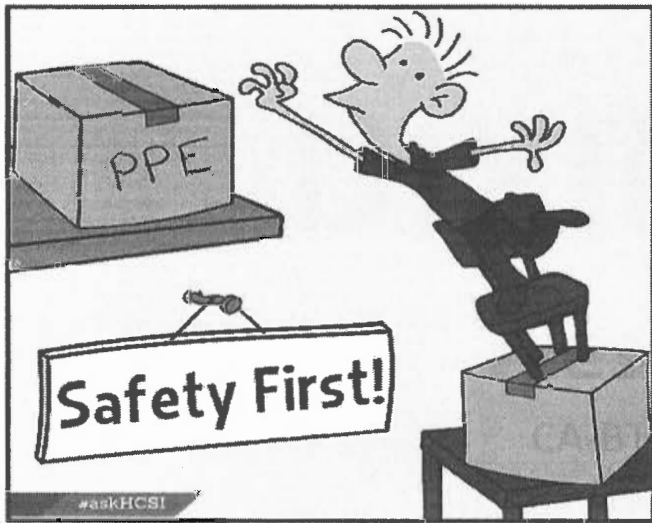

WEATHER DISCUSSION: Northerly winds will persist today with speeds around 15 mph and gusts near or just under 30 mph. Wind chills in the teens and twenties are expected this morning. Afternoon humidity will be lower with some locations drying to around 20%. Temperatures will climb through the 40s and into the 50s with increasing clouds through the afternoon. There will be a low potential for snow flurries/snow showers tonight. No significant accumulations expected.

TODAY: Partly sunny and cold. Morning wind chills in the teens and twenties. North breezes continue with slightly lighter speeds.

High Temperatures: Valley/Drainages: 53-58° Mid-Slope (4500-5500 FT): 47-52° Ridges (> 5500 FT): 42-47°
Minimum Relative Humidity: Valley/Drainages: 15-25% Mid-Slope (4500-5500 FT): 20-25% Ridges (> 5500 FT): 20-30%

Interior heat islands (near DP-301): E winds at 5 mph during the morning hours will quickly intensify and turn to the north through the afternoon. Peak speeds in the afternoon will increase into the 9 to 12 mph range with gusts as high as 24 mph.

DIV S/U: E winds under 5 mph will increase and become more northeasterly through the afternoon. Peak speeds will approach 13 to 16 mph with gusts as great as 28 mph.

DIV W/Z: E to NE winds will range between 4 and 9 mph with gusts to 11 mph through noon. In the afternoon, winds will increase into the 13 to 16 mph range with gusts up to 28 mph.

DIV J/K/L: Sheltering here will keep winds subdued with NE winds increasing from 3 to 5 mph in the morning hours to 6 to 10 mph with gusts to around 15 mph in the afternoon.

Stability: Inversion lifting by noon. Mixing heights around 6,000 feet.

Chance of Precipitation: 2% **LAL:** 1 **Transport Winds:** NE at 30 mph.

TONIGHT: Increasing mid/upper level clouds. Lighter winds expected. A 15-20% chance for flurries/light snow showers

Low Temperatures: Valley/Drainages: 26-31° Mid-Slope (4500-5500 FT): 20-30° Ridges (>5500 FT): 20-30°
Relative Humidity Recovery: Susanville ICP: 27-30° Hat Creek Spike: 28-31°
Valley/Drainages: 70-80% Mid-Slope (4500-5500 FT): 55-65% Ridges (> 5500 FT): 55-65%

Interior heat islands (near DP-301): North breezes will diminish and briefly transition to the SE around midnight. Speeds will remain below 10 mph, except in the higher terrain. Toward sunrise winds will become WNW with speeds between 2 and 6 mph.

DIV S/U: Terrain driven flow (largely downslope/down-valley) is expected after 1900 PDT. After midnight, winds will become SW to WSW with speeds between 2 and 6 mph.

DIV W/Z: Terrain driven flow (largely downslope/down-valley) will commence by 2200 PDT with winds becoming more SW to WSW with speeds between 2 and 7 mph after midnight. The weaker winds will be farther north along CA-Highway 44 in DIV W.

DIV J/K/L: Downslope/down-valley flow should be expected around 2000 PDT with speeds under 4 mph. Toward daybreak, winds will become more westerly with speeds remaining near or just under 4 mph.

Stability: Inversion setting up around 1900-2000 PDT.

Chance of Precipitation: 20% **LAL:** 1 **Transport Winds:** NE to E around 15 mph.

Extended Outlook (Wednesday through Friday): For the extended outlook, anticipate cold mornings with temperatures in the 20s and 30s. Morning RH recovery above 55% should be expected. For the afternoons dry, warm, and breezy conditions are forecast.

Daytime high temperatures will climb into the 50s and 60s, with some 70s possible at the lowest elevations.

There will be little threat for precipitation. Forecast winds are near 10 mph with gusts between 20 and 25 mph.

- Max. Temps. 44-55°

FIRE BEHAVIOR

GENERAL:

Northeast California Energy Release Component is about 55

- **Expect very little fire activity** with a few isolated areas of smoldering and creeping in unburned interior islands, dozer berms, stumpholes and post-burn needlecast. Strong northeast could cause rapid fire spread outside of containment lines.
- **Fuels are grass, brush and timber** - Scott and Burgan fuel models GS2, SH3/4/9, TU1/5 and TL 6/9. 1000-hour fuel moistures are < 10% and live fuels are 60 – 70%.
- **Topography is varied** and includes mountains, hills, drainages, benches and meadows. The elevation ranges from 4000' to over 8000' in Lassen Park. All aspects are represented and slopes range from 0 to 80%.

SPECIFIC FIRE BEHAVIOR:

Very low fire behavior and potential. Very few smoldering hotspots remain within the fire perimeter.

West Zone: There are a few areas of unburned interior islands of vegetation in Lassen Park and Lassen Forest/Prospect Peak/Cluster Lakes areas that will continue to burn themselves out with low intensity. Light smoke may be visible. Any new starts or fire outside containment lines near DIV's S, P, O, N and L could rapidly spread southwesterly.

East Zone: Very little heat evident. There may be a few remaining hot stumpholes and buried heat in dozer berms. Very light smoke visible near Greenville but not a threat to containment lines.

Maximum Fire Behavior (new starts or outside of containment lines):

- Surface Flame Lengths 6-9'
- Rate of Spread 15-35 chains/hour grass and 10-20 chains/hour in timber
- Spotting Distance up to ¼-½ mile
- Probability of Ignition 60%

AIR OPERATIONS

- Gusty northerly winds could limit aviation operations

SAFETY

- Size-up work areas for **fire weakened trees near containment lines**. Watch for hot stumpholes and **rekindle potential** in areas of heavy post-burn needlecast.

FINANCE DEMOB PROCESS

The Finance demob process can be done in person or remotely.

In Person Demob for Equipment and /or Personnel/Crews

- Come to Susanville Fair Grounds and to the Finance Trailer.
- Turn in your completed Last Day Shift Ticket and/or CTR (this would include your travel time) with authorized government signature. Forest Service AD's need to project their travel time to home.
- Turn into finance the Shift Ticket and/or CTR for input. Make sure all equipment is turned in and weed wash is completed.
- A draft will be provided for review.
- After review and approved a "Final" will be printed for signatures.

Remote Demob for Equipment and/or Personnel/ Crews

- Turn in your completed Last Day Shift Ticket and/or CTR (this would include your travel time) with authorized government signature. Forest Service AD's need to project their travel time to home.
- Write your email address on the Shift Ticket and/or CTR
- Send your Shift Ticket and/or CTR to:
 - 2021.dixie.ca.west.finance@firenet.gov
- Finance will complete the posting and send the documents back to you by email for your review and signature.
- Please return the Final Signed Documents to the finance email (Contracted Equipment – in lieu of signature approval you may respond to the finance email that "All is Correct")
- Forest Service Casual Hire Employees (ADs) should also submit their travel information which may include per diem, lodging, baggage fees, gas receipts etc. If you have a rental or you have receipts going home you will have to do travel at your home unit.

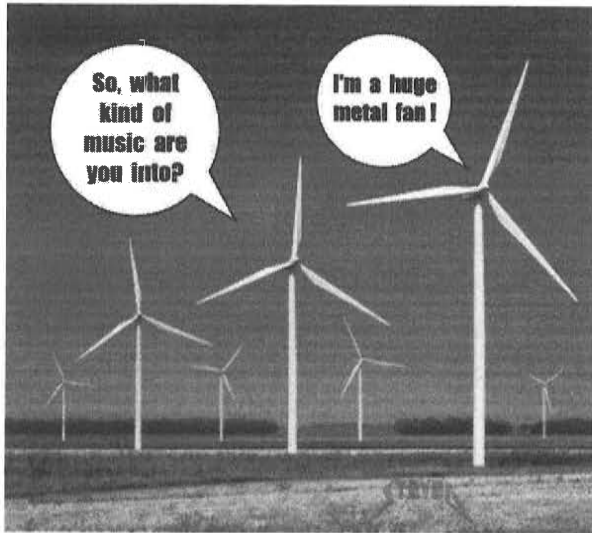



