

WEATHER DISCUSSION:

A dry cold front moved across the region overnight turning our winds around to the northeast. These northeast winds will remain gusty through most of the operational period and will be enhanced somewhat where they align with topography, especially during the afternoon hours. Smoke will likely be over the incident early but eventually those northeast winds should help with ventilation both Wednesday and Thursday. A much drier, cooler and stable air mass will arrive behind the boundary to bring overall benign weather to the incident. Relative humidity will remain low with very poor recovery along the mid slopes.

WEATHER FORECAST WEDNESDAY: Smoke and haze in the morning, becoming mostly sunny in the afternoon.

TEMPERATURES:
Ridge Top: Highs: 71-77
Slope/Valley: Highs: 77-83

HUMIDITY:
Ridge Top: Min: 17-23 %
Slope/Valley: Min: 14-20 %

20 FT WINDS: **Ridge Top:** Northeast 5-10 mph in the morning, increasing to 10-15 mph with localized gusts up to 25 mph in the afternoon.
Slope/Valley: Northeast 3 to 6 mph in the morning, increasing to 10-15 mph with gusts of 20 mph in the afternoon. Localized winds may be higher where topography and winds align.

CHANCE OF THUNDERSTORMS: 0% - LAL: 1 - Haines Index: 4

STABILITY/INVERSION: Weak inversion likely to break by noon. Ventilation will improve dramatically.

WEATHER FORECAST WEDNESDAY NIGHT: Clear. Areas of smoke and haze.

Slope/Valley: Northeast 10-15 mph with gusts to 20 mph in the evening. Becoming NE 5-10 mph by morning. Winds will likely stay higher on exposed slopes and in deeper drainages.

CHANCE OF THUNDERSTORMS: 0% - LAL: 1 - Haines Index: 3

STABILITY/INVERSION: Moderate inversion developing after midnight with poor dispersion

EXTENDED OUTLOOK:

Dry and cooler conditions are expected Thursday with below normal temperatures. Temperatures will warm Friday and over the weekend but remain near or slightly below average. No precipitation or critical fire weather conditions are expected through the weekend. Winds will increase slightly on Saturday as the next upper trough moves through the Pacific Northwest.

INPUTS

WEATHER SUMMARY:

Wind direction will be from the Northeast, a major shift from previous days. Smoke will be over the fire early, but should clear throughout the day. Temperatures will be in the mid-70's to mid-80's with minimum humidity dropping to 14 to 20% during the day. Winds will be Northeast in the morning 5-10 mph, increasing to 10-15 gusting to 25. Overnight the temperatures will be in the lower 40's to lower 50's with humidity recovery at 50-60%, except 35-40% in the mid slope thermal belt areas. Winds overnight will continue from the Northeast at 10-15 mph with 20 mph gusts until early morning hours.

OUTPUTS

FIRE BEHAVIOR

GENERAL: *****FUELS AND FIRE BEHAVIOR ADVISORY IN EFFECT FOR THE FIRE AREA*****

A Smoke layer will be over the fire area to start the day, but will begin to thin around mid-day due to winds increasing. Wind direction will be different than previous days, and therefore challenge the open fire lines differently. Areas that have been sheltered by winds in previous days will now get a push of wind. Expect this change to potentially cause an increase in activity, including single and group tree torching. Exceptionally dry timber stands are very receptive to spotting, and can contribute to large fire growth. The probability of ignition will be around 60% under the smoke cover, and 90% in clear areas. Spotting distances of ¼ to ¾ of a mile are possible in topographic favored areas and any downwind locations.

ERC's at record levels above 97th percentile!!

SPECIFIC:

Butte Sector: Smoldering material will continue to burnout, especially in the stump holes and large dead and down. Minimal heat exists in the sector, expect this to continue as mopup and patrol continues.

Lassen Sector: Fire activity should be moderate to start the shift. Fire activity on the eastern aspects will see winds throughout the day. Expect an increase quickly as the wind exposed slopes begins to experience the forecasted increase in winds. Rugged terrain will channel winds and increase the probability of ember cast and spotting, especially in upper elevations or thinner tree stands. Expect the Morgan fire and the main fire to completely burn together before the end of shift.

Lake Branch: Fire activity in this branch will be primarily smoldering and isolated ground fire. Control lines should not be challenged by the change of wind direction, but be aware of snag trees coming down.

Clear/Susanville/Janesville Branches: Fire progression is primarily fuel and slope driven, but expect short intense runs and plume development in areas where fuel, winds, and topography align. As the smoke clears in the afternoon and if fire becomes established in heavy pockets of fuel in favored topographic features, expect short intense runs and plume development. Wind will be channeled along the escarpment to the southeast and up the Susan river drainage. Expect the steady east winds to influence fire activity for most of the shift and expect the spot fire around Janesville to join the main fire to the West.

AIR OPERATIONS

Air operations will be limited today in the morning, but as the smoke clears throughout the day, opportunities to utilize aircraft will become available.

SAFETY

- Short intense fire runs are possible. Make sure you know where your safety zone is at and the time it takes to get there.
- Watch for spot fires and fire in down-slope position.

Fuels and Fire Behavior Advisory

Northern California

August 2, 2021 to August 16, 2021



Subject: Potential for extreme fire behavior due to critically low live and dead fuel moistures, very dry conditions resulting from persistent drought, minimal snowpack and spring precipitation, and elevated fire danger rating values across much of northern California.

Discussion: Fires burning in northern California are exhibiting extreme fire growth based on critical fuel conditions. Fire spread is fuel driven and does not depend on wind to spread. Surface fuels are very receptive to embers. Long range spotting, area ignition, and group torching is occurring on large fires frequently.

Difference from normal conditions: Northern California is in a drought; currently with 90% at Extreme to Exceptional levels. The drought is expected to persist or intensify through out the fire season. Deficient rainfall and snowpack with early melt off has resulted in fuels that are below average in dryness, with record setting conditions for most areas.

Concerns to Firefighters and the Public:

- Energy Release Component (ERC) at numerous weather stations set record maximums already this year and are running at or above the 97th percentile in most cases. Expect increased fire intensity and spread rates in these areas. Early season extreme fire behavior has been observed in both light and heavy fuels. **Anticipate increased spread rates, spotting, and active nighttime burning.**
- The combination of persistent drought and record-low rainfall and snowpack amounts has led to very low live and dead fuel moistures. Low 1000-hour fuel moistures have been evidenced by complete consumption of dead fuels on recent fires. Live fuel moistures in grasses, shrubs and trees, have already reached critical levels in many areas of Northern California due to limited green-up this spring. **Expect fires to ignite easier and spread faster. Do not expect fires to exhibit reduced fire behavior when entering areas of live fuels; anticipate increased spread rates and spotting.**
- Direct attack is often not feasible under regular diurnal wind conditions with ground resources. And aviation utilization is often insufficient in moderating rate of spread without immediate heavy ground resource response. **Anticipate higher resistance to control in all fuel types.**
- Already this year, Northern California has experienced large fire activity and multiple team deployments. California will likely experience an extended fire season. It is important to be mindful of and manage fatigue for all resources. **Everyone, every day, returns home safely.**

Mitigation Measures:

- Local and inbound fire personnel need to be aware that fire behavior across the state is exceeding normal expectations for this time of the year. **Local briefings need to be thorough and highlight specific fire environment conditions. These include but are not limited to local weather forecasts, Pocket Cards, ERC's, live and dead fuel moistures.**
- Suppression actions need to be based on good anchor points, escape routes, and safety zones. **Remember LCES. Experienced lookouts are essential under these conditions.**
- Base all actions on current and expected behavior of the fire. **Augment initial attack resources as incident activity dictates.**

Area of Concern: Northern California except for the following Predictive Service Areas: North Coast and Bay Marine, west of Highway 101 in Mid-Coast to Mendocino and Diablo-Santa Cruz, and the north eastern portion of Far Eastside.



ALL	COVID 19	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Masks <u>are required indoors</u> in Nevada. Wash/sanitize hands often. Maintain social distancing when applicable. <u>Unvaccinated personnel should wear masks when not socially distanced.</u>
ALL	EXTREME FIRE BEHAVIOR	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Expect intense fire runs with plume dominated fire behavior. Long range spotting of one mile plus has been observed. Prepare for pyro-cumulus collapse with severe out flow winds in all directions.
ALL	DRIVING HAZARDS	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Watch your speeds. Drive defensively! Expect the unexpected. Watch for road degradation, smokey, and dusty conditions. Be aware of debris in the roadways from rollout and suppression operations.
ALL	WUI HAZARDS	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Be aware of the hazards in and around structures, including power lines, septic tanks, and narrow roads/driveways.

Fire and COVID-19 Briefing Checklist

Self-Awareness / Screening

- Immediately separate yourself from others.
- Notify supervisor if you or others experience:
 - Cough, more than expected
 - Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
 - New loss of taste or smell
 - Fever
 - Sore throat
 - Chills
 - Muscle pain
- Review and follow crew and division plans to isolate, triage, and transport symptomatic personnel.

Hygiene on the Fireline

- Properly wash or sanitize your hands often, especially before and after eating or entering a public place, and after coughing or sneezing.
- Avoid handshakes and communal use items.
- Maintain a supply of hand sanitizer and hand wipes. Inform supervisor of needed resupply.
- Disinfect high touch surfaces often:
 - Radios, phones, doors, pumps, fuel cans, etc.

Social Distancing and Protective Equipment

- Initiate, practice, and remind others of social distancing.
- Conduct briefings and conversations outdoors and at least 6 feet apart.
- Utilize face coverings as a tool when practical.
- Clean or replace dirty face coverings, equipment, and PPE.

Communications

- Face coverings and social distancing complicate communications. Ensure effective sender/receiver messaging.

Today's Feature: The Northeastern Maidu People

- The Maidu people have called the majority of the Dixie Fire footprint home for time immemorial.
- This area remained inhabited almost solely by the Maidu people until the Lassen and Nobles Emigrant Trails brought Euro-American settlers into this region.
- The Maidu people are active members of our local community who through their own efforts and partnerships with local agencies take care of and manage their ancestral lands to this day.



K'odojapem's Battle with The Evil Spirit (Westwood Group: Avoidance Area):

- The Homer Lake Special Interest Area atop Keddie Ridge is extremely sacred and is the center of the universe to the Maidu people.
- Creator K'odojapem sprung from Moonlight Peak where he started to form the surrounding landscape in preparation for the arrival of the Maidu people.
- K'odojapem encountered a powerful evil spirit in the form of a giant black snake that rose out of Homer Lake. A monumental battle ensued where K'odojapem was triumphant. As life left the snake it turned into a large wooden log which fell from the sky into the Homer Lake. This tree can still be seen today piercing above the lakewater's surface.

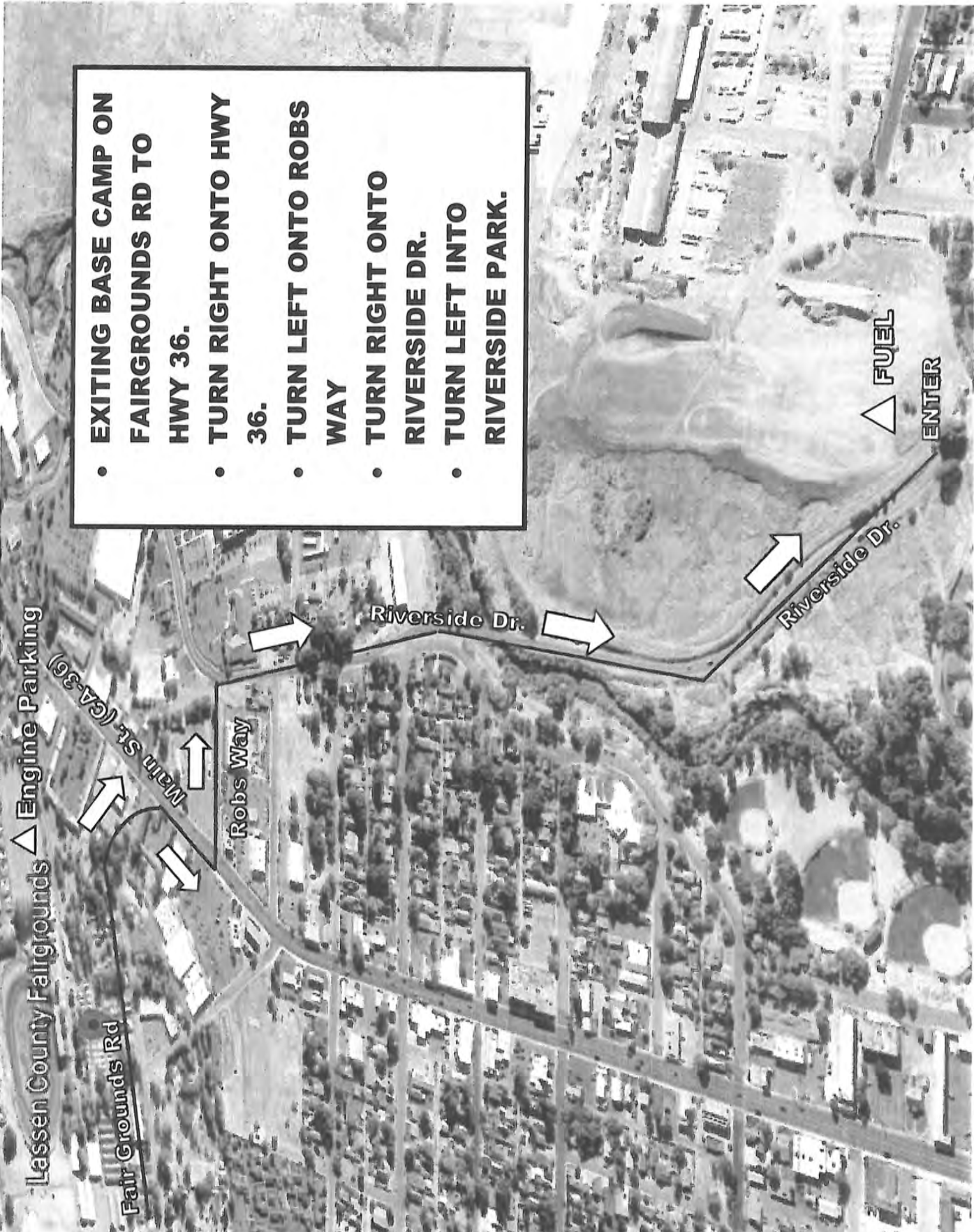

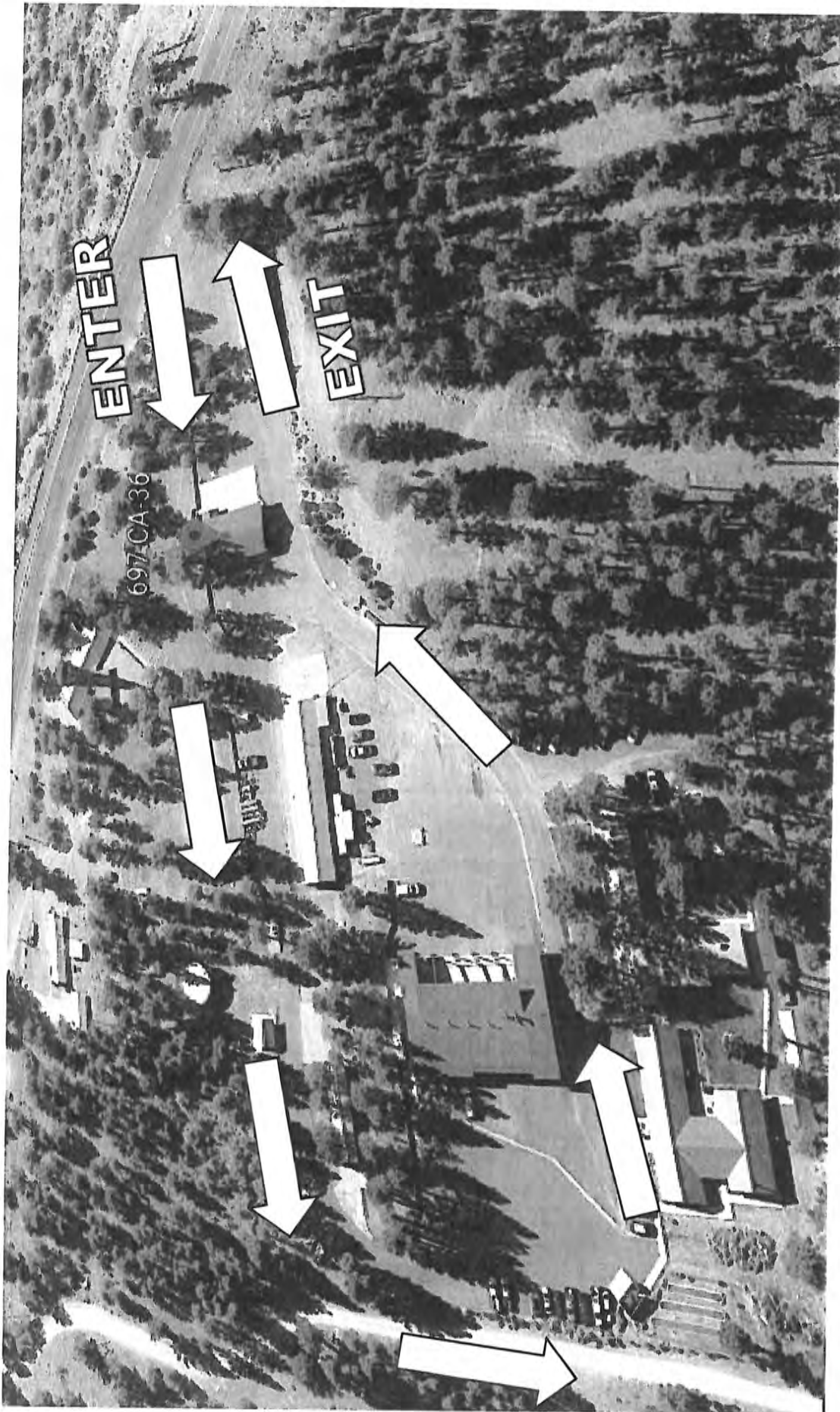


FUEL ROUTE FROM BASE CAMP
