# Dixie West Zone Fire Weather Forecast

## WEATHER DISCUSSION:

Upper level high pressure will continue its grip on the Pacific Northwest through the weekend with a continuation of hot and dry conditions. The atmosphere remains very unstable and with mid-level moisture in place, isolated thunderstorms are expected this afternoon and large plume development is possible. While there may be some minimal amounts of precipitation under the storm cores, the primary concern will be gusty and erratic outflow winds, especially if these winds are channeled with topography. Dry lightning strikes away from the core of the storms will also be possible. Smoke will remain the wildcard in the forecast moving forward. Outside of any convective cells that do develop, winds will remain generally light and primarily driven by terrain due to the high pressure over head. Temperatures will remain very warm and humidity low in the afternoon with poor recovery at night along the mid slopes in particular.

**WEATHER FORECAST FRIDAY:** Smoke and haze will persist. Clear skies above the smoke will become partly cloudy in the afternoon. Isolated thunderstorms possible in the afternoon through early evening hours. Thunderstorms imply gusty and erratic winds.

**TEMPERATURES:**  
**Ridge Top:** Highs: 83-88  
**Slope/Valley:** Highs: 93-98

**HUMIDITY:**  
**Ridge Top:** Min: 17-22 %  
**Slope/Valley:** Min: 12-17 %

**20 FT WINDS:** **Ridge Top:** Light northeast winds in the morning, shifting to the southwest by early afternoon and increasing to 7-10 mph with gusts of 15 mph. Terrain will continue to largely dictate winds.  
**Slope/Valley:** Downslope/down-valley 2-4 mph in the morning, becoming west to southwest in the afternoon and increasing to 5 to 10 mph. Terrain will continue to largely dictate winds.

**CHANCE OF THUNDERSTORMS:** 20% - LAL: 2 - Haines Index: 6

**STABILITY/INVERSION:** Morning inversion decreasing by 1300 hours. Smoke will thin.

**WEATHER FORECAST FRIDAY NIGHT:** Partly cloudy with widespread smoke and haze. Poor overnight recovery along the mid slopes. Isolated thunderstorms will be possible through mid-evening.

**TEMPERATURES:**  
**Ridge Top:** Lows: 55-60  
**Slope/Valley:** Lows: 48-54

**HUMIDITY:**  
**Ridge Top:** Max: 34-39 %  
**Slope/Valley:** Max: 44-49 %

**20 FT WINDS:** **Ridge Top:** Northwest 5-10 mph. Terrain will continue to largely dictate winds.  
**Slope/Valley:** West to southwest 5 to 10 mph in the evening, becoming downslope/down-valley 2-5 mph by morning. Terrain will continue to largely dictate winds.

**CHANCE OF THUNDERSTORMS:** 10% early - LAL: 2 - Haines Index: 5

**STABILITY/INVERSION/:** Strong inversion developing after midnight with poor dispersion

## EXTENDED OUTLOOK:

High pressure will continue through the weekend but then it will begin contract to the Great Basin early next week as a trough of low pressure approaches the west coast. This will result in a dry, stable southwest flow aloft with cooler temperatures but locally breezy conditions with gusts in excess of 30 mph not out of the question Monday.

## INPUTS

### WEATHER SUMMARY:

The fire area will start with thinner smoke in the morning with additional thinning expected in the afternoon. Temperatures will be mid 80's to upper 90's with minimum humidity dropping to 12 to 22% during the day. Winds will be light early out of the Northeast, shifting to the Southwest 7-10 mph gusting to 15 mph in the afternoon, generally on the ridgetops. Overnight the temperatures will be upper 40's to mid-60's with humidity recovery at 34 - 49%. Winds overnight will be downslope/down valley 2-5mph.

## OUTPUTS

### FIRE BEHAVIOR

**GENERAL: \*\*\*FUELS AND FIRE BEHAVIOR ADVISORY IN EFFECT FOR THE FIRE AREA\*\*\***

Light smoke will be over much of the fire this morning and will continue to clear with the change in weather occurring today. Expect a general overall increase in fire activity with the increase in ridgetop winds, with the strong possibility of column development due to atmospheric instability. The probability of ignition will be around 60% with smoke cover increasing to near 100% when the skies clear. Spotting distances of ½ to 1 mile in topographic favored areas. The heavy down fuels are very dry and receptive to spots; they continue to consume almost completely. Ember cast and spots may smolder for some time before they become active enough to show themselves, pay extra attention to downwind locations in the green.

**ERC's at record levels above 97<sup>th</sup> percentile!!**

### SPECIFIC:

**Butte Sector:** Smoldering material will continue to burnout, especially in the stump holes and large dead and down. Northeast winds along with outflow winds from may push smoke and embers into the sector, be aware of the change in wind direction and speed due to channeling in the topography.

**Lassen Sector:** Expect activity to increase with terrain channeled winds, increased ridgetop winds and unstable conditions. The fire progression is mainly ground fire with single and group tree torching possible in the morning. As the day heats up and smoke thins, expect increased activity and spotting, with increasing rates of spread. Exceptionally dry fuels are very receptive to ember cast and have been resistive to direct control efforts without large control lines. The down canyon winds overnight will be light overall, but will be enhanced by topographic features and outflow conditions.

**Westwood Sector:** Smoldering and limited ground fire in the green pockets and residual burning in the Lake branch. Fire activity will be primarily driven by topography and fuels on the perimeter divisions with localized light winds causing short range spotting to be possible in the morning. As the smoke thins and instability moves over the fire area, expect an increase in activity that can challenge control lines. Expect any spot fires to become established in the heavy dead and down fuels, especially during strong outflow wind conditions.

## AIR OPERATIONS

Air operations will be limited today in the morning, but as the smoke clears throughout the day, opportunities to utilize aircraft will become available.

## SAFETY

- Make sure to identify escape routes and safety zones early in the shift.

# Fuels and Fire Behavior Advisory

## Northern California

August 2, 2021 to August 16, 2021



**Subject:** Potential for extreme fire behavior due to critically low live and dead fuel moistures, very dry conditions resulting from persistent drought, minimal snowpack and spring precipitation, and elevated fire danger rating values across much of northern California.

**Discussion:** Fires burning in northern California are exhibiting extreme fire growth based on critical fuel conditions. Fire spread is fuel driven and does not depend on wind to spread. Surface fuels are very receptive to embers. Long range spotting, area ignition, and group torching is occurring on large fires frequently.

**Difference from normal conditions:** Northern California is in a drought; currently with 90% at Extreme to Exceptional levels. The drought is expected to persist or intensify thorough out the fire season. Deficient rainfall and snowpack with early melt off has resulted in fuels that are below average in dryness, with record setting conditions for most areas.

### Concerns to Firefighters and the Public:

- Energy Release Component (ERC) at numerous weather stations set record maximums already this year and are running at or above the 97<sup>th</sup> percentile in most cases. Expect increased fire intensity and spread rates in these areas. Early season extreme fire behavior has been observed in both light and heavy fuels. **Anticipate increased spread rates, spotting, and active nighttime burning.**
- The combination of persistent drought and record-low rainfall and snowpack amounts has led to very low live and dead fuel moistures. Low 1000-hour fuel moistures have been evidenced by complete consumption of dead fuels on recent fires. Live fuel moistures in grasses, shrubs and trees, have already reached critical levels in many areas of Northern California due to limited green-up this spring. **Expect fires to ignite easier and spread faster. Do not expect fires to exhibit reduced fire behavior when entering areas of live fuels; anticipate increased spread rates and spotting.**
- Direct attack is often not feasible under regular diurnal wind conditions with ground resources. And aviation utilization is often insufficient in moderating rate of spread without immediate heavy ground resource response. **Anticipate higher resistance to control in all fuel types.**
- Already this year, Northern California has experienced large fire activity and multiple team deployments. California will likely experience an extended fire season. It is important to be mindful of and manage fatigue for all resources. **Everyone, every day, returns home safely.**

### Mitigation Measures:

- Local and inbound fire personnel need to be aware that fire behavior across the state is exceeding normal expectations for this time of the year. **Local briefings need to be thorough and highlight specific fire environment conditions. These include but are not limited to local weather forecasts, Pocket Cards, ERC's, live and dead fuel moistures.**
- Suppression actions need to be based on good anchor points, escape routes, and safety zones. **Remember LCES. Experienced lookouts are essential under these conditions.**
- Base all actions on current and expected behavior of the fire. **Augment initial attack resources as incident activity dictates.**

**Area of Concern:** Northern California except for the following Predictive Service Areas: North Coast and Bay Marine, west of Highway 101 in Mid-Coast to Mendocino and Diablo-Santa Cruz, and the north eastern portion of Far Eastside.

- Look for depressions in the ground.
- Use your hand tool to sound your way into the burn.
- White ash may be an indicator of an ash pit.
- Ensure that PPE is worn and properly fitted.

## *Thunderstorm Safety Alert*

### *Thunderstorm Safety*

Approaching thunderstorms may be noted by a sudden reverse in wind direction, a noticeable rise in wind speed, and a sharp drop in temperature. Rain, hail, and lightning occur only in the mature stage of a thunderstorm.

### *Situational Awareness*

Observe the 30/30 rule: If you see lightning and hear the thunderclaps following in less than 30 seconds take the storm precautions identified below. Do not resume work in exposed areas until 30 minutes after storm activity has passed.

### *Hazard Control*

- Take shelter in a vehicle or building if possible.
- If outdoors, find a low spot away from tall trees, wire fences, utility lines and other elevated conductive objects. Make sure the place you pick is not subject to flooding.
- If in the woods, move to an area with shorter trees.
- If only isolated trees are nearby, keep your distance twice the tree height.
- If in open county, crouch low with feet together, minimizing contact with the ground. You can use a pack to sit on, but never lay on the ground.
- If you feel your skin tingle or your hair stand on end, immediately crouch low to the ground. Make yourself the smallest possible target and minimize your contact with the ground.
- Don't group together.
- Don't stay on ridge tops, wide open areas, or near ledges or rock outcroppings.
- Don't operate landlines telephones, machinery, or electric motors.
- Don't handle flammable materials in open containers or metal hand tools.

### Fire and COVID-19 Briefing Checklist

#### Self-Awareness / Screening

- Immediately separate yourself from others.
- Notify supervisor if you or others experience:
  - Cough, more than expected
  - Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
  - New loss of taste or smell
  - Fever                      ○ Sore throat
  - Chills                      ○ Muscle pain
- Review and follow crew and division plans to isolate, triage, and transport symptomatic personnel.

#### Hygiene on the Fireline

- Properly wash or sanitize your hands often, especially before and after eating or entering a public place, and after coughing or sneezing.
- Avoid handshakes and communal use items.
- Maintain a supply of hand sanitizer and hand wipes. Inform supervisor of needed resupply.
- Disinfect high touch surfaces often:
  - Radios, phones, doors, pumps, fuel cans, etc.

#### Social Distancing and Protective Equipment

- Initiate, practice, and remind others of social distancing.
- Conduct briefings and conversations outdoors and at least 6 feet apart.
- Utilize face coverings as a tool when practical.
- Clean or replace dirty face coverings, equipment, and PPE.

#### Communications

- Face coverings and social distancing complicate communications. Ensure effective sender/receiver messaging.
