Gusty Winds Today and Tomorrow...Hard Freeze Tonight and Tuesday Night

WEATHER DISCUSSION: A cold front has swept through the region overnight, veering winds northerly and beginning a surge of cold, dry air. Expect strong winds through the day. The strongest winds will be in well-aligned valleys (mostly north to south) with sustained winds of 20-25 mph and gusts to around 40 mph. Look for relative humidity to still bottom out in the 20s, as the dry air invading the area will offset the much colder temperatures. This incoming cold surge will make a few flurries possible - albeit unlikely - on the eastern edge of the fire area. Highs today will struggle to rise much above 50 degrees, if at all. Lows the next couple of nights will fall into the lower 20s and upper teens in the coldest spots.

TODAY: Windy, with peak gusts near/above 40 mph. Strongest winds mid-day to early afternoon. Considerably colder. A few snowflakes at high elevations are possible, but not particularly likely, mainly in the morning. The best chance for a flurry will be on the eastern edge of the fire.

High Temperatures: Minimum Relative Humidity: Valley/Drainages: 50-56° Mid-Slope (4500-5500 ft): 44-50° Ridges (> 5500 ft): 39-45° Valley/Drainages: 15-25% Mid-Slope (4500-5500 ft): 20-30% Ridges (> 5500 ft): 20-30% Valleys and Lower Slopes: NE to around 15 mph, with gusts 25-35 mph in well-aligned valleys.

Poorly aligned valleys will see weaker, but more erratic winds.

Upper Slopes and Ridges: NE 15-20 mph, with gusts reaching up to around 40 mph near well-

aligned valleys.

Stability: Weak inversion, if any, lifting around 0700 with mixing heights to around 9500 ft AGL.

Chance of Precipitation: 10% LAL: 1 Transport Winds: N 25-40 mph.

TONIGHT: Cold, with a hard freeze expected across the fire area. Winds will diminish modestly from earlier in the day, but remain stronger and gustier than a typical night.

Valley/Drainages: 16-23° Mid-Slope (4500-5500 ft): 22-28° Ridges (>5500 ft): 14-20° Valley/Drainages: 90-100% Mid-Slope (4500-5500 ft): 75-85% Ridges (> 5500 ft): 80-90%

Humidity Recovery: Winds:

Valleys/Drainages: North winds 5-10 mph Gusts 15-20 mph in N-S aligned valleys.

Slopes and Ridges: North 5-10 mph, with gusts as high as 30 mph in the evening, diminishing to

10-20 mph later in the night.

Stability: Weak nighttime inversion forming after 2300.

Chance of Precipitation: 10% LAL: 1 Transport Winds: Becoming N after frontal passage, 10-15 mph.

TUESDAY: Cool, dry and gusty again. Winds will be lighter than today, but sustained winds as high as 15 mph and peak gusts to around 30 mph are likely in NE-SW oriented valleys.

High Temperatures: Minimum Relative Humidity: Valley/Drainages: 56-63° Mid-Slope (4500-5500 ft): 48-55° Ridges (> 5500 ft): 43-50° Valley/Drainages: 12-20% Mid-Slope (4500-5500 ft): 12-20% Ridges (> 5500 ft): 15-25%

General Winds:

Valleys and Lower Slopes: NE 5- 10 mph, with gusts 15-20 mph. Upper Slopes and Ridges: NE 15-20 mph, with gusts to around 30 mph.

Stability: Inversion lifting by 0800 with mixing heights to around 5500 ft AGL.

Chance of Precipitation: 0% LAL: 1 Transport Winds: NE 15 mph.

Extended Outlook: Tuesday night looks to be every bit as cold as tonight. From the midweek on, expect a slow, gradual warming trend, but chilly nights will remain the norm. A very weak upper disturbance brings the slightest of chances of a rain shower on Thursday, but fair weather will largely be the rule in the second half of the week.

GENERAL:

Northeast California Energy Release Component is about 55

- Expect very little fire activity with a few isolated areas of smoldering and creeping in unburned interior islands, dozer berms, stumpholes and post-burn needlecast. Strong northeast could cause rapid fire spread outside of containment lines.
- Fuels are grass, brush and timber Scott and Burgan fuel models GS2, SH3/4/9, TU1/5 and TL 6/9. 1000-hour fuel moistures are < 10% and live fuels are 60 70%.
- **Topography is varied** and includes mountains, hills, drainages, benches and meadows. The elevation ranges from 4000' to over 8000' in Lassen Park. All aspects are represented and slopes range from 0 to 80%.

SPECIFIC FIRE BEHAVIOR:

Very low fire behavior and potential. Very few smoldering hotspots remain within the fire perimeter.

West Zone: There are a few areas of unburned interior islands of vegetation in Lassen Park and Lassen Forest/Prospect Peak/Cluster Lakes areas that will continue to burn themselves out with low intensity. Light smoke may be visible. Any new starts or fire outside containment lines near DIV's S, P, O, N and L could rapidly spread southwesterly.

East Zone: Very little heat evident. There may be a few remaining hot stumpholes and buried heat in dozer berms. Very light smoke visible near Greenville but not a threat to containment lines.

Maximum Fire Behavior (new starts or outside of containment lines):

- Surface Flame Lengths 6-9'
- Rate of Spread 15-35 chains/hour grass and 10-20 chains/hour in timber



Major Hazards and Risks:

- **Hazard Trees:** Assess ALL Trees in Work Areas....In addition to suppression and mop-up operations, assess hazard trees when you take breaks and park vehicles. Check out your IRPG pgs. 22-23
- Covid-19: wash hands frequently, practice social distancing, wear face covering when required, clean and disinfect frequently touched surfaces, don't share cell phones, radios etc., and operate as a "module of one".
- Driving: Slow down; Use spotters when backing, and watch for personnel and wildlife on roads.
- Weather: Base actions on current and expected weather.



Snags and wind do not mix!

- Make sure your work area is well scouted for fire weakened trees.
- Establish trigger points for windy conditions.
- Make safety zones known.

Transition is a watch out!

- Moving from one division to another requires good communication.
- Identify Hazards (Situational Awareness) along the way.
- Assess Hazards.
- Develop Controls and Make Risk Decisions.
- Implement Controls.
- Supervise and Evaluate.

If the situation changes significantly, restart the Risk Management Process at the appropriate step.

 - Patient Complaint, Condition and Location via Tactical or Command frequency. Priority 1/Red Tag or Priority
 2/Yellow Tag trigger Incident within Incident (IWI).
- -Division Supervisor/Operations contacts East Zone Communications: If Red Priority Request Emergency Traffic/Clear Channel
 - Division Supervisor or POC* will run "Medical –Emergency" on the Command frequency.
 - Division Supervisor of POC* to use "Medical Incident Report" on back/next page of 206

POC* (Point of Contact) and/or Operations

EMERGENCY DURING OPS. BRIEF 0700-0730:

 If you have an emergency while briefing is going on over the command channel. Wait for a break and transmit your emergency traffic.

LINE "NON-EMERGENCY INCIDENT" PLAN:

- Crew Supervisor to contact Division Supervisor with:
 - Patient Complaint, Condition and Location via Tactical or Command frequency. Priority 3/Green Tag Patients only trigger an Incident within Incident (IWI) if they are being transported to a medical facility.
- Division Supervisor contacts East Zone Communications:
 - Division Supervisor or POC* will run "Non-Emergency Incident" on the Command frequency.
 - Division Supervisor or POC* will use "Medical Incident Report" on back/next page of 206
