WEATHER DISCUSSION: Broad southwesterly flow will continue across the fire area with gusts along ridgetops reaching around 20 mph in the afternoon. Smoke will continue to hamper maximum temperatures during the day but some valleys could manage to reach the upper 70s to lower 80s. Ventilation will improve during the afternoon hours as southwest winds increase aloft but smoke will fill back in tonight as a light drainage flow redevelops after sunset. Locally unstable conditions and stronger wind gusts could develop if smoke clears.

WINDS: **Valleys:** West to southwest 6-10 mph in the evening with localized higher gusts in the terrain (20 FEET) favored areas, becoming downslope/down valley 2-4 mph after midnight.

Ridgetops: Southwest 10-14 mph with gusts to 20 mph in the evening, decreasing to 5-10 mph by morning.

TRANSPORT WIND: Southwest 10-15 mph.

STABILITY/INVERSION: Moderate to strong inversion developing after midnight with poor dispersion.

EXTENDED OUTLOOK: Tuesday through Saturday: A stagnant and dry weather pattern is expected to bring persistent southwest winds each day through the remainder of the week along with minimal cloud cover and continued smoky conditions. A warming trend is expected Thursday lasting through the end of the week resulting in poorer RH recoveries overnight and lower daytime RH minimums.

INPUTS

WEATHER SUMMARY:

Temperatures will warm to the mid 70's to the lower 80's with minimum humidity dropping to 15 to 22% during the day. Light drainage winds in the morning, becoming 3-7 mph mid-day, 10-14 mph on the ridges with gusts to 22 mph possible. Overnight the temperatures will be in the mid 30's to mid 40's with humidity recovery at 65-70%, except 47-52% in the mid slope thermal belt areas. Winds overnight will continue from the Southwest at 6-14 mph becoming downslope in the early morning hours.

OUTPUTS

FIRE BEHAVIOR

GENERAL: ****FUELS AND FIRE BEHAVIOR ADVISORY IN EFFECT FOR THE FIRE AREA****

Smoke will be over the fire, especially in the valleys and low areas before beginning to thin somewhat. Overall fire activity will be moderated by this smoke cover to begin the shift. Ridgetop winds will increase in the afternoon and thin the smoke, allowing for increases in fire activity. As the smoke thins and fire becomes aligned with topography, expect a quick increase in activity with torching and spotting. All the fuel in the area is extremely dry and receptive to ignition. Smoke conditions will affect burning conditions, if thick smoke remains over the fire, expect activity to be moderated.

ERC's at record levels above 97th percentile!!

SPECIFIC:

Butte Sector: Smoldering material will continue to burnout, especially in the stump holes and large dead and down. Needle cast fallen over hot material can ignite and potentially spread. Minimal heat exists in the sector, expect this to continue as mop up and patrol continues.

Lassen Sector: Fire activity should be low to moderate to start the shift, but will increase when wind speeds increase and cause thinning of the smoke. Topography in this sector is very mountainous which will channel winds and increase the probability of ember cast and spotting, especially in upper elevations or thinner tree stands. Spread rates will generally be slow to moderate, but will increase with any change of conditions, such as wind speed or slope alignment. Heavy fuels will hold heat through the night and continue to burn out, and potentially challenge control lines within Branch 9 & 16.

Clear/Lake Branch: Fire activity in this branch will be primarily smoldering and isolated ground fire. Needle cast has fallen over much of these areas, be aware of potential ground fire if the needle cast is over hot spots and stump holes. Control lines should not be challenged but be aware of snag trees coming down.

Janesville Branch: Fire progression is primarily fuel and slope driven, with short range spotting possible in wind aligned areas. If the smoke clears in the afternoon, expect intensity to increase with an increase in spotting production and distances. Limiting these spots by increasing mop up distances will be vital to holding existing control lines. Wind over the escarpment may cause swirling on the eastern face, be aware of erratic winds. Expect fire activity in the area of the escarpment to be erratic, with rapid changes in direction and rates of spread.

AIR OPERATIONS

Air operations may be limited early today, but smoke may clear enough by mid-afternoon for air operations.

SAFETY

- Watch for diurnal wind shifts mid evening
- Short intense fire runs are possible. Make sure you know where your safety zone is at and the time it takes to get there.

Fuels and Fire Behavior Advisory

Northern California

August 17, 2021 to August 31, 2021



Subject: Potential for extreme fire behavior due to critically low live and dead fuel moistures, very dry conditions resulting from persistent drought, minimal snowpack and spring precipitation, and elevated fire danger rating values across much of northern California.

Discussion: Fires burning in northern California are exhibiting extreme fire growth based on critical fuel conditions. Fire spread is fuel driven and does not depend on wind to spread. Surface fuels are very receptive to embers. Long range spotting, area ignition, and group torching is occurring on large fires frequently.

Difference from normal conditions: Northern California is in a drought; currently with 90% at Extreme to Exceptional levels. The drought is expected to persist or intensify through out the fire season. Deficient rainfall and snowpack with early melt off has resulted in fuels that are below average in dryness, with record setting conditions for most areas.

Concerns to Firefighters and the Public:

- Energy Release Component (ERC) at numerous weather stations set record maximums already this year and are running at or above the 97th percentile in most cases. Expect increased fire intensity and spread rates in these areas. Early season extreme fire behavior has been observed in both light and heavy fuels. **Anticipate increased spread rates, spotting, and active nighttime burning.**
- The combination of persistent drought and record-low rainfall and snowpack amounts has led to very low live and dead fuel moistures. Low 1000-hour fuel moistures have been evidenced by complete consumption of dead fuels on recent fires. Live fuel moistures in grasses, shrubs and trees, have already reached critical levels in many areas of Northern California due to limited green-up this spring. **Expect fires to ignite easier and spread faster. Do not expect fires to exhibit reduced fire behavior when entering areas of live fuels; anticipate increased spread rates and spotting.**
- Direct attack is often not feasible under regular diurnal wind conditions with ground resources. And aviation utilization is often insufficient in moderating rate of spread without immediate heavy ground resource response. **Anticipate higher resistance to control in all fuel types.**
- Already this year, Northern California has experienced large fire activity and multiple team deployments. California will likely experience an extended fire season. It is important to be mindful of and manage fatigue for all resources. **Everyone, every day, returns home safely.**

Mitigation Measures:

- Local and inbound fire personnel need to be aware that fire behavior across the state is exceeding normal expectations for this time of the year. **Local briefings need to be thorough and highlight specific fire environment conditions. These include but are not limited to local weather forecasts, Pocket Cards, ERC's, live and dead fuel moistures.**
- Suppression actions need to be based on good anchor points, escape routes, and safety zones. **Remember LCES. Experienced lookouts are essential under these conditions.**
- Base all actions on current and expected behavior of the fire. **Augment initial attack resources as incident activity dictates.**

Area of Concern: Northern California except for the following Predictive Service Areas: North Coast and Bay Marine, west of Highway 101 in Mid-Coast to Mendocino and Diablo-Santa Cruz, and the north eastern portion of Far Eastside.

ALL	COVID 19	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Masks <u>are required indoors</u> in Nevada. Wash/sanitize hands often. Maintain social distancing when applicable. <u>Unvaccinated personnel should wear masks when not socially distanced.</u>
ALL	EXTREME FIRE BEHAVIOR	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Expect intense fire runs with plume dominated fire behavior. Long range spotting of one mile plus has been observed. Prepare for pyro-cumulus collapse with severe out flow winds in all directions.
ALL	DRIVING HAZARDS	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Watch your speeds. Drive defensively! Expect the unexpected. Watch for road degradation, smokey, and dusty conditions. Be aware of debris in the roadways from rollout and suppression operations. Park off of the single lane roadways to allow for through traffic.
ALL	WUI HAZARDS	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Be aware of the hazards in and around structures, including power lines, septic tanks, and narrow roads/driveways. Generators may illegally back-feed electrical lines.

ALL	COMMUNICATIONS	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Check the communication plan for frequency assignments. Be clear and concise when talking on the radio. Use human repeaters as needed.
ALL	BRIEFINGS	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Make sure everyone gets a briefing on the plan for the day. Document this on your ICS 214.

Self-Awareness / Screening

- Immediately separate yourself from others.
- Notify supervisor if you or others experience:
 - Cough, more than expected
 - Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
 - New loss of taste or smell
 - Fever ○ Sore throat
 - Chills ○ Muscle pain
- Review and follow crew and division plans to isolate, triage, and transport symptomatic personnel.

Hygiene on the Fireline

- Properly wash or sanitize your hands often, especially before and after eating or entering a public place, and after coughing or sneezing.
- Avoid handshakes and communal use items.
- Maintain a supply of hand sanitizer and hand wipes. Inform supervisor of needed resupply.
- Disinfect high touch surfaces often:
 - Radios, phones, doors, pumps, fuel cans, etc.

Social Distancing and Protective Equipment

- Initiate, practice, and remind others of social distancing.
- Conduct briefings and conversations outdoors and at least 6 feet apart.
- Utilize face coverings as a tool when practical.
- Clean or replace dirty face coverings, equipment, and PPE.

Communications

- Face coverings and social distancing complicate communications. Ensure effective sender/receiver messaging.

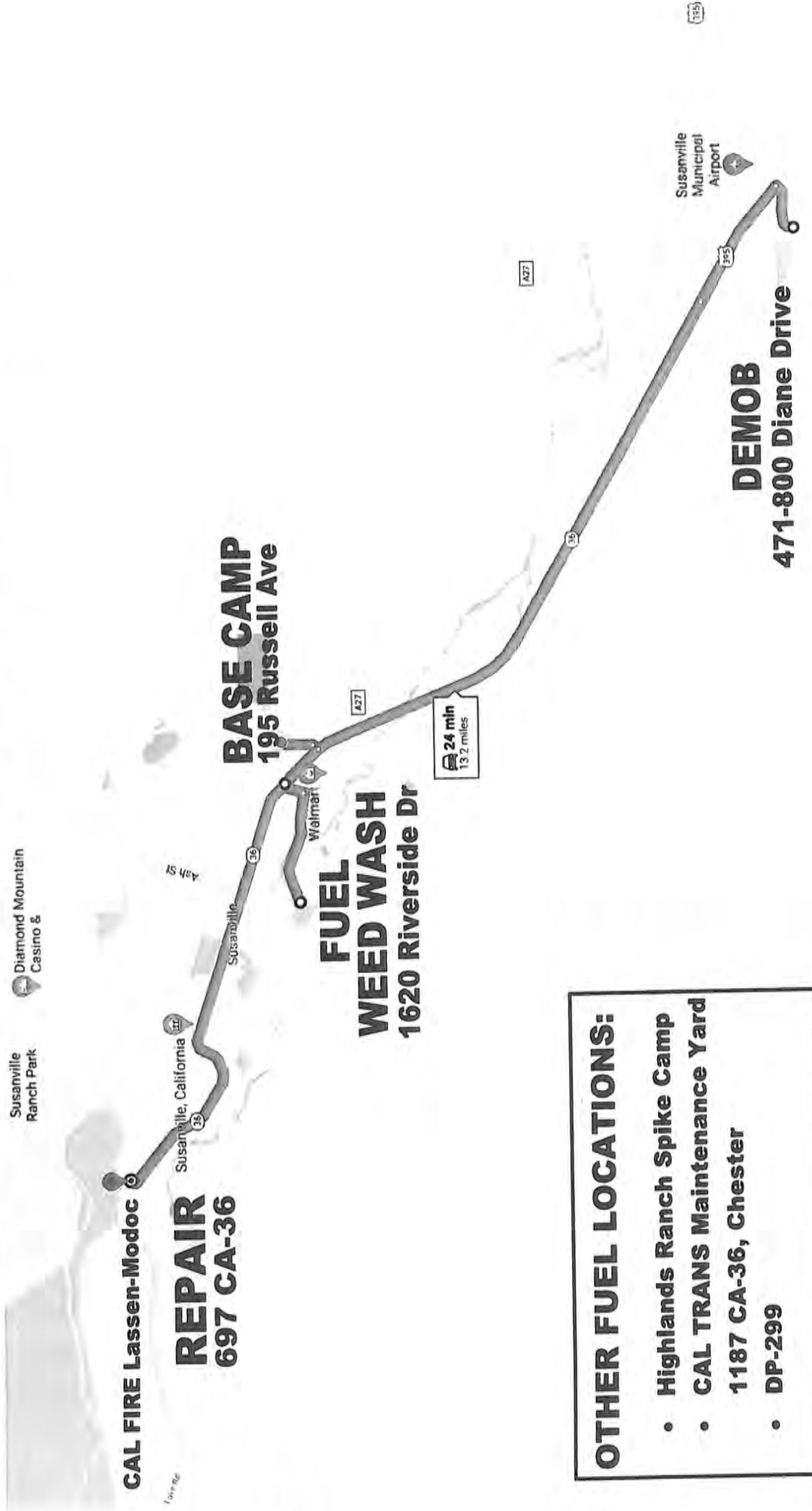
