Local Red Flag Warning in effect 1400-1900 hours for Dixie East Zone Onlv ... A critical fire weather threat expected thru Thursday across Dixie East Zone...

WEATHER DISCUSSION: Single digit minimum relative humidity should be expected thru Thursday with strong westerly winds across the Dixie East Zone and Evans Fires. Instability will support column growth through at least Wednesday. In addition, a wind shift to the northwest is anticipated late Wednesday into early Thursday. Near critical conditions are expected to round out the week with dry and blustery conditions for the weekend.

TODAY: A Local Red Flag Warning is in effect from 1400 to 1900 hours for the Dixie East Zone Only. Morning patchy dense smoke will yield to mostly sunny, hot and windy conditions. The strongest winds will be across west aspects in addition to southwestnortheast oriented drainages. West general wind gusts to 28 mph (possibly greater) are forecast.

Valley-2000 FT: 96-101°

2000-4000 FT: 94-99°

4000-6000 FT: 88-93°

Valley-2000 FT: 8-13% Minimum Relative Humidity:

2000-4000 FT: 8-13%

4000-6000 FT: 10-15%

Rush Creek to Round Valley Lake (DIV N and DIV O): Winds will become more S and WSW with speeds between 10 and 17 mph. Gusts to near 28 mph are anticipated with greater gusts along aligned drainages. The time period that will offer the strongest winds will be mid to late afternoon. Afternoon humidity will fall down to near 9% in spots.

Bucks Lake - Meadow Valley Areas: SSW to WSW winds at 9 to 16 mph with gusts to 25 mph during the late morning and through the afternoon. Stronger gusts are possible across the more exposed regions of Bucks Lake and into Meadow Valley. Afternoon humidity values will fall down to near 10% in many locations. A few spots may fall down into the single digits.

Evans Fire: W winds between 8 to 15 mph with gusts to 18 mph at mid-slope and into valley. Wind gusts to near 25 mph along the ridgeline. Relative humidity will range between 13-15%.

Stability: Inversion lifting around 1200-1300 and becoming unstable with tall smoke columns possible in the late morning/afternoon. CHANCE OF RAIN: 0% TRANSPORT WINDS: Becoming south to southeast at 15 to 20 mph. LAL: 1

TONIGHT: The poor overnight humidity trend will continue with higher elevations not seeing max nighttime RH greater than 35%. Winds will diminish at lower elevations, but may remain elevated mid-slope and higher. Patchy dense smoke should be expected across drainages and valleys.

Valley-2000 FT: 48-53° 2000-4000 FT: 69-75° 4000-6000 FT: 63-73° Min Temperatures: Valley-2000 FT: 40-50% 2000-4000 FT: 15-25% 4000-6000 FT: 20-35% Relative Humidity Recovery:

Rush Creek to Round Valley Lake (DIV N and DIV O):. Strong winds below 4500 feet will subside and become more southerly around Round Valley Lake. Across Rush Creek, winds may turn more toward the northeast. Speeds between 2 and 5 mph can be expected here. Above 4500 feet, winds within the thermal belt may increase toward sunrise with S winds possibly approaching 10 mph. Gusts may near 15 mph.

Bucks Lake - Meadow Valley Areas: W to SW winds will subside quickly after sunset with down-slope/down-valley winds becoming established around 2200 hours. Speeds should fall below 8 mph, though the highest points along Burton Ridge may remain elevated and out of the S at 5 to 10 mph.

Evans Fire: Winds will transition to becoming downslope/down-valley (generally N-NE) with speeds under 8 mph. Along the ridgeline, S winds are possible with speeds between 5 and 10 mph.

Stability: Inversion setting in around 2300-0200 (Wednesday). Smoke likely becoming trapped beneath inversion in valleys. CHANCE OF RAIN: 0% TRANSPORT WINDS: Becoming more northeasterly at 5 to 10 mph. LAL: 1

EXTENDED OUTLOOK: The primary concern in the extended outlook will be for an increasingly likely critical fire weather threat across the incident area (east zone) Wednesday and Thursday. Winds will continue to ramp up through mid-week with the strongest winds and lowest afternoon RH expected on Wednesday afternoon. Winds may gust as high as 30 mph along aligned drainages and ridgelines. Afternoon humidity will approach the single digits with overnight humidity recovery near or below 30%. A wind shift is anticipated during the day on Thursday and SW-W winds will become NW-N through the day.

Fuels: ERC's will remain at or above the 97th percentile. All fuels are receptive to burn.

OUTPUTS

FIRE BEHAVIOR

GENERAL: Hot, dry, and windy weather. Main fire progression will continue to the northeast. Wind driven runs in the flats have been observed to cover a distance of 1mile+. Where wind and slope align expect the potential for extreme fire behavior to include sustained crown runs and long-range spotting (1mile+). In general, spotting will be less than ½ mile and from rollout. Fire will remain active under the smoke. Watch for fire whirl development at intersecting drainages and on the lee side of any large column.

The fire will remain active at night along ridge tops and in canyon bottoms that align with the down canyon winds.

All fuels are available to burn.

Increased clearing and ventilation will increase fire activity in the afternoon.

We have transitioned to a hot, dry, and breezy trend, the same conditions were present when the fire started.

SPECIFIC:

East Zone:

Branch XX: The fire will continue to impact the HWY 70/89 corridors and threaten structures. Expect very active fire behavior and challenges to containment lines. Unburned areas inside the main perimeter will continue to burn out, interior flare ups are likely. Potential exists for fire to threaten structures along Rush Creek, Caribou road, and HWY 89. ***Fire is established on both sides of HWY 89. Winds have been observed to battle up and down canyon making fire whirls and cross canyon spotting probable***.

XXIII: Active patrol for spot fires is necessary. If the fire spots out of existing lines, expect challenges to containment. Unburned areas inside the main perimeter will continue to burn out, interior flare ups are likely. *** Line construction in Montgomery Creek has been successful, however be on the look out for spots.***

Branch XXV: Expect active flanking and head fire runs along the ridges. The fire will continue to back and flank into the valley. If fire becomes established east of Buck's Lake expect wind aligned runs with rapid rates of spread to the east. As the fire moves east it will burn into difficult terrain and align with west facing slopes. Direct attack has been challenging, expect this to continue. General westerly flow will challenge north/south running containment lines. ***Wind will test containment lines***.

Evans Fire: Minimal forward progression is forecasted unless strong winds affect the fire area. Fuels in the Moonlight burn scar are sparse and spread is highly dependent on wind. Jackpots of heavy fuels will burn intensely. **All Branches:** ***If fire gets established outside of containment lines, expect challenges to containment. Spotting has been a problem across the fire and will continue.***

AIR OPERATIONS: Smoke will limit air operations to the north and east sides of the fire area.

SAFETY

- Heavy smoke will impair visibility for lookouts.
- Roads will be impacted by roll out debris and falling snags in any burn area.
- Smoke impacts to powerlines, review powerline safety in the IRPG.
- Unburned fuel between you and the fire.

Please don't make any assumptions out there.

- ➤ Snags and Hazard Trees Follow Hazard Tree Safety Guidelines (IRPG p. 22). Limit number of personnel around snags and their exposure time; fallers must be qualified for trees being felled. Be especially alert around snags after dark. Check overhead for dead branches and make a good assessment prior to parking your vehicles.
- ➤ **Driving on the Incident** Many of the roads are very narrow with minimal turn-outs. Practice defensive driving at all times. Adhere to posted speed limits and drive with headlights on. Be alert for wildlife on roads at all times. Increase following distances on dusty roads.
- Hazardous Terrain Steep terrain is one of the most serious hazards on this incident. Rolling material has been a major issue. Rocks and trees have been loosened or dislodged by the fire. Evaluate your work area closely before entering. Spread personnel out farther than 10 feet apart. Stagger personnel so they are not working or walking directly below each other.
- > Hydration & Fatigue Monitor yourself and those you supervise. Be alert for signs of fatigue and take breaks as necessary. Maintain 2:1 work/rest ratio. It's going to get warmer here.

Air Operations

- Follow aviation watch out situations on page 46 of the IRPG.
- Don't plan on air resources for medical transport or resupply.
- Refer to page 58 of the IRPG for properly directing retardant and bucket drops.

- Look for flying objects and debris from nearby retardant and water drops.
- Be sure to always monitor the air to ground frequency so that you are not caught off guard.



- Grab a GPS point, bump it up the chain of command or directly inform a Resource Advisor on the line or in camp.

Stav Out!

- READs will be using flagging for areas to avoid suppression activities. Strip of red/black flagging.
- For more information, please consult with a READ.

Food & Wildlife

• Throwing away and storing food in proper containers can keep wildlife off the line which prevents encounters with firefighters as well as future harm to the animals.

Riparian Areas

- Meadows are natural barriers. Tie the line to them, not through them. If line is needed, go around and outside of the meadow to avoid damage.
- Stream and creeks will not be used as line. If needing to cross, minimize damage (i.e. on a dozer lift the blade and only track over) to prevent post-fire stability issues. Do not push or cut line through or along them.

Water Drafting Sites

- Access the water source while trying your best to minimize damage to the soil and vegetation.
- If using a portable pump, make sure there is a spill kit and absorption pads to catch any accidental spills.
- Place portable pumps as far away as you can from the water source. Use screens on the intakes.
- Store fuel cans away from the water source and on a flat surface.

Working in the Wilderness

- Follow MIST for suppression actions.
- Utilize system trails as much as possible for travel and/or handline.
- Consult with READs for spike camps, helispots, and sling sites locations.
- Practice "Leave No Trace" as much as possible.
- Work with READs to minimize visual impacts to wilderness areas when possible.

Suppression Repair

- Utilize and coordinate with READs when implementing suppression repair plan.
- READs will determine when a line is completed by "approving" the line verbally and/or in ArcGIS Collector.




Figure 1 – Bird's eye view of water bars that are acceptable vs. unacceptable

- Where the use of waterbars are applicable, see figure 1 for a visual bird's eye view. Questions? Ask a READ.






