



<u>Strategic Objectives:</u>			
Implement a full suppression strategy on the Dixie Fire. Strategy and Tactics implemented on the incident are to be prioritized utilizing life safety, community infrastructure defense, and natural/cultural values as a guiding principle. Minimize acres burned on all lands by effective and efficient firefighting efforts that offer the highest probability of success while maintaining safety first.			
<u>Leaders Intent:</u>			
Work effectively with cooperative partners towards a common goal of protecting values in a safe and efficient manner. All incident assigned personnel should be prepared to take appropriate actions regarding:			
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Professional behavior, conduct timely/effective communications. • Personal safety and safety of others, including driving slowly, safely, and defensively while implementing tactics that offer a high probability of success. • Manage fatigue by taking breaks and maintaining work rest guidelines. • Ensure all personnel have been briefed in operational strategies and tactics.

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Utilize the risk management process to identify and mitigate hazards to protect first responders and the public. Emphasize strategies and tactics that have the highest probability of success and the least exposure to first responders and the public. • Develop proactive strategies to protect life, residential properties, communities, businesses and infrastructure. Employ tactics that fulfill these strategies while being mindful of the necessity for contingency and emergency plans. Ensure strategies account for incident priorities, applying resources to those protecting life and residential properties first. • Follow COVID-19, CDC and established local, state and federal guidance to limit virus spread within the incident and surrounding communities near the fire area. • Provide timely and continuous incident information to affected agency partners, cooperators, CALFIRE Team 3, as well as the public. • Utilize social media and all other communication tools to keep the public well informed of the fire conditions and other pertinent information. • Maintain fiscal accountability and keep costs commensurate with values at risk.

WEATHER DISCUSSION:

Northeasterly winds will continue through the day as the trough of low pressure continues to exit into the Great Basin. Temperatures will slowly warm over the next couple of days to near average. Winds will turn slightly more northerly but won't be as strong as Wednesday. With smoke expected to blanket the southern half of the fire again it is likely inversions will hold over the southern portions of the fire. Thermal belts will again start to develop resulting in warmer and drier mid slopes overnight.

FIRE BEHAVIOR

GENERAL:

- Fire behavior will be moderated by cooler temperatures today and significant decrease in afternoon winds, but clear skies will allow for direct solar heating increase activity in smoldering and surface fire.
- Change in wind direction to NE will provide wind-test or spotting that may affect containment lines.
- Nighttime fire behavior will be similar to last night, small change higher Rh but lower windspeeds.

SPECIFIC:

DIV-NN: Minimal activity along Hwy 147 (W of Dyer). Monitor for holdover spots.

DIV-PP: Expect similar afternoon wind driven surface fire, torching and short-range spotting in Antelope Valley and west towards DIV-QQ. The fire continues to advance to the south and east towards the Walker fire (2019) burn scar. This a wind prone area.

DIV-QQ: Active backing and flanking fire in Hosselkus Creek drainage spreading to the south towards Genesee, surface fire, individual and group tree torching with potential for crown runs and short-range spotting (alignment of drainage and winds). Use persistent forecasting through the course of the day to estimate timing of fire potentially impacting to Genesee road and values at risk.

Valley Group: Minimal activity, interior smoldering on Keddie Point, Hunt Canyon area, and north of Hwy 89 (S of Dyer). Watch out for hold-over spots.

Division RR/WW/XX: Minimal activity, interior smoldering.

Night Branch

Moderate to good RH recovery (up to 70%). Fire behavior should moderate in the late evening. The shift will start with a higher probability of ignition (>15-29% POI) as a dryer but, cooler day shift is forecasted.

AIR OPERATIONS: Expect inversion to lift out in early afternoon. NNE winds will push smoke to south over Genesee and Quincy areas.

SAFETY: Limited visibility may give you a false sense of security. Use LCES to ensure you know what the fires are doing around you.



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

RESOURCE ADVISOR MESSAGE

Reporting of Cultural Sites

- Grab a GPS point, bump it up the chain of command or directly inform a Resource Advisor on the line or in camp.

Stay Out!

- **READs will be using flagging for areas to avoid suppression activities. Strip of red/black flagging.**
- For more information, please consult with a READ.

Food & Wildlife

- Throwing away and storing food in proper containers can keep wildlife off the line which prevents encounters with firefighters as well as future harm to the animals.

Riparian Areas

- Meadows are natural barriers. Tie the line to them, not through them. If line is needed, go around and outside of the meadow to avoid damage.
- Stream and creeks will not be used as line. If needing to cross, minimize damage (i.e. on a dozer lift the blade and only track over) to prevent post-fire stability issues. Do not push or cut line through or along them.

Water Drafting Sites

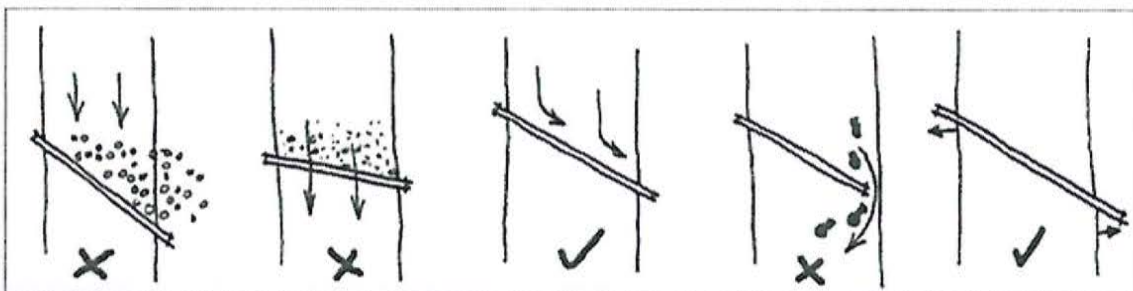
- Access the water source while trying your best to minimize damage to the soil and vegetation.
- If using a portable pump, make sure there is a spill kit and absorption pads to catch any accidental spills.
- Place portable pumps as far away as you can from the water source. Use screens on the intakes.
- Store fuel cans away from the water source and on a flat surface.

Working in the Wilderness

- Follow MIST for suppression actions.
- Utilize system trails as much as possible for travel and/or handline.
- Consult with READs for spike camps, helispots, and sling sites locations.
- Practice "Leave No Trace" as much as possible.
- Work with READs to minimize visual impacts to wilderness areas when possible.

Suppression Repair

- Utilize and coordinate with READs when implementing suppression repair plan.
- READs will determine when a line is completed by "approving" the line verbally and/or in ArcGIS Collector.
- Where the use of waterbars are applicable, see visual bird's eye view below. Questions? Ask a READ.

What does it look like?



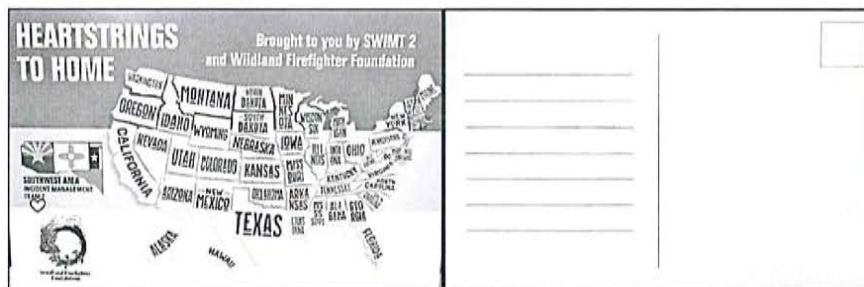
- **Increased Emotional Response:** Someone who is normally calm is now irritable, “on edge”, angry, or quick-tempered.





