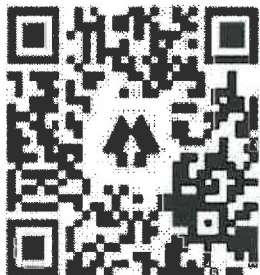

Implement and/or account for the repair of fire suppression-related activities as specified in the Dixie Fire Suppression Repair plan 3. Identify and communicate hazards and conduct actions only when risks have been mitigated to acceptable level. 4. Maintain an elevated awareness of current COVID-19 precautions and best infectious disease control measures to ensure the health of fire personnel and the public. 5. Provide safe and efficient initial attack within the current fire area or when requested by the local units. 6. Provide timely and accurate information to the public, stakeholders, cooperators and the adjacent incident management teams (East & West zones) about fire status, fire management strategies and tactics, repair efforts, and any potential fire-related safety and health concerns. 7. Driving Home

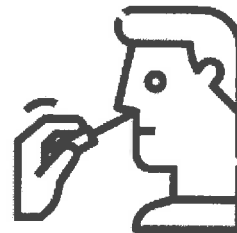
- Get at least 8 hours rest before beginning travel.

COVID-19 EXPOSURE NOTIFICATION PLAN

Scenario 1: Individual exhibits signs symptoms of covid. Supervisor uses chain of command to notify appropriate Command and General (C&G) staff member. C&G staff member informs Safety Officer and/or Incident Covid Advisor of situation. Safety informs Incident Commander of possible case(s). Incident Commander (IC) advises Agency Administrator as outlined in Delegation of Authority.

Scenario 2: Individual tests positive for Covid: Incident Covid Advisor (or Incident Safety officer) informs Forest Covid Advisor and Incident Commander of a positive case. Incident Commander advises Agency Administrator of positive case(s) as outlined in the Delegation of Authority.

Scenario 3: Individual(s) has been exposed to another individual who has tested positive with Covid. Incident Covid Advisor (or Incident Safety officer) assists exposed individual in arranging covid testing. Safety Officer informs Forest Covid Advisor and Incident Commander of situation. Incident Commander informs Agency Administrator as outlined in Delegation of Authority.

In all scenarios the Incident Safety Officer will keep the following Command and General Staff members informed of the situation. Finance Section Chief, Planning Section Chief, Logistics Section Chief.

In all scenarios follow protocols established in R5 REGION 5 Pacific Southwest Region COVID-19 Response Action Process v3 (August 18, 2021)

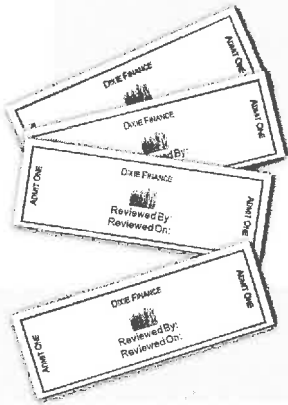
HOTEL, CAMPGROUND, and ALTERNATIVE LODGING (Rental) RECEIPTS:

Please provide a copy of your **zero balance** lodging receipts to FINANCE when you receive them. Interim receipts can be added to the final invoice to reduce the waiting time on your demob day.

Remember, you do not need to submit food receipts.

Per diem is added automatically to contractor invoices when shift tickets are recorded for payment.

IF YOU ARE ON THE DEMOB LIST, COME TO FINANCE TO PREVIEW YOUR SHIFT TICKETS, CONTRACT, and DOCUMENTATION BEFORE YOUR DEMOB DATE.



When we audit your finance package, you will be issued a ticket to allow you to be among the first to be demobed.

RETURN ALL ACCOUNTABLE PROPERTY (i.e. radios, supplies, etc.) to COMMS and SUPPLIES UNITS before going to Finance to finalize your time.

AFTER YOU FINALIZE ALL CTRs and Shift Tickets deliver Unit Logs, Performance Evaluations and other documentation to the Demob Unit at ICP or arrange with your supervisor to deliver your documentation to Demob.

AFTER YOU RETURN EVERYTHING AND GET YOUR FINAL INVOICE, scan the QR code to complete the demob process.
