/Drainages: 20-25% Mid-Slope (4500-5500 FT): 20-25% Ridges (> 5500 FT): 20-25%
General Winds: Valleys and Lower Slopes: Light downslope/downvalley winds becoming upslope/upvalley around 5 mph after 1100. Increasing westerly winds to around 10 mph after 1700.
Upper Slopes and Ridges: Light downslope/downvalley winds becoming upslope/upvalley after 1100, gradually becoming more westerly and increasing to 10-15 mph around/after 1700.

Stability: Morning inversion lifting 0800-1000 with mixing heights deepening to around 6500 ft AGL.
Chance of Rain: 5% LAL: 1 **Transport Winds:** Light/Variable becoming WNW 10-15 mph.

TONIGHT: Cold front passing overnight. Winds becoming northerly and increasing in strength. Brief, light precipitation is possible towards morning, but unlikely. A few snowflakes at higher elevations are possible.

Low Temperatures: Valley/Drainages: 20-25° Mid-Slope (4500-5500 FT): 29-34° Ridges (>5500 FT): 20-24°
Humidity Recovery: Valley/Drainages: 90-100% Mid-Slope (4500-5500 FT): 60-75% Ridges (> 5500 FT): 80-90%
Winds: Valleys/Drainages: West around 10 mph early evening, becoming northerly after the cold front passes, by midnight. Winds increase to 10-15 mph by morning.
Slopes and Ridges: West 10-15 mph early evening, becoming northerly after the cold front passes between 2000 and midnight. Wind speeds increase to 15-20 mph towards morning.

Stability: Weak inversion at most developing around 2000 PDT. The frontal passage will minimize impact of any nighttime inversion, and may prevent one from forming at all.
Chance of Precipitation: 10% LAL: 1 **Transport Winds:** Becoming N after frontal passage, 10-15 mph.

MONDAY: Windy, with peak gusts near/above 40 mph. Strongest winds mid-day to early afternoon. Considerably cooler. A few snowflakes at high elevations are possible, but not particularly likely, mainly in the morning. The best chance for a flurry will be on the eastern edge of the fire.

High Temperatures: Valley/Drainages: 46-55° Mid-Slope (4500-5500 FT): 43-50° Ridges (> 5500 FT): 39-46°
Minimum Relative Humidity: Valley/Drainages: 20-30% Mid-Slope (4500-5500 FT): 20-30% Ridges (> 5500 FT): 20-30%
General Winds: Valleys and Lower Slopes: NE to around 15 mph, with gusts 25-35 mph in well-aligned valleys. Poorly aligned valleys will see weaker, but more erratic winds.
Upper Slopes and Ridges: NE 15-20 mph, with gusts reaching up to around 40 mph near well-aligned valleys.

Stability: Weak inversion, if any, lifting by 0800 with mixing heights to around 10000 ft AGL.
Chance of Precipitation: 10% LAL: 1 **Transport Winds:** NNE 25-40 mph.

Extended Outlook: Red Flag conditions possible again Tuesday. Though not expected to be quite as strong as winds on Monday, general northeast winds are still expected to be gusty. Ridgetop winds are forecast to gust to near 30 mph, strongest in valleys that align with the northeast winds. Drier air surging into the region will push afternoon RH down below 20 percent. Cold weather is expected to reign at night – temperatures Monday night/Tuesday morning and Tuesday night/Wednesday morning will fall into the low to mid 20s, and even into the teens in the coldest spots. *Even light winds will result in wind chill values in the teens area-wide.*

- Mostly sunny, mild and cooling, with dry, increasing westerly winds
- Max. Temp.: 63-69°
- Min. RH: 20-25%. Maximum nighttime RH: 75% (higher in valley bottoms)
- Winds: Upslope becoming westerly 5-10 mph with gusts to 15 on ridges

FIRE BEHAVIOR

GENERAL:

Northeast California Energy Release Component is about 56

- **Expect very little fire activity** with a few isolated areas of smoldering and creeping in unburned interior islands, dozer berms, stumpholes and post-burn needlecast.
- **Fuels are grass, brush and timber** - Scott and Burgan fuel models GS2, SH3/4/9, TU1/5 and TL 6/9. 1000-hour fuel moistures are < 10% and live fuels are 60 – 70%.
- **Topography is varied** and includes mountains, hills, drainages, benches and meadows. The elevation ranges from 4000' to over 8000' in Lassen Park. All aspects are represented and slopes range from 0 to 80%.

SPECIFIC FIRE BEHAVIOR:

Very low fire behavior and potential. Very few smoldering hotspots remain within the fire perimeter. Low likelihood for any control issues.

West Zone: There are a few areas of unburned interior islands of vegetation in Lassen Park and Lassen Forest/Prospect Peak/Cluster Lakes areas that will continue to burn themselves out with low intensity. Light smoke may be visible.

East Zone: Very little heat evident. There may be a few remaining hot stumpholes and buried heat in dozer berms. Very light smoke visible near Greenville but not a threat to containment lines.

Maximum Fire Behavior (for any new starts outside of containment lines):

- Surface Flame Lengths 3-6'
- Rate of Spread 12-20 chains/hour grass and 6-10 chains/hour in timber
- Spotting Distance up to 1000'
- Probability of Ignition < 40%

If Red Priority Request Emergency Traffic/Clear Channel
 - Division Supervisor or POC* will run "Medical –Emergency" on the Command frequency.
 - Division Supervisor of POC* to use "Medical Incident Report" on back/next page of 206

POC* (Point of Contact) and/or Operations

EMERGENCY DURING OPS. BRIEF 0700-0730:

- If you have an emergency while briefing is going on over the command channel. Wait for a break and transmit your emergency traffic.


LINE "NON-EMERGENCY INCIDENT" PLAN:

- Crew Supervisor to contact Division Supervisor with:
 - Patient Complaint, Condition and Location via Tactical or Command frequency. **Priority 3/Green Tag** Patients only trigger an Incident within Incident (IWI) if they are being transported to a medical facility.
