

# FIRE WEATHER FORECAST

**\*\*\* Very Unstable in the Afternoon with Enhanced Pyro-Cumulus Growth Likely \*\*\***

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**WEATHER DISCUSSION:** Very warm and dry weather conditions will continue across the fire area today though be moderated somewhat by smoke shading through early afternoon. Mid-level moisture moving in from the SE will begin to filter into the area in the afternoon. The addition of the moisture during the heat of the afternoon will rapidly increase the instability impacting the fire. Smaller pyro-cumulus developments will start building periodically over more intense areas of burning by around 1300 with larger columns likely from 1500 onward. The mid to late afternoon pyro-cumulus will have the potential to continue to grow rapidly and reach heights where cloud to ground lightning, strong and erratic downdraft winds and rotating columns are possible.

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## SUNDAY

**WEATHER:** Warm and continued dry with smoke lingering through early afternoon. Very unstable in the afternoon.

**MAXIMUM TEMPERATURE:** Highs in the mid-90s 2000-3000 ft valleys and upper 70s along 6000-7000 ft ridges.

**MINIMUM RELATIVE HUMIDITY:** Low to mid teens.

### 20 FOOT WINDS:

**Branch I, V & VII** - NE down-canyon winds around 10 mph diminishing between 0900 & 1000. Up-slope winds 3-5 mph developing late morning then becoming predominately SW and increasing to 8-11 mph with gusts to 20 mph in the afternoon. Expect swirling and battling winds near drainage intersections.

**Branch IX & X** - Along ridges E-NE winds 5-8 mph through 1000 becoming W-SW 8-12 mph in the afternoon. At lower elevations light winds until around 1200 becoming up-slope 3-5 mph early afternoon and SW 10-15 mph mid to late afternoon in more open areas and aligned valleys with up-valley winds 4-8 mph in individual narrower drainages. Along Butt Valley Reservoir SE winds will increase to 10 to 15 mph in the afternoon.

**STABILITY:** Extensive smoke cover through midday. *Very unstable in the afternoon with rapid pyro-cumulus development likely. Lightning, strong & erratic outflow winds and column rotation possible.*

**CHANCE OF RAIN:** 0%

**LAL:** 2 (from the column)

**SMOKE TRANSPORT WIND:** W-SW 10-15 mph.

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## SUNDAY NIGHT

**WEATHER:** Partly cloudy in the evening then mostly clear.

**MINIMUM TEMPERATURE:** Lows in the upper 60s to low 70s.

**MAXIMUM RELATIVE HUMIDITY:** 25-30% ridges to 40-45% valleys except up to 60% Branch X valleys.

**20 FOOT WINDS:** SW winds around 10 mph in the evening, diminishing around 2000. In Branch I, V & VII winds will become NE around 2200 and increase to 10-15 mph around 0100. In Branch IX & X SW to NW general winds will diminish around sunset though will be replaced again with SE (Branch IX) and SW (Branch X) down-slope/down-valley winds 5-7 mph with gusts 10 to 12 mph during the early morning hours.

**STABILITY:** Dense smoke will blanket the Lake Almanor area and settle into surrounding valleys through the night. NE down canyon winds will carry smoke pooling in Feather River Valley downstream to the SW. Maximum thermal belt effects continuing with warm and dry conditions through the night will occur around 5000 ft and above. Potential for smaller pyro-cumulus development will continue along the ridges overnight.

**CHANCE OF RAIN:** 0%

**LAL:** 1

**SMOKE TRANSPORT WIND:** W-SW 10 to 15 mph in the evening becoming NE down valley after midnight.

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**OUTLOOK FOR MONDAY THROUGH FRIDAY:** SW winds will increase to 20-30 mph along ridges Mon afternoon with continued dry RHs in the mid to upper teens. Enhanced pyro-cumulus development potential will continue Mon afternoon and evening as mid-level moisture continues to gradually increase over the fire area. Isolated thunderstorms are possible Mon afternoon and evening though will most likely stay east of the fire area. Another wave of monsoonal moisture will swing through late Mon Night through early Tue morning bringing the potential for high based nocturnal thunderstorms. Thunder potential will continue off and on through the end of the week.

## INPUTS

### WEATHER SUMMARY: Continued Hot and Dry

**Temps:** Day Mid 80's-near 100' Night mid 50-60's

**RH:** Day 8-17% Night 25-45%

**Winds:** Day Ridges W/SW 18-22 gusts to 25mph Night Ridges Becoming W/NW 7-12mph

**Fuels:** ERC's will remain at or above the 97<sup>th</sup> percentile. All fuels are receptive to burn.

## OUTPUTS

### FIRE BEHAVIOR

**GENERAL:** Main fire progression will continue to the north and east and be mainly fuels driven, however the increase in general winds aloft will increase potential fire behavior. Where wind and slope align expect the potential for extreme fire behavior to include sustained crown runs and long range spotting (1mile+). In general, spotting will be less than ¼ mile and from rollout. With the increase in general flow, fire will remain active under the smoke after 1100. Watch for fire whirl development at intersecting drainages and on the lee side of any large column.

The fire will remain active at night along ridge tops and in canyon bottoms that align with the down canyon winds.

All fuels are available to burn and the Probability of Ignition will be 80-90%

### SPECIFIC:

#### West Zone:

**Branch I:** Expect mainly backing fire along the HWY 70 corridor as unburned fuels continue to burn out. There remains a potential for the fire to make down canyon runs at night when the wind reverses. Keep a heads up for fire whirl development. Residual heat from yesterdays' push up the Feather River will pose a threat to structures. Smoke settling in at night will limit visibility.

**Branch V:** Spotting will continue to be an issue. Spotting will continue to be problematic but mainly short range. If the Branch remains under the smoke column, this will dampen fire behavior, potentially allowing opportunities for direct attack. If the smoke lifts out, expect a dramatic increase in fire activity and an increase in spotting distances.

**Branch X:** Most of the Branch will remain under the smoke. The fire is also out alignment with sparser fuels. All of these factors should diminish fire behavior but will remain problematic due to heavy fuel loading and spotting potential. If the smoke does clear out, expect a dramatic increase in fire activity where wind and slope align.

#### East Zone:

**Branch XX:** The fire will continue to impact HWY 70 and 89. Expect rapid rates of spread and long-range spotting. Structures along HWY 70 and 89 will be impacted by intense flanking and backing fire as the fire continues to move north on 89 from the HWY 70/89 junction.

**Branch XXV:** Expect active flanking and head fire runs along the ridges. The fire will continue to back and flank into Buck's Lake. If fire becomes established east of the lake expect wind aligned runs with rapid rates of spread to the east. As the fire moves east it will burn into difficult terrain and align with west facing slopes. Smoke should settle in at night and dampen fire behavior.

**Fly Fire:** Expect the fire to continue burning NE and East. The fire will exhibit extreme rates of spread when burning along aligned ridges. Spotting will be about a quarter mile and from rollout. As the fire slops over Mount Hough it will fall into a backing alignment, however it will continue to burn aggressively.

**AIR OPERATIONS:** Smoke will limit air operations to the north and east sides of the fire and other areas until the smoke mixes out around 1100-1200hrs.

## SAFETY

- Make sure lookouts are posted in places where they can see potential spotting.
- Roll out and debris from burned areas will impact HWY 70, HWY 89, and Caribou Rd.
- Smoke impacts to powerlines, review powerline safety in the IRPG.
- Unburned fuel between you and the fire.

**Zonning the fire:**

With the fire being zoned, maintain accountability of all personnel and resources in assigned work locations. Ensure personnel have access to both IAP's and specifically review the communication plan for both zones. Personnel should be aware of the strategy and tactics occurring in different zones.

**Multiple Base Camps:**

The fire has three base camps. It is imperative that personnel and resources are briefed on which base camp they are assigned to. Personnel shall receive a briefing at each base camp. The Westwood and Quincy base camps are in areas that personnel have not been to before. Please make sure you are driving safely, increase following distances, and maintain situational awareness.

**Extreme Fire Behavior:**

Expect intense fire runs with plume dominated fire behavior. Take weather regularly. Maintain situational awareness specific to wind direction changes and increased fire spread. Long range spotting of one mile plus has been observed. Beware of pyro-cumulus development and the potential for rapid changes in conditions and weather/lightning associated. Prepare for possible deterioration of pyro-cumulus which will cause severe out flow winds in all directions.

**Entrapment Avoidance:**

Adhere to the 10 Standard Firefighting orders. Consider the 18 Situations that Shout Watch Out. Consider the Common Denominators of Fire Behavior on Tragedy Fires. Maintain LCES. Establish your decision point(s). Conduct risk management.

**Safety Zones/TRA:**


Locations where the threatened firefighter may find refuge from danger. Safety zones should be large enough, conceptualized, and planned as a location where no shelter is needed. Utilize temporary refuge areas when appropriate.

**Communications:**

There are areas on the fire that the Command Channels have limited reception. Use human repeaters to relay messages. Make sure your radios are cloned with the correct frequencies. Review the ICS 205 for both zones.

**Firing Operations:**

Follow the Firing Operation Checklist. Assure that: Lookouts are posted, communications are established with both firing and holding teams, escape routes and safety zones are established and not compromised by the firing operations, and that the firing plan has been approved and relayed to all adjoining forces.

**COVID-19:**

Follow California Department of Public Health masking guidance. Ensure you are performing good personal hygiene practices by washing your hands frequently. Ensure you are reporting any illnesses or if you are not feeling well to your supervisor. If you are coughing, ensure you cover your cough properly.

**Power lines:**

Follow Power Line Safety guidelines (IRPG pg.24)  
Follow FIRESCOPE identification and management of Life Safety Zones procedures, 3 horizontal strands of fire line tape, write "Do not enter" or "Do not cross

**Wildlife:**

Rattlesnakes, bears, and other potentially dangerous animals have been spotted in the fire area. Be aware of where you are stepping and placing your hands especially around rock piles. If you come across a potentially dangerous animal, let it be known and leave the area.

**Driving:**


Steep, narrow, or dusty roads throughout fire area. Maintain safe following distances and appropriate speed when traversing roads. SLOW DOWN! Flag unstable roads and other hazards that may be encountered while driving. Follow posted speed limits while driving in base camp. Drive with your vehicle headlights on. Pay extra attention while driving on Highway 70, there are several areas where rocks have fallen onto the roadway and closures maybe in effect. Limit your exposure time while in the Highway 70 fire area. Reduce speed on Hwy 32 and always maintain control of your vehicle.

**Physical and Mental Wellness:**

Continually monitor yourself and your crew. Hydrate and increase your caloric intake when performing arduous work during long shifts. Monitor work / rest cycle.

## CONTACTED OR EXPOSED PERSONNEL AND ASYMPTOMATIC

- Notify supervisor.
- Maintain appropriate face covering per California Department of Public Health guidelines.
- Self-monitor for symptoms.
- Work status based on C.D.P.H and O.S.H.A guidelines.

## PREVENTATIVE MEASURES TO SLOW THE TRANSMISSION COVID-19:

- Maintain appropriate face covering per California Department of Public Health guidelines.
- Wash your hands regularly with soap and water, or clean them with alcohol-based hand rub.
- Maintain at least six feet distance between you and people coughing or sneezing.
- Avoid touching your face.
- Cover your mouth and nose when coughing or sneezing.
- Refrain from smoking and other activities that weaken the lungs.
- Stay home if you feel unwell.
