

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**WEATHER DISCUSSION:** Increasing southwest winds aloft should push any remaining residual monsoonal moisture east of the Dixie Fire with any afternoon convection to the north and east. Less smoke and stronger winds aloft should allow for an earlier lifting of the inversion with more direct sunshine on the fuels. General winds from the southwest will be adverse to the line in Branch IX and X but the wind at your back in VII and V. Humidity values may tick slightly drier with temperatures running near normal from the mid 80s to mid 90s. Any afternoon cumulus build ups will decrease by early evening. Southwest evening winds will ease by 2200 then turn northeast downcanyon overnight with poor to moderate humidity recovery.

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### **WEATHER FORECAST SUNDAY:**

**WEATHER:** Areas of smoke through mid morning otherwise hazy sunshine. Seasonably hot and dry.

**TEMPERATURES:** Mid 80s above 4500 feet with mid 90s lower elevations..

**HUMIDITY:** Lowering 15-25% afternoon hours with direct sunshine on southwest slopes.

**20 FT WINDS:**

**RIDGETOP** - Southwest 6-12 mph afternoon gusts 18-22 mph.

**SLOPE/VALLEY** - Light through 1000 am then afternoon upcanyon 3-7 mph gusts 10-12 mph.

**HAINES INDEX:** 4 **LAL:** 1 **Chance of Rain:** 5%

**STABILITY/INVERSION:** Moderate morning inversion breaking by 1100 upper slopes but hanging through 1300 along Highway 70.

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**Sunday Night:** Smoke settling into the drainages. Othwerwise mostly clear with poor humidity recovery.

**LOW TEMPERATURES:** Upper 50s to mid 60s lower valleys with lower 70s mid and upper slopes.

**HUMIDITY:** Poor to moderate recovery 35-50% overnight.

**20 FT WINDS:**

**RIDGETOP** - Southwest 5-10 mph evening gusts 15 mph through 2100 then light overnight.

**SLOPE/VALLEY** - Evening upcanyon through 2200 then northeast downcanyon 4-8 mph except  
Gusts 15-20 mph Branch 1

**HAINES INDEX:** 3 **LAL:** 1 **Chance of Rain:** 0%

**STABILITY/INVERSION:** Strong night time inversion setting up after 2200 hours.

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**EXTENDED FORECAST:** A seasonable weather pattern looks to set up Monday and Tuesday with continued southwest winds. Highs upper 80s and 90s with low humidity. Will be watching for increasing southwest winds Weds and Thursday as an upper system passes over NorCal giving the fire a good wind test by late week as humidity stays low. No rain in the forecast at this time with another hot and dry ridge building by mid-month.

## FIRE BEHAVIOR

### General:

Clearing skies and warm conditions helped increase activity yesterday. Elevated conditions return this afternoon and into the night with clear skies and lower fuel moistures. Fire activity will continue in the remaining unburned pockets. Activity will remain active at night with lower RH and winds present. Probability of Ignition (PIG) is slightly elevated today due to higher temperature and sun. Spotting distances should remain less than ½ mile, unless an extreme crown run occurs. With less smoke in the air, expect earlier activity, especially on southern facing slopes. Large fuel mop up still critical due to dryness. Watch for needle drop and creeping into unburned areas.

### Extreme Fire Behavior:

Extreme behavior is mostly influenced by heavy fuel loadings, stand density and steep slopes. When this occurs, it will burn with high intensity with group torching and spotting. The potential for crown runs is likely when intensive surface fire occurs where slopes and wind align in thick stands with low branches. These runs can develop Pyro cumulus clouds with erratic and unpredictable behavior.

**Fuels:** There is a large variety of fuels throughout the area. Mixed pine forest with grass or shrub understory, open grass and isolated shrub areas. Live fuel moistures are very low. Drought conditions are extreme in the region and large dead fuels are very dry. The predominant fuel type in the fire area is TL6, TU5 and GS2.

Energy Release Component is **below the 90<sup>th</sup>** percentile at 77. (Fuel Model G 90<sup>th</sup> percentile is 81)  
ERC is projected to rebound back by the beginning of the week

**1HR fuel moisture:** 5% (same as yesterday)

**10HR moisture:** 6% (--)

**100HR fuel moisture:** % 8 (--)

**Energy Release Component:** 77 (+1)

**Burning Index:** 72 (-4)

**Probability of Ignition:** 70%

**Local Watchout Thresholds:** (bold if present) 3 present today.

**20' winds over 10 mph, RH below 20%, Temp > 85 deg, 10 HR < 5%**

## SPECIFIC: West Zone

**BRANCH I, V, VII** Holding and mop up today should not have adverse conditions. Smoldering and torching still possible with increase in temperatures and low RH. Expect activity to pick earlier around 1200. Continued backing and creeping of unburned pockets. Beware of local influences on winds such as ridges and drains. Snags from previous firing will continue to smolder and present spotting. Down drain winds will keep smoke on the line in the night. Any spots outside containment will spread quickly.

**BRANCH IX:** Fire continues to burn interior areas. SW winds will favor interior island ignition. Beware of heavy shrub fuels over heavy litter as they may flare. Expect activity to pick up after 1200.

**BRANCH X:** Holding and mop up today should not face adverse conditions on most of DIV M. Increased activity possible in unburned areas of Caribou area. Roll outs are primary source of growth. Any spots outside containment will spread quickly. Expect activity after 1200, earlier on south facing slopes.

**AIR OPERATIONS and SMOKE FORECAST:** Visibility will improve for air operations after 1100

## SAFETY:

**Watch Out #13:** On a hillside where rolling material can ignite fuel below.

Smoldering and consumption of ground fuels makes things come loose and can roll.

**Driving:**

Steep, narrow, or dusty roads throughout fire area. Maintain safe following distances and appropriate speed when traversing roads. SLOW DOWN! Flag unstable roads and other hazards that may be encountered while driving. Follow posted speed limits while driving in base camp. Drive with your vehicle headlights on. Pay extra attention while driving on Highway 70, there are several areas where rocks have fallen onto the roadway and closures maybe in effect. Limit your exposure time while in the Highway 70 fire area. Reduce speed on Hwy 32 and always maintain control of your vehicle.

**Physical and Mental Wellness:**

Continually monitor yourself and your crew. Hydrate and increase your caloric intake when performing arduous work during long shifts. Monitor work / rest cycle.

**Communications:**

There are areas on the fire that Command Channels have limited reception. Use human repeaters to relay messages. Make sure your radios are cloned with the correct frequencies. Review the ICS 205 for both zones. Monitor neighboring Tac channels.

**COVID-19:**

Follow California Department of Public Health masking guidance. Ensure you are performing good personal hygiene practices by washing your hands frequently. Ensure you are reporting any illnesses or if you are not feeling well to your supervisor. If you are coughing or sneezing, ensure you cover your mouth properly.

**Multiple Base Camps:**

The fire has three base camps. It is imperative that personnel and resources are briefed on which base camp they are assigned to. Personnel shall receive a briefing at each base camp. The Westwood and Quincy base camps are in areas that personnel have not been to before. Please make sure you are driving safely, increase following distances, and maintain situational awareness.

**Wildlife:**

Rattlesnakes, bears, and other potentially dangerous animals have been spotted in the fire area. Be aware of where you are stepping and placing your hands especially around rock piles. If you come across a potentially dangerous animal, let it be known and leave the area.

**Zoning the fire:**  
With the fire being zoned, maintain accountability of all personnel and resources in assigned work locations. Ensure personnel have access to both IAP's and specifically review the communication plan for both zones. Personnel should be aware of the strategy and tactics occurring in different zones.

**Extreme Fire Behavior:**  
Expect intense fire runs with plume dominated fire behavior. Take weather regularly. Maintain situational awareness specific to wind direction changes and increased fire spread. Long range spotting of one mile plus has been observed. Beware of pyro-cumulus development and the potential for rapid changes in conditions and weather/lightning associated. Prepare for possible deterioration of pyro-cumulus which will cause severe out flow winds in all directions.

**Safety Zones/TRA:**  
Locations where the threatened firefighter may find refuge from danger. Safety zones should be large enough and planned as a location where no shelter is needed. Utilize temporary refuge areas when appropriate.

**Entrapment Avoidance:**  
Adhere to the 10 Standard Firefighting orders. Consider the 18 Situations that Shout Watch Out. Consider the Common Denominators of Fire Behavior on Tragedy Fires. Maintain LCES. Establish your decision point(s). Conduct risk management.

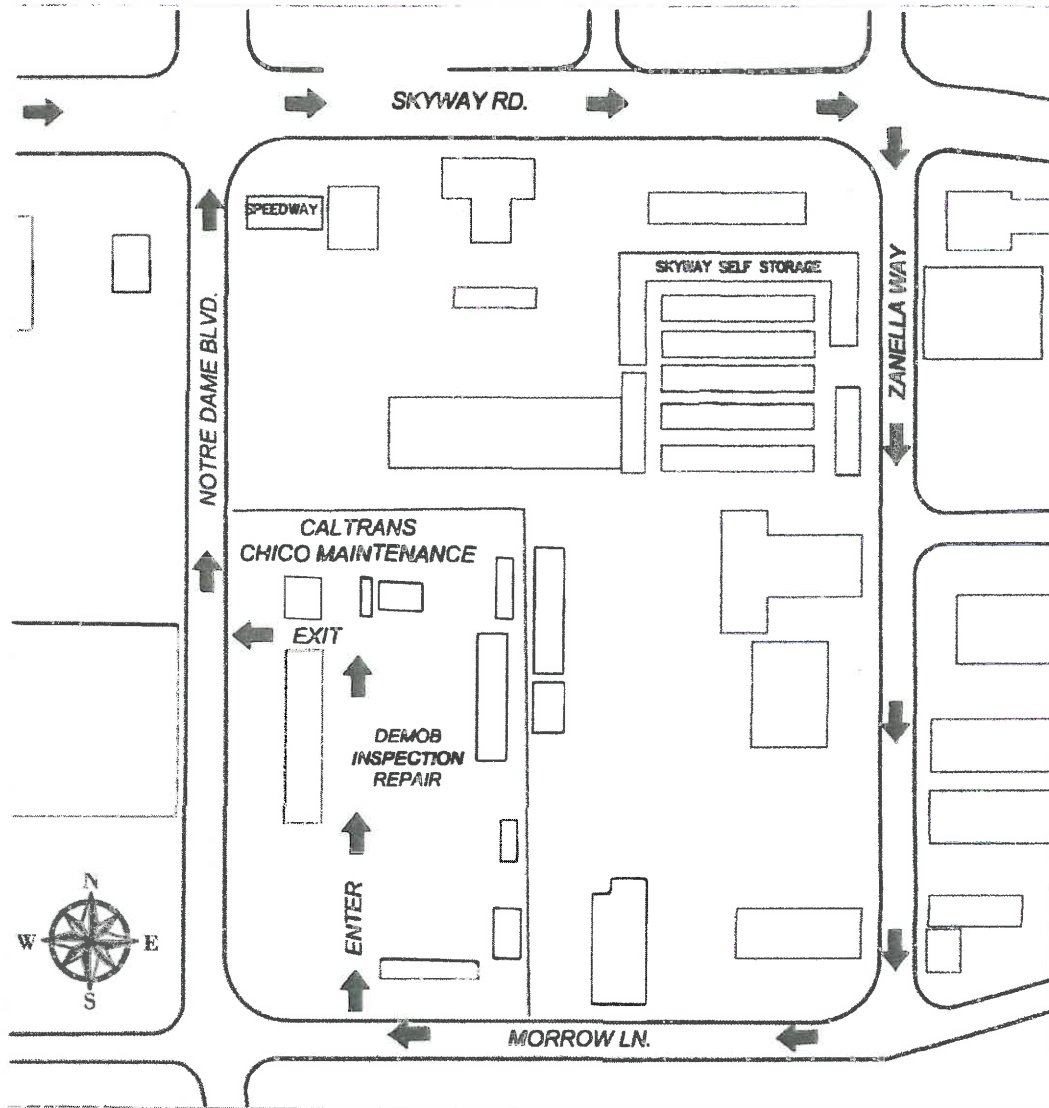

## EMERGENCY FIRE SUPPRESSION REPAIR PLAN – DIXIE INCIDENT - WEST ZONE

**Fire Suppression Repair** is the repair of damage caused directly from fire suppression activities. It is not the repair of infrastructure or rehabilitation of burned areas caused by the fire. We cannot upgrade facilities beyond their pre-fire condition. Fire suppression repair shall be applied to mitigate infrastructure damage and natural resource damage.

**Infrastructure Damage:** Culverts and other watercourse crossings, water sources, trails, road barriers removed for fire access, trash, debris and supplies left by fire suppression activities; miscellaneous.

**Natural Resource Damage:** Repair of existing problems caused by fire suppression activities (direct effect) to natural resources and to prevent likely future problems such as accelerated erosion caused by rains (indirect effect). The goal is to minimize soil erosion, adverse impacts to water quality, and adverse impacts to protected species of plants and animals

### REPAIR GUIDELINES

**General:** Restore berms and barriers removed for fire control access.

**Drop Points/Staging Areas/Safety Zones:** New construction: Cross drain and abandon (if applicable). Existing: Repair to original condition, remove debris resulting from use. Pick up all trash.

**Roads:** Reshape soil surfaced roads that were used during fire control operations. Roads should be out-sloped with rolling dips where degradation of the road prism has resulted from fire control operations. Clean out culvert inlets and outlets as needed. Report any damaged culverts to the Fire Suppression Repair Specialist for specific repair guidance. Breach berms, where appropriate, to facilitate drainage.

**Fire lines:** Break apart dozer piles of pushed over trees, vegetation, and soil, and spread along tractor roads, tractor fire breaks, or any other areas disturbed during fire suppression activities. Lop and scatter displaced vegetation to a height of less than 30 inches or chip within 100' of a public or unlocked private road or structure. Scatter the lopped material along the fire line. Pull back any excess soil material sidecast along roads or tractor disturbed areas that are located within 100 feet of any watercourse or spring. Install waterbreaks on all constructed or used dozer lines using the following criteria:

Fire line and road gradient (%):	0-10	11-25	26-50	>50
Fire line waterbreak spacing:	100'	75'	50'	25'
Road waterbreak spacing:	200'	150'	100'	75'

Waterbreaks and/or rolling dips shall be used to reduce the volume and velocity of water by directing it off fire lines as soon as possible at controlled locations. The outfall end of all waterbreaks shall be opened by hand if necessary. Waterbreaks should be located to discharge into natural vegetation. Waterbreaks should cross the fire line at an angle of approximately 30 degrees.

**Hand lines:** Install waterbreaks as needed based on slope and soil erodibility.

All waterbreaks shall be installed diagonally with a minimum cut of 3" into existing grade, and minimum height of 6". Waterbreaks shall be constructed to allow for drainage at the discharge end into non-erodible material.

**Slash Piles:** Piles within 150' of permanent structures or public roads will be lopped and/or scattered within 18" of the soil surface.

Piles along roads and fences: Lop to fire protection standards to ensure decreased fire risk is obtained. Scatter smaller debris where applicable.

**Watercourse Crossings:** All slash, soil, and debris deposited into watercourses resulting from fire suppression activities shall be removed and stabilized above the high-water line.

Major watercourse damage, if present, shall be reported to the Fire Suppression Repair Specialist prior to the end of the shift day.

Where fire lines are constructed within 100' of flowing watercourses, slash or straw mulching will be applied. All loose soil must be pulled away from the watercourse and stabilized.

**Archaeological or Historic Sites:** All potential sites shall be avoided. Contact Incident Archaeologist or the Suppression Repair Specialist.

**Sensitive sites:** Red and black candy-striped flagging has been used to designate equipment exclusion buffer zones for sensitive areas. Contact a Resource Advisor or Suppression Repair Specialist prior to performing any work in these areas.

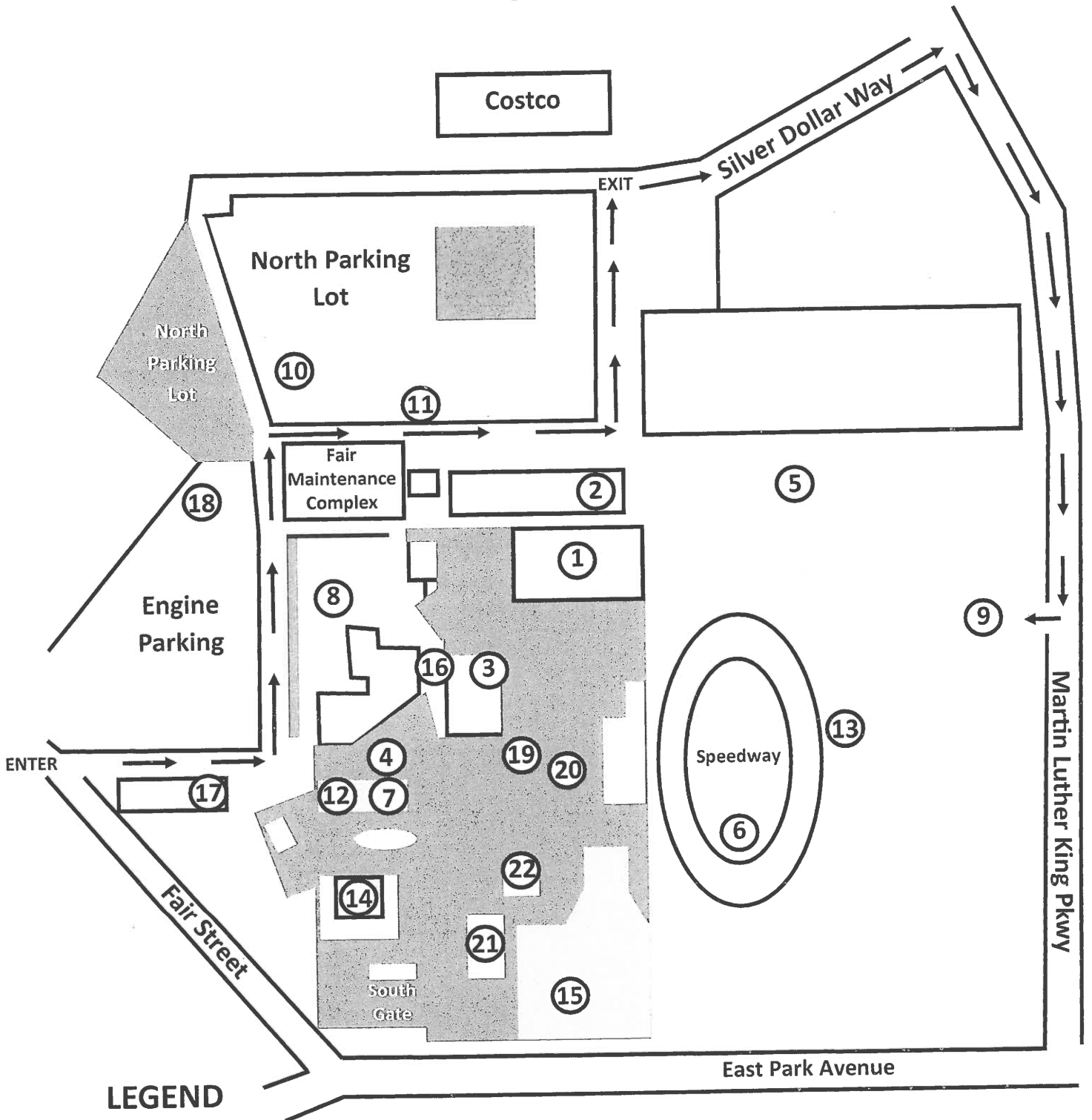

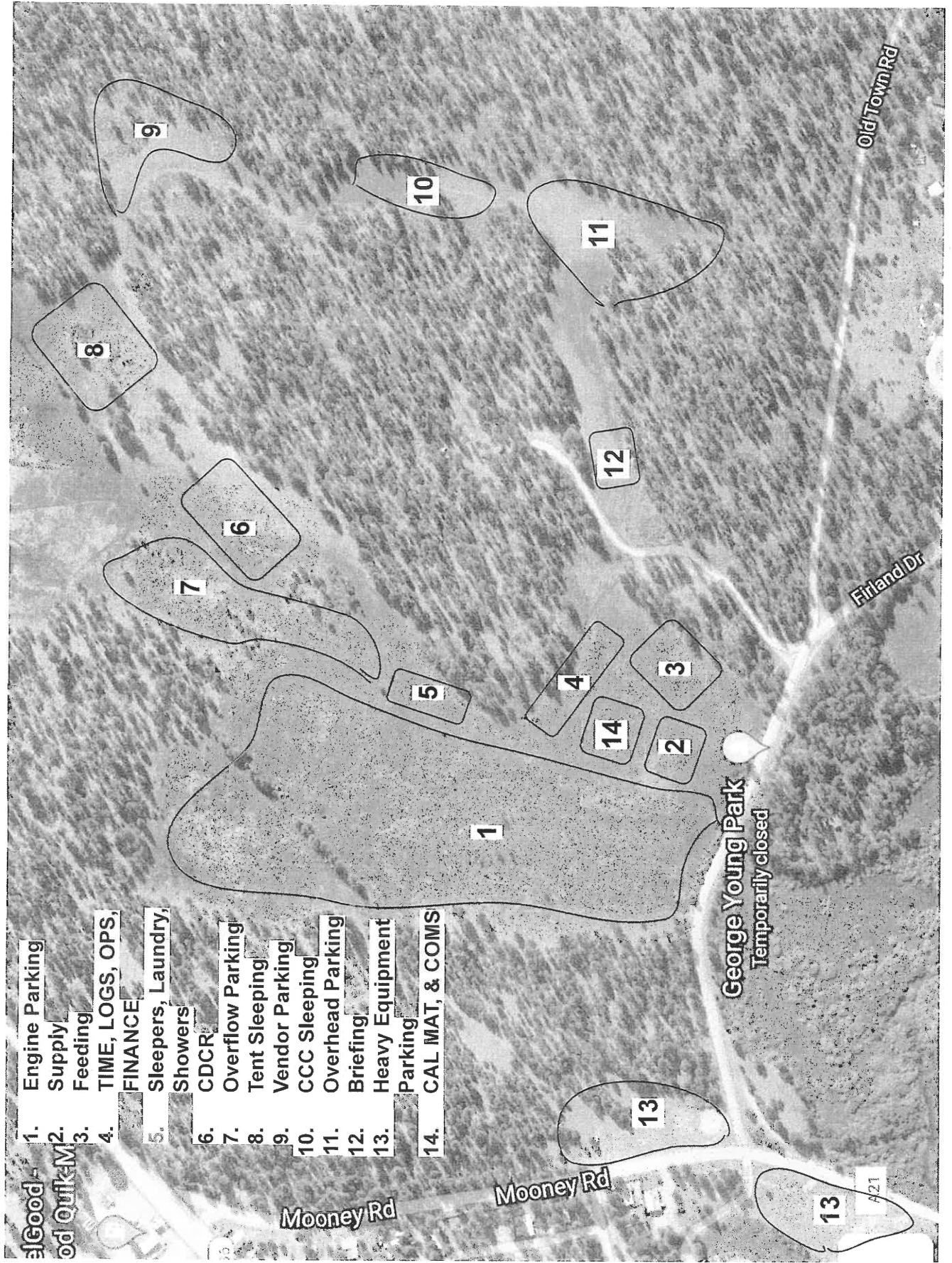
