

WEATHER DISCUSSION: A drier SW flow pattern will continue over the fire area through the week with lowering afternoon RHs and worsening overnight recoveries. Temperatures will remain a few degrees above seasonal normal through Thu and then warm further Fri and Sat. The southwesterly afternoon and evening portion of the typical up and down canyon wind pattern will be a bit breezier than normal today and Thu with Fri and Sat favoring the nighttime NE winds. While inversions will form each night with smoke settling in valleys, ridges will remain warmer and drier with thermal belt effects strengthening.

WEDNESDAY:

WEATHER: Warm, dry, breezy and unstable in the afternoon.

MAXIMUM TEMPERATURE: Highs in the mid 90s 2000 ft, mid 80s 4000 ft and mid 70s 6000 ft.

MINIMUM RELATIVE HUMIDITY: 8-11% lower elevations to 12-15% ridges & in the High Lakes area (Branch X)

20 FOOT WINDS:

Feather River Valley Corridor - NE down-canyon winds 10-15 mph with localized gusts 20-25 mph early diminishing between 0900 & 1000. Up-slope SE and up-canyon SW winds 4-8 mph developing late morning then becoming predominately S to SW and increasing to 14-18 mph with gusts to 25 mph in the afternoon.

W & NW Portions of the Fire – Lighter NE winds early becoming up-slope 3-5 mph mid-morning. S to SW winds 8-11 mph developing late morning with afternoon gusts 15-20 mph along exposed ridges.

DIV R, S & U – Winds in the tributary valleys of divisions R, S & U will follow their own daily patterns with up-slope winds developing mid to late morning and up-valley SE to E winds in Chips Creek, S winds in Yellow Creek & SE to S winds increasing to 5 to 7 mph in the afternoon with gusts to 15 mph. These areas and the portion of the Feather River Valley near Belden will continue to see swirly and battling winds.

STABILITY: Valley inversions lifting around 1100. Becoming unstable in the afternoon.

CHANCE OF RAIN: 0% **LAL:** 1 **SMOKE TRANSPORT WIND:** SW 20-25 mph in the afternoon.

WEDNESDAY NIGHT:

WEATHER: Clear and locally breezy.

MINIMUM TEMPERATURE: Lows in the mid to upper 60s

MAXIMUM RELATIVE HUMIDITY: 20 to 25%.

20 FOOT WINDS: SW winds 10-15 mph in the evening, diminishing after sunset. Winds becoming NE around 2200 and increasing to 10-15 mph around 0100 with localized gusts to 25 mph through the Feather River Corridor developing during the early morning hours.

STABILITY: Smoke pooling in valley inversions and moving down the Feather River Valley.



CHANCE OF RAIN: 0% **LAL:** 1 **SMOKE TRANSPORT WIND:** SW 10 to 15 mph in the evening becoming NE down valley after midnight.

THURSDAY: Continued warm, dry, sunny and unstable. Afternoon highs ranging from the mid 90s at 2000 ft to mid 70s along 6000+ ft ridges with Min RHs 8 to 11%. Overnight lows will fall into the upper 60s with RH recoveries 20-25%. SW winds 15-25 mph will develop in the afternoon and shift to NE down canyon winds 10-15 mph at night locally gusting up to 25 mph.

OUTLOOK FOR FRIDAY AND SATURDAY: Temperatures will warm more rapidly on Fri and Sat with RHs continuing to fall and overnight RH recoveries becoming increasingly poor. Breezy SW up-canyon winds will be enhanced during the afternoons but still reverse to overnight down canyon NE winds each night with peak gusts increasing to 25-30 mph the most channeled and exposed locations.

INPUTS

WEATHER SUMMARY: Continued Hot, Dry, and Breezy

Temps: Day: Mid 80's-90's Night: 60's

RH: Day: 9-13 Night: High 20-25

Winds: Day: Ridges SW 14-18 gusts to 25mph Night: NE 10-15mph after 2200 gusts up to 25 early morning.

Stability: Valley inversions mixing out around 1100 becoming unstable in the afternoon.

OUTPUTS

FIRE BEHAVIOR

GENERAL: Main fire progression will continue to the North and NE. Fire behavior characterized as active backing, aggressive upslope runs with sustained crowning and torching when in alignment with slope and wind. Expect long range spotting up to 1 mile and from roll out. Fire activity at night will remain active and spread direction will shift to the S and SW around 2400-0100 hrs.

With the dry fuels, keep an eye out for torching trees near the lines for potential sources of spotting.

100hr fuels are at 4%FM, 1000hr fuels are at 8%FM and are receptive to spots.

Probability of Ignition will be 80-90%

SPECIFIC:

Branch I: DIV A/B lines are expected to hold. If fire, becomes established over the line, expect rapid rates of spread. The heavy dead and down pockets of fuels will hold heat for long periods and produce intense heat. DIV S fire will continue to progress to the N and NE toward the Caribou Powerhouse.

Branch V: DIV F No forward fire progression is expected. Mop-up will be extensive in areas where heavy fuels continue to burn out. Snags be a safety hazard. DIV M/P short range spotting will challenge containment on established lines.

Branch X: DIV Q fire will continue to progress N and NW into the Snow Mtn and Butte Creek areas. DIV R fire will continue to progress to the N. With expected fire behavior, opportunities for direct attack will be limited and expect fire to challenge indirect lines hard.

Branch XX: DIV W fire is established in Bucks Creek and will continue to actively back and make intense upcanyon runs. DIV U fire will continue to progress to the E and NE.

AIR OPERATIONS: Smoke will impact aircraft operations on the north side of the fire.

SAFETY

- Make sure Lookouts are posted in places where they can see potential spotting.
- Roll out and debris from the burned area will impact HWY 70 and Caribou Rd.
- Smoke impacts to powerlines, review powerline safety in IRPG.

Extreme Fire Behavior:

Expect intense fire runs with plume dominated fire behavior. Take weather regularly. Maintain situational awareness specific to wind direction changes and increased fire spread. Beware of pyrocumulus and the potential for rapid changes in conditions and weather/lightning conditions associated to the pyrocumulus. Long range spotting of 1 mile plus has been observed.

Entrapment Avoidance:

Adhere to the 10 Standard Firefighting orders. Consider the 18 Situations that Shout Watch Out. Consider the Common Denominators of Fire Behavior on Tragedy Fires. Maintain LCES. Establish your decision point(s). Conduct risk management.

Safety Zones/TRA:

Locations where the threatened firefighter may find refuge from the danger. Safety zones should be large enough, conceptualized, and planned as a location where no shelter is needed. Utilize temporary refuge areas when appropriate.

Communications:

There are areas on the fire that the Command Channels have limited reception. Use human repeaters to relay messages. Make sure your radios are cloned with the correct frequencies.

Physical and Mental Wellness:

Continually monitor your crew. Hydrate and increase your caloric intake when performing arduous work during long shifts. Monitor work / rest cycle.

Driving:

Steep, narrow or dusty roads throughout fire area. Maintain safe following distances and appropriate speed when traversing roads. Flag unstable roads and other hazards that may be encountered while driving. Follow posted speed limits while driving in base camp. Drive with your vehicle headlights on. Pay extra attention while driving on Highway 70, there are several areas where rocks have fallen onto the roadway and closures maybe in effect. Limit your exposure time while in the Highway 70 fire area.

Power lines:

Follow Power Line Safety guidelines (IRPG pg.24.)

Follow FIRESCOPE identification and management of Life Safety Zones procedures, 3 horizontal strands of fire line tape, write "Do not enter" or "Do not cross".

Rail Roads:


Major train tracks are in the fire area. Assume ALL tracks are active. Do not walk on or near the train tracks. Keep a safe distance from any active trains.

COVID-19:

Follow C.D.P.H. masking guidance. Ensure you are performing good personal hygiene practices by washing your hands frequently. Ensure you are reporting any illnesses or if you are not feeling well to your supervisor. If you are coughing ensure you cover your cough.

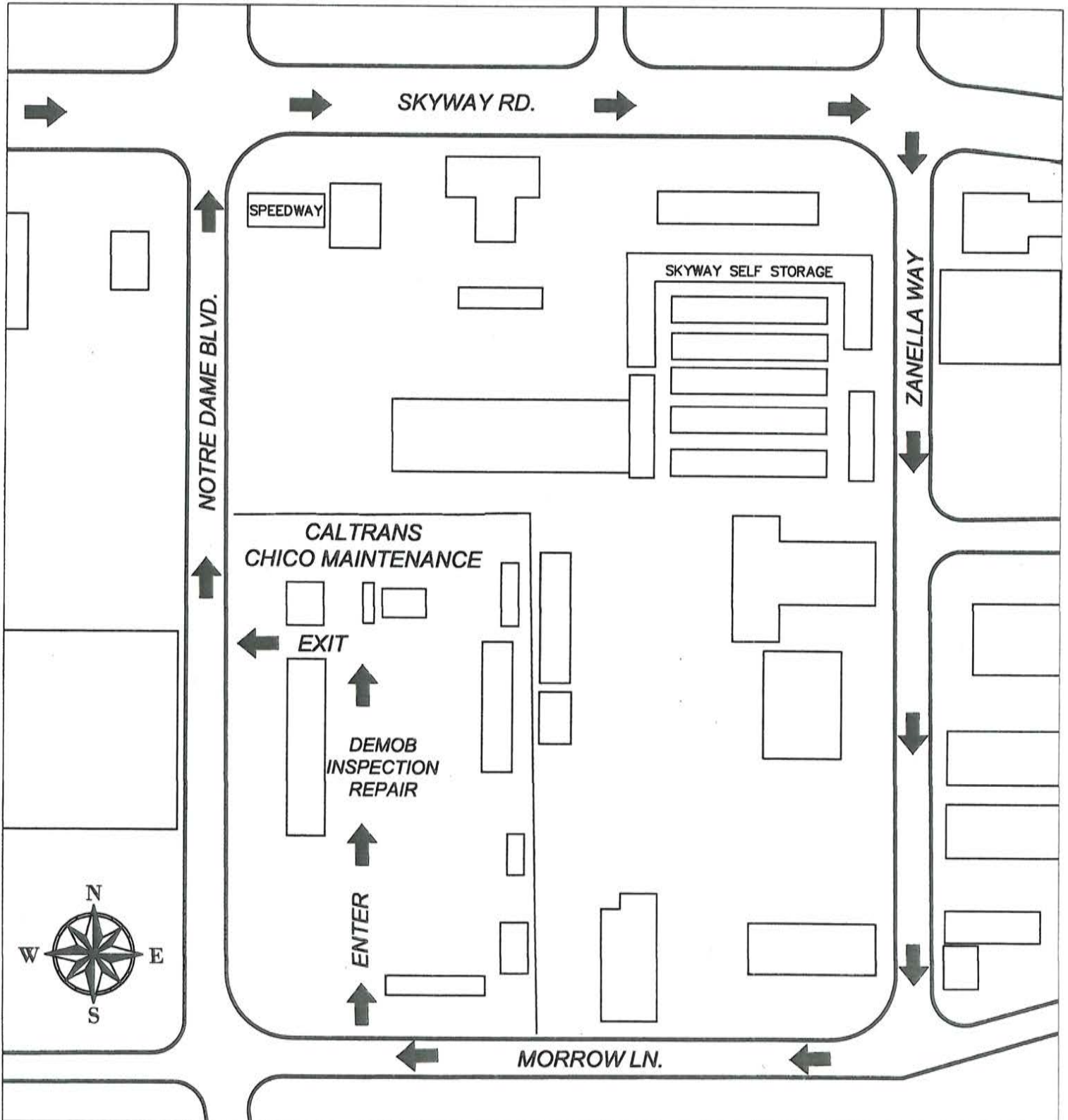

MEDIA

The California State Penal Code Section 409.5(d) allows the news media to enter scenes of disaster, riot, or civil disturbance. Properly identified members of the news media should not be restricted from entering locations specified within the code. However, this does not include crime scenes, private property and does not imply that the news media may interfere with incident operations while they are in the areas of concern. FEDERAL FIRE SOCIAL MEDIA POLICY

Social media posts can reflect on the professionalism of your crew, your agency, and Wildland Firefighting Community. The U.S. Forest Service has enjoyed a reputation as the world leader in wildland firefighting for over 100 years. Protect our legacy with good conduct on the fireline and online. When assigned to a federal fire you are considered a federal employee under the delegation of authority. Even if you are a contractor, AD or from a partner agency we recommend you follow these ethics guidelines which apply to federal employees all the time.

PHOTOGRAPHS AND VIDEOS OF INCIDENT

The Public Information Office would like copies of the video and pictures that you safely took while not in an emergency, fire suppression activity or in an overhead assignment. Bring your video and pictures to the Public Information trailer; they will be reviewed and possibly uploaded to our many CAL FIRE social media sites. Remember, we don't want photographs or videos that depict unsafe, unprofessional, or embarrassing circumstances, which are a serious breach of ethics.

- Division Supervisors please submit a legible copy of your IAP notes to Finance daily. This is a cost apportionment fire. Daily debriefing of the Divisions will begin when the Cost Apportionment Team is in place.
- Report all injuries to the COMP/CLAIMS Unit.
- Report any vehicle accidents or equipment damage to COMP/CLAIMS, including rental vehicles.

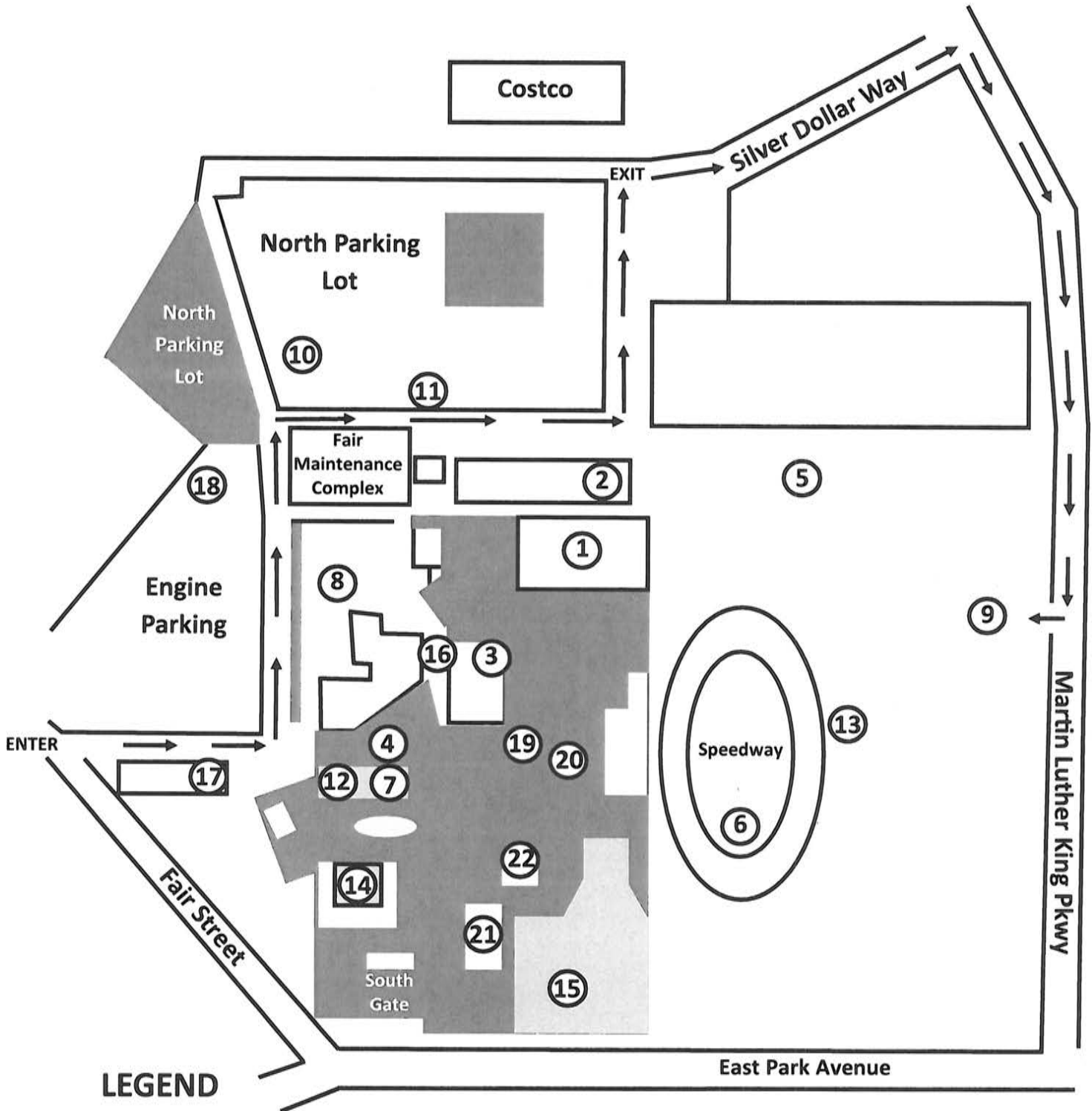
