


WEATHER DISCUSSION: ...RED FLAG WARNING 100 PM WED TO 800 PM THU...
CRITICAL FIRE WEATHER conditions are expected through the operational periods. Southwesterly and upvalley winds will gust 20-40 MPH this afternoon and evening, before diminishing overnight. Relative humidity will drop to the 5-12% range today with poor to moderate recovery tonight. The critical fire weather conditions will continue through Thursday evening.

WEATHER FORECAST:

WEATHER: Partly cloudy. Areas of smoke.

MAX TEMPERATURES: Ridges/Upper Slopes: 84-92.
Valleys/Lower Slopes: 90-98.

MIN HUMIDITY: 5-12%.

20 FT WINDS:
RIDGETOP - Variable 4-8 MPH becoming south to southwest 10-20 MPH with gusts 25-35 MPH by the afternoon. Isolated gusts 40 MPH possible along well exposed ridges.
SLOPE/VALLEY - Variable/upslope 4-8 MPH becoming upvalley 8-15 MPH with gusts 20-25 MPH in the afternoon.

STABILITY/INVERSION: Inversion lifting around 1200.

WEATHER: Partly cloudy. Areas of smoke.

MIN TEMPERATURES: Ridges/Upper Slopes: 56-66.
Valleys/Lower Slopes: 48-58.


MAX HUMIDITY: Ridges/Upper Slopes: 25-40%.
Valleys/Lower Slopes: 35-55%.

20 FT WINDS:
RIDGETOP - South to southwest 10-20 MPH with gusts 25-35 MPH early, decreasing to 6-12 MPH with gusts 15-20 MPH overnight.
SLOPE/VALLEY - Upvalley 6-12 MPH with gusts 15 to 20 MPH early, becoming variable 4-8 MPH.

STABILITY/INVERSION: Inversion developing after 2200.

EXTENDED OUTLOOK: Critical fire weather conditions will continue through Thursday evening with gusty winds and low relative humidity. The winds will shift to a more NW direction Thursday evening. For Friday through the weekend, seasonable conditions will prevail with typical diurnal winds.

FIRE BEHAVIOR

Red Flag Warning over the next few operational periods. The fire environment is primed for large fire growth. Expect all fuels to be available for ignition, both live and dead. Any open line is subject to the strong SW winds and spotting. Fire activity has shown to increase at approximately 1400 to 1500. Divisions that appear dormant can become very active where fuel, slope and fuel align. Expect fire behavior to increase once the inversion lifts (1200).

SPECIFIC FIRE BEHAVIOR:

Branch XX

Division N: Minimal fire behavior, interior smoldering. Potential for rollout into the North Fork Feather River drainage and spotting with SW wind.

Division O: Anticipate active fire behavior in the area of Hwy 89 and Hauns Rd., Surface fire runs and crown fire with alignment. Spotting potential from SW winds (.5-1 mile)

Division P/Q: Minimal activity, interior smoldering. Open line is subject to SW winds.

Greenville Contingency

Potential for active fire behavior similar to Division O to include structure defense.

Branch XXIII

Division R/U/V: Minimal activity, Interior smoldering.

Division W: Minimal activity, Interior smoldering. Open line is subject to SW winds.

Division X/Z: Minimal activity, interior smoldering

Meadow Valley

No fire behavior expected.

Night Branch

Cooler temperatures and low RH in the beginning of the shift. Moderate RH recovery on ridge tops and up to 55% in the valleys. Be mindful of wind shifts and speeds due to topographical features. The shift will start with a Pig of 70-80% diminishing after sunset. Expect fire activity to diminish in the morning hours. Potential for large fire growth and intensity continues to exist at night.

OPERATIONAL TEMPO

Maintaining operational tempo is not solely about speeding up to match or exceed the pace of the environment. It is also about knowing when operations should slow down and why.

We are most vulnerable to accidents and errors when operational tempo changes, especially when it changes quickly.

Maintaining good situation awareness despite change in operational tempo represents a considerable challenge.

The key to managing operational tempo successfully is monitoring the changing environment and capabilities of the team, and then applying good judgment to determine whether to push forward or pull back while making necessary adjustments.

Be sure all elements of your safety plan are in place prior to Engagement!!
