#### Strategic Objectives:

Implement a full suppression strategy on the Dixie Fire. Strategy and Tactics implemented on the incident are to be prioritized utilizing life safety, community infrastructure defense, and natural/cultural values as a guiding principle. Minimize acres burned on all lands by effective and efficient firefighting efforts that offer the highest probability of success while maintaining safety first.

#### Leaders Intent:

Work effectively with cooperative partners towards a common goal of protecting values in a safe and efficient manner. All incident assigned personnel should be prepared to take appropriate actions regarding:

- Professional behavior, conduct timely/effective communications.
- Personal safety and safety of others, including driving slowly, safely, and defensively while implementing tactics that offer a high probability of
- Manage fatigue by taking breaks and maintaining work rest guidelines.
- Ensure all personnel have been briefed in operational strategies and tactics.

#### Management Objectives:

- Utilize the risk management process to identify and mitigate hazards to protect first responders and the public. Emphasize strategies and tactics that have the highest probability of success and the least exposure to first responders and the public.
- Develop proactive strategies to protect life, residential properties, communities, businesses and infrastructure. Employ tactics that fulfill these strategies while being mindful of the necessity for contingency and emergency plans. Ensure strategies account for incident priorities, applying resources to those protecting life and residential properties first.
- Follow COVID-19, CDC and established local, state and federal guidance to limit virus spread within the incident and surrounding communities near the fire area.
- Provide timely and continuous incident information to affected agency partners, cooperators, CALFIRE Team 1, as well as the public.
- Utilize social media and all other communication tools to keep the public well informed of the fire conditions and other pertinent information.
- Maintain fiscal accountability and keep costs commensurate with values at risk.

#### WEATHER DISCUSSION:

Ridge winds will start from the southeast early in the afternoon and then turn to the southwest after 1400. Terrain driven winds will again dominate the lower levels of the fire as the ridge top winds remain fairly weak. Temperatures will remain above average and RHs will again fall to single digits in some locations as there is very dry air in place. Overnight thermal belt development will again be likely. Winds overnight will be terrain driven with only light winds at ridgetop.

# FIRE BEHAVIOR

#### GENERAL:

- Higher windspeeds and temperatures (80-90°), critically low daytime humidity and dead fuel moistures, and poor nighttime humidity recoveries add up to a very active behavior today.
- In areas where smoke inversions have set in, expect increased fire behavior in thermal belt zones and when
  inversion lifts.
- Nighttime fire behavior will be more active in the thermal belt (mid-slope), think warmer and dryer. The valley bottoms will have the greatest humidity recovery and cooler temperatures to moderate fire behavior.

#### SPECIFIC

DIV-NN/OO/PP: Minimal activity. Monitor for heat near the line and holdover spots.

**DIV-QQ & Genesee Group:** Firing operation on westside of Mt. Jura near Taylorsville continues to consume available fuels. Decreasing activity will reduce potential for any flare ups or torching. Watch out for spotting from Grizzly/Peel Ridge Spots into Genesee Valley near Ward Creek area.

Valley Group: Minimal activity. Monitor for heat near the line and holdover spots.

DIV-RR: Grizzly and Peel Ridge fire will continue to spread upstream in Little Grizzly Creek with column development assistance increasing spotting and flanking to the east. Expect active backing, flanking, surface fire, individual and group tree torching, passive/active crowning where fuels/slope align. Activity will be moderated in the morning by deep smoke inversion layer. If column develops—watch out for long-range spotting, increase of fire activity and potential down outflow winds if the column collapses.

DIV-WW/XX: Minimal activity, interior smoldering.

#### Night Branch

Low daytime humidity, poor nighttime humidity recovery expect fire activity to diminish little overnight. The shift will start with a higher probability of ignition (>15-29% POI). Monitor areas for spots from yesterday's column development, specifically in Genesee Valley area near Ward Creek.

AIR OPERATIONS: Smoke inversion lifting out of Genesee Valley later today between ~1:30-2:30.

**SAFETY:** Snags and fire weakened trees continue to be one of the biggest hazards out there. Continue surveying work areas overhead hazards and mitigate them by having them removed or use flagging to keep people well clear of area.

# SAFETY MESSAGE



Fire fighter safety comes first on every fire, every time

## Dixie specific hazards and risks:

## Mine tailings: Mt Hough Group

Walker mine is located 4 miles to the south-east of the fires edge near DP 614 along the Beckwourth Genesee Road. Mine tailings contain silica dust which can become airborne in the wind. Silica dust can lead to silicosis and lung cancer. This area is approximately 100 acres in size. Firefighters should avoid the area and a buffer zone of ½ mile from burning silica should be observed. If installing containment lines in the area, use the existing roads around mine tailings. Stay out of the area between the roads and tailings.

## **Heavy Equipment: All Divisions**

When meeting lowboys along roadways always give them the inside of the road, don't force them to use the outside shoulder which may be soft and give way to the extra weight. Make eye contact with heavy equipment operator before approaching.

# Firing Operations: DIV RR

Fully brief all firing and holding resources before initiation of firing operations. Watch for spot fires and be ready to suppress quickly yet safely. Ensure LCES is always in place.

# Leadership is all about character

Fire leaders set the example by exhibiting strong character. Character is based on values. It is the combination of actions and words that others appraise to determine if the leader can be trusted to do the right thing

- Know our values, review them frequently, and look for areas of improvement.
- Admitting when we are wrong.
- Taking time to reflect on our actions.
- Finding role models and asking them to be a mentor.
- Studying leaders and leadership, learning from their successes and mistakes.

# Accountability

- Know where your crewmembers are at all times.
- · Have crewmembers work in pairs.
- Do you have the buddy system set in place on the fireline?
- Inform Division or your Supervisor of changing locations.
- Do you know how to use your radio and is it cloned?
- Check **IN** with the Division Supervisor on site if not assigned there
- Check OUT with your supervisor (Or Division) at the end of shift.



# RESOURCE ADVISOR MESSAGE

### Reporting of Cultural Sites

Grab a GPS point, bump it up the chain of command or directly inform a Resource Advisor on the line or in camp.

### Stay Out!

- READs will be using flagging for areas to avoid suppression activities. Strip of red/black flagging.
- Pay attention to the avoidance areas marked on the map.
- For more information, please consult with a READ.

### TRASH/FOOD & WILDLIFE

- Be professional, pick up your trash and that of others, you can get trash bags from supply.
- Throwing away and storing food in proper containers can keep wildlife off the line which prevents encounters with firefighters as well as future harm to the animals.

#### Riparian Areas

- Meadows are natural barriers. Tie the line to them, not through them. If line is needed, go around and outside of the meadow to avoid damage.
- Stream and creeks will not be used as line. If needing to cross, minimize damage (i.e. on a dozer lift the blade and only track over) to prevent post-fire stability issues. Do not push or cut line through or along them.

### **Water Drafting Sites**

- Access the water source while trying your best to minimize damage to the soil and vegetation.
- If using a portable pump, make sure there is a spill kit and absorption pads to catch any accidental spills.
- Place portable pumps as far away as you can from the water source. Use screens on the intakes.
- Store fuel cans away from the water source and on a flat surface.

### Working in the Wilderness

- Follow MIST for suppression actions.
- Consult with READs for spike camps, helispots, and sling sites locations.
- Practice "Leave No Trace" as much as possible.
- Work with READs to minimize visual impacts to wilderness areas when possible.




