

WEATHER SUMMARY: Continued Hot and Dry

Temp: Day Mid 80s, Night mid 60s RH: Day 18%, night 40% Winds: SW@22 gust to 35. Night SW@11 gust to 18

FIRE BEHAVIOR

General: Main fire progression will continue to be to the north where East/West aligned drainages are being influenced by SW winds. The fire will remain active at night as dry fuels continue to consume even under higher RH and low temperatures. Spotting remains the greatest threat as Probability of Ignition is above 90%. Spotting distances should remain less than ½ mile, unless an extreme crown run occurs. Increased activity is likely when the smoke cover breaks.

Fuels: There is a large variety of fuels throughout the area. Mixed pine forest with grass or shrub understory, open grass and isolated shrub areas. Grasses are cured and live fuel moistures are very low. Drought conditions are extreme in the region and large dead fuels are very dry. The predominant fuel type in the fire area is TL6, TU5 and GS2.

Energy Release Component is **well above the 97th** percentile at 90. (*Fuel Model G 97th percentile is 85*)
ERC is projected to continue increasing slowly with no significant decrease in the forecast.

Expected Surface Fire Behavior:

Grass (GR2):	12-16' flame length and Rate of Spread 8-12 ch/hr head

Extreme Fire Behavior:

Extreme behavior is mostly influenced by heavy fuel loadings, stand density and steep slopes. Fires will burn with high intensity with group torching and spotting. The potential for crown runs is likely when intensive surface fire occurs where slopes and wind align. Spotting distances can range from 1-2 miles if crown runs develop.

SPECIFIC: West Zone

BRANCH I: Continued backing and smoldering along control lines. Spotting and roll out remains the highest threat.

BRANCH V: Continued backing and smoldering along control lines. Spotting and roll out remains the highest threat.

BRANCH VII: Expect continued fire progression toward control lines and Humbolt Peak. Short upslope runs likely coming out of Scotts John Creek drainage which will increase spotting potential.

BRANCH IX: Increased likelihood of short runs and spotting as the fire enters Yellow Creek drainage and transitions upslope.

BRANCH X: Fire behavior and activity should be moderated due to continued smoke coverage.

AIR OPERATIONS and SMOKE FORECAST: Visibility will improve for air operations after 1100

Poor visibility can make it hard to see any established fire or spot. Also, aerial support will not be available due to visibility. Lookouts will also be limited.

***** Increasing SW winds. Continued dry & unstable with enhanced pyro-cumulus potential *****

WEATHER DISCUSSION: The warm and dry weather pattern will continue with SW winds increasing over the fire area in the afternoon. The smoke-filled valley inversions will mix out earlier in the day allowing clearer air and lower RHs to impact the area. Mid-level moisture will continue to be present over the area bringing a potential for both isolated thunderstorms and rapid column growth in the afternoon. The mid to late afternoon pyro-cumulus will have the potential to reach heights where cloud to ground lightning, strong and erratic downdraft winds and rotating columns are possible.

MONDAY

WEATHER: Warm, dry and breezy. Cumulus build-up forming over the mountains in the early afternoon. Isolated thunderstorms are possible beginning mid to late afternoon but will most likely remain east of the fire area.

MAXIMUM TEMPERATURE: Highs in the mid-90s 2000-3000 ft valleys and upper 70s along 6000-7000 ft ridges.

MINIMUM RELATIVE HUMIDITY: Low to mid-teens.

20 FOOT WINDS:

Branch I, V & VII - NE down-canyon winds around 10 mph diminishing between 0900 & 1000. Up-slope winds 3-5 mph developing late morning then becoming predominately SW and increasing to 11-14 mph with gusts to 20 to 25 mph in the afternoon. Expect swirling and battling winds near drainage intersections.

Branch IX & X - Light winds until around 1100 becoming up-slope 3-5 mph through early afternoon and SW 10-15 mph mid to late afternoon. Up-valley winds 4-8 mph in individual narrower drainages. Along Butt Valley Reservoir SE winds will increase to 10 to 15 mph in the afternoon.

Peaks & Higher Ridges - E-NE winds 5-8 mph through 1000. SW winds increasing to 20-25 mph with gusts 30 to 35 mph possible in the afternoon.

STABILITY: Inversions lifting around 1100. *Very unstable in the afternoon with rapid pyro-cumulus development likely. Lightning, strong & erratic outflow winds and column rotation possible.*

CHANCE OF RAIN: 5% **LAL:** 2 **SMOKE TRANSPORT WIND:** Becoming SW 20-30 mph in the afternoon.

MONDAY NIGHT

WEATHER: Clouds moving through overnight with isolated high based thunderstorms possible.

MINIMUM TEMPERATURE: Lows in the 60s.

MAXIMUM RELATIVE HUMIDITY: 30-40% ridges to around 60% valleys.

20 FOOT WINDS: SW winds 15-20 mph in the evening, diminishing around 2200. In Branch I, V & VII winds will become NE around 2200 and increase to 5 to 10 mph around 0100. In Branch IX & X SW to NW general winds will diminish around sunset with SE (Branch IX) and SW (Branch X) down-slope/down-valley winds 4-7 mph developing during the early morning hours.

STABILITY: Dense smoke will blanket the Lake Almanor area and settle into surrounding valleys through the night. NE down canyon winds will carry smoke pooling in Feather River Valley downstream to the SW.

CHANCE OF RAIN: 10% **LAL:** 2 **SMOKE TRANSPORT WIND:** SW 15 to 20 mph in the evening becoming NE down valley after midnight.

OUTLOOK FOR TUESDAY THROUGH SATURDAY: Following a day of cooler conditions due to increased cloud cover on Tue, temperatures will warm back to well above normal levels for Wed through Sat. RHs will increase bit on Tue but dry again Tue Night and Wed as a drier air mass pushes back into the area. Periodic surges of monsoonal moisture up the Sierra Mountains will bring isolated thunderstorm potential to the area each afternoon and evening through the week. Currently the coverage of storms looks to be sparse and mainly focused to the east of the area. NE overnight down canyon winds will be enhanced from Tue Night through Thu Night.

MAJOR HAZARDS AND RISKS:

Zoning the fire:

With the fire being zoned, maintain accountability of all personnel and resources in assigned work locations. Ensure personnel have access to both IAP's and specifically review the communication plan for both zones. Personnel should be aware of the strategy and tactics occurring in different zones.

Extreme Fire Behavior:

Expect intense fire runs with plume dominated fire behavior. Take weather regularly. Maintain situational awareness specific to wind direction changes and increased fire spread. Long range spotting of one mile plus has been observed. Beware of pyro-cumulus development and the potential for rapid changes in conditions and weather/lightning associated. Prepare for possible deterioration of pyro-cumulus which will cause severe out flow winds in all directions.

Multiple Base Camps:

The fire has three base camps. It is imperative that personnel and resources are briefed on which base camp they are assigned to. Personnel shall receive a briefing at each base camp. The Westwood and Quincy base camps are in areas that personnel have not been to before. Please make sure you are driving safely, increase following distances, and maintain situational awareness.

Communications:

There are areas on the fire that the Command Channels have limited reception. Use human repeaters to relay messages. Make sure your radios are cloned with the correct frequencies. Review the ICS 205 for both zones.

Entrapment Avoidance:

Adhere to the 10 Standard Firefighting orders. Consider the 18 Situations that Shout Watch Out. Consider the Common Denominators of Fire Behavior on Tragedy Fires. Maintain LCES. Establish your decision point(s). Conduct risk management.

Safety Zones/TRA:

Locations where the threatened firefighter may find refuge from danger. Safety zones should be large enough, conceptualized, and planned as a location where no shelter is needed. Utilize temporary refuge areas when appropriate.

Firing Operations:

Follow the Firing Operation Checklist. Assure that: Lookouts are posted, communications are established with both firing and holding teams, escape routes and safety zones are established and not compromised by the firing operations, and that the firing plan has been approved and relayed to all adjoining forces.

COVID-19:

Follow California Department of Public Health masking guidance. Ensure you are performing good personal hygiene practices by washing your hands frequently. Ensure you are reporting any illnesses or if you are not feeling well to your supervisor. If you are coughing, ensure you cover your cough properly.

Power lines:

Follow Power Line Safety guidelines (IRPG pg.24)
Follow FIRESCOPE identification and management of Life Safety Zones procedures, 3 horizontal strands of fire line tape, write "Do not enter" or "Do not cross"

Wildlife:

Rattlesnakes, bears, and other potentially dangerous animals have been spotted in the fire area. Be aware of where you are stepping and placing your hands especially around rock piles. If you come across a potentially dangerous animal, let it be known and leave the area.

Driving:

Steep, narrow, or dusty roads throughout fire area. Maintain safe following distances and appropriate speed when traversing roads. SLOW DOWN! Flag unstable roads and other hazards that may be encountered while driving. Follow posted speed limits while driving in base camp. Drive with your vehicle headlights on. Pay extra attention while driving on Highway 70, there are several areas where rocks have fallen onto the roadway and closures maybe in effect. Limit your exposure time while in the Highway 70 fire area. Reduce speed on Hwy 32 and always maintain control of your vehicle.

Physical and Mental Wellness:

Continually monitor yourself and your crew. Hydrate and increase your caloric intake when performing arduous work during long shifts. Monitor work / rest cycle.

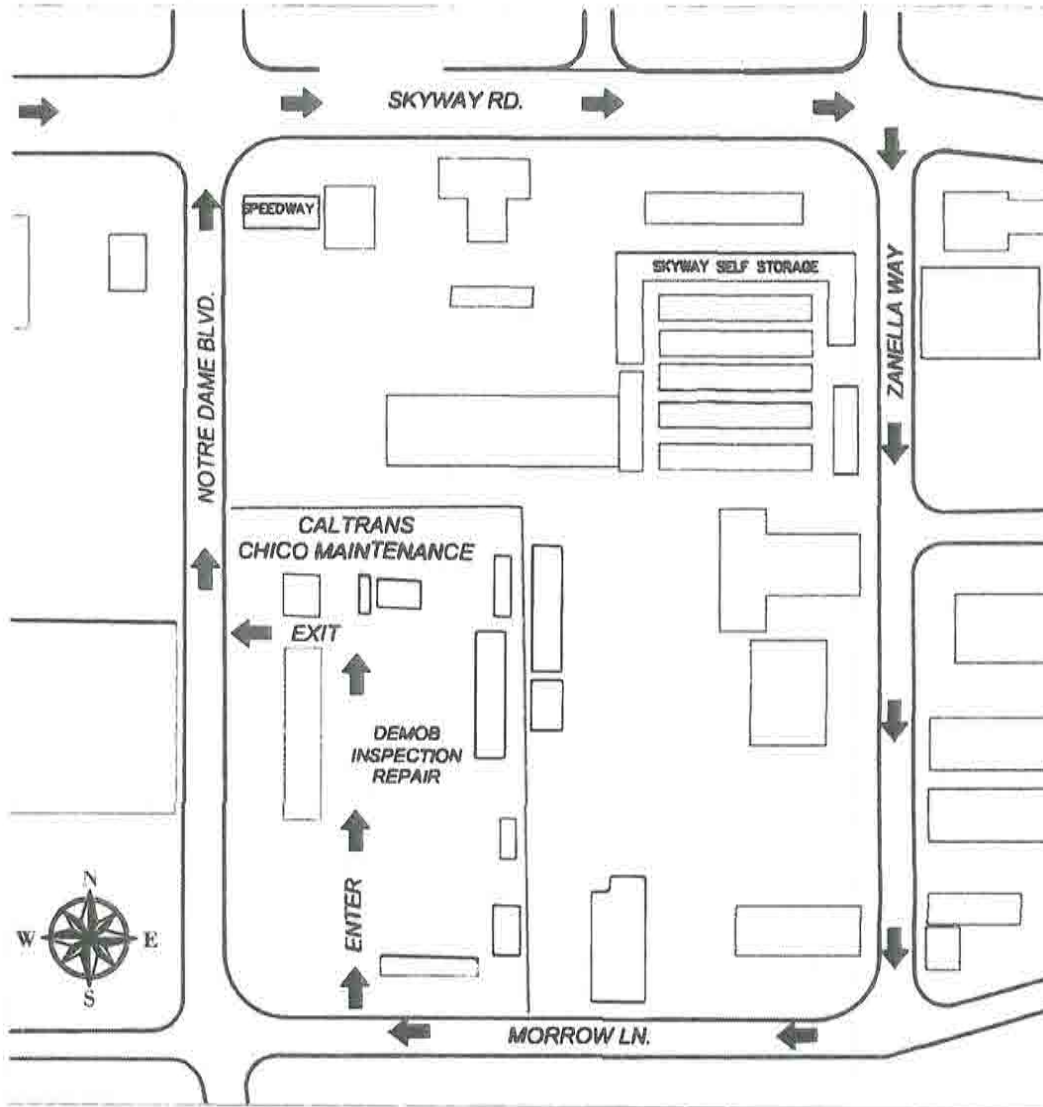

EMERGENCY FIRE SUPPRESSION REPAIR PLAN – DIXIE INCIDENT - WEST ZONE

Fire Suppression Repair is the repair of damage caused directly from fire suppression activities. It is not the repair of infrastructure or rehabilitation of burned areas caused by the fire. We cannot upgrade facilities beyond their pre-fire condition. Fire suppression repair shall be applied to mitigate infrastructure damage and natural resource damage.

Infrastructure Damage: Culverts and other watercourse crossings, water sources, trails, road barriers removed for fire access, trash, debris and supplies left by fire suppression activities; miscellaneous.

Natural Resource Damage: Repair of existing problems caused by fire suppression activities (direct effect) to natural resources and to prevent likely future problems such as accelerated erosion caused by rains (indirect effect). The goal is to minimize soil erosion, adverse impacts to water quality, and adverse impacts to protected species of plants and animals

REPAIR GUIDELINES

General: Restore berms and barriers removed for fire control access.

Drop Points/Staging Areas/Safety Zones: New construction: Cross drain and abandon (if applicable). Existing: Repair to original condition, remove debris resulting from use. Pick up all trash.

Roads: Reshape soil surfaced roads that were used during fire control operations. Roads should be out-sloped with rolling dips where degradation of the road prism has resulted from fire control operations. Clean out culvert inlets and outlets as needed. Report any damaged culverts to the Fire Suppression Repair Specialist for specific repair guidance. Breach berms, where appropriate, to facilitate drainage.

Fire lines: Break apart dozer piles of pushed over trees, vegetation, and soil, and spread along tractor roads, tractor fire breaks, or any other areas disturbed during fire suppression activities. Lop and scatter displaced vegetation to a height of less than 30 inches or chip within 100' of a public or unlocked private road or structure. Scatter the lopped material along the fire line. Pull back any excess soil material sidecast along roads or tractor disturbed areas that are located within 100 feet of any watercourse or spring. Install waterbreaks on all constructed or used dozer lines using the following criteria:

Fire line and road gradient (%):	0-10	11-25	26-50	>50
Fire line waterbreak spacing:	100'	75'	50'	25'
Road waterbreak spacing:	200'	150'	100'	75'

Waterbreaks and/or rolling dips shall be used to reduce the volume and velocity of water by directing it off fire lines as soon as possible at controlled locations. The outfall end of all waterbreaks shall be opened by hand if necessary. Waterbreaks should be located to discharge into natural vegetation. Waterbreaks should cross the fire line at an angle of approximately 30 degrees.

Hand lines: Install waterbreaks as needed based on slope and soil erodibility.

All waterbreaks shall be installed diagonally with a minimum cut of 3" into existing grade, and minimum height of 6". Waterbreaks shall be constructed to allow for drainage at the discharge end into non-erodible material.

Slash Piles: Piles within 150' of permanent structures or public roads will be lopped and/or scattered within 18" of the soil surface.

Piles along roads and fences: Lop to fire protection standards to ensure decreased fire risk is obtained. Scatter smaller debris where applicable.

Watercourse Crossings: All slash, soil, and debris deposited into watercourses resulting from fire suppression activities shall be removed and stabilized above the high-water line.

Major watercourse damage, if present, shall be reported to the Fire Suppression Repair Specialist prior to the end of the shift day.

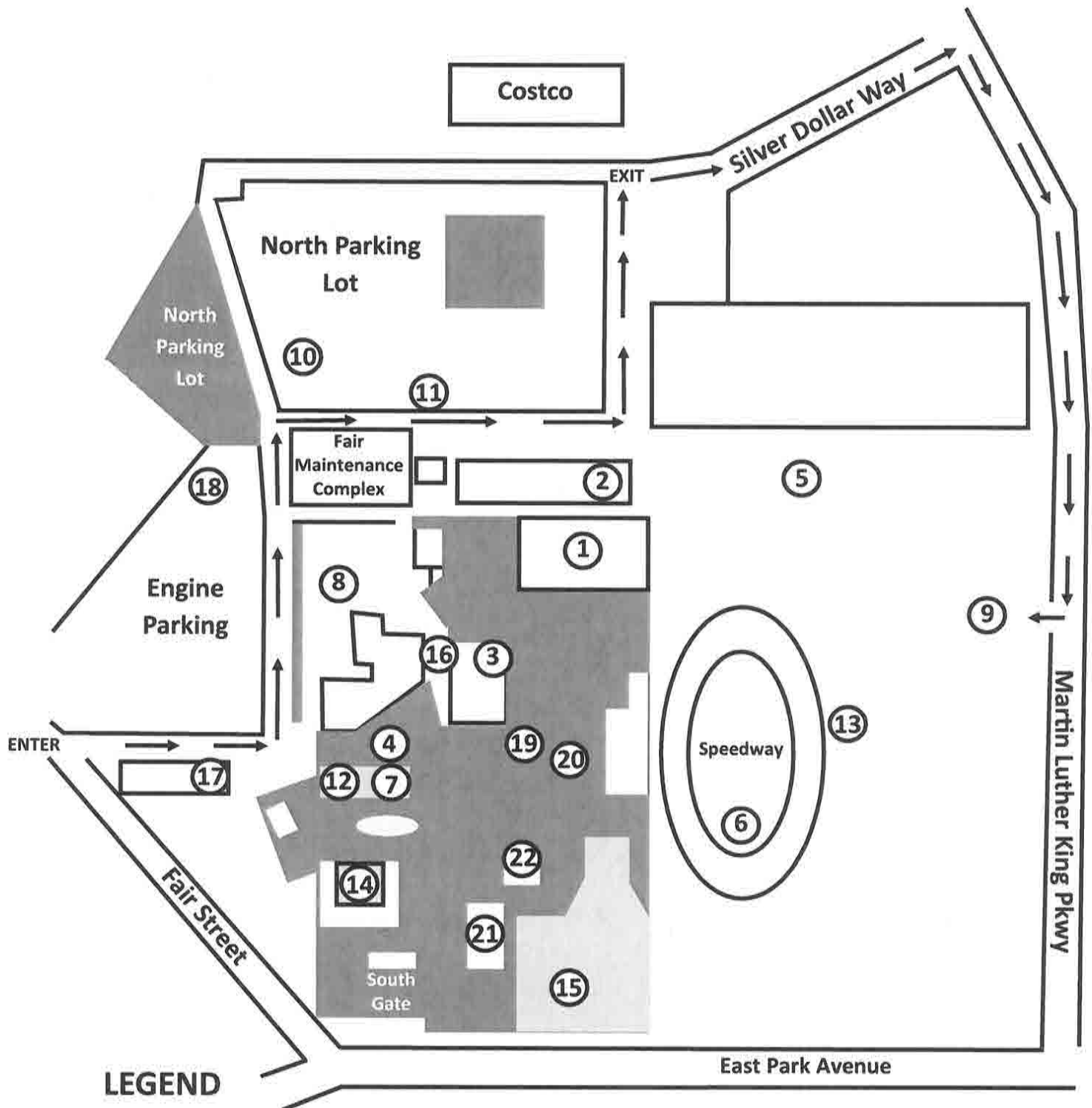
Where fire lines are constructed within 100' of flowing watercourses, slash or straw mulching will be applied. All loose soil must be pulled away from the watercourse and stabilized.

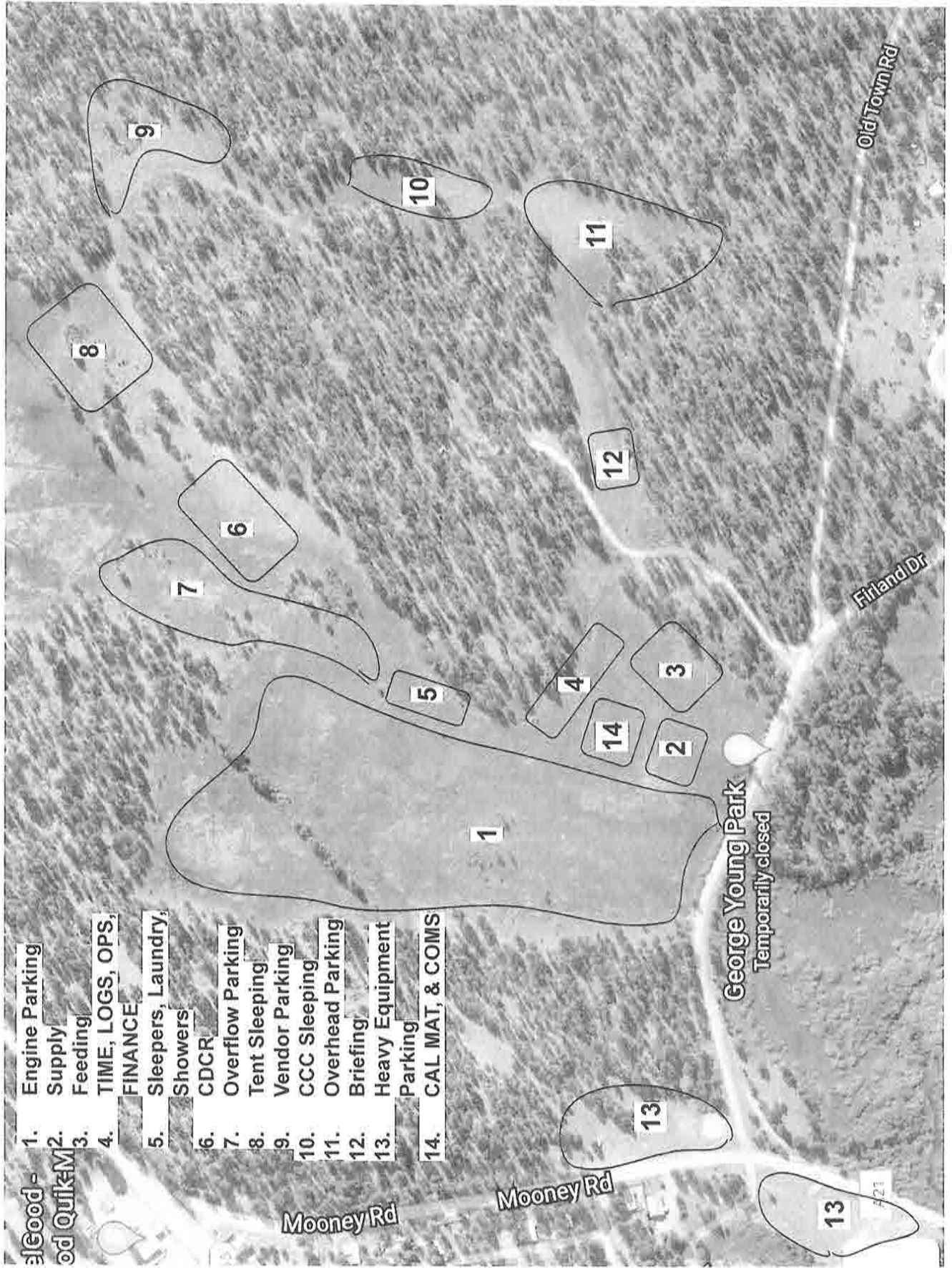

STANDARD FIRE FIGHTING ORDERS

1. Keep informed on FIRE WEATHER conditions and forecasts.
2. Know what your FIRE is DOING at all times, observe personally, use scouts.
3. Base all action on current and expected BEHAVIOR of FIRE.
4. Have ESCAPE ROUTES for everyone and make them known.
5. Post a LOOKOUT when there is possible danger.
6. Be ALERT, keep CALM, THINK clearly, ACT decisively.
7. Maintain prompt COMMUNICATION with your men, your boss, and adjoining forces.
8. Give clear INSTRUCTIONS and be sure they are understood.
9. Maintain CONTROL of your men at all times.
10. Fight fire aggressively but provide for SAFETY first.
