3. Objective(s):

Strategic Objectives:

Implement a full suppression strategy on the Dixie Fire. Strategy and Tactics implemented on the incident are to be prioritized utilizing life safety, community infrastructure defense, and natural/cultural values as a guiding principle. Minimize acres burned on all lands by effective and efficient firefighting efforts that offer the highest probability of success while maintaining safety first.

Leaders Intent:

Work effectively with cooperative partners towards a common goal of protecting values in a safe and efficient manner. All incident assigned personnel should be prepared to take appropriate actions regarding:

- Professional behavior, conduct timely/effective communications.
- Personal safety and safety of others, including driving slowly, safely, and defensively while implementing tactics that offer a high probability of success.
- Manage fatigue by taking breaks and maintaining work rest guidelines.
- Ensure all personnel have been briefed in operational strategies and tactics.

Management Objectives:

- Utilize the risk management process to identify and mitigate hazards to protect first responders and the public. Emphasize strategies and tactics that have the highest probability of success and the least exposure to first responders and the public.
- Develop proactive strategies to protect life, residential properties, communities, businesses and infrastructure. Employ tactics that fulfill these
 strategies while being mindful of the necessity for contingency and emergency plans. Ensure strategies account for incident priorities,
 applying resources to those protecting life and residential properties first.
- Follow COVID-19, CDC and established local, state and federal guidance to limit virus spread within the incident and surrounding communities near the fire area.
- · Provide timely and continuous incident information to affected agency partners, cooperators, CALFIRE Team 3, as well as the public.
- Utilize social media and all other communication tools to keep the public well informed of the fire conditions and other pertinent information.
- Maintain fiscal accountability and keep costs commensurate with values at risk.

Control Objectives: East

- · Keep the fire south of Fruit Growers Blvd in Branch XX.
- Keep the fire north and west of the 2019 Walker Fire scar in Branch XXV.
- Keep the fire north of Grizzly Ridge and west of Forest Service Road 25N42 in Branch XXX.
- Keep the fire within established containment lines in Divisions XX, WW, RR, in Branch XXX, and Division NN in Branch XX.

Control Objectives: West

- Keep the fire north of the fire perimeter and Highway 162 and the junction on Highway 70.
- Keep the fire south of Harvey Valley Road.
- Keep the fire east of Mill Creek drainage.
- Keep the fire west of the Lassen County line.

Expect RHs to dip into the lower teens each afternoon with poor overnight recoveries in the thermal belts. A little high level cloud cover isn't out of the question on Wednesday which will add some shading to the forecast.

FIRE BEHAVIOR

GENERAL:

- Hot and dry conditions persist today, and lower nightime humidity and fuel moistures which will increase probability of ignition and resistance to control.
- In areas where smoke inversions have set in, expect earlier increase in fire behavior in thermal belt zones. Also, areas where inversion lifts (or breaks) activity will increase with air flow and exposure to solar heating.
- Nighttime fire behavior will be more active in the thermal belt (mid-slope), think warmer and dryer. Whereas the
 valley bottoms will have the greatest humidity recovery and cooler temperatures to moderate fire behavior.

SPECIFIC

DIV-NN/OO: Minimal activity along Hwy 147 (W of Dyer). Monitor for heat near the line and holdover spots.

DIV-PP: Minimal activity in most areas, with large dead and down fuel potentially holding heat, and stump holes near control lines. Dead and down will have high resistance to control due to exceptionally dry fuels and low humidity. This a wind prone area.

DIV-QQ & Genesee Group: On Mt Jura and into Genesee Valley expect active backing, flanking and surface fire with individual tree torching with potential for short-range spotting. Inversion, if present should clear in afternoon. Watch out for spotting from yesterday's activity. Monitor fire behavior activity trend to identify indicators and time when fire behavior increases and decreases. Watch for spot fires from "Peel Ridge" spot fire

Valley Group: Minimal activity, watch out for hold-over spots and hidden heat in stump holes. Any duff smoldering near control lines.

DIV-RR: Grizzly Spot has spotted to NW end of Peel Ridge (aka 'Peel Ridge Spot'). Active surface fire, individual and group tree torching, passive crowning (supported by surface fire) where fuels/slope align. Grizzly and Peel Ridge spots will have active backing, flanking, and roll-out and up slope runs. Activity will be moderated in the morning by deep smoke inversion layer. Watch out for spotting, rollout and potential uphill fire runs. If column develops— watch out for long-range spotting, increase of fire activity and potential down outflow winds if the column collapses. Grizzly and Peel Ridge Spots if not grown together likely will Little Grizzly Creek DIV-WW/XX: Minimal activity, interior smoldering.

Night Branch

Moderate to good RH recovery. Fire behavior should moderate in the late evening. The shift will start with a higher probability of ignition (>15-29% POI). Monitor areas for spots from yesterday's column development, specifically in Genesee Valley area.

AIR OPERATIONS: Smoke inversion lifting out of Genesee Valley between 11:30-13:30.

SAFETY: Large fire growth is expected today. Don't be surprised! Have your safety zones and/or escape routes preidentified and timed.

- Fully brief all firing and holding forces to ensure the plan is well understood.
- Continually monitor weather and terrain effects as the firing operation progresses.
- Identify primary and secondary escape routes prior to beginning.

Medical Emergency

- Review the 206 daily and ensure all personnel know their role in a medical response.
- Box 6 of the 206 is for division forces to identify and prefill in for their specific location.

- Know where your EMTF's are and confirm you're in contact with them daily.
- Review IRPG 105-106.

Trainee Registration QR Code




