**Strategic Objective**

Implement a full suppression strategy on the Dixie Fire. Strategy and Tactics implemented on the incident are to be prioritize utilizing life safety, community infrastructure defense, and natural/cultural values as a guiding principal. Minimize acres burned on all lands by effective and efficient firefighting efforts that offer the highest probability of success while maintaining safety first.

**Leaders Intent**

Work effectively with cooperative partners towards a common goal of protecting values in a safe and efficient manner. All incident assigned personnel should be prepared to take the appropriate actions regarding:

- Professional behavior, conduct timely / effective communications
- Personal safety and safety of others, including driving slowly, safely and defensively Implementation of tactics that offer a high probability of success
- Manage fatigue by taking breaks and maintaining work rest guidelines
- All line supervision personnel including crew and striketeam leaders must attend the morning Operational Briefing

**Management Objectives**

- Utilize the risk management process to identify and mitigate hazards to protect first responders and the public. Emphasize strategies and tactics that have the highest probability of success and the least exposure to first responders and the public.
- Develop proactive strategies to protect life, residential properties, communities, businesses and infrastructure. Employ tactics that fulfill these strategies while being mindful of the necessity for contingency and emergency plans. Ensure strategies account for incident priorities, applying resources to those protecting life and residential properties first.
- Follow COVID-19, CDC and established local, state and federal guidance to limit virus spread within the incident and surrounding communities near the fire area.
- Provide timely and continuous incident information to affected agency partners, cooperators, Great Basin Team 1 as well as the public.
- Utilize social media and all other communications tools to keep the public well informed of the fire conditions and other pertinent information.
- Maintain fiscal accountability and keep costs commensurate with values at risk.

**Control Objectives**

- Keep the fire north of Grizzly Ridge and Davis Lake
- Keep the fire south of Harvey Valley Road
- Keep the fire east of Ponderosa Way and within established control lines
- Keep the fire west of Highway 395 while ensuring infrastructure defense in the communities of Janesville and Milford

**General Situational Awareness**

Steep and rugged terrain, critically dry and receptive fuel beds, active area for fire history and drought stressed trees.

**WEATHER DISCUSSION:** Elevated fire weather conditions will continue today, with the higher wind gusts from the southwest across the Janesville branch area and to the southeast along US-395. Winds across Lassen and Shasta Sectors will be slightly lower. The atmosphere remains very dry with poor overnight humidity recoveries, dropping to critically low levels below 15% this afternoon. Cooler temperatures are expected with winds and very low humidity still the primary concern.

**SKY/WEATHER:** Morning valley smoke, clearing from southwest to northeast afternoon.

**EXTENDED OUTLOOK: Thursday through Monday.** A more typical southwest wind from the central valley region is expected each day through early next week. Temperatures will fall several degrees Thursday but relative humidity will remain quite low with poor to moderate higher elevation recoveries. Dry conditions will continue into early next week with some clouds returning Monday.

### INPUTS

#### WEATHER SUMMARY:

The weather will continue to be warm and dry, with high winds. Temperatures will be 72-84 degrees during the day and 38-53 degrees overnight. Humidity will be 9-16 percent during the day and 25-65 percent overnight. The wind will be southwest 11-17 mph with gust to 20-25 mph in the afternoon. Overnight the winds will be southwest 10-15 mph with gust to 20-25 mph. Winds will weaken through the night.

### OUTPUTS

#### FIRE BEHAVIOR

**GENERAL:** \*\*\**FUELS AND FIRE BEHAVIOR ADVISORY IN EFFECT FOR THE FIRE AREA*\*\*\*

The red flag warning has expired, however the conditions and the fuels are still going to create fire conditions resistant to control. The wind will continue to be strong enough to keep the primary direction of the fire progressing towards the northeast. The diminishing winds could contribute to column development if the fire becomes established control lines and makes a large run. The limited humidity recovery and the fuels will continue to be extremely receptive to embers, allowing spots to become established quickly if suppression is delayed.

#### SPECIFIC:

**Lassen/Shasta Sector:** The wind will continue to create spotting issues, specifically in Branch 16. The column will continue to be directed to the east to northeast. The fuels along the highway are more spaced with shorter brush which should reduce the amount of fire in the crown. The area to the west has open meadows with light fuel loading more conducive for control efforts. Branch 9 will see little growth as the fuels in the Reading Fire area need higher winds to support fire spread.

**Butte Sector:** The wind will not have as much impact in the area but will be stronger than in the previous days. Interior torching could see longer transports of fire brands. The stronger wind will also contribute to more overstory falling to the ground creating more potential for active fire.

**Janesville Branch:** The winds will continue to be strong on top of the ridge and filter down to the valley. The timber on the ridge will contribute to mid-range spotting. The fuels in the valley are light and receptive to embers. The fuels are also more favorable for structure protection and suppression efforts.

**Clear/Lake Branch:** The air should start to clear out throughout the day and increase activity of smoldering material. The wind will also contribute to the overstory continuing to fall to the ground creating new ground fuels and increasing activity. Any interior islands will have the potential to increase in activity.

### AIR OPERATIONS

The smoke may settle into some of the deeper valleys but should clear early.

### SAFETY

Weather is a dynamic factor in fire spread, continue to be observant of changes and how it interacts with the terrain and fuels. Have escape routes and safety zones built into your plan for the day.

# Fuels and Fire Behavior Advisory

## Northern California

September 1, 2021 to September 15, 2021



**Subject:** Potential for extreme fire behavior due to critically low live and dead fuel moistures, very dry conditions resulting from persistent drought, minimal snowpack and spring precipitation, and elevated fire danger rating values across much of northern California.

**Discussion:** Fires burning in northern California are exhibiting extreme fire growth based on critical fuel conditions. Fire spread is fuel driven and does not depend on wind to spread. Events with wind have led to extreme rates of spread. Surface fuels are very receptive to embers. Long range spotting, area ignition, and group torching is occurring on large fires frequently.

**Difference from normal conditions:** Northern California is in a drought; currently with 90% at Extreme to Exceptional levels. The drought is expected to persist or intensify throughout the fire season. Deficient rainfall and snowpack with early melt off has resulted in fuels that are below average in dryness, with record setting conditions for most areas.

### Concerns to Firefighters and the Public:

- Energy Release Component (ERC) at numerous weather stations set record maximums already this year and are running at or above the 97<sup>th</sup> percentile in most cases. Expect increased fire intensity and spread rates in these areas. Early season extreme fire behavior has been observed in both light and heavy fuels. **Anticipate increased spread rates, spotting, and active nighttime burning.**
- The combination of persistent drought and record-low rainfall and snowpack amounts has led to very low live and dead fuel moistures. Low 1000-hour fuel moistures have been evidenced by complete consumption of dead fuels on recent fires. Live fuel moistures in grasses, shrubs and trees, have already reached critical levels in many areas of Northern California due to limited green-up this spring. **Expect fires to ignite easier and spread faster. Do not expect fires to exhibit reduced fire behavior when entering areas of live fuels; anticipate increased spread rates and spotting.**
- Direct attack is often not feasible under regular diurnal wind conditions with ground resources. And aviation utilization is often insufficient in moderating rate of spread without immediate heavy ground resource response. **Anticipate higher resistance to control in all fuel types.**
- Already this year, Northern California has experienced large fire activity and multiple team deployments. California will likely experience an extended fire season. It is important to be mindful of and manage fatigue for all resources. **Everyone, every day, returns home safely.**

### Mitigation Measures:

- Local and inbound fire personnel need to be aware that fire behavior across the state is exceeding normal expectations for this time of the year. **Local briefings need to be thorough and highlight specific fire environment conditions. These include but are not limited to local weather forecasts, Pocket Cards, ERC's, live and dead fuel moistures.**
- Suppression actions need to be based on good anchor points, escape routes, and safety zones. **Remember LCES. Experienced lookouts are essential under these conditions.**
- Base all actions on current and expected behavior of the fire. **Augment initial attack resources as incident activity dictates.**

**Area of Concern:** Northern California except for the following Predictive Service Areas: North Coast and Bay Marine, west of Highway 101 in Mid-Coast to Mendocino and Diablo-Santa Cruz, and the north eastern portion of Far Eastside.

## CONTACTED OR EXPOSED PERSONNEL AND ASYMPTOMATIC

- Notify supervisor
- Maintain appropriate face covering
- Self-monitor for symptoms

## PREVENTATIVE MEASURES TO SLOW THE TRANSMISSION OF COVID-19:

- Wash your hands regularly with soap and water or clean them with alcohol-based hand sanitizer
- Maintain at least six feet distance between you and people coughing or sneezing
- Avoid touching your face
- Cover your mouth and nose when coughing or sneezing
- Stay home if you feel unwell

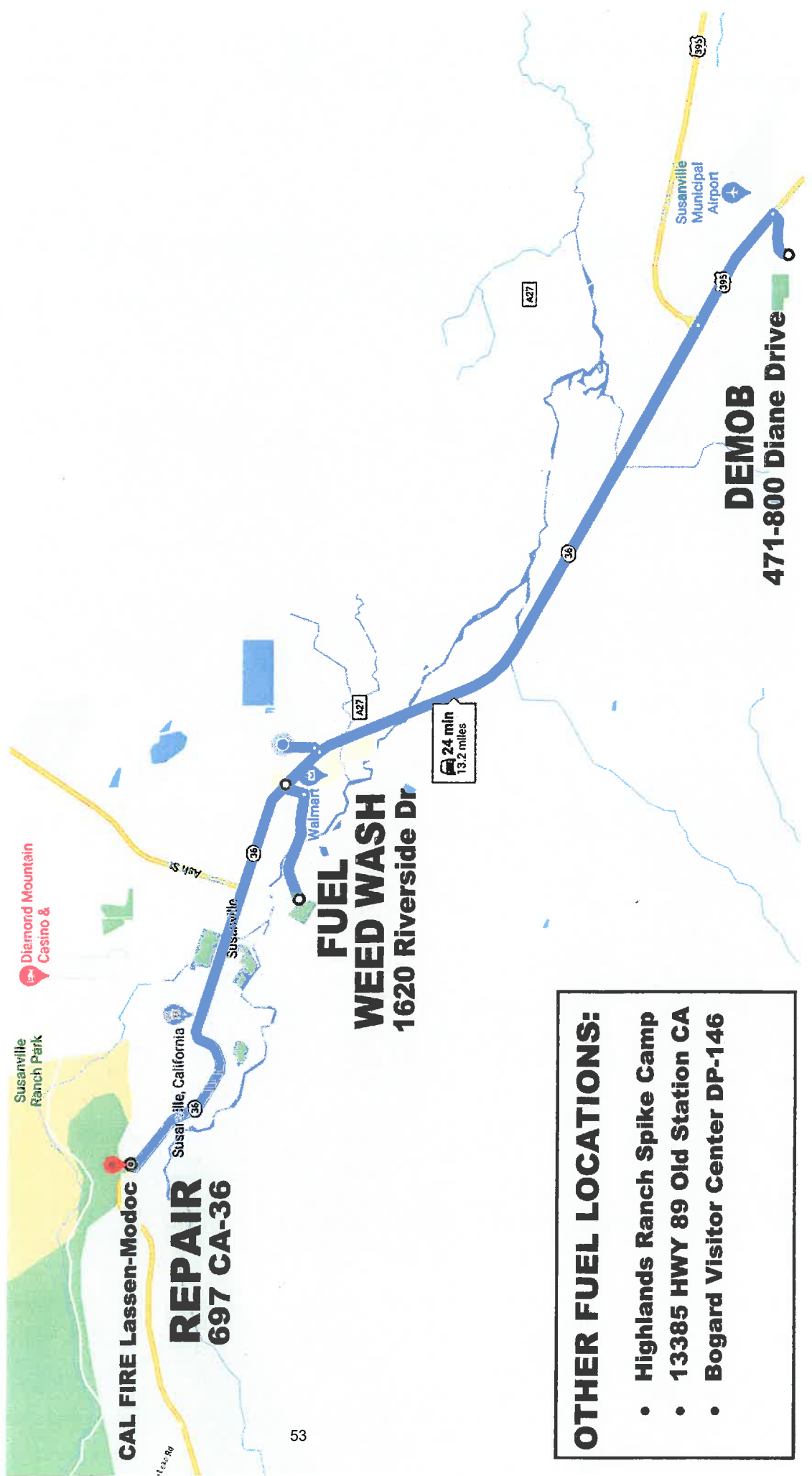

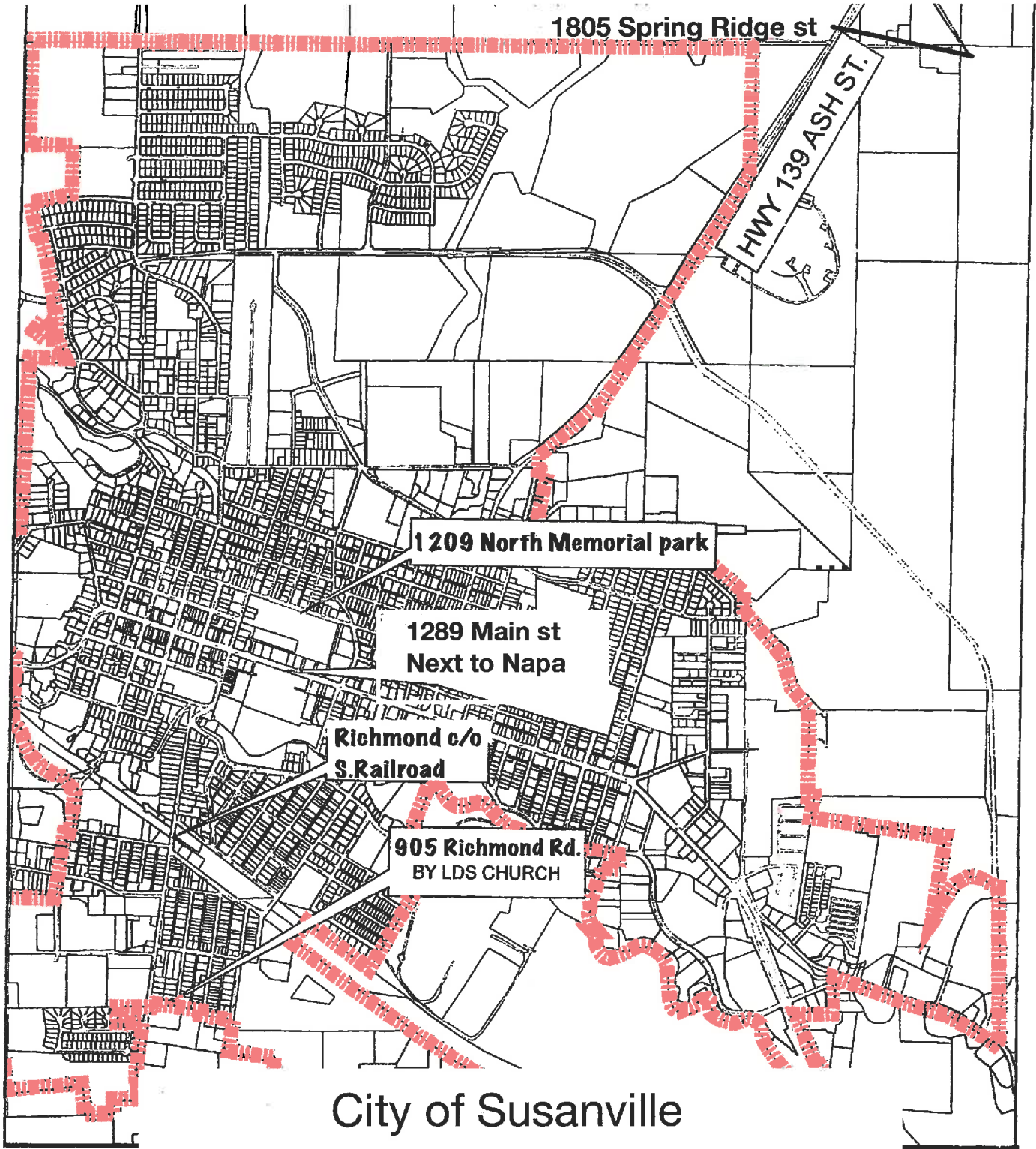
# FUEL-REPAIR-DEMOb MAP
