

<b><u>Strategic Objectives:</u></b>			
A full suppression strategy is to be utilized on the Dixie Incident. Strategy and tactics implemented on the incident are to be prioritized utilizing life safety, community infrastructure defense, and natural/cultural values as a guiding principle. Minimize acres burned on all lands by efficient firefighting efforts that offer the highest probability of success while maintaining safety first.			
<b><u>Leaders Intent:</u></b>			
Work effectively with cooperative partners towards a common goal of protecting values in a safe and efficient manner. All incident assigned personnel should be prepared to take appropriate actions regarding:			
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>· Professional behavior, conduct timely/effective communications</li> <li>· Personal safety and safety of others, including driving slowly, safely, and defensively with the implementation of tactics that offer a high probability of success.</li> <li>· Manage fatigue by taking breaks and maintaining work rest guidelines.</li> <li>· All line supervision personnel, including crew and strike team leaders, must attend the morning Operational Briefing.</li> </ul>			
<b><u>Management Objectives:</u></b>			
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>· Utilize the risk management process to identify and mitigate hazards to protect first responders and the public. Emphasize strategies and tactics that have the highest probability of success and the least exposure to firefighters and the public</li> <li>· Develop strategies to protect life, property, communities, businesses and infrastructure. Employ tactics that fulfill these strategies while being mindful of the necessity for contingency and emergency plans. Ensure strategies account for incident priorities, applying resources to those with the highest consequences first.</li> <li>· Follow COVID-19, CDC and established local, state and federal guidance to limit virus spread within the incident and surrounding communities near the fire area.</li> <li>· Provide timely and continuous incident information to affected agency partners, cooperators, CALFIRE Team 3, as well as the public.</li> <li>· Maintain fiscal accountability and keep costs commensurate with values at risk.</li> </ul>



**FUELS:** The major fuel types, found in and around the fire area are timber understory and brush.

**Ignition Receptiveness:** ERC levels are just below the 97<sup>th</sup> percentile. **Probability of Ignition** 90-100%

**Dryness:** Dead and down fuel moistures: 1 hour – 3% **10 hour- 5%**, 100 hour -5%, and 1000 hour-5%.

### FIRE BEHAVIOR

Potential for plume dominated fire based on the forecasted weather and fire behavior, **look up, look down, look all around**. Fire intensity will increase with clear air. The Sheep fire (2020) burn scar should slow forward progression to the NE. Be mindful of wind prone areas and spotting potential (Dyer Mt., Coyote Peak, Lone Rock, Hunt Canyon).

### SPECIFIC FIRE BEHAVIOR:

#### Branch XX

**Evans Group:** Anticipate active fire behavior to include surface fire, group torching and spotting into the Wildcat Ridge area. The fire has proven to move through the Moonlight burn scar without resistance.

**Dyer Group:** Moderate fire behavior, fuel driven flanking fire near Coyote Peak, moving at a slow ROS towards Hamilton Mountain. Expect uphill movement on Dyer Mt. and spotting into the Mountain Meadows area.

**Hunt Group:** Anticipate Moderate fire behavior, flanking fire in Hunt Cyn. and potential for spotting across the North Arm of the Indian Valley (Diamond Mt. Rd.)

#### Branch XXV

**Division QQ:** Moderate activity, interior smoldering and flanking in the Hunt Canyon area.

**Division RR:** Minimal activity, interior smoldering.

**Division WW:** Minimal activity, interior smoldering.

**Division XX:** Minimal activity, interior smoldering.

#### Night Branch

Mild to high temperatures and low RH in the beginning of the shift. Moderate to good RH recovery (up to 65%). Improved conditions should provide opportunities to reinforce containment lines and reduce spotting potential. Fire behavior should moderate in the early morning hours. The shift will start with a higher probability of ignition as a slightly warmer Day Shift is forecasted. Inversion developing after 2100.

## Common Denominators

There are five major common denominators of fire behavior on fatal and near-fatal fires. Such fires often occur:

- On relatively small fires or deceptively quiet areas of large fires.
- In relatively light fuels, such as grass, herbs, and light brush.
- When there is an unexpected shift in wind direction or in wind speed.
- When fire responds to topographic conditions and runs uphill.
- Critical burn period between 1400 and 1700 with clear air.

## Building Positive Work Culture

- Establish daily individual goals to assist organizational success.
- Foster positive work relationships with all members of the organization.
- Be a proactive listener. Hear what discussions other workers are having.
- Care for the well-being of all employees.
- Be flexible and transparent.

## Escape Route/Safety Zone Checklist

### Escape Routes:

- More than one escape route
- Scouted – soils, vegetation, slope
- Timed – slowest person, fatigue, dozer speed
- Marked – flagged for day and night use

### Safety Zones:

- Survivable without a shelter
- Natural – clean burn, water, bare soil/rock
- Manmade – constructed sites, roads
- Scouted for size and hazards
- Close enough considering escape time needed

### Remember and Follow:

- The 10 Standard Fire Orders
- The 18 Situations That Shout Watch Out
- The Common Denominators of Fire Behavior on Tragic Fires
- The Downhill Line Construction Guidelines

## Leadership is All About Character

Fire leaders set the example by exhibiting strong character. Character is based on values. It is the combination of actions and words that others appraise to determine if the leader can be trusted to do the right thing

- Know our values, review them frequently, and look for areas of improvement.
- Admitting when we are wrong.
- Taking time to reflect on our actions.
- Finding role models and asking them to be a mentor.
- Studying leaders and leadership, learning from their successes and mistakes.

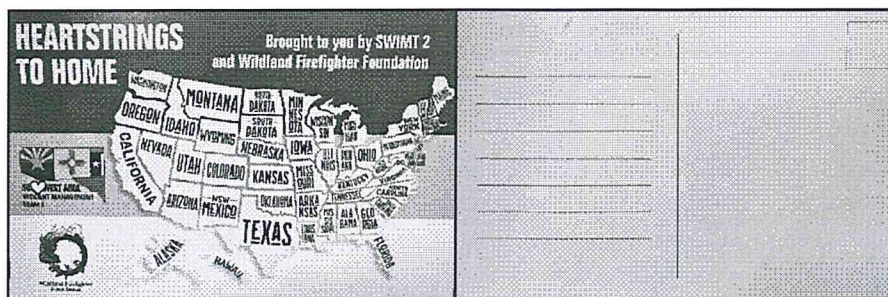

# RESOURCE ADVISOR MESSAGE

## Reporting of Cultural Sites

- Do not use the radio. Looters listen to our frequencies and will note where you find things.
- Grab a GPS point, bump it up the chain of command or directly inform a Resource Advisor on the line or in camp.

## Stay Out!

- **READs will be using flagging for areas to avoid suppression activities. Strip of red/black flagging.**
- For more information, please consult with a READ.

## Food & Wildlife

- Throwing away and storing food in proper containers can keep wildlife off the line which prevents encounters with firefighters as well as future harm to the animals.

## Riparian Areas

- Meadows are natural barriers. Tie the line to them, not through them. If line is needed, go around and outside of the meadow to avoid damage.
- Stream and creeks will not be used as line. If needing to cross, minimize damage (i.e. on a dozer lift the blade and only track over) to prevent post-fire stability issues. Do not push or cut line through or along them.

## Water Drafting Sites

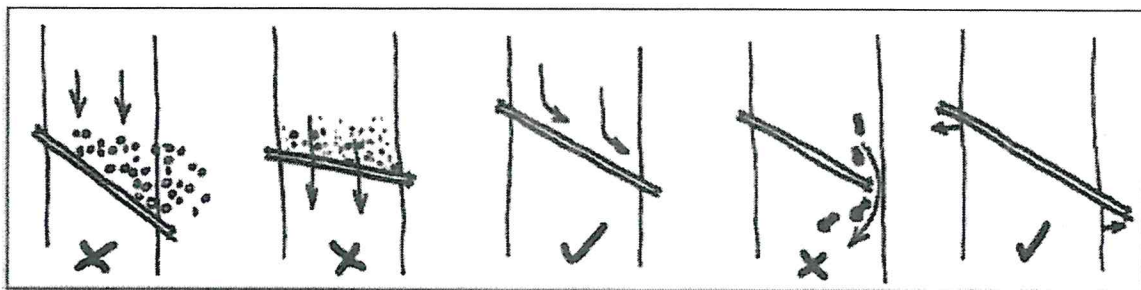
- Access the water source while trying your best to minimize damage to the soil and vegetation.
- If using a portable pump, make sure there is a spill kit and absorption pads to catch any accidental spills.
- Place portable pumps as far away as you can from the water source. Use screens on the intakes.
- Store fuel cans away from the water source and on a flat surface.

## Working in the Wilderness

- Follow MIST for suppression actions.
- Utilize system trails as much as possible for travel and/or handline.
- Consult with READs for spike camps, helispots, and sling sites locations.
- Practice "Leave No Trace" as much as possible.
- Work with READs to minimize visual impacts to wilderness areas when possible.

## Suppression Repair

- Utilize and coordinate with READs when implementing suppression repair plan.
- READs will determine when a line is completed by "approving" the line verbally and/or in ArcGIS Collector.
- Where the use of waterbars are applicable, see visual bird's eye view below. Questions? Ask a READ.

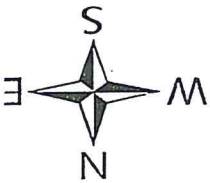
