





<b>3. Objective(s):</b>			
<b><u>Strategic Objectives:</u></b>			
Implement a full suppression strategy on the Dixie Fire. Strategy and Tactics implemented on the incident are to be prioritized utilizing life safety, community infrastructure defense, and natural/cultural values as a guiding principle. Minimize acres burned on all lands by effective and efficient firefighting efforts that offer the highest probability of success while maintaining safety first.			
<b><u>Leaders Intent:</u></b>			
Work effectively with cooperative partners towards a common goal of protecting values in a safe and efficient manner. All incident assigned personnel should be prepared to take appropriate actions regarding:			
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Professional behavior, conduct timely/effective communications.</li> <li>• Personal safety and safety of others, including driving slowly, safely, and defensively while implementing tactics that offer a high probability of success.</li> <li>• Manage fatigue by taking breaks and maintaining work rest guidelines.</li> <li>• Ensure all personnel have been briefed in operational strategies and tactics.</li> </ul>			
<b><u>Management Objectives:</u></b>			
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Utilize the risk management process to identify and mitigate hazards to protect first responders and the public. Emphasize strategies and tactics that have the highest probability of success and the least exposure to first responders and the public.</li> <li>• Develop proactive strategies to protect life, residential properties, communities, businesses and infrastructure. Employ tactics that fulfill these strategies while being mindful of the necessity for contingency and emergency plans. Ensure strategies account for incident priorities, applying resources to those protecting life and residential properties first.</li> <li>• Follow COVID-19, CDC and established local, state and federal guidance to limit virus spread within the incident and surrounding communities near the fire area.</li> <li>• Provide timely and continuous incident information to affected agency partners, cooperators, CALFIRE Team 3, as well as the public.</li> <li>• Utilize social media and all other communication tools to keep the public well informed of the fire conditions and other pertinent information.</li> <li>• Maintain fiscal accountability and keep costs commensurate with values at risk.</li> </ul>

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Keep the fire south of Fruit Growers Blvd in Branch XX.</li> <li>• Keep the fire north and west of the 2019 Walker Fire scar in Branch XXV.</li> <li>• Keep the fire north of Genesee Valley Rd.</li> <li>• Keep the fire within established containment lines in Divisions XX, WW, RR, in Branch XXX, and Division NN in Branch XX.</li> </ul>

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Keep the fire north of the fire perimeter and Highway 162 and the junction on Highway 70.</li> <li>• Keep the fire south of Harvey Valley Road.</li> <li>• Keep the fire east of Mill Creek drainage.</li> <li>• Keep the fire west of the Lassen County line.</li> </ul>

### WEATHER DISCUSSION:

Winds will switch back to the southwest and continue that way for the next few days. With the switch in wind direction, expect the smoke cover to be much less over the southern edge of the fire. Overall temperatures will be warmer but areas that are now clear of smoke can expect it to be noticeably warmer and drier. Inversions should start to break by 1200. Thermal belts will become more prominent creating a drier and warmer layer at midslopes at night.

### FIRE BEHAVIOR

#### GENERAL:

- Switch in wind direction today from NE to SW help push the fire back in on itself in many of the active areas around the East Zone divisions. Except, fire in area east of Antelope Lake and escarpment that borders Hwy 395.
- Fire behavior will slightly increase over the fire due to a slight increase in windspeeds and temperatures. Also, southern portion of active fire areas on eastside of fire will have clear skies (DIV-QQ and PP) with SW winds clearing the inversion by afternoon, this will allow increased activity in all phases of fire growth from direct solar heating of fuels and burning.
- Nighttime fire behavior will be more active in the thermal belt (mid-slope), think warmer and dryer, whereas the valley bottoms will have the greatest humidity recovery and cooler temperatures to moderate fire behavior.

#### SPECIFIC:

**DIV-NN:** Minimal activity along Hwy 147 (W of Dyer). Monitor for holdover spots.

**DIV-PP:** WATCHOUT- SW winds today over the Escarpment have the potential to have strong downslope winds. This can contribute to rapid growth and spotting ahead with rapid establishment and erratic fire behavior. Be alert for active areas along control lines spotting outside of line. This a wind prone area.

**DIV-QQ:** Active backing and flanking fire in Hosselkus Creek drainage spreading to the south towards Genesee Hotel area. Active backing surface fire, individual and group tree torching with potential for short-range spotting (alignment of drainage and winds).

**Valley Group:** Minimal activity, interior smoldering on Keddie Point, Hunt Canyon area, and north of Hwy 89 (S of Dyer). Watch out for hold-over spots.

**Division RR/WW/XX:** Minimal activity, interior smoldering.

#### Night Branch

Moderate to good RH recovery (up to 70%). Fire behavior should moderate in the late evening. The shift will start with a higher probability of ignition (>15-29% POI) as a hotter day shift is forecasted.

**AIR OPERATIONS:** Expect inversion to lift out in early afternoon, with SW winds improving visibility on S-end.

**SAFETY:** One of our watch out situations is having unburned fuel between you and the fire. When working on spots or indirect line ensure escape routes and safety zones are identified and make them known.

## ***SAFETY MESSAGE***

*Fire fighter safety comes first on every fire, every time*



### **Dixie Specific Safety:**

- Repopulation is occurring in some areas and evacuations in others. Be heads up that the public may be in areas they shouldn't be. On highways 89, 70 and other roads, keep your head on a swivel.
- Be aware that mines exist in and near the fire area. If a mine exists, keep your distance and avoid heavy equipment near the area. If you find a mine that has not been identified, flag it off and report it through the chain of command to the Safety Officer.
- Be cognizant of hazard trees in fire burned areas. With the change in wind direction, fire damaged trees may be pushed in a new direction causing trees that have been standing for days after the fire moved through to fall.
- August 21<sup>st</sup> is the start of bow season. Both forests are closed for hunting but be aware that there may be hunters in the area.

### **Operational Leadership**



- **TAKE CHARGE** of assigned resources
- **MOTIVATE** with a "CAN DO SAFELY" attitude
- **DEMONSTRATE INITIATIVE** .....take action
- **COMMUNICATE**.....give specific instruction
- **SUPERVISE**.....be accountable for your actions

### **Bias For Action**

In a high-risk environment, freelancing is a dangerous and unpredictable element, causing more harm than good. Ultimately, leaders are always accountable for their actions.

- A bias for action acknowledges wildfire as an environment where events do not always go according to plan.
- At times during an incident, one person may be the only individual to see what needs to be done and to make it happen.
- Time may not permit gathering all of the information that one might like to have; if you wait until you have all the facts to be 100% sure of your decision, it will almost always be too late.

In these time-critical situations, fire leaders use judgment, act within the intent of their leaders, work in unison with others, develop and communicate a plan, then inform superiors of actions as soon as safely possible.

On a chaotic and rapidly-developing wildfire, one person taking the initiative can make all the difference in taking advantage of an opportunity. Being hesitant, risk-averse, or indecisive can expose firefighters to greater long-term risks and translate into a waste of time, opportunity, energy, and money.

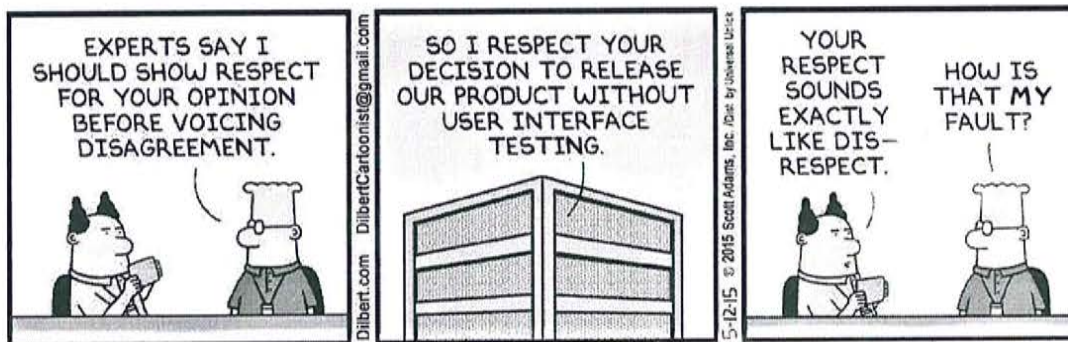

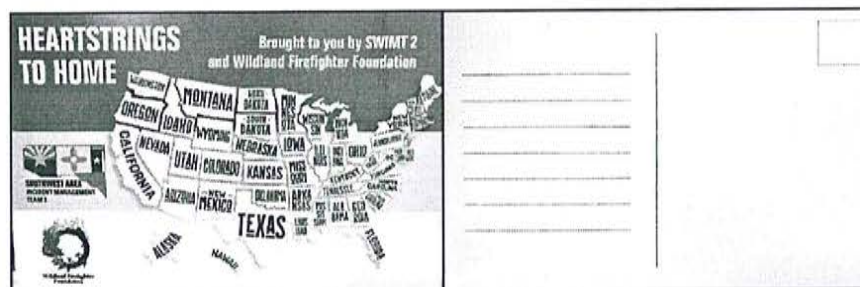


