



WEATHER DISCUSSION: Today will be a transition day between one storm that passed through the area Tuesday night into Wednesday, and another that will pass through very late tonight and early Friday morning. Expect this transition weather to be unsettled, but also disorganized, with on and off rain showers and gusty south to southwest winds. Winds will gradually strengthen through the night as the next storm approaches. More organized rain will move through early Friday morning as the front moves through. Some embedded thunderstorms are possible, and these thunderstorm cells could produce enough rain for potential debris flows.

TODAY: Rain chances will be lower relative to the days preceding and following, but a smattering of light showers around the area is still expected. Best chance for rain will likely be on the western portion of WW/XX. South to southwest winds will continue.

High Temperatures: Valley/Drainages: 59-65° Mid-Slope (4500-5500 ft): 54-62° Ridges (> 5500 ft): 51-57°
Minimum Relative Humidity: Valley/Drainages: 70-85% Mid-Slope (4500-5500 ft): 70-80% Ridges (> 5500 ft): 65-75%
General Winds: Valleys and Lower Slopes: S 5-10 with gusts around 20 mph developing in the afternoon.
 Upper Slopes and Ridges: SSW 10-15 with gusts to 25 mph in the morning, strengthening to 15-20 mph with gusts to 35 mph in the late afternoon.

Stability: Weak inversion dissipating by 0900, but overcast will keep mixing heights below 2000 ft AGL.
Chance of Precipitation: 90% (West) – 70% (East) LAL: 1 Transport Winds: S 15-30 mph

TONIGHT: Expect southerly winds to stay up tonight, even increasing towards morning as the next storm moves in. Rain should remain scattered and relatively disorganized until morning. A slightly better chance for rain exists for WW/XX.

Low Temperatures: Valley/Drainages: 34-40° Mid-Slope (4500-5500 ft): 38-45° Ridges (>5500 ft): 35-45°
Humidity Recovery: Valley/Drainages: 90-100% Mid-Slope (4500-5500 ft): 90-100% Ridges (> 5500 ft): 80-95%
Winds: Valleys/Drainages: S 5-10 mph. Gusts to 25 mph developing towards dawn.
 Slopes and Ridges: S around 15 mph. Gusts to 25 in the evening, increasing to 35 mph by dawn.

Stability: No nighttime inversion due to approaching front. Instability along front may support some embedded thunderstorms.
Chance of Precipitation: 80% LAL: 2 Transport Winds: SSW 15-25 mph

FRIDAY: The main body of the next storm arrives early Friday morning. The prime window for rain is between 5 and 8 am along a front moving through. This rain may contain some embedded thunderstorms within it. Any thunderstorms will be able to produce some lightning strikes, strong and erratic winds, and possibly rain rates high enough to cause debris flows.

High Temperatures: Valley/Drainages: 54-60° Mid-Slope (4500-5500 ft): 50-58° Ridges (> 5500 ft): 44-49°
Minimum Relative Humidity: Valley/Drainages: 63-73% Mid-Slope (4500-5500 ft): 60-67% Ridges (> 5500 ft): 60-70%
General Winds: Valleys and Lower Slopes: S 5-10 mph with gusts to 25 early in the morning. Erratic winds during and shortly after frontal passage. SSW 5-10 with gusts 15-25 resuming in the afternoon.
 Upper Slopes and Ridges: SW 15-25, gusts to 35 early. Erratic winds during and shortly after frontal passage in the morning, with SSW 10-15 mph and gusts to 25 resuming for the afternoon.

Stability: Mixing heights peaking in afternoon, 3000-4000 ft AGL.
Chance of Precipitation: 100% LAL: 2 Transport Winds: S 25, diminishing to 10-15 mph in the afternoon.

Extended Outlook: Expect the train of autumn storms to continue into early next week, keeping the potential for gusty winds and precipitation in place almost constantly. Of the next several days, the driest looks to be Saturday, another transition day between storms. The strongest, wettest storm in this string is poised to move across the area in a window between late Saturday night and Monday when an atmospheric river will pump significant moisture into Northern California. The amount of forecast rainfall has a wide range due to how narrow this atmospheric river is expected to be, but more than an inch or rainfall area-wide is likely, with potential for several inches of rain. This storm will also carry a threat of rain rates high enough to cause debris flows.







QR code for submitting weather obs/fire behavior to IMET





QR code for nearby weather observations



THE LOCAL SITUATION

What's New

Beginning on Monday 10/18, all newly issued resource orders will contain language requiring Covid testing upon arrival and at demobilization. This may cause some hiccups, but once implemented it will better protect resources assigned to the incident.

In Camp

Past 10 days: Two individuals tested positive for Covid 19. Both were asymptomatic and discovered during demobilization testing.

Don't become complacent. Covid is a risk in camp. Mitigations like masking and social distancing reduce the risk.

In Town: Quincy and the southern region of Plumas County

Positive cases are trending up sharply in southern Plumas County. In a three day period last week, from 10/12 to 10/14, 46 new cases were identified. As of 10/14 there were a total of 116 active cases cases

Plumas County provides updated numbers on Mondays and Thursdays. The next update is expected to reveal a continued rise in cases.

State-wide and Nationally

Generally, with a few exceptions, California and National Covid infection rates are trending downward.

Guidance On Safe Transition To Home Unit After Demobilization

The Incident Commander and your IMT leadership offer this informational guidance to refer to concerning safe travel after demobilization from the Dixie East Zone during the COVID-19 pandemic.

Once you leave the incident, you will lose the protective “bubble” you have built up and will be traveling among the public. It is readily evident that social distancing, handwashing, and vaccinations are inconsistent in many communities that you will travel through.

For you to remain free from exposure to COVID-19, you will need to be especially disciplined in continuing these common practices.

The safe practices that have been developed for health and safety remain:

- **Social Distance:** Maintain minimum 6 feet spacing whenever possible. Expose as few team members as possible to public areas like shops and convenience stores whenever possible. Avoid unnecessary face-to-face or close contact with persons outside your module while in transit. Avoid sharing food, utensils, or personal items.
- **Mask:** Wear your mask, especially if you are not vaccinated.
- **Hand Hygiene:** Continue regular hand hygiene. Wash hands for 20-30 seconds with soap and water. You may substitute hand sanitizer as needed. Rub generously into all hand surfaces for 20-30 seconds.
- **Disinfect and Clean Common Spaces:** Clean and disinfect all areas such as door handles (interior and exterior), dashboards, steering wheel, buttons/knobs, and other interior surfaces. Be especially careful of contact with public items, including gas pumps, door handles, restroom surfaces and keypads.
- **Regular Monitoring and Self-Assessment:** Daily self-check using the standard symptom list. Maintain awareness of any change in your health. Immediately discuss with your supervisor should you exhibit symptoms.

Should you develop symptoms and exhibit distress, seek care immediately. Do not delay care to continue travel to your home unit.

Symptoms to monitor (This list does not include all possible symptoms):

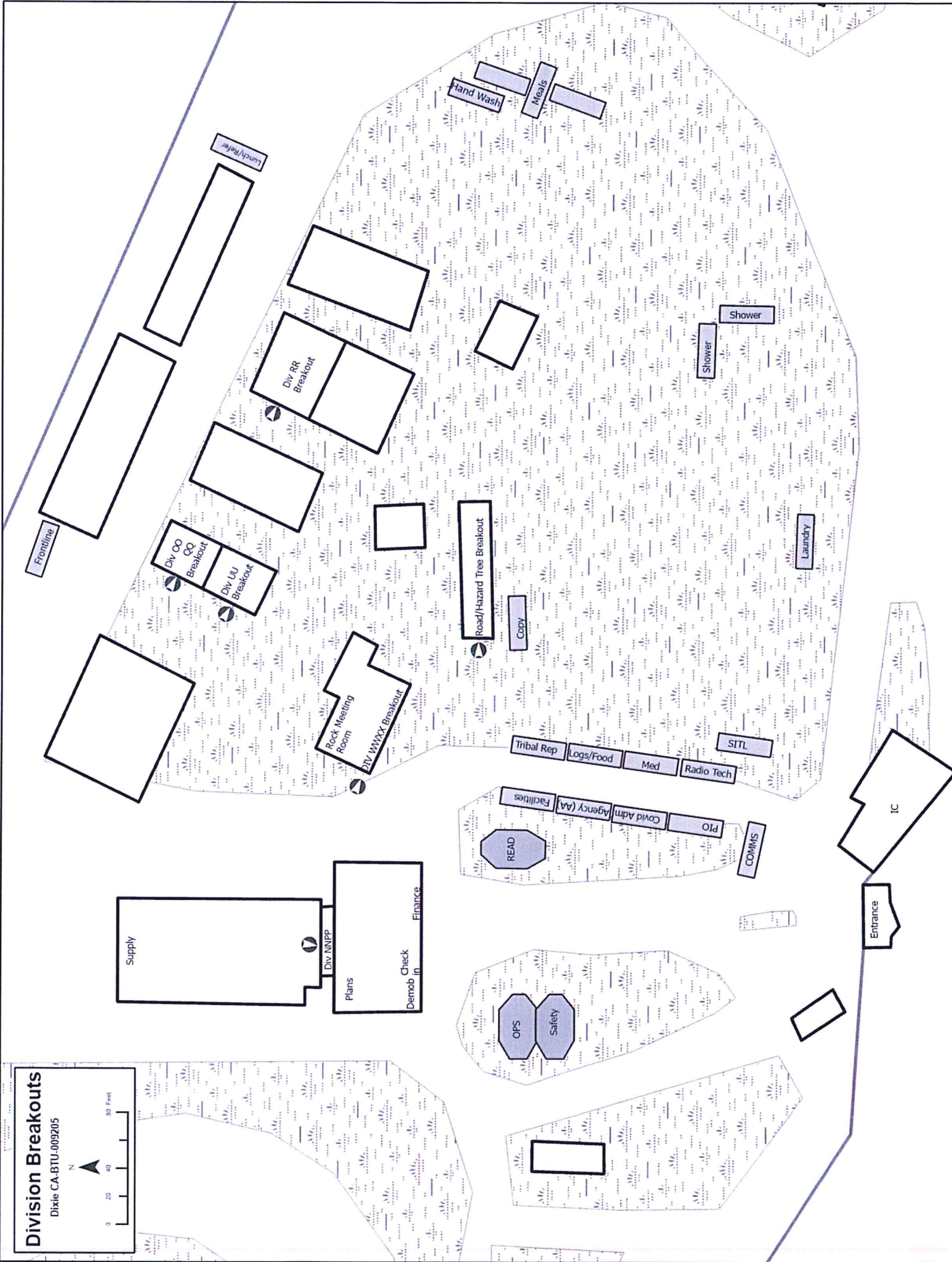
- Headache
- New loss of taste or smell
- Sore throat
- Congestion or runny nose
- Nausea or vomiting
- Diarrhea
- Fever or chills.
- Measured temp 100.4 or greater.
- Cough
- Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
- Fatigue
- Muscle or body aches

LINE "MEDICAL-EMERGENCY" PLAN:

- Crew Supervisor to contact Division Supervisor/Operations with:
 - Patient Complaint, Condition and Location via Tactical or Command frequency. **Priority 1/Red Tag** or **Priority 2/Yellow Tag** trigger Incident within Incident (IWI).
- Division Supervisor/Operations contacts East Zone Communications: If Red Priority Request Emergency Traffic/Clear Channel
 - Division Supervisor or POC* will run "Medical –Emergency" on the Command frequency.
 - Division Supervisor of POC* to use "Medical Incident Report" on back/next page of 206

POC* (Point of Contact) and/or Operations

EMERGENCY DURING OPS. BRIEF 0700-0730:

- If you have an emergency while briefing is going on over the command channel. Wait for a break and transmit your emergency traffic.

LINE "NON-EMERGENCY INCIDENT" PLAN:

- Crew Supervisor to contact Division Supervisor with:
 - Patient Complaint, Condition and Location via Tactical or Command frequency. **Priority 3/Green Tag** Patients only trigger an Incident within Incident (IWI) if they are being transported to a medical facility.
- Division Supervisor contacts East Zone Communications:
 - Division Supervisor or POC* will run "Non-Emergency Incident" on the Command frequency.
 - Division Supervisor or POC* will use "Medical Incident Report" on back/next page of 206

FOR A **NON-EMERGENCY INCIDENT**: WORK THROUGH CHAIN OF COMMAND TO REPORT AND TRANSPORT INJURED PERSONNEL AS NECESSARY.

FOR A **MEDICAL EMERGENCY**: IDENTIFY ON SCENE INCIDENT COMMANDER BY NAME AND POSITION AND ANNOUNCE "MEDICAL EMERGENCY" TO INITIATE RESPONSE FROM COMMUNICATIONS

Use the following items to communicate situation to communications/dispatch.

1. CONTACT COMMUNICATIONS / DISPATCH (Verify correct frequency prior to starting report)

2. INCIDENT STATUS: Provide incident summary (including number of patients) and command structure.
Ex: "Communications, I have a Red priority patient, unconscious, struck by a falling tree.

"This will be the Trout Meadow Medical Incident, IC is TFLD Jones. EMT Smith is providing medical care."
