WEATHER DISCUSSION:

Another upper level trough of low pressure will move across the incident today. Winds will shift from light and generally terrain driven to light southeast and then become predominantly southwest by early afternoon. Once that wind shift does occur, speeds will gradually increase and become gusty later in the day. Terrain will largely dictate the winds. Smoke from the Dixie incident and numerous surrounding fires will be the wild card in all of this and may keep higher winds from surfacing. Winds will slacken overnight and become terrain driven by Saturday morning. Southwest winds are expected to increase on Saturday as another dry front moves through.

WEATHER FORECAST FRIDAY: Smoke and haze, especially in the morning. Mostly clear skies are expected above the smoke layer.

TEMPERATURES:
Ridge Top: Highs: 70-75
Slope/Valley: Highs: 75-80

HUMIDITY:
Ridge Top: Min: 18-25 %
Slope/Valley: Min: 14-20 %

20 FT WINDS: **Ridge Top:** Light northeast in the morning, turning to the southwest by early afternoon and increasing to 10-15 mph with localized gusts up to 25 mph.
Slope/Valley: Downslope/down valley 2-4 mph in the morning, turning to the southwest by early afternoon and increasing to 10-15 mph with localized gusts up to 20 mph. Localized winds may be higher along exposed ridges. Terrain will impact the general winds.

CHANCE OF THUNDERSTORMS: 0% - **LAL:** 1 - **Haines Index:** 3

STABILITY/INVERSION: Moderate inversion will slowly dissipate by noon. Ventilation will be moderate.

WEATHER FORECAST FRIDAY NIGHT: Clear. Areas of smoke and haze.

20 FT WINDS: **Ridge Top:** Southwest 10-15 mph with gusts to 20 mph in the evening, decreasing to 5-10 mph by morning.
Slope/Valley: Southwest 10-15 mph in the evening with localized higher gusts in the terrain favored areas, becoming downslope/down valley 3-5 mph by morning.

CHANCE OF THUNDERSTORMS: 0% - **LAL:** 1 - **Haines Index:** 2

STABILITY/INVERSION: Moderate to strong inversion developing after midnight with poor dispersion

EXTENDED OUTLOOK: Another dry cold front will cross the incident on Saturday with southwest winds increasing in response. Wind speeds of 20 to 25 mph with gusts as high as 30 mph are possible with thick smoke possibly limiting the wind speed somewhat. Sunday and beyond will feature a generally light winds and near normal temperatures. RH will remain low with generally poor recovery at night along the mid slopes.

INPUTS

WEATHER SUMMARY:

Wind direction will be shifting today throughout the morning from the downslope to predominantly Southwest, a shift from previous days. Temperatures will be in the lower 70's to the lower 80's with minimum humidity dropping to 14 to 25% during the day. Winds will be light in the morning 5-10 mph, turning to Southwest 10-15 gusting to 25 mph. Overnight the temperatures will be in the upper 30's to lower 50's with humidity recovery at 60-72%, except 37-44% in the mid slope thermal belt areas. Winds overnight will continue from the Southwest at 10-15 mph becoming downslope in the early morning hours.

OUTPUTS

FIRE BEHAVIOR

GENERAL: ****FUELS AND FIRE BEHAVIOR ADVISORY IN EFFECT FOR THE FIRE AREA****

The Smoke layer will be in the low valleys and areas of active burning to start the day, but may thin around mid-day. Wind direction will impact the southwestern faces of the topography, a different direction than previous days. Areas that have been sheltered by winds in previous days will now get a push of wind. Expect this change to potentially cause an increase in activity, including single and group tree torching. Exceptionally dry timber stands are very receptive to spotting, and can contribute to large fire growth. The probability of ignition will be around 60% under the smoke cover, and 90% in clear areas. Spotting distances of ¼ to ¾ of a mile are possible in topographic favored areas and any downwind locations.

ERC's at record levels above 97th percentile!!

SPECIFIC:

Butte Sector: Smoldering material will continue to burnout, especially in the stump holes and large dead and down. Minimal heat exists in the sector, expect this to continue as mopup and patrol continues.

Lassen Sector: Fire activity should be moderate to start the shift. Fire activity on the southwestern aspects will see winds throughout the day. Expect an increase quickly as the wind exposed slopes begins to experience the forecasted increase in winds. Rugged terrain will channel winds and increase the probability of ember cast and spotting, especially in upper elevations or thinner tree stands. Fire activity in Branch 13 will be especially prone to terrain driven winds.

Lake Branch: Fire activity in this branch will be primarily smoldering and isolated ground fire. Control lines should not be challenged by the change of wind direction, but be aware of snag trees coming down.

Clear/Susanville/Janesville Branches: Fire progression is primarily fuel and slope driven, but expect short intense runs and plume development in areas where fuel, winds, and topography align. As the smoke clears in the afternoon and if fire becomes established in heavy pockets of fuel in favored topographic features, expect short intense runs and plume development. Wind over the escarpment may cause swirling on the eastern face, be aware of erratic winds. Winds will also funnel down the Susan river drainage, potentially stoking interior heat and smoldering spots.

AIR OPERATIONS

Air operations may be limited early today, but smoke may clear enough by mid-afternoon for air operations.

SAFETY

- Escape routes and safety zones are a must especially with heavy timber and extremely dry fuels and observed extreme fire behavior!
- Snags and stump holes are likely in timber areas.

Fuels and Fire Behavior Advisory

Northern California

August 17, 2021 to August 31, 2021



Subject: Potential for extreme fire behavior due to critically low live and dead fuel moistures, very dry conditions resulting from persistent drought, minimal snowpack and spring precipitation, and elevated fire danger rating values across much of northern California.

Discussion: Fires burning in northern California are exhibiting extreme fire growth based on critical fuel conditions. Fire spread is fuel driven and does not depend on wind to spread. Surface fuels are very receptive to embers. Long range spotting, area ignition, and group torching is occurring on large fires frequently.

Difference from normal conditions: Northern California is in a drought; currently with 90% at Extreme to Exceptional levels. The drought is expected to persist or intensify through out the fire season. Deficient rainfall and snowpack with early melt off has resulted in fuels that are below average in dryness, with record setting conditions for most areas.

Concerns to Firefighters and the Public:

- Energy Release Component (ERC) at numerous weather stations set record maximums already this year and are running at or above the 97th percentile in most cases. Expect increased fire intensity and spread rates in these areas. Early season extreme fire behavior has been observed in both light and heavy fuels. **Anticipate increased spread rates, spotting, and active nighttime burning.**
- The combination of persistent drought and record-low rainfall and snowpack amounts has led to very low live and dead fuel moistures. Low 1000-hour fuel moistures have been evidenced by complete consumption of dead fuels on recent fires. Live fuel moistures in grasses, shrubs and trees, have already reached critical levels in many areas of Northern California due to limited green-up this spring. **Expect fires to ignite easier and spread faster. Do not expect fires to exhibit reduced fire behavior when entering areas of live fuels; anticipate increased spread rates and spotting.**
- Direct attack is often not feasible under regular diurnal wind conditions with ground resources. And aviation utilization is often insufficient in moderating rate of spread without immediate heavy ground resource response. **Anticipate higher resistance to control in all fuel types.**
- Already this year, Northern California has experienced large fire activity and multiple team deployments. California will likely experience an extended fire season. It is important to be mindful of and manage fatigue for all resources. **Everyone, every day, returns home safely.**

Mitigation Measures:

- Local and inbound fire personnel need to be aware that fire behavior across the state is exceeding normal expectations for this time of the year. **Local briefings need to be thorough and highlight specific fire environment conditions. These include but are not limited to local weather forecasts, Pocket Cards, ERC's, live and dead fuel moistures.**
- Suppression actions need to be based on good anchor points, escape routes, and safety zones. **Remember LCES. Experienced lookouts are essential under these conditions.**
- Base all actions on current and expected behavior of the fire. **Augment initial attack resources as incident activity dictates.**

Area of Concern: Northern California except for the following Predictive Service Areas: North Coast and Bay Marine, west of Highway 101 in Mid-Coast to Mendocino and Diablo-Santa Cruz, and the north eastern portion of Far Eastside.

Firefighter survival, Deployment zones, fire shelters

Ash Pit Awareness

- Observe the remnants of the vegetation model.
- Look for depressions in the ground.
- Use your hand tool to sound your way into the burn.
- White ash may be an indicator of an ash pit.
- Ensure that PPE is worn and properly fitted.



ALL	COVID 19	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Masks <u>are required indoors</u> in Nevada. Wash/sanitize hands often. Maintain social distancing when applicable. <u>Unvaccinated personnel should wear masks when not socially distanced.</u>
ALL	EXTREME FIRE BEHAVIOR	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Expect intense fire runs with plume dominated fire behavior. Long range spotting of one mile plus has been observed. Prepare for pyro-cumulus collapse with severe out flow winds in all directions.
ALL	DRIVING HAZARDS	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Watch your speeds. Drive defensively! Expect the unexpected. Watch for road degradation, smokey, and dusty conditions. Be aware of debris in the roadways from rollout and suppression operations.
ALL	WUI HAZARDS	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Be aware of the hazards in and around structures, including power lines, septic tanks, and narrow roads/driveways.
ALL	PERSONNEL SAFETY	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> All personnel are responsible for their personal safety. Immediately report any suspicious activity. Be sure to wear all required PPE while on the fire line.
ALL	ACTIVE TRAIN TRACKS	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Consider all train tracks in the fire areas as active.
ALL	HYDRATION	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Drink water before, during, and after each shift. Be alert for signs of heat stress in yourself and others.
ALL	FIRE AND DROUGHT WEAKENED TREES/SNAG HAZARDS	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Follow Hazard Tree Safety Guidelines (IRPG p. 22). Many of the trees within the fire area and along roadways are stressed due to drought conditions and burn times.
ALL	CIVILIAN PRESENCE	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Watch for civilian traffic. Watch for residents in and around the area.
ALL	COMMUNICATIONS	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Check the communication plan for frequency assignments. Be clear and concise when talking on the radio. Use human repeaters as needed.
ALL	BRIEFINGS	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Make sure everyone gets a briefing on the plan for the day. Document this on your ICS 214.
ALL	LCES	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Ensure that LCES is being utilized.
ALL	AIRCRAFT AWARENESS	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Be aware of rotor wash when working near helicopters. Hazard trees may respond to the impacts of aircraft.
ALL	HEAVY EQUIPMENT	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Watch out for heavy equipment traffic! Be watchful around heavy equipment, they may not see you.
ALL	WILDLIFE	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Wildlife including bears have been observed by fire personnel.

Fire and COVID-19 Briefing Checklist

Self-Awareness / Screening

- Immediately separate yourself from others.
- Notify supervisor if you or others experience:
 - Cough, more than expected
 - Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
 - New loss of taste or smell
 - Fever ○ Sore throat
 - Chills ○ Muscle pain
- Review and follow crew and division plans to isolate, triage, and transport symptomatic personnel.

Hygiene on the Fireline

- Properly wash or sanitize your hands often, especially before and after eating or entering a public place, and after coughing or sneezing.
- Avoid handshakes and communal use items.
- Maintain a supply of hand sanitizer and hand wipes. Inform supervisor of needed resupply.
- Disinfect high touch surfaces often:
 - Radios, phones, doors, pumps, fuel cans, etc.

Social Distancing and Protective Equipment

- Initiate, practice, and remind others of social distancing.
- Conduct briefings and conversations outdoors and at least 6 feet apart.
- Utilize face coverings as a tool when practical.
- Clean or replace dirty face coverings, equipment, and PPE.

Communications

- Face coverings and social distancing complicate communications. Ensure effective sender/receiver messaging.

It ain't always easy... being green.

- Endangered species
 - Populations have declined 95%!
- Threats are primarily drought, chytrid fungus, and non-native trout that feed on them.
 - Worldwide, frogs are in danger because of chytrid fungus. It affects these frogs as well.
- Retardant contains various chemicals, which frogs absorb through their skin. Also, ground disturbance and fire cause silt to cover their creeks and ponds.

Frogs need to live in
or near water.
Toads don't.
(usually)

- If disturbed, they produce a distinctive mink- or garlic-like odor to ward off predators and other animals.
- They do not have vocal sacks, but they can make a flat clicking sound.
- Crews can help by staying out of avoidance areas and helping with suppression repair that helps keep their habitat from silting over.
 - Aviation resources can avoid spreading chytrid by avoiding No Dip areas.
 - Please don't touch them. They breathe and absorb chemicals through their skin!

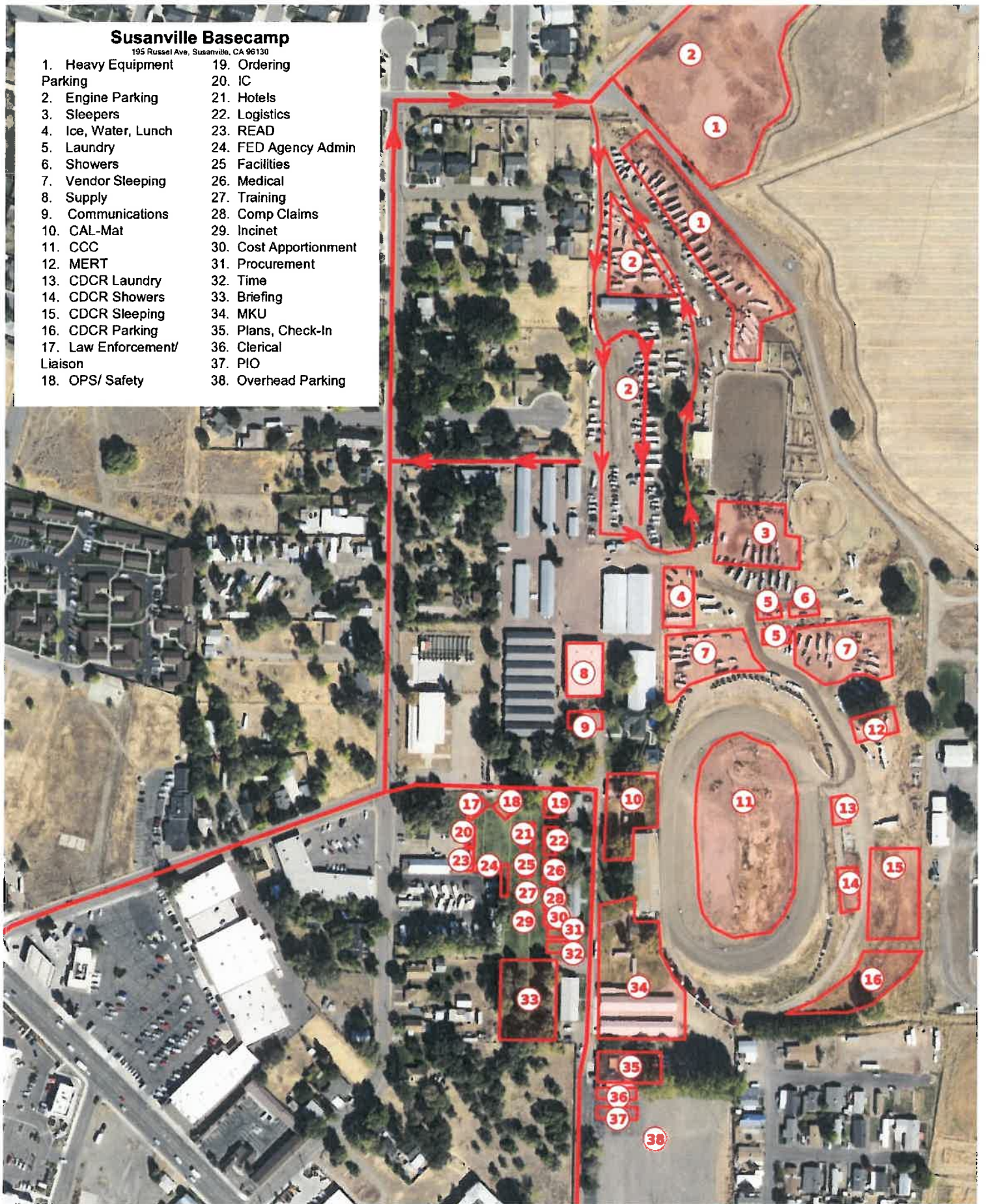

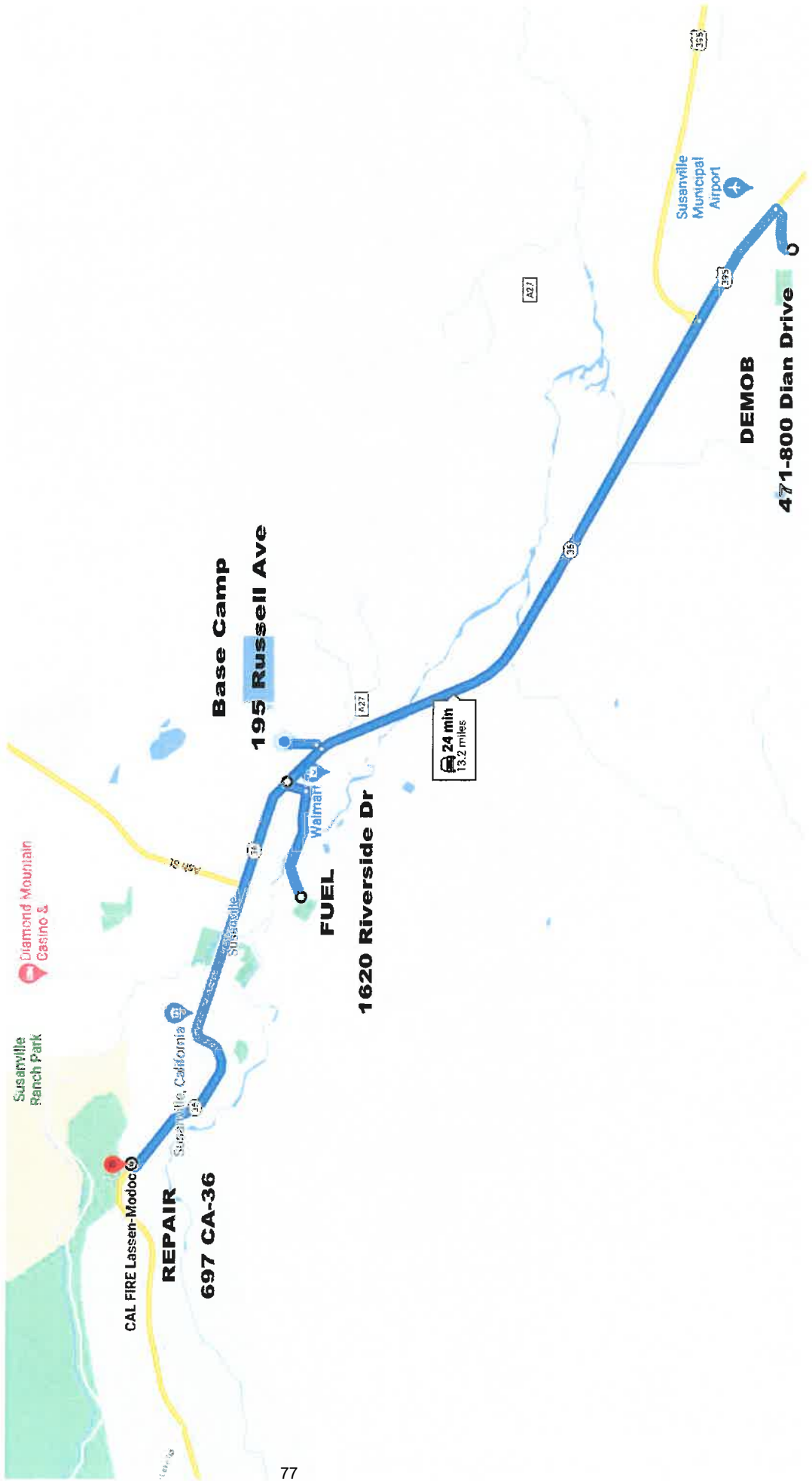
