

WEATHER DISCUSSION: Isolated high based thunderstorms are possible early this morning. While storm coverage and lightning amounts are expected to be sparse, these early storms also may be on the drier side. Isolated to widely scattered thunderstorm chances will return in the afternoon and evening with storms becoming wetter as the day progresses. While the bulk of these storms are expected to remain to the east of the fire area, strong outflow winds potentially gusting as high as 40 to 50 mph may have the potential to channel through steep valley towards the fire area. Away from thunderstorm influences, the typical breezy up canyon afternoon SW winds and nighttime NE reversal pattern will continue.

MONDAY: *** Strong Outflow winds possible from Thunderstorms ***

WEATHER: Partly cloudy with isolated high based thunderstorms possible early. Cumulus build ups will develop over the mountains midday with isolated to widely scattered thunderstorms forming in the afternoon but mainly staying east of the fire area. Early storms may contain only light amounts of rain but will moisten through the day.

MAXIMUM TEMPERATURE: Highs in the mid 90s 2000 ft, mid 80s 4000 ft and mid 70s 6000 ft.

MINIMUM RELATIVE HUMIDITY: 15-18%.

20 FOOT WINDS:

Feather River Valley Corridor - NE down-canyon winds 10-15 mph with localized gusts 20-25 mph early diminishing between 0900 & 1000. Up-slope SE and up-canyon SW winds 4-8 mph developing late morning then becoming predominately S to SW and increasing to 10-15 mph with gusts 20-25 in the afternoon.

North and West Portions of the Fire – Lighter NE winds early becoming up-slope 3-5 mph mid-morning. S to SW winds 8-10 mph developing late morning with afternoon gusts 15-20 mph along exposed ridges.

STABILITY: Valley inversions lifting around 1000. Unstable in the afternoon with continued pyro-cumulus development possible above the smoke column.

CHANCE OF RAIN: 15% **LAL:** 2 **SMOKE TRANSPORT WIND:** Becoming SW 15-20 mph in the afternoon.

MONDAY NIGHT:

WEATHER: Isolated thunderstorms possible in the evening and then becoming mostly clear.

MINIMUM TEMPERATURE: Lows in the 60s.

MAXIMUM RELATIVE HUMIDITY: 30-35%.

20 FOOT WINDS: SW winds 10-15 mph in the evening, diminishing after sunset. Winds becoming NE around 2200 and increasing to 10-15 mph around 0100 with localized gusts 20-25 mph through the Feather River Corridor developing during the early morning hours.

STABILITY: Smoke pooling in valley inversions and moving down the Feather River Valley.

CHANCE OF RAIN: 10% **LAL:** 2 in the evening...then 1.

SMOKE TRANSPORT WIND: SW 10 to 15 mph in the evening becoming down valley after midnight.

TUESDAY: Temperatures will cool a couple of degrees on Tue though still remain warmer than seasonal normals with afternoon highs ranging from the low 90s at 2000 ft to lower 70s along 6000+ ft ridges with Min RHs in the mid teens. Overnight lows will fall into the 60s with RH recoveries around 30%. SW winds 15-25 mph will develop in the afternoon and shift to NE down canyon winds 10-15 mph at night locally gusting up to 25 mph.

OUTLOOK FOR WEDNESDAY THROUGH FRIDAY: Drier SW flow will persist for Wed through Fri with RHs falling through the end of the week. Afternoon Min RHs will fall into the low teens and upper single digits with night RH recoveries gradually worsening as well. Breezy SW up-canyon winds will be enhanced during the afternoons flipping to overnight down canyon NE winds each night.

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

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

Thunderstorm/Lightning:

Keep alert on the current local forecasts. Reference page 21 in the IRPG. Follow the 30/30 rule. If you see lightning and hear thunder within 30 seconds, seek shelter. Do not resume work until 30 minutes has passed.

Extreme Fire Behavior:

Expect intense fire runs. Take weather regularly. Maintain situational awareness specific to wind direction changes and increased fire spread.

Entrapment Avoidance:

Adhere to the 10 Standard Firefighting orders. Consider the 18 Situations that Shout Watch Out. Consider the Common Denominators of Fire Behavior on Tragedy Fires. Maintain LCES. Establish your decision point(s). Conduct risk management.

Safety Zones/TRA:

Locations where the threatened firefighter may find refuge from the danger. Safety zones should be conceptualized and planned as a location where no shelter is needed. Utilize temporary refuge areas when appropriate.

Fatigue – Physical and Mental:

Continually monitor your crew. Hydrate and increase your caloric intake when performing arduous work during long shifts. Monitor work / rest cycle.

Driving:

Steep, narrow or dusty roads throughout fire area. Maintain safe following distances and appropriate speed when traversing roads. Flag unstable roads and other hazards that may be encountered while driving. Follow posted speed limits while driving in base camp. Drive with your vehicle headlights on. Pay special attention while driving through the fire area on Highway 70. There are several areas where rocks have fallen on the roadway and one lane closures maybe in effect. Limit your exposure time while in the Highway 70 fire area.

Rail Roads:

Major train tracks are in the fire area. Assume ALL tracks are active. Do not walk on or near the train tracks. Keep a safe distance from any active trains.

THUNDERSTORM & LIGHTNING SAFETY

REMEMBER!

If you can hear thunder or see lightning (the actual strike vs “heat lightning” described below), you are close enough to the storm to be struck by lightning.

Heat lightning is lightning from a thunderstorm too far away for the thunder to be heard. However, the storm may be moving in your direction.

- **Maintain Situational Awareness** at all times and post **Lookouts** as needed to observe thunder cells.
- Approaching thunder cells will affect wind speed and direction.
- Keep the **“30/30 Rule”** in mind. If you see lightning and hear thunder within 30 seconds, seek shelter and/or follow the established **Safety/Disengagement Plan**.
- Take shelter inside vehicles or buildings.
- If caught outdoors, find a low spot and assume a crouched position, limiting contact with the ground.
- Avoid tall trees, wire fences, utility poles, etc.
- Do not stay on ridgetops, wide open areas, near ledges or rock outcroppings.
- Do not group together.
- Handheld radios and cellular telephones can be used.
- Do not use land line telephones, machinery, or electric motors.
- Remain in a safe environment for at least 30 minutes after the thunder cell has passed.

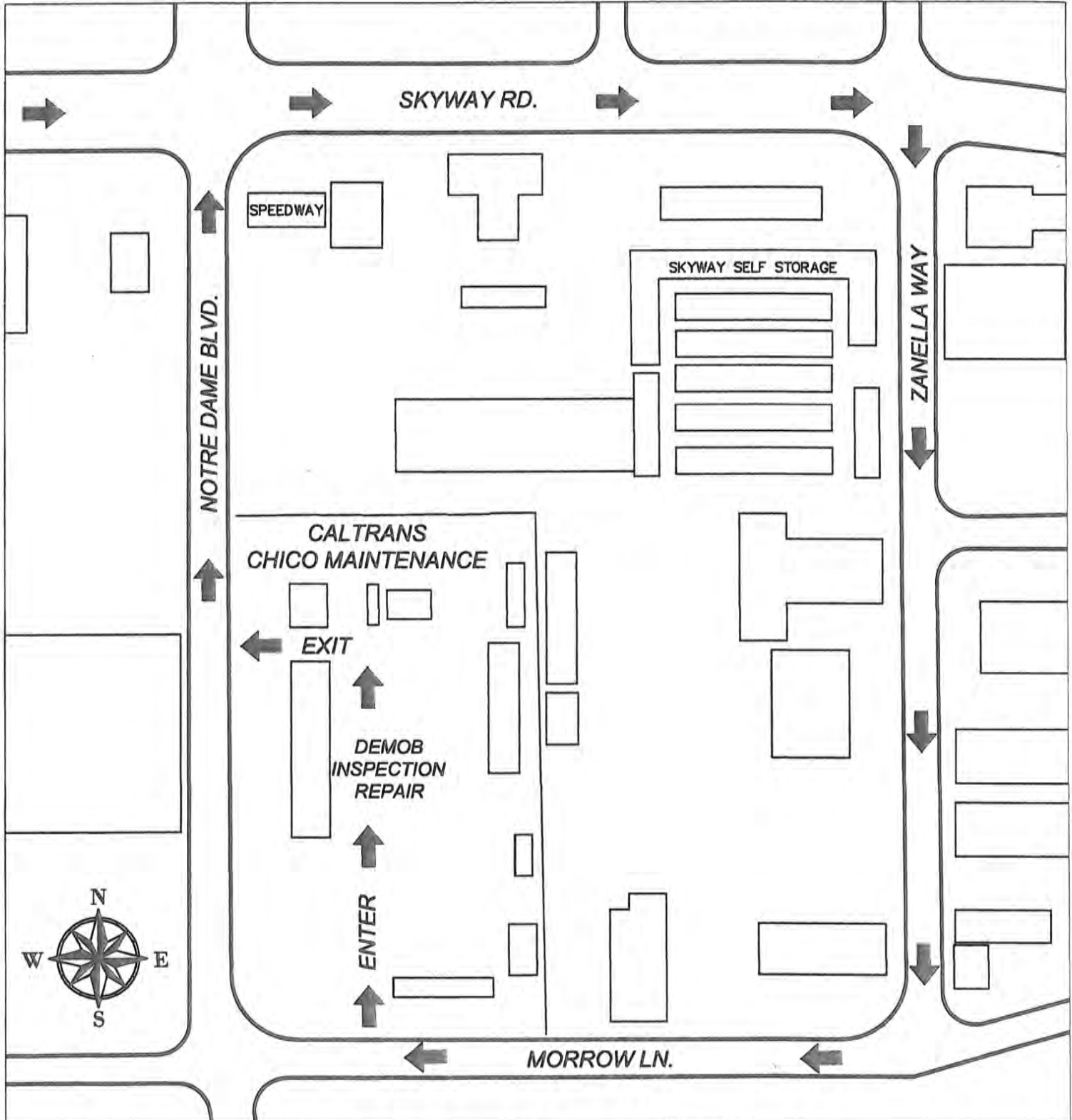

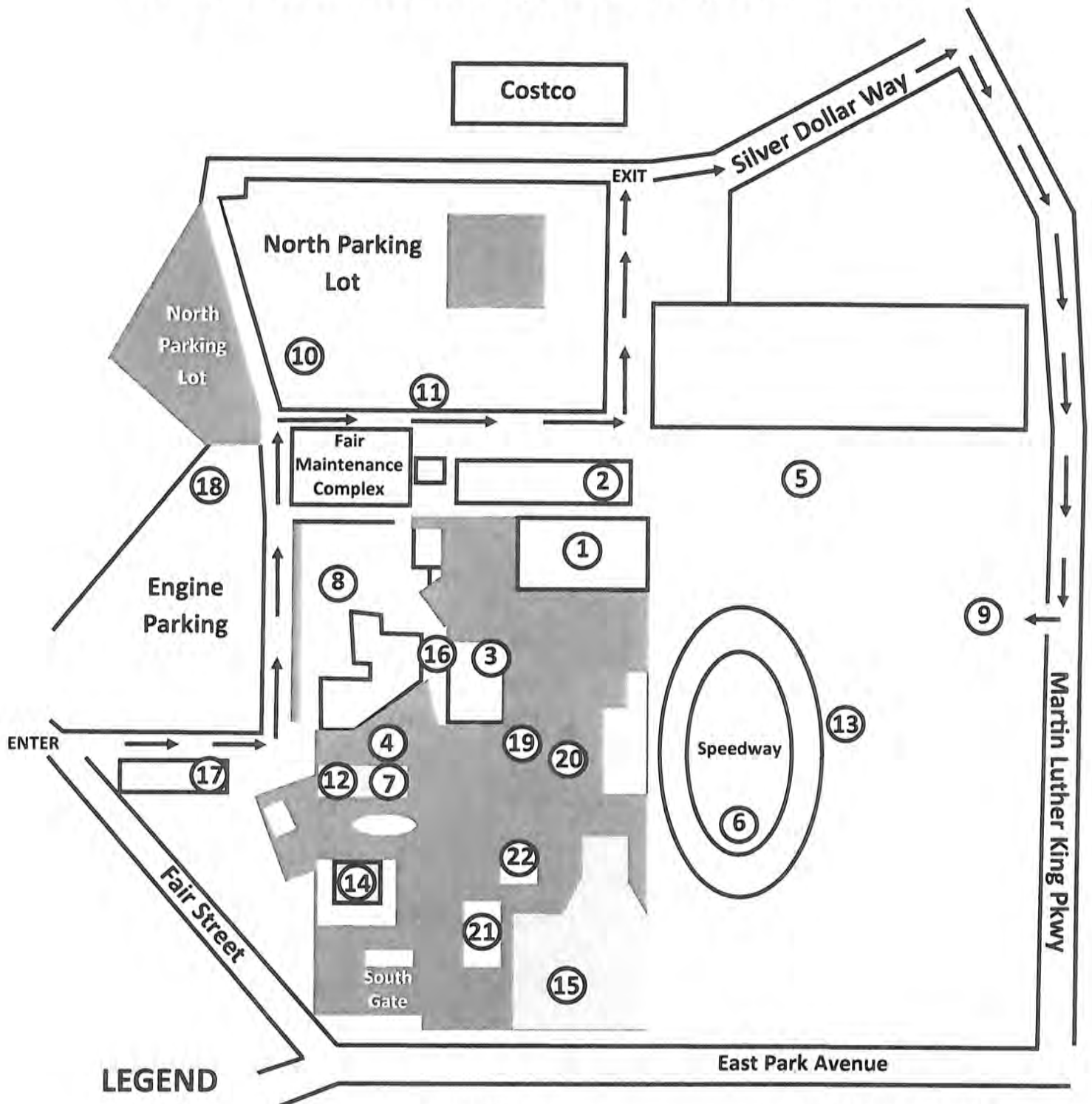
