WEATHER DISCUSSION: The next in a string of autumn storms will be in progress at the beginning of shift, but will also be starting to wind down. Expect rain to become more scattered as the day goes on, and may end entirely on NN/PP and OO/QQ. Rain potential will be highest through the day on WW/XX. Expect total rainfall for the day to vary greatly across the Zone. The easternmost part of the fire can expect closer to 0.10 inches of rain, while the westernmost edge of the zone is likely to see at least half an inch, and may exceed an inch of rain. South winds will likely be strongest in the morning, with sustained winds around 20 mph and peak gusts to around 35 mph. Expect those winds to diminish through the day, but continue to expect gusts at exposed locations to exceed 20 mph.

TODAY: Strong and gusty winds as storm system moves through. Any snow or wintry mix at the very highest elevations will quickly become fully rain by 0900. Rain becomes more scattered in the afternoon and evening, but may not fully come to an end.

High Temperatures: Valley/Drainages: 53-58° Mid-Slope (4500-5500 ft): 47-57° Ridges (> 5500 ft): 44-49°
Minimum Relative Humidity: Valley/Drainages: 65-80% Mid-Slope (4500-5500 ft): 55-70% Ridges (> 5500 ft): 60-75%
General Winds: Valleys and Lower Slopes: South winds around 10-15 mph with gusts 20-25 for most of the day. Only slight weakening in wind speeds towards sunset.
Upper Slopes and Ridges: South winds 15-20 mph gusting to around 35 at sunrise, slowly diminishing through the day to 10-15 mph with gusts to 20 mph by sunset.

Stability: Despite passing storm preventing overnight inversion, it will also keep mixing heights to around 2500 ft AGL.
Chance of Precipitation: 75% LAL: 1 Transport Winds: SW 30-35 mph

TONIGHT: Expect southerly winds to stay up tonight rather than becoming light as they typically do, with gusts at levels more typically seen during the day. Scattered showers will continue around the area overnight.

Low Temperatures: Valley/Drainages: 31-37° Mid-Slope (4500-5500 ft): 35-44° Ridges (>5500 ft): 33-42°
Humidity Recovery: Valley/Drainages: 90-100% Mid-Slope (4500-5500 ft): 90-100% Ridges (> 5500 ft): 75-90%
Winds: Valleys/Drainages: South 5-10 mph with gusts to around 15 mph. Winds slowly increasing from low end of range to high end of range through the night.
Slopes and Ridges: South 10-15 mph with gusts 20-25, gradually strengthening from low end of range to high end through the night.

Stability: Weak nighttime inversion developing after 2300.
Chance of Precipitation: 70% LAL: 1 Transport Winds: S 10-15 mph

THURSDAY: Rain chances will be lower relative to the days preceding and following, but a slight chance of light showers is still possible. Breezy south-southwest winds are expected to continue, but a little lighter than on Wednesday or Friday.

High Temperatures: Valley/Drainages: 57-64° Mid-Slope (4500-5500 ft): 53-62° Ridges (> 5500 ft): 49-55°
Minimum Relative Humidity: Valley/Drainages: 70-85% Mid-Slope (4500-5500 ft): 70-80% Ridges (> 5500 ft): 65-75%
General Winds: Valleys and Lower Slopes: S 5-10 mph with gusts to 15-20. Strongest winds expected mid-day.
Upper Slopes and Ridges: S 10-15 with gusts 20-25 mph.

Stability: Weak inversion dissipating by 0900, but overcast will keep mixing heights below 2000 ft AGL.
Chance of Precipitation: 80% LAL: 1 Transport Winds: S 15-20 mph

Extended Outlook: Expect the train of autumn storms to continue through at least early next week, keeping the potential for gusty winds and precipitation in place. These moisture-laden storms are likely to bring moderate to heavy rain at times, particularly in a window between late Saturday night and Monday when an atmospheric river will pump significant moisture into Northern California. The amount of forecast rainfall has a wide range due to how narrow this atmospheric river is expected to be, but more than an inch or rainfall area-wide is likely, with potential for more.

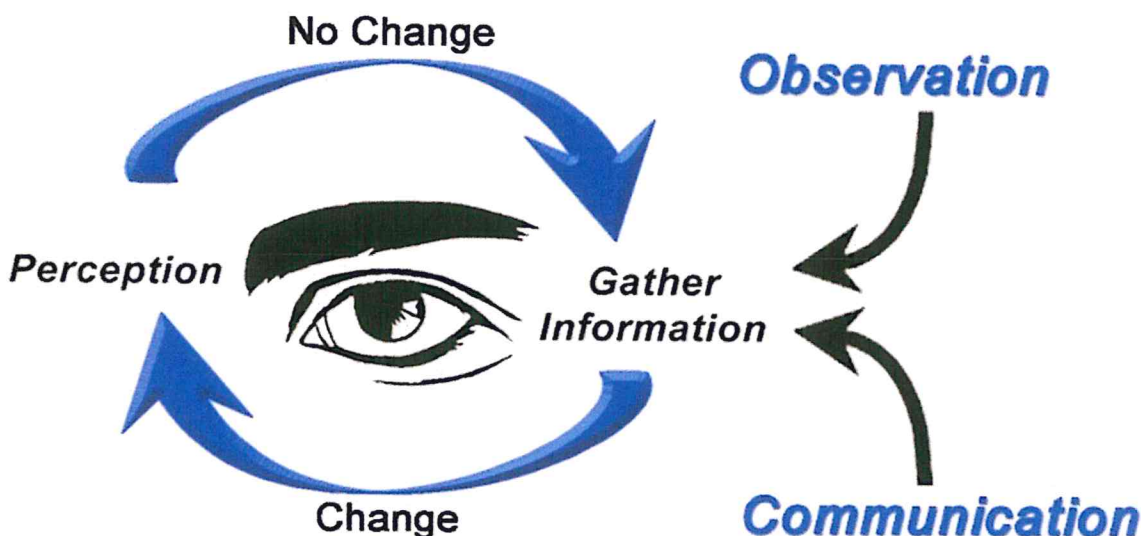

Covid – 19 – Self screen and report symptoms to your supervisor. Practice fireline hygiene, social distancing and wear masks when appropriate.

The cornerstone of good decision making is good situational awareness. Situational awareness is depicted as a cycle because the situation and people's perceptions are constantly changing.

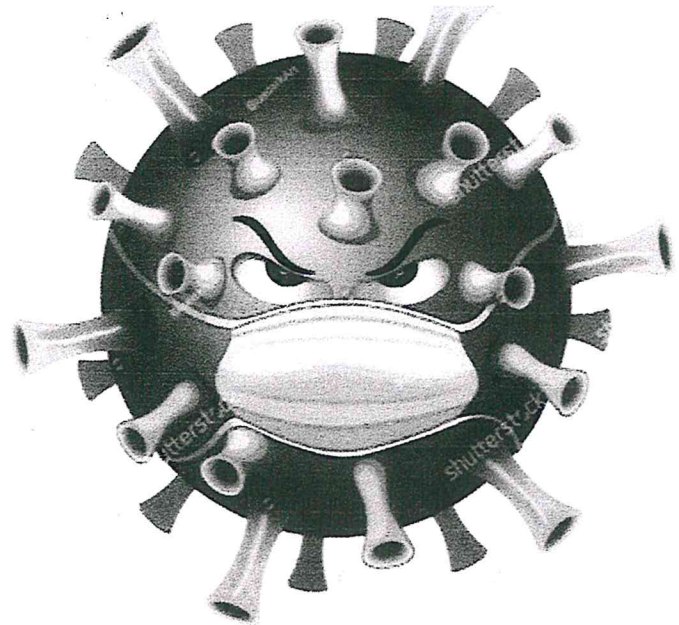

THE LOCAL SITUATION

What's New

Beginning on Monday 10/18, all newly issued resource orders will contain language requiring Covid testing upon arrival and at demobilization.

This may cause some hiccups, but once implemented it will better protect resources assigned to the incident.

In Camp

Past 10 days: Two individuals tested positive for Covid 19. Both were asymptomatic and discovered during demobilization testing.

Don't become complacent. Covid is a risk in camp. Mitigations like masking and social distancing reduce the risk.

In Town: Quincy and the southern region of Plumas County

Positive cases are trending up sharply in southern Plumas County. In a three day period last week, from 10/12 to 10/14, 46 new cases were identified. As of 10/14 there were a total of 116 active cases cases

Plumas County provides updated numbers on Mondays and Thursdays. The next update is expected to reveal a continued rise in cases.

State-wide and Nationally

Generally, with a few exceptions, California and National Covid infection rates are trending downward.

Resource Advisor Message

- Thanks for all your continued good work. Repair is making significant progress. Communication and cooperation have been good.
- Amendment to the suppression repair plan: We are preparing an amendment to the plan to clarify direction on potential operational delineation (POD) lines, hazard trees, seeding, and GIS going forward. We anticipate this will be signed soon and will then share it with you.
- When hazard trees are felled, woody material may be removed to reduce fuel hazard. Options include chipping, piling for later burning, and decking.
- Remember that a line cleared for repair by archaeologists or other resource advisors may still have avoidance areas for archaeology, heritage, or rare species reasons.
- Avoidance areas will be clearly flagged with red/black flagging by the resource advisors.
- Resource advisors do not control or order equipment. We make requests or recommendations through the division supervisors and the chain of command.
- As always, work with the resource advisors if you have questions or concerns. Thanks for your cooperation and teamwork!

Guidance On Safe Transition To Home Unit After Demobilization

The Incident Commander and your IMT leadership offer this informational guidance to refer to concerning safe travel after demobilization from the Dixie East Zone during the COVID-19 pandemic.

Once you leave the incident, you will lose the protective “bubble” you have built up and will be traveling among the public. It is readily evident that social distancing, handwashing, and vaccinations are inconsistent in many communities that you will travel through.

For you to remain free from exposure to COVID-19, you will need to be especially disciplined in continuing these common practices.

The safe practices that have been developed for health and safety remain:

- **Social Distance:** Maintain minimum 6 feet spacing whenever possible. Expose as few team members as possible to public areas like shops and convenience stores whenever possible. Avoid unnecessary face-to-face or close contact with persons outside your module while in transit. Avoid sharing food, utensils, or personal items.
- **Mask:** Wear your mask, especially if you are not vaccinated.
- **Hand Hygiene:** Continue regular hand hygiene. Wash hands for 20-30 seconds with soap and water. You may substitute hand sanitizer as needed. Rub generously into all hand surfaces for 20-30 seconds.
- **Disinfect and Clean Common Spaces:** Clean and disinfect all areas such as door handles (interior and exterior), dashboards, steering wheel, buttons/knobs, and other interior surfaces. Be especially careful of contact with public items, including gas pumps, door handles, restroom surfaces and keypads.
- **Regular Monitoring and Self-Assessment:** Daily self-check using the standard symptom list. Maintain awareness of any change in your health. Immediately discuss with your supervisor should you exhibit symptoms.

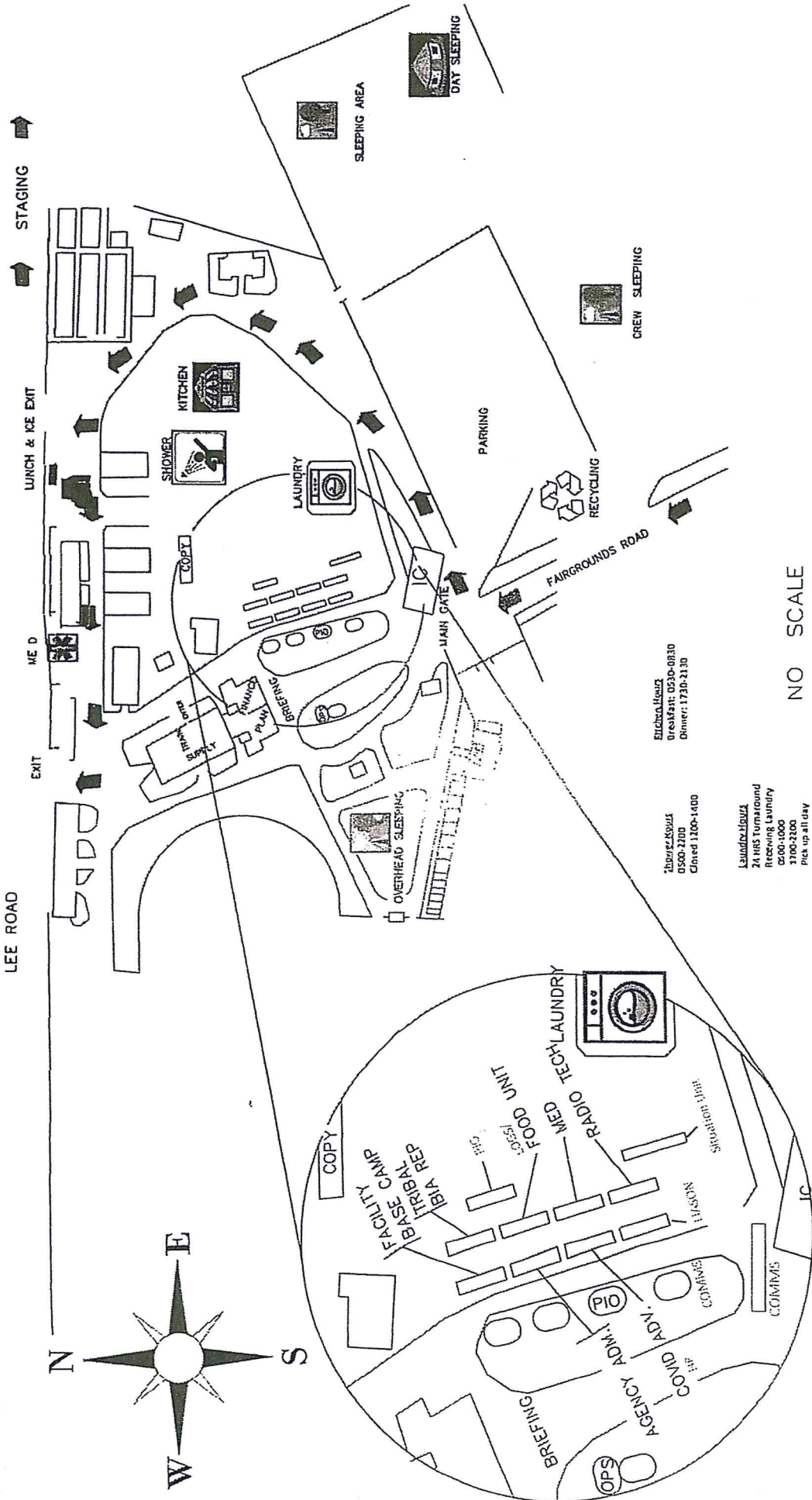
Should you develop symptoms and exhibit distress, seek care immediately. Do not delay care to continue travel to your home unit.

Symptoms to monitor (This list does not include all possible symptoms):

- Headache
- New loss of taste or smell
- Sore throat
- Congestion or runny nose
- Nausea or vomiting
- Diarrhea
- Fever or chills.
- Measured temp 100.4 or greater.
- Cough
- Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
- Fatigue
- Muscle or body aches
