# Guidance On Safe Transition To Home Unit

## After Demobilization

The Incident Commander and the EAIMT leadership offer this informational guidance to refer to concerning safe travel after demobilization from the Dixie East Zone during the COVID-19 pandemic.

Once you leave the Incident, you will lose the protective “bubble” you have built up and will be traveling among the public. It is readily evident that social distancing, handwashing, and vaccinations are inconsistent in many communities that you will travel through.

For you to remain free from exposure to COVID-19, you will need to be especially disciplined in continuing these common practices. The safe practices that have been developed for health and safety remain:

- **Social Distance:** Maintain minimum of 6 feet spacing whenever possible. Expose as few team members as possible to public areas like shops and convenience stores whenever possible. Avoid unnecessary face-to-face or close contact with persons outside your module while in transit. Avoid sharing food, utensils, or personal items.
- **Mask:** Wear your mask, especially if you are not vaccinated.
- **Hand Hygiene:** Continue regular hand hygiene. Wash hands for 20-30 seconds with soap and water. You may substitute hand sanitizer as needed. Rub generously into all hand surfaces for 20-30 seconds.
- **Disinfect and Clean Common Spaces:** Clean and disinfect all areas such as door handles (interior and exterior), dashboards, steering wheel, buttons/knobs, and other interior surfaces. Be especially careful of contact with public items, including gas pumps, door handles, restroom surfaces and keypads.
- **Regular Monitoring and Self-Assessment:** Daily self-check using the standard symptom list. Maintain awareness of any change in your health. Immediately discuss with your supervisor should you exhibit symptoms.

Should you develop symptoms and exhibit distress, seek care immediately. Do not delay care to continue travel to your home unit.

Symptoms to monitor (This list does not include all possible symptoms):

- Headache
- New Loss of Taste or Smell
- Sore Throat
- Congestion or Runny Nose
- Nausea or Vomiting
- Diarrhea
- Fever or Chills
- Measured Temperature of 100.4 or Greater
- Cough
- Shortness of Breath or Difficulty Breathing
- Fatigue
- Muscle or Body Aches

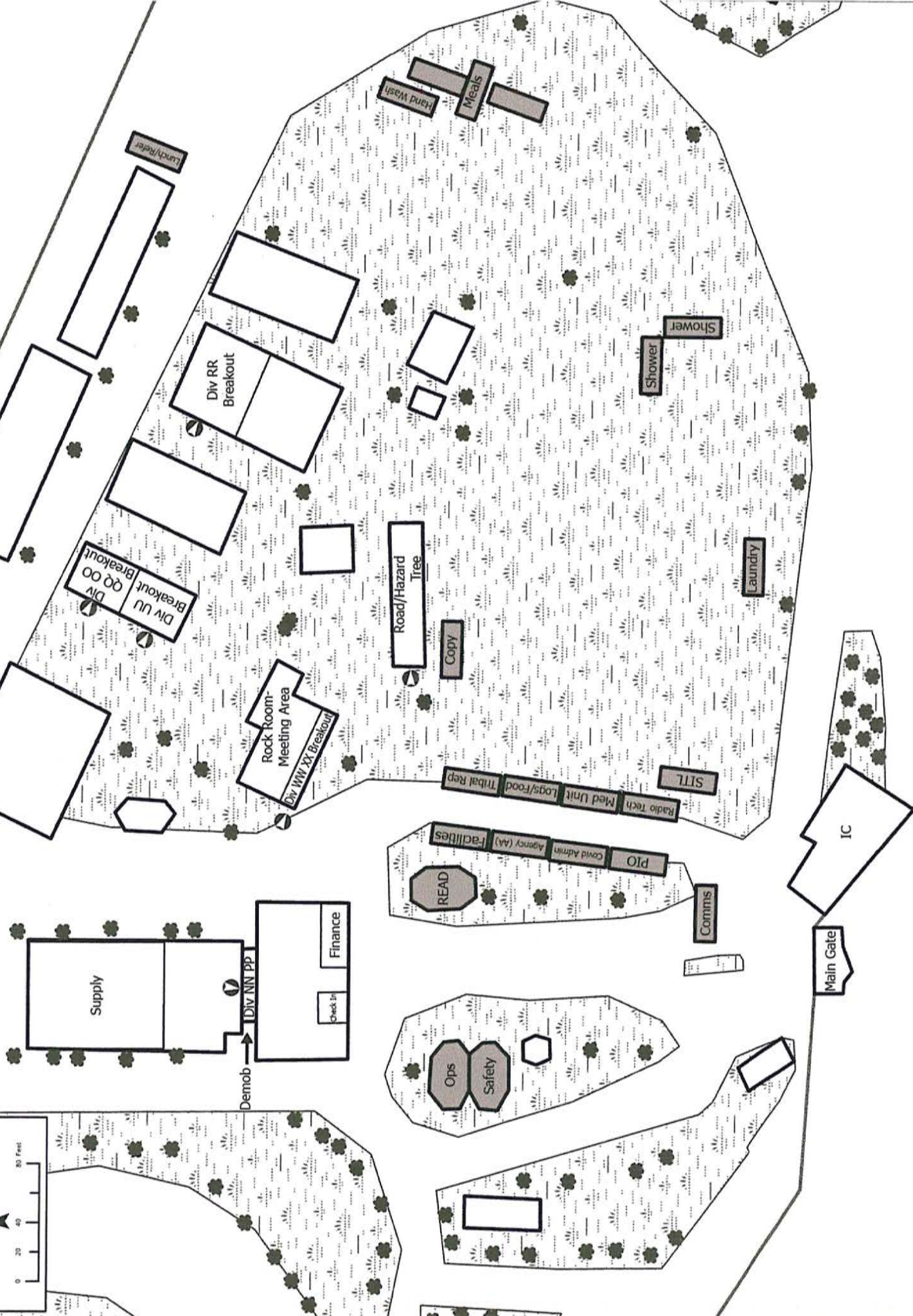
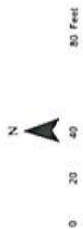

**LINE "MEDICAL-EMERGENCY" PLAN:**

- Crew Supervisor to contact Division Supervisor/Operations with:
  - Patient Complaint, Condition and Location via Tactical or Command frequency. **Priority 1/Red Tag** or **Priority 2/Yellow Tag** trigger Incident within Incident (IWI).
- Division Supervisor/Operations contacts East Zone Communications: If Red Priority Request Emergency Traffic/Clear Channel
  - Division Supervisor or POC\* will run "Medical -Emergency" on the Command frequency.
  - Division Supervisor of POC\* to use "Medical Incident Report" on back/next page of 206

POC\* (Point of Contact) and/or Operations

**EMERGENCY DURING OPS. BRIEF 0700-0730:**

- If you have an emergency while briefing is going on over the command channel. Wait for a break and transmit your emergency traffic.

**LINE "NON-EMERGENCY INCIDENT" PLAN:**

- Crew Supervisor to contact Division Supervisor with:
  - Patient Complaint, Condition and Location via Tactical or Command frequency. **Priority 3/Green Tag** Patients only trigger an Incident within Incident (IWI) if they are being transported to a medical facility.
- Division Supervisor contacts East Zone Communications:
  - Division Supervisor or POC\* will run "Non-Emergency Incident" on the Command frequency.
  - Division Supervisor or POC\* will use "Medical Incident Report" on back/next page of 206

Medical Incident Report

FOR A **NON-EMERGENCY INCIDENT**: WORK THROUGH CHAIN OF COMMAND TO REPORT AND TRANSPORT INJURED PERSONNEL AS NECESSARY.

FOR A **MEDICAL EMERGENCY**: IDENTIFY ON SCENE INCIDENT COMMANDER BY NAME AND POSITION AND ANNOUNCE **"MEDICAL EMERGENCY"** TO INITIATE RESPONSE FROM COMMUNICATIONS

Use the following items to communicate situation to communications/dispatch.

1. **CONTACT COMMUNICATIONS / DISPATCH** (Verify correct frequency prior to starting report)  
Ex: "Communications, Div. Alpha. Stand-by for Emergency Traffic."

2. **INCIDENT STATUS**: Provide incident summary (including number of patients) and command structure.  
Ex: "Communications, I have a Red priority patient, unconscious, struck by a falling tree. Requesting air ambulance to Forest Road 1 at (Lat./Long.)  
"This will be the Trout Meadow Medical Incident, IC is TFLD Jones. EMT Smith is providing medical care."

Severity of Emergency AND Transport Priority (priority 1, 2, 3)	<input type="checkbox"/> <b>RED / PRIORITY 1 Life or limb threatening injury or illness. Evacuation need is IMMEDIATE</b> Ex: Unconscious, difficulty breathing, bleeding severely, 2° – 3° burns more than 4 palm sizes, heat stroke, disoriented.  <input type="checkbox"/> <b>YELLOW / PRIORITY 2 Serious Injury or illness.
