

FIRE BEHAVIOR

GENERAL:

- Hot and dry conditions persist today and trend through the week it is projected to have lower humidity and fuel moistures which will increase probability of ignition and resistance to control.
- Areas where smoke inversions have set in, expect earlier increase in fire behavior in thermal belt zones. Also, areas where inversion lifts (or breaks) activity will increase with air flow and exposure to solar heating.
- Nighttime fire behavior will be more active in the thermal belt (mid-slope), think warmer and dryer. The valley bottoms will have the greatest humidity recovery and cooler temperatures to moderate fire behavior.

SPECIFIC:

DIV-NN/OO: Minimal activity along Hwy 147 (W of Dyer). Monitor for holdover spots.

DIV-PP: Eastside pine stands on upper third of slope of escarpment can be holding heat in dead and down and in stump holes in slop-over/spot near Milford. Dead and down will have high resistance to control due to exceptionally dry fuels and low humidity. This a wind prone area. Expect rapid rates of spread if spotting occurs.

DIV-QQ & Genesee Group: On Mt Jura and into Genesee Valley expect active backing, flanking and surface fire with individual tree torching with potential for short-range spotting. Inversion, if present, should clear by afternoon. *If fire activity supports column development, watch out for rapid increase of fire activity and potential down outflow winds. Spot across Genesee Creek, directly below the "Grizzly Spot", has spread upslope to join with it.*

Valley Group: Minimal activity, interior smoldering on Keddie Point, Hunt Canyon area, and north of Hwy 89 (S of Dyer). Watch out for hold-over spots.

DIV-RR: Backing, flanking, and roll-out from the spot ("**Grizzly Spot**") between Grizzly Peak and Genesee Valley will continue. Activity has been moderated by yesterday's deep smoke inversion layer. It has been followed up by aviation support and line construction around the top and upper flanks. *Watch for rollout and potential uphill fire runs.*

DIV-WW/XX: Minimal activity, interior smoldering.

Night Branch


Moderate to good RH recovery. Fire behavior should moderate in the late evening. The shift will start with a higher probability of ignition (>15-29% POI).

AIR OPERATIONS: Very large fire area, expect smoke inversion to lift out at different times, morning into afternoon.

SAFETY: Watch out for fire weakened trees. Be aware and ensure work areas are cleared of snags prior to engaging.



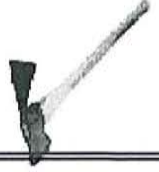

Dixie Specific Safety:

- Don't assume that rocks on a road are cold. Before moving them with your hands, check to see if the rock is hot or move it with a tool. Either way, always use gloves.
- When working in Genesee Valley, Taylorsville and Milford performing structure protection, drive slowly and cautiously as not everyone has evacuated.
- Fire damaged trees that have been burned during the past few weeks can become dangerous when winds change directions. Though you have passed the same tree for days, this may be the day the tree comes down. **Reassess as you progress.**

CUMULATIVE FATIGUE

DRIVING HAZARDS

Mountain Driving:

Driving involves the greatest risk we face in an average day on this incident—and it requires your full attention.

- Drive slowly and defensively.
- wear your seat belts, lights on, reduce speeds and chock vehicles when parked.
- Watch for wildlife on the roadway at early morning and night, especially on the 70 and 89 highways.
- The right vehicle for the right road for the right reason. Scout roads before sending up large transports or water tenders.
- Beardsley grade and Hwy 89 are long downhill runs to the bottom. Over-use of air brakes while traveling on a long downgrade will heat the brake drums and shoes to the point where the brakes are of little or no use.

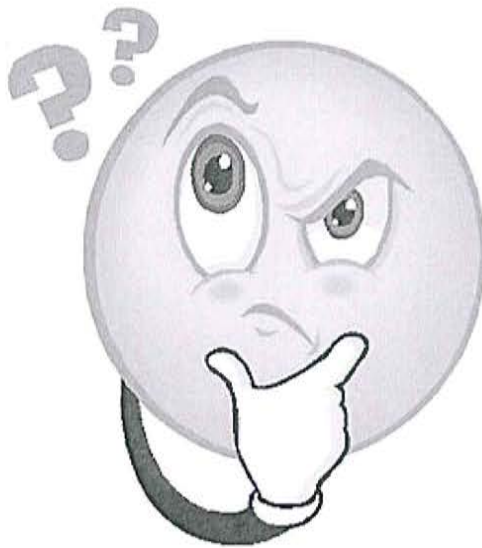

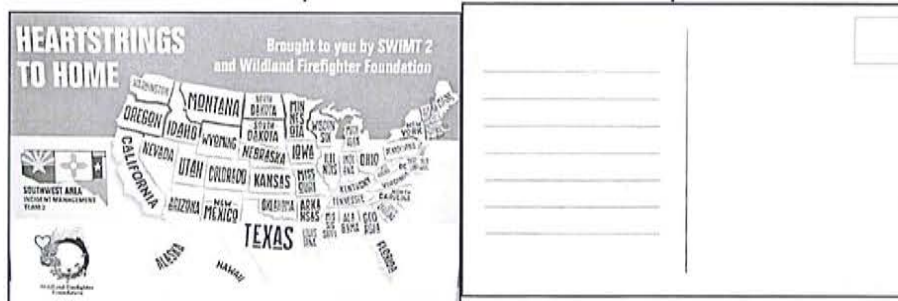
