Minimize acres burned on all lands by effective and efficient firefighting efforts that offer the highest probability of success while maintaining safety first.</p> <u>Leaders Intent:</u> <p>Work effectively with cooperative partners towards a common goal of protecting values in a safe and efficient manner. All incident assigned personnel should be prepared to take appropriate actions regarding:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Professional behavior, conduct timely / effective communications. - Personal safety and the safety of others, including driving safely and defensively while implementing tactics that offer a high probability of success. - Manage fatigue by taking breaks and maintaining work rest guidelines. - Ensure all personnel have been briefed in operational strategies and tactics. 																					
<u>Management Objectives</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Utilize the risk management process to identify and mitigate hazards to protect first responders and the public. Emphasize strategies and tactics that have the highest probability of success and the least exposure to first responders and the public. - Develop proactive strategies to protect life, residential properties, communities, businesses and infrastructure. Employ tactics that fulfill these strategies while being mindful of the necessity for contingency and emergency plans. Ensure strategies account for incidents priorities, applying resources to those protecting life and residential properties first. - Follow COVID-19, CDC and established local, state and federal guidance to limit virus spread within the incident and surrounding communities near fire area. - Provide timely and continuous incident information to affected agency partners, cooperators, CALFIRE Team 1 as well as the public. - Utilize social media and all other communication tools to keep the public well informed of the fire conditions and other pertinent information. - Coordinate with Resource Advisors to implement suppression repair according to the plan and agency policy. - Maintain fiscal accountability and keep costs commensurate with values at risk.

WEATHER DISCUSSION: Gradual warming and drying continues today due to high pressure over the region. Wind will be a little more west southwest, and should be a little stronger.

WEATHER FORECAST:

WEATHER: Mostly sunny, by 0900 becoming sunny.

TEMPERATURE: Ridge high 72 to 80. Valley high 79 to 87.

HUMIDITY: Ridge minimum 14 to 20 percent. Valley minimum 11 to 19 percent.

20 FT WIND:

RIDGETOP – Variable up to 5 mph, by 1100 becoming SW to WSW 2 to 8 mph gusts to 14 mph. By 1400, ridge wind increasing to 8 to 15 mph gusts to 26 mph. **Escarpment wind** variable up to 5 mph, by 1100 becoming SW 5 to 10 mph gusts to 16 mph. By 1600, escarpment wind increasing to 9 to 15 mph gusts to 28 mph.

SLOPE/VALLEY – Down valley/downslope 1 to 4 mph, becoming upslope/up valley 7 to 13 mph gusts to 24 mph.

HAINES INDEX: 5 Moderate.

LIGHTNING ACTIVITY LEVEL: 1.

MIXING HEIGHT/TRANSPORT WIND: Rising to 3000 to 5000ft AGL, SW 10 mph.

STABILITY/INVERSION: Inversion top near 5800ft elevation, breaking from 1200-1300.

OUTLOOK FOR TONIGHT: Clear with more smoke development. **Low temperature:** Ridges 50 to 58. Valleys 38 to 52. **Maximum humidity:** Ridges 36 to 42 percent. Valleys 48 to 58 percent. **Ridge wind** WSW 7 to 15 mph gusts to 25 mph, by 2100 becoming W 7 to 13 mph gusts to 20 mph. By 0200 ridge wind becoming NW to N 4 to 10 mph gusts to 14 mph. **Escarpment wind** SW 10 to 18 mph gusts to 28 mph, by 2100 becoming SW 6 to 12 mph gusts to 18 mph. FIRE BEHAVIOR

- GENERAL:**
- Fuels are drying out: clear skies (increased solar radiation), warmer temperatures, and drying winds. Low fuel moistures remain in large fuels, one day wetting rain not enough change. Make your work count, by reducing heat and fire activity near control lines while fire behavior is damped down. Fire behavior will be much more receptive during next couple days. Minimal activity today over fire as normal southwest diurnal pattern returns.
 - As fine dead fuel moistures dry out (up to ¼ inch diameter), such as dead grasses, leaf litter, and timber litter. Expect greater smoldering, active fire behavior and potential spread where heavier fuels and stump holes have retained fire activity and provide source ignition as fuels become available.

SPECIFIC:

DIV WW/XX: Minimal fire activity expected.

DIV UU: Heat holding on steep slopes near Devils Punchbowl will be holding in place as things dry out. Favorable for mopping up and reducing heat near fires edge. Careful to watch for slippery footing, especially where retardant has been applied.

DIV OO: Minimal activity expected. Active fire in stump holes and logs near control lines or near pockets/islands of unburned fuels pose a potential risk for spreading or spotting.

DIV RR/QQ: Activity near Dixie Peak down to Dixie Valley is one of the primary concerns for roll-out and spotting, as things dry out and fire activity increases. SW winds should favor these divisions. From DP-623 to Lake Davis, SW winds will align with the fireline and there is potential for spots across this line. On Road 111, hot spots may flare up and have potential to spot into the Red Clover Valley and the improvements located there.

DIV PP: Minimal fire activity expected. Escarpment winds will not favor any fire along the rim and downslope. SW winds should be favorable for the handline above DP-626 but expect variable wind directions along the face and valley.

Honey Group: Minimal fire activity expected. The flanks should be mostly in alignment with the SW winds.

Night Ops: Lower temperatures, higher relative humidity and lower wind speeds will greatly reduce fire activity overnight.

AIR OPERATIONS: Clear air today. Expect minimum fire activity impacts to due to smoke to air operations.

SAFETY: As fuels dry out, maintain situational awareness. Plan for fire behavior to be more active over the next week as fuels dry out, probability of ignition increases, and rates of spread and spotting potential increases.

Riparian Areas

- Meadows are natural barriers. Tie the line to them, not through them. If line is needed, go around and outside of the meadow to avoid damage.
- Stream and creeks will not be used as line. If needing to cross, minimize damage (i.e. on a dozer lift the blade and only track over) to prevent post-fire stability issues. Do not push or cut line through or along them.

Water Drafting Sites

- Access the water source while trying your best to minimize damage to the soil and vegetation.
- If using a portable pump, make sure there is a spill kit and absorption pads to catch any accidental spills.
- Place portable pumps as far away as you can from the water source. Use screens on the intakes.
- Store fuel cans away from the water source and on a flat surface.

Working in the Wilderness

- Follow MIST for suppression actions.
- Consult with READs for spike camps, helispots, and sling sites locations.
- Practice "Leave No Trace" as much as possible.
- Work with READs to minimize visual impacts to wilderness areas when possible.


