- Provide timely and continuous incident information to affected agency partners, cooperators, California Team 4 as well as the public.
- Maintain fiscal accountability and keep costs commensurate with values at risk.

- Keep the fire north of fire perimeter and Highway 162 and the junction on Highway 70
- Keep the fire south of Highway 44
- Keep the fire east of Highway 32
- Keep the fire west of Genesee Road and Grizzly Ridge to Highway 70

General Situational Awareness

Steep and rugged terrain, critically dry and receptive fuel beds, active area for fire history and drought stressed trees.

Dry Cold Frontal Passage this afternoon

WEATHER DISCUSSION: Thick smoke over the fire again this morning will keep the fire environment moderated through about midday. By early afternoon a weak cold front will pass just north of the region. However it will be close enough to bring some stronger West winds to the ridges. In addition, as this occurs the smoke will lift and clear from the west. As the smoke clears and winds surface be ready for a rapid increase in fire activity this afternoon. The front will bring a reinforcing shot of dry air aloft that will create a more unstable airmass that will allow for more plume dominated fire potential through the afternoon and early evening burn period. Thick smoke will settle over the region after dark with some northeast winds setting up behind the front and aligning with the nighttime downcanyons.

WEATHER FORECAST SUNDAY:

WEATHER: Heavy smoke through midday then clearing west to east afternoon hours.

TEMPERATURES: Upper 70s above 5000 feet and areas of thick smoke. Mid to upper 80s elsewhere.

HUMIDITY: 12-22%

20 FT WINDS:

RIDGETOP – Light through 1100 then increasing Westerly 8-12 mph gusts 20-30 mph.

SLOPE/VALLEY - Light through 1100 then upcanyon 4-8 mph gusts 12 mph.

HAINES INDEX: 5 **LAL:** 1

STABILITY/INVERSION: Inversion lifting 1100-1200 hours, **may dissipate rapidly !!!**

SUNDAY NIGHT: Smoke settling over the fire below 5000 feet otherwise mostly clear.

LOW TEMPERATURES: 44-53 Branch IX and 54-63 Branch V and VII

HUMIDITY: Moderate recovery 35-50%

20 FT WINDS:

RIDGETOP - West 6-12 mph through sunset then Northeast 4-8 mph gusts 10-12 mph overnight.

SLOPE/VALLEY - Northeast downcanyon 4-8 mph gusts 15 mph Branch I

HAINES INDEX: 2 **LAL:** 1 **STABILITY/INVERSION:** Strong nighttime inversion setting up after midnight.

EXTENDED FORECAST: High pressure builds this week with a warming and drying trend as the week wears on. Smoke from the Dixie and nearby fires will be the forecast wild card. Light winds early in the week will likely lead to more smoke but as the ridge builds temperatures will continue to warm with lowering humidity.

INPUTS

WEATHER SUMMARY: ***Dry Cold front passage this afternoon***

The fire area will have heavy smoke in the morning with expected clearing in the afternoon. Temperatures will be in the 70s and 80s with minimum humidity 12 to 22 percent during the day with a west wind 5-10 with gust to 20-30 mph. Overnight the temperatures will be 44 to 63 degrees and humidity recovery to 35 to 50%. Winds overnight will be northeast 4-8 with gust to 12 on the ridges and downslope in the drainages.

OUTPUTS

FIRE BEHAVIOR

GENERAL: ***FUELS AND FIRE BEHAVIOR ADVISORY IN EFFECT FOR THE FIRE AREA***

The smoke will begin to clear the fire area starting midday, but may be replaced by smoke from other fire from throughout the region. Once the smoke starts to clear, expect the fire activity to pick up dramatically. The probability of ignition will be around 40 percent with smoke cover increasing to above 85 percent with clear skies, but with the drought conditions and very dry fuels, spotting will be an issue for much of the operational period. The heavy down fuels are very dry and are receptive to fire brands. Small flare ups can contribute to short to medium range spotting which will travel far enough to potentially cross control lines, limiting these spots by increasing mop up distances will be vital to holding existing control lines.

ERC's at record levels above 97th percentile!!

SPECIFIC:

Branch I, V, VII: Smoldering material will continue to burnout, with ember cast potential from the heavy dead and down. Unburned over story near the control lines could pose a spotting threat if ignited, especially during the evening hours with the downcanyon winds.

Branch IX, XIII, XVI: The fire will continue to progress East and Northeast towards McCoy Flat and Hwy 44. The fire progression will be limited under the smoke cover in the morning. Expect a quick increase in activity near midday with column development when the winds are forecasted to increase. As columns begin to develop, spotting distances of ½ to 1 mile should be expected. Expect single and group torching to be a contributor to fire spread, especially when winds increase and fire moves into steeper terrain. The west portions of the fire will see the clearing skies first with increasing activity. The down canyon winds overnight will advance the fire to the west slowly and create short range spotting potential until the smoke moves back over the fire.

Branch XVIII, Lake, Hamilton: Smoke will remain over these areas for much of the day. Fire activity should be limited to the ground with occasional single tree torching and short range spotting. Clearcut blocks are very receptive fuel beds and provide limited barriers to spread. Expect smoldering and creeping activity in the Lake and Hamilton areas, as smoke will only thin but won't clear completely.

AIR OPERATIONS

Increasing winds should allow for air operations to start sooner, but may also bring smoke in from other fires in the region. The best potential for flight operations should be around 12 on the western portions of the fire and mid-afternoon for the north and eastern branches.

SAFETY

- Mop up should be more extensive in areas that could generate windblown embers across the line.
- Fire weakened trees have a higher probability of falling due to long duration burnout and drought stress.

Fuels and Fire Behavior Advisory

Northern California

July 17, 2021



Subject: Potential for extreme fire behavior due to critically low live and dead fuel moistures, very dry conditions resulting from persistent drought, minimal snowpack and spring precipitation, and elevated fire danger rating values across much of northern California.

Discussion: Fires burning in northern California are exhibiting extreme fire growth based on critical fuel conditions. Fire spread is fuel driven and does not depend on wind to spread. Surface fuels are very receptive to embers. Long range spotting, area ignition, and group torching is occurring on large fires frequently.

Difference from normal conditions: Northern California is in a drought; currently with 90% at Extreme to Exceptional levels. The drought is expected to persist or intensify throughout the fire season. Deficient rainfall and snowpack with early melt off has resulted in fuels that are 4-6 weeks ahead of normal drying/curing rates.

Concerns to Firefighters and the Public:

- Energy Release Component (ERC) at numerous weather stations set record maximums already this year and are running at or above the 97th percentile in most cases. Expect increased fire intensity and spread rates in these areas. Early season extreme fire behavior has been observed in both light and heavy fuels. **Anticipate increased spread rates, spotting, and active nighttime burning.**
- The combination of persistent drought and record-low rainfall and snowpack amounts has led to very low live and dead fuel moistures. Low 1000-hour fuel moistures have been evidenced by complete consumption of dead fuels on recent fires. Live fuel moistures in grasses, shrubs and trees, have already reached critical levels in many areas of Northern California due to limited green-up this spring. **Expect fires to ignite easier and spread faster. Do not expect fires to exhibit reduced fire behavior when entering areas of live fuels; anticipate increased spread rates and spotting.**
- Direct attack is often not feasible under regular diurnal wind conditions with ground resources. And aviation utilization is often insufficient in moderating rate of spread without immediate heavy ground resource response. **Anticipate higher resistance to control in all fuel types.**
- Already this year, Northern California has experienced large fire activity and multiple team deployments. California will likely experience an extended fire season. It is important to be mindful of and manage fatigue for all resources. **Everyone, every day, returns home safely.**

Mitigation Measures:

- Local and inbound fire personnel need to be aware that fire behavior across the state is exceeding normal expectations for this time of the year. **Local briefings need to be thorough and highlight specific fire environment conditions. These include but are not limited to local weather forecasts, Pocket Cards, ERC's, live and dead fuel moistures.**
- Suppression actions need to be based on good anchor points, escape routes, and safety zones. **Remember LCES. Experienced lookouts are essential under these conditions.**
- Base all actions on current and expected behavior of the fire. **Augment initial attack resources as incident activity dictates.**

Area of Concern: Northern California except for the following Predictive Service Areas: North Coast and Bay Marine, west of Highway 101 in Mid-Coast to Mendocino and Diablo-Santa Cruz, and the north eastern portion of Far Eastside.
