



Strategy and Tactics implemented on the incident are to be prioritized utilizing life safety, community infrastructure defense, and natural/cultural values as a guiding principle. Minimize acres burned on all lands by effective and efficient firefighting efforts that offer the highest probability of success while maintaining safety first.

Work effectively with cooperative partners towards a common goal of protecting values in a safe and efficient manner. All incident assigned personnel should be prepared to take appropriate actions regarding:

Employ tactics that fulfill these strategies while being mindful of the necessity for contingency and emergency plans. Ensure strategies account for incident priorities, applying resources to those protecting life and residential properties first. • Follow COVID-19, CDC and established local, state and federal guidance to limit virus spread within the incident and surrounding communities near the fire area. • Provide timely and continuous incident information to affected agency partners, cooperators, CALFIRE Team 3, as well as the public. • Utilize social media and all other communication tools to keep the public well informed of the fire conditions and other pertinent information. • Maintain fiscal accountability and keep costs commensurate with values at risk.

WEATHER DISCUSSION:

Winds will continue from the southwest at ridgetop but without the strength that was seen on Saturday. The weaker winds will delay inversion breakup by about an hour. Drier air will return to the area allowing humidities to drop back into the teens during the afternoon. Smoke conditions should improve to more of just a haze as we have a little deeper mixing layer in the lower atmosphere.

FIRE BEHAVIOR

GENERAL:

- Hotter temperatures, lower humidity, and lower but moderate windspeeds today mean active fire day.
- Components for very active to extreme fire behavior are still present: extreme drought, critical fire indices (ERCs & BIs) conditions, near record low 100hr & 1000hr dead fuel moisture presents.
- Nighttime fire behavior will be more active in the thermal belt (mid-slope), think warmer and dryer. Whereas the valley bottoms will have the greatest humidity recovery and cooler temperatures to moderate fire behavior.

SPECIFIC:

DIV-NN/OO: Minimal activity along Hwy 147 (W of Dyer). Monitor for holdover spots.

DIV-PP: Eastside pine stands on upper third of slope escarpment will be holding heat from slop-over/spot near Milford. Dead and down will have high resistance to control due to exceptionally dry fuels and low humidity. Be alert for active areas along control lines that may have spotted outside of line. This a wind prone area. Expect rapid rates of spread, if spotting occurs.

DIV-QQ: Active backing, flanking and surface fire in Genesee Valley with individual tree torching with potential for short-range spotting. Inversion, if present should clear by noon. ***If fire activity supports column development, watch out for rapid increase of fire activity and potential down outflow winds.***

Valley Group: Minimal activity, interior smoldering on Keddie Point, Hunt Canyon area, and north of Hwy 89 (S of Dyer). Watch out for hold-over spots.

DIV-RR: Backing, flanking, and roll-out from the spot between Grizzly Peak and Genesee Valley will continue. It has been moderated by yesterday's aerial retardant drops to slow active spread. Watch for rollout and potential uphill fire runs.

DIV-WW/XX: Minimal activity, interior smoldering.


Night Branch
 Moderate to good RH recovery. Fire behavior should moderate in the late evening. The shift will start with a higher probability of ignition (>15-29% POI).

AIR OPERATIONS: Expect inversion to lift out in early afternoon with SW winds improving visibility.

SAFETY: Watch for pyrocumulus development overhead or nearby, it can collapse unexpectedly creating gusty and erratic outflow winds and rapid rates of spread in any direction. Outflow winds can travel long distances following terrain.

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SAFETY MESSAGE

Fire fighter safety comes first on every fire, every time



Major Hazards and Risks:

Fire Behavior:

- Warming trend, switch in wind direction, and inversion lift will cause an increase of fire behavior. Ensure LCES is in place.
- Spot fires are growing rapidly. Have a plan in place with all resources before engaging.

Transportation:

- Moving from area to area during structure defense poses and increased risk of accidents. Move with purpose but maintain safe driving habits and keep your speed appropriate for the conditions.
- Pull off the road completely if you are parking along roadsides for an extended period of time. Equipment not fully pulled off the road is hindering travel in the Taylorsville and Genesee Valley area.

Fatigue:

- Fatigue is setting in on most of us.
- Let's take care of ourselves and each other and assure we are adhering to work rest guidelines. If you see, hear, or feel something is not making sense:

STOP, THINK, TALK, ACT

- **STOP** for a minute or two.
- **THINK** about what is not making sense.
- **TALK** it over with your partner, crew and/or supervisor.
- **ACT** only when the job or task makes sense and all concerns have been mitigated.

Wildland Urban Interface Safety

The wildland/urban interface "Watch-outs!" include:

- Poor roads
- Bridge load limits
- Wooden construction and wood shake roofs
- Power lines
- Propane tanks and Hazmat threat
- Inadequate water supply
- Natural fuels within 30 ft. (9 m) or closer to structures
- Structures in chimneys, box canyons, narrow canyons, or on steep slopes
- Extreme fire behavior
- Strong winds
- Panic during an evacuation

Scene Assessment and Structure Triage:

- Estimated time when the fire will hit
- Distribution of structures
- Number and vulnerability of structures
- Firefighting tactics that are likely to work

When fighting a fire in the interface, stick to these Do's and "Don'ts":

- **DO** wear full PPE.
- **DO** keep at least 100 gal. of water in reserve.
- **DO** have a protective line for personnel and vehicles.
- **DO** back vehicles in for quick egress.
- **DO** use a 1.5 in. hose when possible.
- **DO** post lookouts as necessary.
- **DON'T** enter burning buildings unless you are properly trained and equipped.

Clear Communication

“The single biggest problem in communication is the illusion that it has taken place.” – George Bernard Shaw

When communicating over the radio, we rely on the recipient to respond and acknowledge that the message has been received. We can't assume understanding or receipt of the message until we get this response.

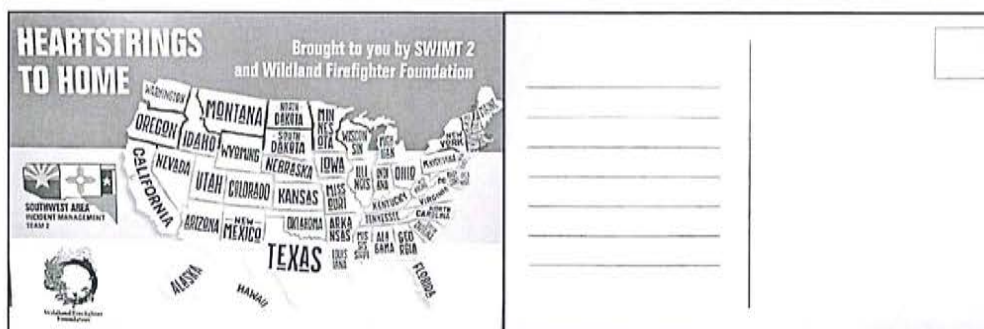
The same concept is applicable to any other kind of communication. Here's a situation where the right response may be useful:

- Joe said something that annoyed you. You feel like Joe was trying to annoy you on purpose. You heard that someone said someone else said that someone else said that Joe said he did, in fact, say what he said to annoy you.

The common denominator in the above situation is that no direct communication has been made with Joe, so it could be possible he doesn't even realize that what he said had that effect on you. So, ask yourself if you've responded to the "message" you've received.

If not, voice your concerns (*respectfully*), then elevate if the problem persists.



