**WEATHER DISCUSSION:** High pressure begins to take hold today, making for fair weather and warming temperatures. Weather clears completely with winds becoming light in the afternoon. This trend continues for the rest of the week.

**TODAY:** Partly cloudy. Light west-northwest winds will begin to have some terrain influence. An isolated shower or two is possible in the morning.

**High Temperatures:** Valley/Drainages: 50-60° Mid-Slope (4500-5500 FT): 48-58° Ridges (> 5500 FT): 45-56°  
**Minimum Relative Humidity:** Valley/Drainages: >65% Mid-Slope (4500-5500 FT): >65% Ridges (> 5500 FT): >65%

**DIV S/U:** WNW winds 4-8 gusting to 15 mph. Variable terrain-driven winds possible in the afternoon.

## Fire Order of the Day:

Keep informed on weather, forecasts and ground conditions.

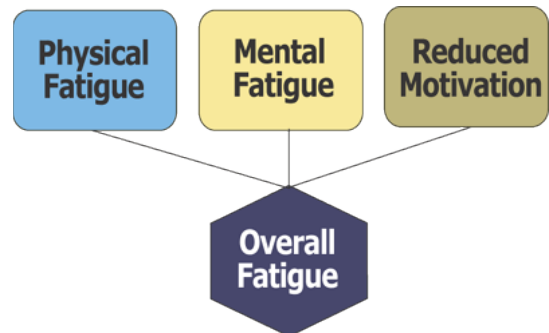
- Inform assigned resources of changes in weather and ground conditions.
- Be clear and specific.
- Don't assume they know of changes in conditions.

## Hazard Trees

- Follow "Hazard Tree Safety" guidelines IRPG page 22
- Monitor weather and ground conditions.
- Don't take breaks in high concentrations of hazard trees
- Know where your assigned resources are working – clear of hazard tree locations.
- Remember the hazard zone is 2 ½ times the tree height
- Use qualified fallers to mitigate snags



## Fatigue Management



- Fatigue management goes beyond counting hours on timesheets, it is individualized and overt.
- Cumulative fatigue is dangerous. It prevents sound decision-making, confounds situational awareness, and dulls reaction times. It is as problematic in the office as it is on the fireline.
- Becoming **cold** and **wet** does add to fatigue. Wear warm clothing and take necessary precautions to stay as dry as possible.
- Cumulative fatigue is manifest in the explanations used when folks are asked to take a break, or take a day off... "I don't have time." "There is too much going on." "As soon as things calm down a bit."

## VIRTUAL DEMOB PROCESS will be virtual for all resources.



**Step 1:** Feds and Fed contractors are to obtain a COVID-19 test within 72hrs prior to DEMOB.

**Step 2:** Return all accountable property (i.e., radios, supplies, etc.) to the COMS Unit and/or SUPPLY at Hat Creek or ICP.

**Step 3:** ALL NON-LOCAL VEHICLES that have been off pavement must go through WEED WASH at: 1620 Riverside Dr. Susanville, CA prior to demobilizing.

**Step 4:** Finalize all CTRs and Shift Tickets and complete any other required Finance demobilization item(s). For **FINANCE** questions: call **279-203-4435** or email **2021.dixie.ca.west.finance@firenet.gov**.

**Step 5:** Deliver Unit Logs, Performance Evaluations and other documentation to the Documentation Unit at the ICP. If you are unable to check-out at the ICP, arrange with your supervisor to deliver your documentation to the Documentation Unit.

**Step 6:** After you have completed the applicable previous Steps, use the QR code to complete the demob process.

The Demobilization Unit will not demobilize you from the incident until it has received completed virtual Demobilization Form. For DEMOB questions, email [2021.dixie.ca.west.demob@firenet.gov](mailto:2021.dixie.ca.west.demob@firenet.gov) or call 279-203-4451.

## EXTENSIONS AND CREW SWAPS

**Extensions** – when Equipment and Overhead personnel are assigned longer than 14 consecutive days

- Your DIVS/Unit Leader will ask if you want to extend
- Obtain an “Extension Request Form” and fill out section A and C (be specific on number of days to be extended, first working dates, R&R dates,...., etc.)
- Have your DIVS/Unit Leader sign section B (incident supervisor) and Approved by #2 , then have your home unit supervisor sign Section D. (if your supervisor isn’t available to sign, an email is acceptable).
- Return form to DIVS/Unit Leader or Unit Leader to be routed for other signatures.

**Crew Swaps** – when swapping equipment operators

- Within 2 days of DEMOB (aka, your name appears on Tentative DEMOB list), fill out the “Departing and Arriving Person(s) Section” of the form.
- Submit completed and OSC approved Crew Swap form to Plans/Demob/Check-In at ICP or email to [2021.dixie.ca.west.checkin@firenet.gov](mailto:2021.dixie.ca.west.checkin@firenet.gov).

**Incoming/relief personnel will NEED TO HAVE A COVID-19 TEST prior to going to the line.** (see COVID-19 testing page)

**The PLANS/DEMOB/CHECKIN trailer will be staffed from 0630-1030 daily.**
