**Strategic Objective**

Implement a full suppression strategy on the Dixie Fire. Strategy and Tactics implemented on the incident are to be prioritize utilizing life safety, community infrastructure defense, and natural/cultural values as a guiding principal. Minimize acres burned on all lands by effective and efficient firefighting efforts that offer the highest probability of success while maintaining safety first.

**Leaders Intent**

Work effectively with cooperative partners towards a common goal of protecting values in a safe and efficient manner. All incident assigned personnel should be prepared to take the appropriate actions regarding:

- Professional behavior, conduct timely / effective communications
- Personal safety and safety of others, including driving slowly, safely and defensively Implementation of tactics that offer a high probability of success
- Manage fatigue by taking breaks and maintaining work rest guidelines
- All line supervision personnel including crew and striketeam leaders must attend the morning Operational Briefing

**Management Objectives**

- Utilize the risk management process to identify and mitigate hazards to protect first responders and the public. Emphasize strategies and tactics that have the highest probability of success and the least exposure to first responders and the public.
- Develop proactive strategies to protect life, residential properties, communities, businesses and infrastructure. Employ tactics that fulfill these strategies while being mindful of the necessity for contingency and emergency plans. Ensure strategies account for incident priorities, applying resources to those protecting life and residential properties first.
- Follow COVID-19, CDC and established local, state and federal guidance to limit virus spread within the incident and surrounding communities near the fire area.
- Provide timely and continuous incident information to affected agency partners, cooperators, California Team 4 as well as the public.
- Utilize social media and all other communications tools to keep the public well informed of the fire conditions and other pertinent information.
- Maintain fiscal accountability and keep costs commensurate with values at risk.

**Control Objectives**

- Keep the fire north of fire perimeter and Highway 162 and the junction on Highway 70
- Keep the fire south of Harvey Valley Road
- Keep the fire east of Mill Creek drainage
- Keep the fire west of Genesee Valley Road and Grizzly Ridge to Highway 70 and Highway 395 to limit fire spread

**General Situational Awareness**

Steep and rugged terrain, critically dry and receptive fuel beds, active area for fire history and drought stressed trees.

# Dixie West Zone Fire Weather Forecast

### WEATHER DISCUSSION:

Upper level high pressure will continue to dominate the Pacific Northwest keeping very warm and dry conditions over the incident. As always, with the amount of smoke being produced by this incident and other nearby fires, it will be the wildcard moving forward. If the smoke does clear enough this afternoon, there is enough instability and leftover moisture that a stray thunderstorm cannot be ruled out but the overall possibility is very low. Any thunderstorm will be capable of producing gusty and erratic outflow winds. Otherwise, it will remain very warm with low afternoon humidity and poor recovery at night, especially along the mid slopes. Upper level low pressure will move into the Pacific Northwest early next week and while it will be slightly cooler, it will remain dry with breezy conditions developing.

**WEATHER FORECAST SATURDAY:** Smoke and haze. Clear skies above the smoke will become partly cloudy in the afternoon. A stray thunderstorm remains possible in the afternoon through early evening hours. Thunderstorms imply gusty and erratic winds.

**TEMPERATURES:**  
**Ridge Top:** Highs: 83-88  
**Slope/Valley:** Highs: 93-98

**HUMIDITY:**  
**Ridge Top:** Min: 17-22 %  
**Slope/Valley:** Min: 12-17 %

**20 FT WINDS:** **Ridge Top:** Light and variable in the morning, becoming west to southwest by early afternoon and increasing to 7-10 mph with gusts of 15 mph. Terrain will continue to largely dictate winds.  
**Slope/Valley:** Downslope/down-valley 2-4 mph in the morning, becoming west to southwest in the afternoon and increasing to 5 to 10 mph. Terrain will continue to largely dictate winds.

**CHANCE OF THUNDERSTORMS:** 10% - **LAL:** 2 - **Haines Index:** 5  
**STABILITY/INVERSION:** Morning inversion decreasing by 1400 hours. Smoke will thin.

**WEATHER FORECAST SATURDAY NIGHT:** Partly cloudy in the evening, becoming clear by morning with widespread smoke and haze. Poor overnight recovery along the mid slopes. A stray thunderstorm will be possible through mid-evening.

**Ridge Top:** Lows: 55-60  
**Slope/Valley:** Lows: 48-54

**HUMIDITY:**  
**Ridge Top:** Max: 34-39 %  
**Slope/Valley:** Max: 47-52 %

**20 FT WINDS:** **Ridge Top:** West 5-10 mph in the evening, becoming northwest by morning. Terrain will continue to largely dictate winds.  
**Slope/Valley:** West to southwest 5 to 10 mph in the evening, becoming downslope/down-valley 2-5 mph by morning. Terrain will continue to largely dictate winds.

**CHANCE OF THUNDERSTORMS:** 10% early - **LAL:** 2 - **Haines Index:** 5  
**STABILITY/INVERSION:** Strong inversion developing after midnight with poor dispersion

### EXTENDED OUTLOOK:

An upper level trough of low pressure will move into the Pacific Northwest early next week and push the upper level high into the southwest United States. This will result in a dry, stable west to southwest flow aloft with cooler temperatures. This pattern would support locally breezy conditions with gusts in excess of 30 mph not out of the question Monday.

## INPUTS

### WEATHER SUMMARY:

Warm and dry conditions will prevail over the fire again, along with smoke being present for most of the day. Temperatures will be mid 80's to upper 90's with minimum humidity dropping to 12 to 22% during the day. Winds will be light and variable in the morning, shifting to the Southwest 7-10 mph gusting to 15 mph in the afternoon, generally on the ridgetops. Overnight the temperatures will be upper 40's to upper 50's with humidity recovery at 34 - 52%. Winds overnight will be downslope/down valley 2-5mph.

## OUTPUTS

### FIRE BEHAVIOR

**GENERAL: \*\*\*FUELS AND FIRE BEHAVIOR ADVISORY IN EFFECT FOR THE FIRE AREA\*\*\***

Smoke will be over much of the fire this morning and will thin somewhat throughout the day. Some atmospheric stability returns to the fire area, reducing the Haines index to 5. The probability of ignition will be around 60% under the smoke cover, and 80-90% in more clear areas. Spotting distances of 500-1000 feet in topographic favored areas and any downwind locations. The heavy down fuels are very dry and receptive to spots; they continue to consume almost completely. Ember cast and spots may smolder for some time before they become active enough to show themselves, pay extra attention to downwind locations in the green.

**ERC's at record levels above 97<sup>th</sup> percentile!!**

### SPECIFIC:

**Butte Sector:** Smoldering material will continue to burnout, especially in the stump holes and large dead and down. Southwest winds should push smoke and embers into burned area but be aware of potential change in wind direction and speed due to channeling in the topography.

**Lassen Sector:** Fire progression will be mainly ground fire with single and group tree torching possible in the morning. As the day heats up and smoke thins, activity and spotting with increasing rates of spread are possible. The fire spread is dictated by fuel loading and topography, be aware of surface winds that are affected by these factors. Exceptionally dry fuels are very receptive to ember cast and have been resistive to direct control efforts without large control lines. The down canyon winds overnight will be light overall, but will be enhanced by topographic features and outflow conditions.

**Westwood Sector:** Smoldering and creeping ground fire in the green pockets and residual burning in the Lake branch. Fire activity in the Westwood sector and perimeter divisions will be primarily driven by topography and fuels with localized light winds causing short range spotting to be possible. As the smoke thins and surface heating occurs, expect an increase in activity that can challenge control lines. Expect any spot fires to become established in the heavy dead and down fuels, with the potential for growth even under light winds.

## AIR OPERATIONS

Air operations will be limited today in the morning, but as the smoke clears throughout the day, opportunities to utilize aircraft may become available.

## SAFETY

- Snags and stump holes are likely in timber areas.
- Mop up should be more extensive in areas that could generate wind blown embers across the line.

# Fuels and Fire Behavior Advisory

## Northern California

August 2, 2021 to August 16, 2021



**Subject:** Potential for extreme fire behavior due to critically low live and dead fuel moistures, very dry conditions resulting from persistent drought, minimal snowpack and spring precipitation, and elevated fire danger rating values across much of northern California.

**Discussion:** Fires burning in northern California are exhibiting extreme fire growth based on critical fuel conditions. Fire spread is fuel driven and does not depend on wind to spread. Surface fuels are very receptive to embers. Long range spotting, area ignition, and group torching is occurring on large fires frequently.

**Difference from normal conditions:** Northern California is in a drought; currently with 90% at Extreme to Exceptional levels. The drought is expected to persist or intensify through out the fire season. Deficient rainfall and snowpack with early melt off has resulted in fuels that are below average in dryness, with record setting conditions for most areas.

### Concerns to Firefighters and the Public:

- Energy Release Component (ERC) at numerous weather stations set record maximums already this year and are running at or above the 97<sup>th</sup> percentile in most cases. Expect increased fire intensity and spread rates in these areas. Early season extreme fire behavior has been observed in both light and heavy fuels. **Anticipate increased spread rates, spotting, and active nighttime burning.**
- The combination of persistent drought and record-low rainfall and snowpack amounts has led to very low live and dead fuel moistures. Low 1000-hour fuel moistures have been evidenced by complete consumption of dead fuels on recent fires. Live fuel moistures in grasses, shrubs and trees, have already reached critical levels in many areas of Northern California due to limited green-up this spring. **Expect fires to ignite easier and spread faster. Do not expect fires to exhibit reduced fire behavior when entering areas of live fuels; anticipate increased spread rates and spotting.**
- Direct attack is often not feasible under regular diurnal wind conditions with ground resources. And aviation utilization is often insufficient in moderating rate of spread without immediate heavy ground resource response. **Anticipate higher resistance to control in all fuel types.**
- Already this year, Northern California has experienced large fire activity and multiple team deployments. California will likely experience an extended fire season. It is important to be mindful of and manage fatigue for all resources. **Everyone, every day, returns home safely.**

### Mitigation Measures:

- Local and inbound fire personnel need to be aware that fire behavior across the state is exceeding normal expectations for this time of the year. **Local briefings need to be thorough and highlight specific fire environment conditions. These include but are not limited to local weather forecasts, Pocket Cards, ERC's, live and dead fuel moistures.**
- Suppression actions need to be based on good anchor points, escape routes, and safety zones. **Remember LCES. Experienced lookouts are essential under these conditions.**
- Base all actions on current and expected behavior of the fire. **Augment initial attack resources as incident activity dictates.**

**Area of Concern:** Northern California except for the following Predictive Service Areas: North Coast and Bay Marine, west of Highway 101 in Mid-Coast to Mendocino and Diablo-Santa Cruz, and the north eastern portion of Far Eastside.

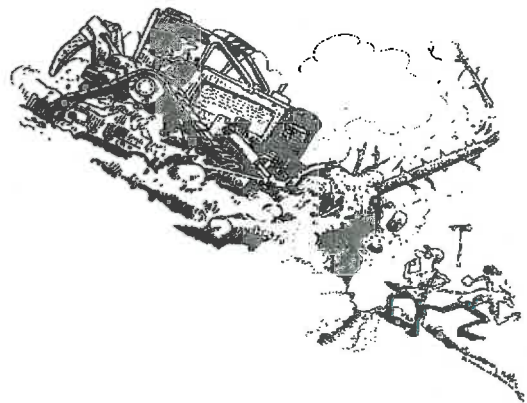

## Fire and COVID-19 Briefing Checklist

### Self-Awareness / Screening

- Immediately separate yourself from others.
- Notify supervisor if you or others experience:
  - Cough, more than expected
  - Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
  - New loss of taste or smell
  - Fever                      ○ Sore throat
  - Chills                      ○ Muscle pain
- Review and follow crew and division plans to isolate, triage, and transport symptomatic personnel.

### Hygiene on the Fireline

- Properly wash or sanitize your hands often, especially before and after eating or entering a public place, and after coughing or sneezing.
- Avoid handshakes and communal use items.
- Maintain a supply of hand sanitizer and hand wipes. Inform supervisor of needed resupply.
- Disinfect high touch surfaces often:
  - Radios, phones, doors, pumps, fuel cans, etc.

### Social Distancing and Protective Equipment

- Initiate, practice, and remind others of social distancing.
- Conduct briefings and conversations outdoors and at least 6 feet apart.
- Utilize face coverings as a tool when practical.
- Clean or replace dirty face coverings, equipment, and PPE.

### Communications

- Face coverings and social distancing complicate communications. Ensure effective sender/receiver messaging.

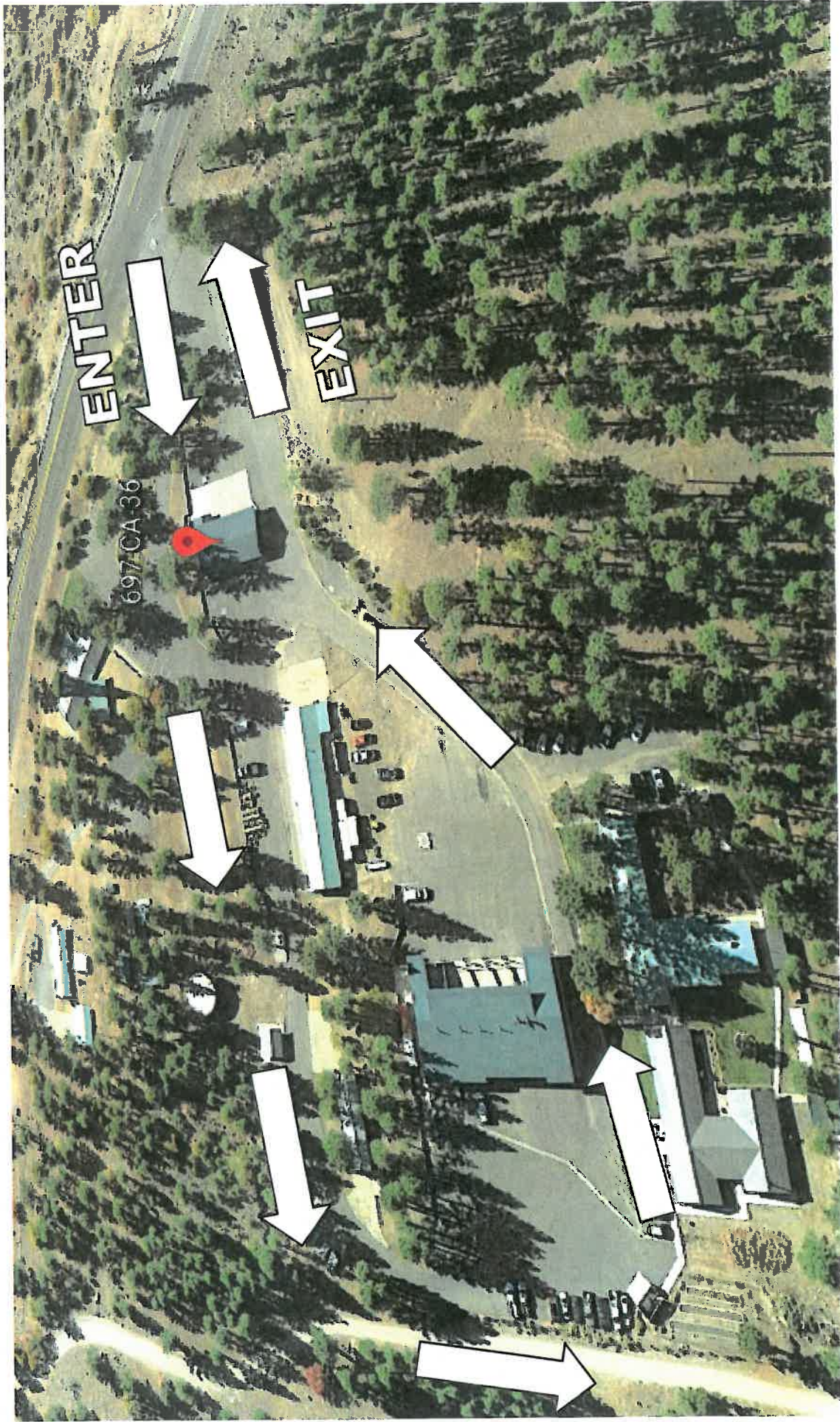
# FUEL ROUTE FROM BASE CAMP
