DISCUSSION: A historic atmospheric river event will bring **extreme rainfall** through Monday. Expect a wide range of rainfall amounts, with the far western end of Dixie East picking up storm-total amounts of 9-13", central sections (e.g. Quincy ICP, Indian Valley) seeing 4-8", and the far eastern end near Honey Lake receiving 2-4". The **risk of debris flows, rock falls, landslides and flash flooding will be extremely high on Sunday FOR ALL AREAS** within and near the burn scar. Wind will be an added concern, with **high potential for downed trees**, particularly in areas impacted by fire. **Lowering snow levels Monday** will result in **several inches of snow** above 6,000 ft, and lighter snow accumulations possible down to 5,500 or even 5,000 ft. Precipitation will decrease Monday afternoon, with a few lingering showers Tuesday before drier weather arrives.



Debris Flow Safety


- Debris flows are fast-moving, often deadly slides consisting of mud, rocks, water and other debris, and are common after fires.
- Bursts of high-intensity rainfall are most likely to trigger debris flows, although these can occur during lower rainfall rates as well.
- Avoid low-lying areas, drainages and creeks during heavy rain, particularly near steep slopes.
- Seek higher ground if a **Flash Flood Warning** is issued for your location, or if you suspect a debris flow is imminent or occurring.

Guidance On Safe Transition To Home Unit

After Demobilization

The Incident Commander and the EAIMT leadership offer this informational guidance to refer to concerning safe travel after demobilization from the Dixie East Zone during the COVID-19 pandemic.

Once you leave the Incident, you will lose the protective “bubble” you have built up and will be traveling among the public. It is readily evident that social distancing, handwashing, and vaccinations are inconsistent in many communities that you will travel through.

For you to remain free from exposure to COVID-19, you will need to be especially disciplined in continuing these common practices. The safe practices that have been developed for health and safety remain:

- **Social Distance:** Maintain minimum of 6 feet spacing whenever possible. Expose as few team members as possible to public areas like shops and convenience stores whenever possible. Avoid unnecessary face-to-face or close contact with persons outside your module while in transit. Avoid sharing food, utensils, or personal items.
- **Mask:** Wear your mask, especially if you are not vaccinated.
- **Hand Hygiene:** Continue regular hand hygiene. Wash hands for 20-30 seconds with soap and water. You may substitute hand sanitizer as needed. Rub generously into all hand surfaces for 20-30 seconds.
- **Disinfect and Clean Common Spaces:** Clean and disinfect all areas such as door handles (interior and exterior), dashboards, steering wheel, buttons/knobs, and other interior surfaces. Be especially careful of contact with public items, including gas pumps, door handles, restroom surfaces and keypads.
- **Regular Monitoring and Self-Assessment:** Daily self-check using the standard symptom list. Maintain awareness of any change in your health. Immediately discuss with your supervisor should you exhibit symptoms.

Should you develop symptoms and exhibit distress, seek care immediately. Do not delay care to continue travel to your home unit.

Symptoms to monitor (This list does not include all possible symptoms):

- Headache
- New Loss of Taste or Smell
- Sore Throat
- Congestion or Runny Nose
- Nausea or Vomiting
- Diarrhea
- Fever or Chills
- Measured Temperature of 100.4 or Greater
- Cough
- Shortness of Breath or Difficulty Breathing
- Fatigue
- Muscle or Body Aches

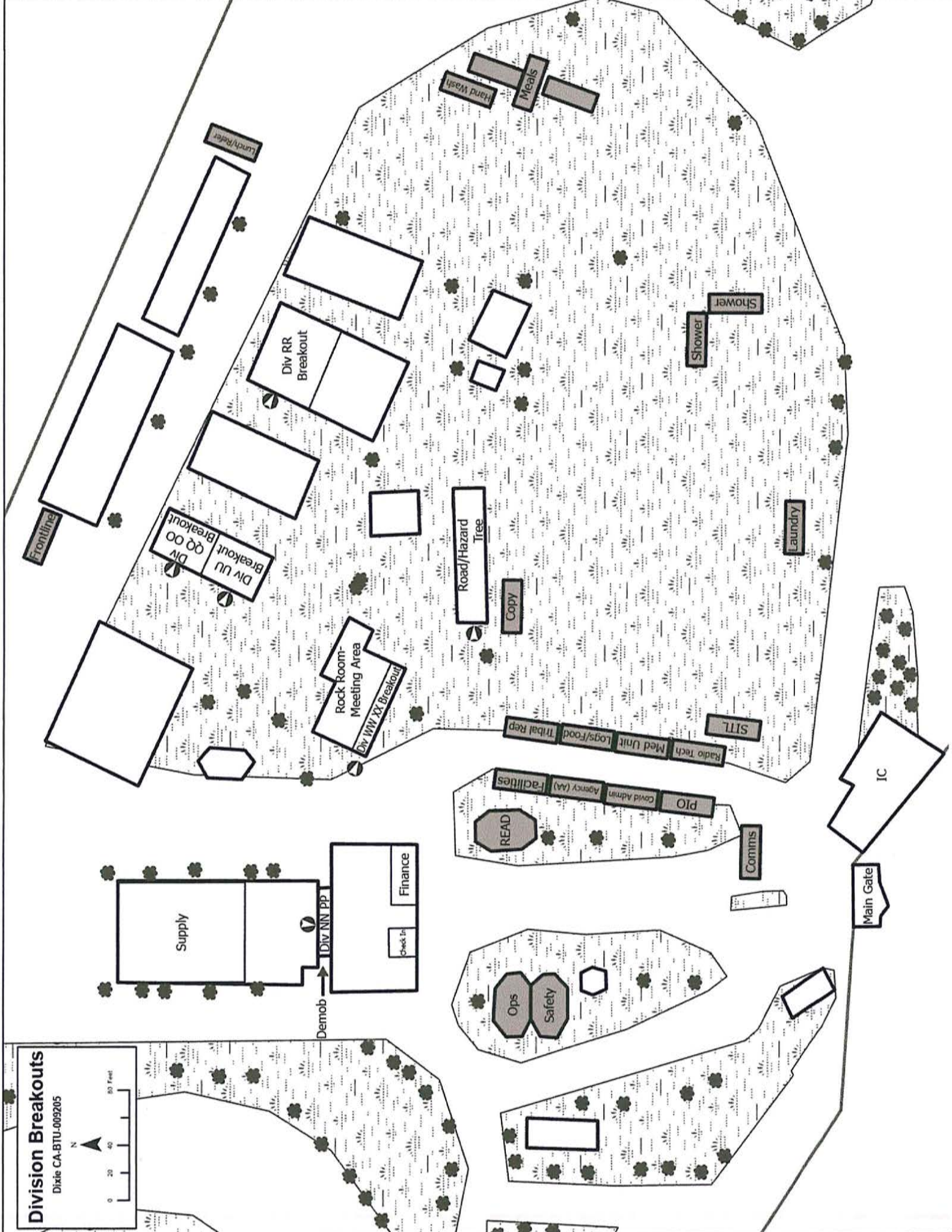
