




WEATHER DISCUSSION: Today will provide a short break of fair weather before a string of frequent disturbances are forecast to roll through the area into early next week. With clouds breaking some, we should warm up modestly from yesterday, with highs reaching from the 40s at elevation to the 60s in lower valleys. Winds will begin fairly light in the valleys, but already around 10 mph at ridgetop. From here, we'll see winds become more southerly and gusts to around 20 mph will emerge in the afternoon. Do not look for winds to drop off as much overnight, as the next storm system will be moving into the area late tonight into Wednesday, keeping winds up. As the storm moves through, expect gusty winds to return through Wednesday morning when they begin to gradually diminish.

TODAY: Sky becomes partly cloudy to mostly sunny. This will help temperatures rebound 5-10 degrees from Monday.
High Temperatures: Valley/Drainages: 59-63° Mid-Slope (4500-5500 ft): 54-62° Ridges (> 5500 ft): 48-54°
Minimum Relative Humidity: Valley/Drainages: 32-44% Mid-Slope (4500-5500 ft): 28-40% Ridges (> 5500 ft): 30-40%
General Winds: Valleys and Lower Slopes: Light and variable winds early pick up around 1100, becoming southerly 5-10 mph with gusts 15-20.
Upper Slopes and Ridges: South winds 5-10 mph increasing around 1100 to 10-15 with gusts to around 20 mph.

Stability: Nighttime inversion lifting around 1000, mixing heights rise to 3500-3500 ft AGL.
Chance of Precipitation: 15% **LAL:** 1 **Transport Winds:** S 15-20 mph

TONIGHT: Expect southerly winds to stay up tonight, even increasing towards morning as the next in a string of autumn storms moves through. Precip chances will increase after midnight, with a mix or changeover to snow possible above 6000 feet.
Low Temperatures: Valley/Drainages: 29-33° Mid-Slope (4500-5500 ft): 32-40° Ridges (>5500 ft): 31-38°
Humidity Recovery: Valley/Drainages: 90-100% Mid-Slope (4500-5500 ft): 85-100% Ridges (> 5500 ft): 75-90%
Winds: Valleys/Drainages: South winds around 10 mph in the evening, increasing to 10-20 mph with gusts 20-30 mph after 0200
Slopes and Ridges: South winds 10-15 mph and gusts to 20, increasing to 15-20 mph with gusts to around 30 mph after midnight through sunrise.

Stability: No nighttime inversion, as incoming storm keeps lower atmosphere well mixed and less stable.
Chance of Precipitation: 80% **LAL:** 1 **Transport Winds:** SW 10-20 mph

WEDNESDAY: Strong and gusty winds as storm system moves through. Any snow or wintry mix will return to full rain after 0900 or so. Rain will become more scattered in the afternoon and evening, but may not fully come to an end.
High Temperatures: Valley/Drainages: 51-57° Mid-Slope (4500-5500 ft): 47-55° Ridges (> 5500 ft): 42-48°
Minimum Relative Humidity: Valley/Drainages: 64-72% Mid-Slope (4500-5500 ft): 52-67% Ridges (> 5500 ft): 50-75%
General Winds: Valleys and Lower Slopes: South winds around 15 mph with gusts to 25 at sunrise, slowly diminishing to around 10 mph and becoming SSW by sunset.
Upper Slopes and Ridges: South winds about 20 mph gusting to around 30 at sunrise, slowly diminishing through the day and becoming more southwesterly. Wind speeds 10-15 mph with gusts up to 20 mph by sunset.

Stability: Despite passing storm preventing overnight inversion, it will also keep mixing heights to around 1500 ft AGL.
Chance of Precipitation: 85% **LAL:** 1 **Transport Winds:** S 15 mph

Extended Outlook: Expect a quick succession of fast-moving storms through the weekend, keeping the potential for gusty winds and precipitation in place. At this time, the most impactful windows appear to be Friday, and Saturday night into Sunday. Some snow mixing with the rain is possible, particularly at higher elevations. These moisture-laden storms are likely to bring moderate to heavy rain at times.

- Partly sunny, mild, and cool with afternoon breezes, with the next in a series of disturbances arriving tonight
- Max. Temps: 50-60°+
- Min. RH: 28-40%
- Winds: Becoming southerly 5-10 mph with gusts 15-20 mph and higher on ridges

FIRE BEHAVIOR

GENERAL:

Northeast California Energy Release Component is about 61

- **Expect very little fire activity.** Some isolated smoldering/creeping may be evident in stumpholes, interior islands, dozer berms and post-burn needlecast.
- **Fuels** are grass, brush and timber - Scott and Burgan fuel models GS2, SH3/4/9, TU1/5 and TL 6/9. *Live and 1000-hour dead fuels are very dry*, estimated at 60-75% and less than 10% respectively.
- **Topography** is widely varied including mountains, hills, drainages, benches, meadows and flats. The elevation range is 4000' to over 8000' in Lassen Park. All aspects are represented and slopes range from 0 to over 80%.

SPECIFIC FIRE BEHAVIOR:

With recent widespread precipitation, overall, there is very low fire behavior and potential predicted.

Both Zones: Only a very few areas of isolated heat with occasional smokes visible but no threats to containment lines are expected.

Maximum Fire Behavior (new starts or outside of containment lines). Assumes dry fine fuels and sustained eye-level winds up to 15-20 mph.

- Surface Flame Lengths: Grass 3-6', Brush 5-9', Timber 3-6'
- Surface Rates of Spread: Grass 9-27 chs/hr, Brush 13-40 chs/hr, Timber 5-11 chs/hr
- Spotting Distance: 0.1-0.2 miles
- Probability of Ignition: <40%

Day Operations 10-19-2021

Major Hazards and Risks:

- **Driving:** *Slow Down!* Watch for ice/snow and animals on roads.
- **Weather:** Be aware of changing weather conditions. Watch out for increasing wind, snow, and ice in your work area. Communicate observed changes to conditions in the work environment and adjust tactics as needed.
- **Hazard Trees:** Assess ALL Trees in Work Areas. Assess hazard trees when you take breaks and park vehicles. Check out your IRPG pgs. 22-23.
- **Extended Medical Extraction Times:** Make a solid medical plan with your division in the morning. Make sure all resources understand it.
- **Working in Cold/Wet Weather:** Carry extra clothing to prevent hypothermia following shift. Dry out gear each night for next day. Watch footing on frozen ground. Maintain personal hydration. Monitor wind-chill and establish trigger points for disengagement.

TRANSFER OF COMMAND

- Risks to fireline personnel increase significantly during transfer of command periods regardless of the size or complexity of the incident. Many fatalities, serious injuries, and incidents with potential for injury have occurred during these transition periods. If you have been on the incident for a while, take time to inform new team members of current situation. Lead up!

Team Work

This fall, when you see Geese heading south for the winter, flying along in “V” formation, you might consider what science has discovered as to why they fly that way. As each bird flaps its wings, it creates up lift for the bird immediately following.

By flying in “V” formation the whole flock adds at least 71% greater flying range than if each bird flew on its own. When a goose falls out of formation, it suddenly feels the drag and resistance of trying to go it alone and quickly gets back into formation to take advantage of the lifting power of the bird in front.

When the Head Goose gets tired, it rotates back in the wing and another goose flies point.

Geese honk from behind to encourage those up front to keep up their speed.

Finally, and this is important, when a goose gets sick, or is wounded by gunshots and falls out of formation, two other geese fall out with that goose and follow it down to lend help and protection. They stay with the fallen goose until it is able to fly, or until it dies. Only then do they launch out on their own, or with another formation to catch up with their group.



Resource Advisor Message

- Thanks for all your continued good work. Repair is making significant progress. Communication and cooperation have been good.
- Amendment to the suppression repair plan: We are preparing an amendment to the plan to clarify direction on potential operational delineation (POD) lines, hazard trees, seeding, and GIS going forward. We anticipate this will be signed soon and will then share it with you.
- When hazard trees are felled, woody material may be removed to reduce fuel hazard. Options include chipping, piling for later burning, and decking.
- Remember that a line cleared for repair by archaeologists or other resource advisors may still have avoidance areas for archaeology, heritage, or rare species reasons.
- Avoidance areas will be clearly flagged with red/black flagging by the resource advisors.
- Resource advisors do not control or order equipment. We make requests or recommendations through the division supervisors and the chain of command.

Guidance On Safe Transition To Home Unit After Demobilization

The Incident Commander and your IMT leadership offer this informational guidance to refer to concerning safe travel after demobilization from the Dixie East Zone during the COVID-19 pandemic.

Once you leave the incident, you will lose the protective “bubble” you have built up and will be traveling among the public. It is readily evident that social distancing, handwashing, and vaccinations are inconsistent in many communities that you will travel through.

For you to remain free from exposure to COVID-19, you will need to be especially disciplined in continuing these common practices.

The safe practices that have been developed for health and safety remain:

- **Social Distance:** Maintain minimum 6 feet spacing whenever possible. Expose as few team members as possible to public areas like shops and convenience stores whenever possible. Avoid unnecessary face-to-face or close contact with persons outside your module while in transit. Avoid sharing food, utensils, or personal items.
- **Mask:** Wear your mask, especially if you are not vaccinated.
- **Hand Hygiene:** Continue regular hand hygiene. Wash hands for 20-30 seconds with soap and water. You may substitute hand sanitizer as needed. Rub generously into all hand surfaces for 20-30 seconds.
- **Disinfect and Clean Common Spaces:** Clean and disinfect all areas such as door handles (interior and exterior), dashboards, steering wheel, buttons/knobs, and other interior surfaces. Be especially careful of contact with public items, including gas pumps, door handles, restroom surfaces and keypads.
- **Regular Monitoring and Self-Assessment:** Daily self-check using the standard symptom list. Maintain awareness of any change in your health. Immediately discuss with your supervisor should you exhibit symptoms.

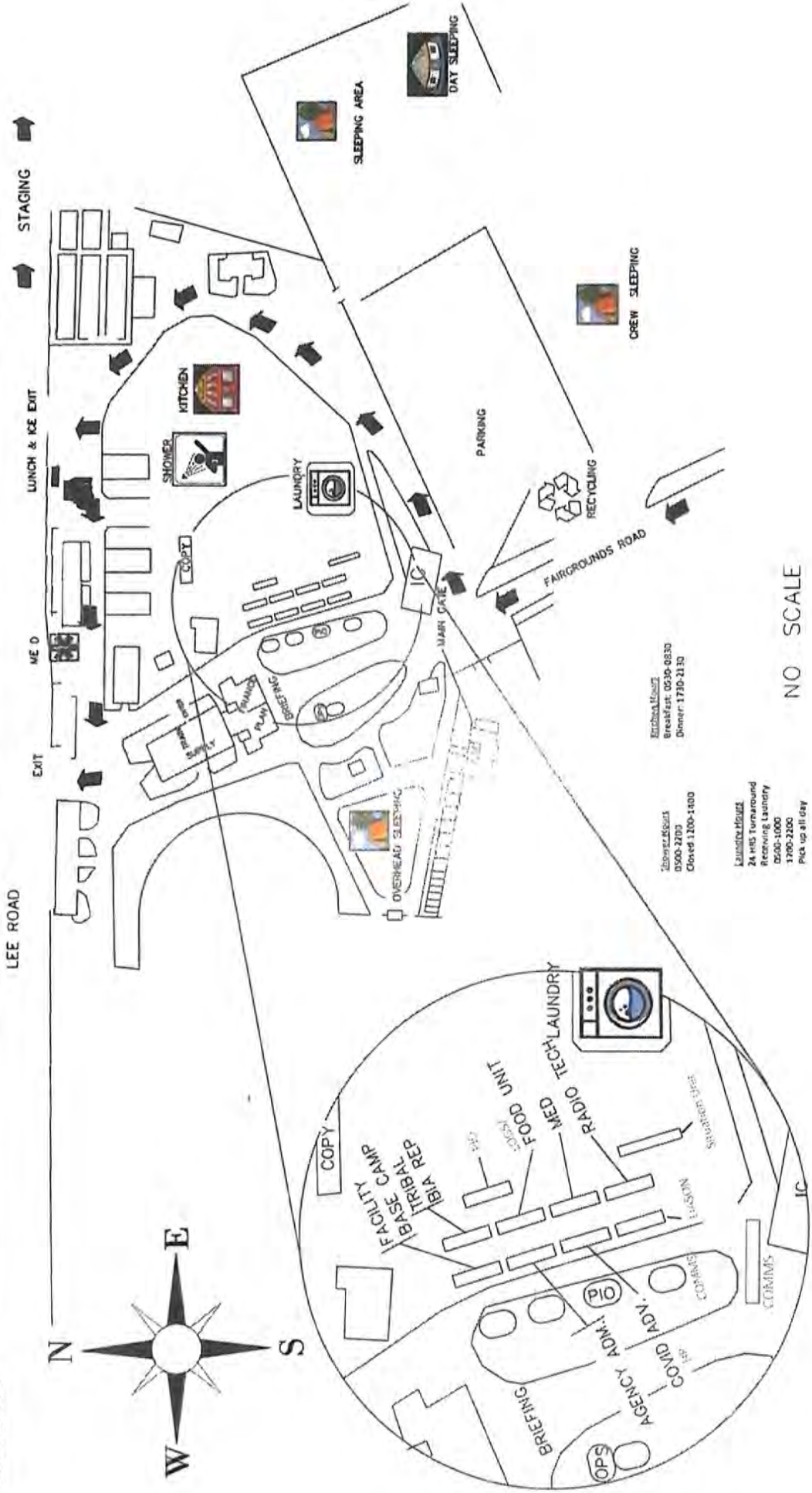
Should you develop symptoms and exhibit distress, seek care immediately. Do not delay care to continue travel to your home unit.

Symptoms to monitor (This list does not include all possible symptoms):

- Headache
- New loss of taste or smell
- Sore throat
- Congestion or runny nose
- Nausea or vomiting
- Diarrhea
- Fever or chills.
- Measured temp 100.4 or greater.
- Cough
- Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
- Fatigue
- Muscle or body aches


