Employ tactics that fulfill these strategies while being mindful of the necessity for contingency and emergency plans. Ensure strategies account for incident priorities, applying resources to those protecting life and residential properties first. • Follow COVID-19, CDC and established local, state and federal guidance to limit virus spread within the incident and surrounding communities near the fire area. • Provide timely and continuous incident information to affected agency partners, cooperators, CALFIRE Team 3, as well as the public. • Utilize social media and all other communications tools to keep the public well informed of the fire conditions and other pertinent information. • Maintain fiscal accountability and keep costs commensurate with values at risk.

FIRE BEHAVIOR

GENERAL:

- Red Flag conditions continue today, ending tonight at near midnight. Afternoon forecasted winds 5-10 mph than higher today. Prepare for this in afternoon. Know what the fire is doing where it may impact you.
- Nighttime fire behavior will be similar to last night, small change higher Rh but higher windspeed too.

SPECIFIC:

DIV-QQ: Expect afternoon wind driven surface fire, torching and long-range spotting in Antelope Valley. The fire continues to advance to the east towards the Walker fire (2019) burn scar. This a wind prone area.

DIV-NN: Moderate activity in the interior from previous firing operation on Dyer Mountain. Fuel driven flanking fire in the Hamilton Mountain area, advancing north at a slow rate of spread.

Valley Group: Flanking fire in Peters Creek (SW-NE drainage), surface fire, potential for crown runs and spotting with alignment. Anticipate potential increased activity due to strong winds. Minimal activity, interior smoldering on Keddie Point. Minimal activity, interior smoldering in the Hunt Canyon area.

Division RR/WW/XX: Minimal activity, interior smoldering.

Night Branch

Moderate to good RH recovery (up to 65%). Fire behavior should moderate in the late evening. Inversion developing after 2100. The shift will start with a higher probability of ignition as a much warmer day shift is forecasted.

AIR OPERATIONS: Reduced visibility from smoke in the morning. West winds may clear in afternoon.

SAFETY: Fire behavior can change dramatically between shaded and unshaded areas. When smoke clears watch for increased fire behavior.

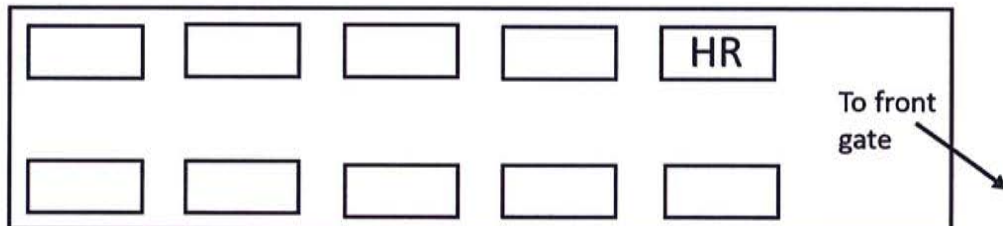

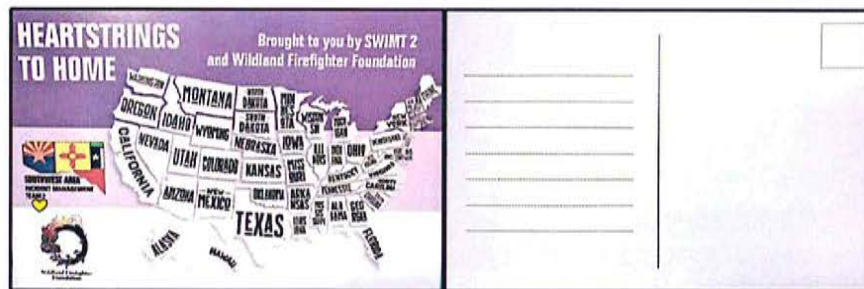
