







<b>3. Objective(s):</b>			
<b>Strategic Objectives:</b>			
Implement a full suppression strategy on the Dixie Fire. Strategy and Tactics implemented on the incident are to be prioritized utilizing life safety, community infrastructure defense, and natural/cultural values as a guiding principle. Minimize acres burned on all lands by effective and efficient firefighting efforts that offer the highest probability of success while maintaining safety first.			
<b>Leaders Intent:</b>			
Work effectively with cooperative partners towards a common goal of protecting values in a safe and efficient manner. All incident assigned personnel should be prepared to take appropriate actions regarding:			
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Professional behavior, conduct timely/effective communications.</li> <li>• Personal safety and safety of others, including driving slowly, safely, and defensively while implementing tactics that offer a high probability of success.</li> <li>• Manage fatigue by taking breaks and maintaining work rest guidelines.</li> <li>• Ensure all personnel have been briefed in operational strategies and tactics.</li> </ul>			
<b>Management Objectives:</b>			
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Utilize the risk management process to identify and mitigate hazards to protect first responders and the public. Emphasize strategies and tactics that have the highest probability of success and the least exposure to first responders and the public.</li> <li>• Develop proactive strategies to protect life, residential properties, communities, businesses and infrastructure. Employ tactics that fulfill these strategies while being mindful of the necessity for contingency and emergency plans. Ensure strategies account for incident priorities, applying resources to those protecting life and residential properties first.</li> <li>• Follow COVID-19, CDC and established local, state and federal guidance to limit virus spread within the incident and surrounding communities near the fire area.</li> <li>• Provide timely and continuous incident information to affected agency partners, cooperators, CALFIRE Team 3, as well as the public.</li> <li>• Utilize social media and all other communications tools to keep the public well informed of the fire conditions and other pertinent information.</li> <li>• Maintain fiscal accountability and keep costs commensurate with values at risk.</li> </ul>

## WEATHER DISCUSSION:

Northeasterly winds will persist through the day, with gusts around 20 mph. Temperatures will be cooler behind last night's front with minimum RH in the teens to mid-twenties. With the passage of the upper-level trough, an inversion was unlikely to develop overnight. Stable air behind the front will reduce the Haines Index this afternoon.

### FIRE BEHAVIOR

#### GENERAL:

- Fire behavior will be moderated by cooler temperatures today and significant decrease in afternoon winds, but clear skies will allow for direct solar heating increase activity in smoldering and surface fire.
- Change in wind direction to NE will provide wind-test or spotting that may affect containment lines.
- Nighttime fire behavior will be similar to last night, small change higher Rh but lower windspeeds.

#### SPECIFIC:

**DIV-NN:** Moderate activity in the interior from previous firing operation on Dyer Mountain. Minimal to moderate activity around along Hwy 147 (W of Dyer) and Hwy 89 (S of Dyer).

**DIV-PP:** Expect afternoon wind drive surface fire, torching and short-range spotting in Antelope Valley and west towards DIV-QQ. The fire continues to advance to the South and East towards the Walker fire (2019) burn scar. This a wind prone area.

**DIV-QQ:** Flanking fire in Peters Creek (SW-NE drainage), surface fire, potential for crown runs and spotting with alignment (like yesterday). Watch for spotting and spread to S over Beardsley Grade.

**Valley Group:** Minimal activity, interior smoldering on Keddie Point, and in the Hunt Canyon area.

**Division RR/WW/XX:** Minimal activity, interior smoldering.

#### Night Branch

• Moderate to good RH recovery (up to 70%). Fire behavior should moderate in the late evening. The shift will start with a higher probability of ignition (>15-29% POI) as a dryer but cooler Day Shift is forecasted.

**AIR OPERATIONS:** Expect little inversion development, passing front with NE winds provide good visibility.

**SAFETY:** Weather conditions have moderated today from Red Flag conditions yesterday. Base all actions on current and expected behavior of the fire, BUT plan on worst case scenarios.

### **Murphy's Fire Behavior Rules**

- Winds will remain constant...until your burnout is lit
- Upon reaching the far side of the fire...all radios and batteries will cease to work
- Rain occurs only after a fire is finally controlled
- The arrival time for back-up coincides precisely with fire containment
- A 3:1 gas/diesel mix burns hotter than a 3:1 diesel/gas mix...so does the person carrying the drip torch
- You are always short one lunch
- Leak-proof bags will...self-priming pumps won't
- Burning on the wrong side of the line will prolong the time of containment

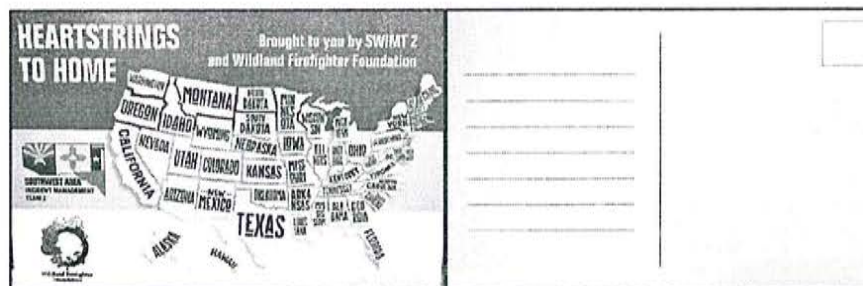




