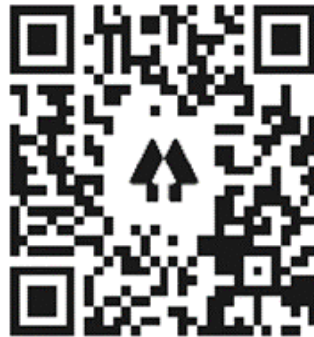

<b>3. Objective(s):</b>			
Management Objectives:			
<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Ensure firefighter and public safety by using strategies and tactics, with the highest probability of success, that keeps the fire within the existing containment lines and minimize the impact to the cultural, heritage, and natural resources.</li> <li>2. Implement and/or account for the repair of fire suppression-related activities as specified in the Dixie Fire Suppression Repair plan</li> <li>3. Identify and communicate hazards and conduct actions only when risks have been mitigated to acceptable level.</li> <li>4. Maintain an elevated awareness of current COVID-19 precautions and best infectious disease control measures to ensure the health of fire personnel and the public.</li> <li>5. Provide safe and efficient initial attack within the current fire area or when requested by the local units.</li> <li>6. Provide timely and accurate information to the public, stakeholders, cooperators and the adjacent incident management teams (East &amp; West zones) about fire status, fire management strategies and tactics, repair efforts, and any potential fire-related safety and health concerns.</li> <li>7. Maintain fiscal accountability and keep costs commensurate with values at risk.</li> </ol>			
Control Objectives:			
Keep the fire within the current containment lines and maintain availability for initial attack if requested.			
<b>4. Operational Period Command Emphasis:</b>			
Suppression damage repair - Repair damage to Forest Service improvements. Repair or minimize damage to soil, water, and other resources directly attributable to the fire suppression activity on National Forest System lands. Repair or stabilize watershed areas that have had their erosion potential significantly increased, or their drainage pattern altered by suppression-related activities.

# Dixie West Zone Weather Forecast

**WEATHER DISCUSSION:** A brief reprieve from precipitation can be expected for much of the daylight hours. It'll remain cold, with highs in the 40s and 50s. Winds will increase today with peak gusts near 25 mph. Tonight, precipitation chances will climb to around 60% with an uptick in winds. Sustained winds near 15 to 20 mph are forecast with gusts as high as 45 mph across some of the higher terrain. Additional accumulating snowfall will be possible above 6000 FT elevations with amounts as great as 3 inches.

**TODAY:** Morning patchy fog (some freezing) will be possible, especially in valleys/drainages. Visibility may be reduced. Otherwise, mostly cloudy skies with a few peeks of sunshine will be possible at times. Low chance for precipitation in the afternoon.

**High Temperatures:** Valley/Drainages: 52-57 ° Mid-Slope (4500-5500 FT): 43-48° Ridges (> 5500 FT): 40-45°  
**Minimum Relative Humidity:** Valley/Drainages: 40-45% Mid-Slope (4500-5500 FT): 45-55% Ridges (> 5500 FT): 45-55%

**Interior heat islands (near DP-301):** Southerly flow will increase through the day with sustained speeds near 15 mph and brief gusts to around 25 mph.

**DIV S/U:** A short period of NW winds possible Tuesday mid-morning across DIV S, but winds will be mainly out of the S and SW with speeds between 6 and 10 mph. A few gusts to near 25 mph possible.

**DIV W/Z:** Morning terrain driven flow will become southerly through the day with speeds between 9 and 13 mph with gusts to 25 mph forecast.

**DIV J/K/L:** S to SE winds are forecast with speeds between 8 and 12 mph with occasional gusts to around 22 mph. Mid-slope winds along Lassen Peak may accelerate in the afternoon to 9 to 15 mph with gusts upward of 25 mph.

**DIV P/O/N:** Winds will be sheltered some due to Lassen Peak with speeds between 3 and 6 mph. A few gusts to near 15 mph are expected.

**Stability:** Strong inversion lifting around 1500 PDT. Mixing heights will increase to around 4500 FT

**Chance of Precipitation:** 10% **LAL:** 1 **Transport Winds:** Becoming southerly around 20 mph.

**TONIGHT:** Precipitation chances will increase through the daylight hours on Wednesday. Some snow possible above 6000 FT elevation. Snowfall amounts may climb as great as 3 inches. Otherwise southerly breezes will intensify through the night.

**Low Temperatures:** Valley/Drainages: 29-39° Mid-Slope (4500-5500 FT): 32-37° Ridges (>5500 FT): 25-30°  
**Susanville ICP:** 35-38° **Hat Creek Spike:** 37-39°

**Relative Humidity Recovery:** Valley/Drainages: > 95% Mid-Slope (4500-5500 FT): >95% Ridges (> 5500 FT): > 95%

**Interior heat islands (near DP-301):** S winds will increase through the nighttime hours with speeds approaching 20 mph. A few gusts to 45 mph are possible.

**DIV S/U:** Higher elevations will likely experience the breeziest conditions with sustained winds around 15 mph. Gusts of up to 35 mph should be expected.

**DIV W/Z:** S to SW winds are forecast through the overnight hours with parts of DIV W experiencing sustained winds near 15 mph with gusts to 35 mph. Across DIV Z, winds will be subdued with speeds near 8 mph and occasional gusts near 15 mph.

**DIV J/K/L:** S to SE winds of 6 to 8 mph with gusts to 15 mph are forecast.

**DIV P/O:** Southerly downslope flow will be enhanced with wind speeds approaching 15 mph with gusts to 30-35 mph.

**Stability:** Weak inversion possibly setting up around 0400 PDT (Wednesday)

**Chance of Precipitation:** 60% **LAL:** 1 **Transport Winds:** South to southwest near 20 mph.

**Extended Outlook (Wednesday through Friday):** The active weather pattern will continue through the extended outlook with precipitation chances of 70% or greater across the incident. Some of this precipitation may fall in the form of accumulating snow at elevations above 6500 FT. Event total rainfall amounts remain uncertain, but could tally as great as three-quarters to an inch of liquid equivalent rainfall. Cloud cover will keep conditions cold during the day and elevate humidity values. Blustery conditions are forecast with wind gusts in the 20 to 35 mph range in the extended outlook.

### WEATHER SUMMARY

See *IMET Weather Forecast*

- Partly sunny, mild, and cool with afternoon breezes, with the next in a series of disturbances arriving tonight
- Max. Temps: 50-60°+
- Min. RH: 28-40%
- Winds: Becoming southerly 5-10 mph with gusts 15-20 mph and higher on ridges

## FIRE BEHAVIOR

### GENERAL:

\*Northeast California Energy Release Component is about 61\*

- **Expect very little fire activity.** Some isolated smoldering/creeping may be evident in stumpholes, interior islands, dozer berms and post-burn needlecast.
- **Fuels** are grass, brush and timber - Scott and Burgan fuel models GS2, SH3/4/9, TU1/5 and TL 6/9. *Live and 1000-hour dead fuels are very dry*, estimated at 60-75% and less than 10% respectively.
- **Topography** is widely varied including mountains, hills, drainages, benches, meadows and flats. The elevation range is 4000' to over 8000' in Lassen Park. All aspects are represented and slopes range from 0 to over 80%.

### SPECIFIC FIRE BEHAVIOR:

With recent widespread precipitation, overall, there is very low fire behavior and potential predicted.

**Both Zones:** Only a very few areas of isolated heat with occasional smokes visible but no threats to containment lines are expected.

**Maximum Fire Behavior** (new starts or outside of containment lines). Assumes dry fine fuels and sustained eye-level winds up to 15-20 mph.

- Surface Flame Lengths: Grass 3-6', Brush 5-9', Timber 3-6'
- Surface Rates of Spread: Grass 9-27 chs/hr, Brush 13-40 chs/hr, Timber 5-11 chs/hr
- Spotting Distance: 0.1-0.2 miles
- Probability of Ignition: <40%

## AIR OPERATIONS

- No weather or fire behavior related aviation limitations are anticipated

## SAFETY

- Watch for fire and wind weakened hazard trees along control lines.
- Look-up, Look-down, Look-around... and *Listen*, often you'll hear trees falling before you can see them

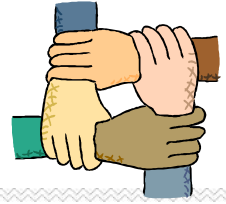

**Step 5:** Deliver Unit Logs, Performance Evaluations and other documentation to the Documentation Unit at the ICP. If you are unable to check-out at the ICP, arrange with your supervisor to deliver your documentation to the Documentation Unit.

**Step 6:** After you have completed the applicable previous Steps, use the QR code to complete the demob process.

## EXTENSIONS AND CREW SWAPS

- Return form to DIVS/Unit Leader or Unit Leader to be routed for other signatures.

**Crew Swaps** – when swapping equipment operators

- Within 2 days of DEMOB (aka, your name appears on Tentative DEMOB list), fill out the “Departing and Arriving Person(s) Section” of the form.
- Submit completed and OSC approved Crew Swap form to Plans/Demob/Check-In at ICP or email to [2021.dixie.ca.west.checkin@firenet.gov](mailto:2021.dixie.ca.west.checkin@firenet.gov).

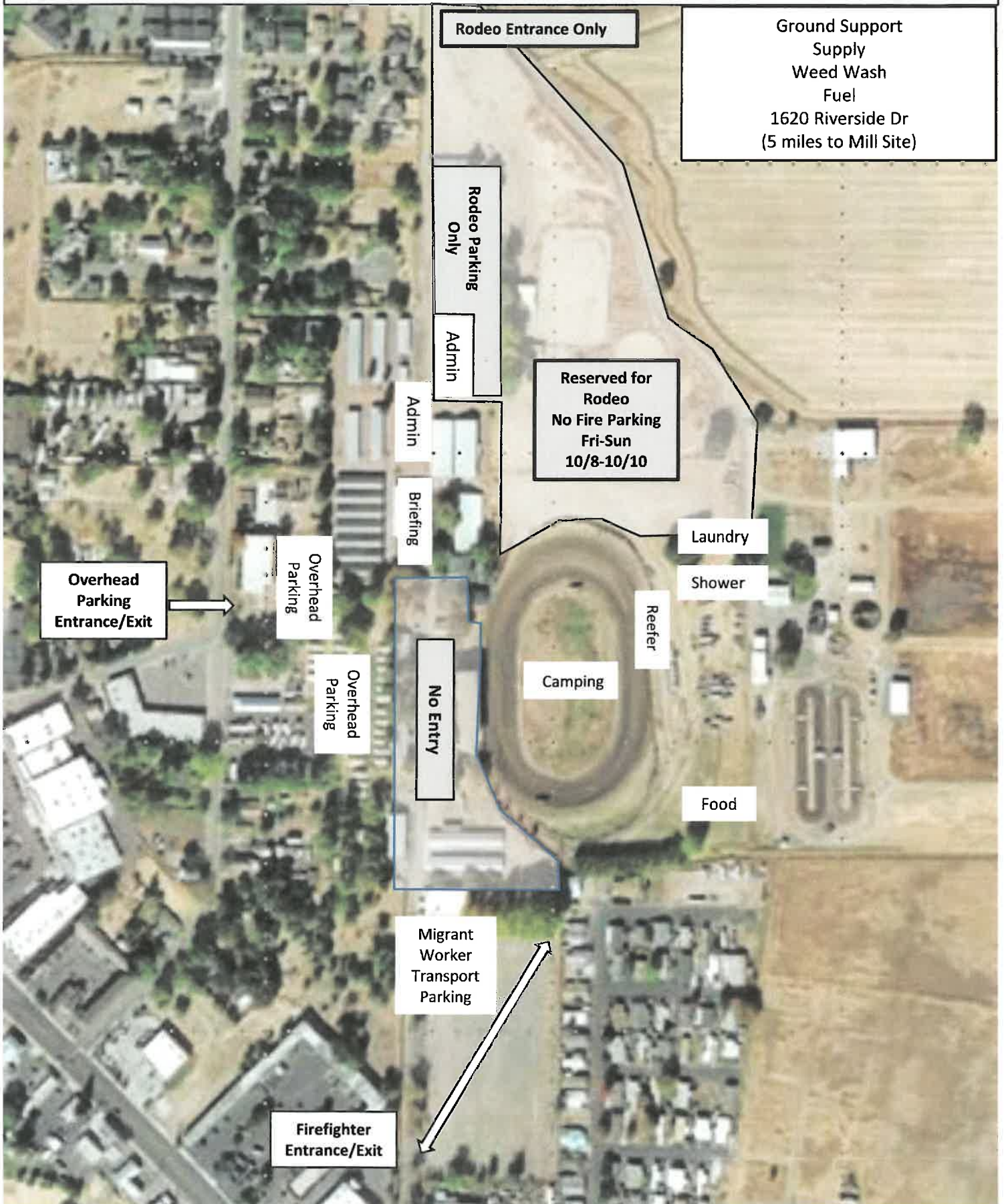
