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3. Objective(s):

Strategic Objectives

Implement a full suppression strategy on the Dixie Fire. Strategy and tactics implemented on the incident are to be prioritized utilizing life safety, community infrastructure defense, and natural / cultural values as a guiding principle. Minimize acres burned on all lands by effective and efficient firefighting efforts that offer the highest probability of success while maintaining safety first.

Leaders Intent:

Work effectively with cooperative partners towards a common goal of protecting values in a safe and efficient manner. All incident assigned personnel should be prepared to take appropriate actions regarding:

- Professional behavior, conduct timely / effective communications.
- Personal safety and the safety of others, including driving safely and defensively while implementing tactics that offer a high probability of success.
- Manage fatigue by taking breaks and maintaining work rest guidelines.
- Ensure all personnel have been briefed in operational strategies and tactics.

Management Objectives

- Utilize the risk management process to identify and mitigate hazards to protect first responders and the public. Emphasize strategies and tactics that have the highest probability of success and the least exposure to first responders and the public.
- Develop proactive strategies to protect life, residential properties, communities, businesses and infrastructure. Employ tactics that fulfill these strategies while being mindful of the necessity for contingency and emergency plans. Ensure strategies account for incidents priorities, applying resources to those protecting life and residential properties first.
- Follow COVID-19, CDC and established local, state and federal guidance to limit virus spread within the incident and surrounding communities near fire area.
- Provide timely and continuous incident information to affected agency partners, cooperators, CIIMT 14 and NIMO 1, as well as the public.
- Utilize social media and all other communication tools to keep the public well informed of the fire conditions and other pertinent information.
- Coordinate with Resource Advisors to implement suppression repair according to the plan and agency policy.
- Maintain fiscal accountability and keep costs commensurate with values at risk.

Control Objectives

- Keep the fire north of Grizzly Ridge and Davis Lake.
- Keep the fire south of Harvey Valley Road.
- Keep the fire east of Ponderosa Way and within established control lines.
- Keep the fire west of Highway 395 while ensuring infrastructure defense in the communities of Janesville and Milford.

General Situational Awareness:

Utilize IRPG checklist to support management decision making. Provide clear and concise directions, ask clarifying questions when needed.



...Increasing Southwest Winds this Week with Low Humidity Through Friday...

WEATHER DISCUSSION: Sunny with low humidity. Wind will begin light terrain driven then become southwest and increase afternoon, gusting to 25 mph over ridges. Gusty southwest winds increase through the week. Cooling late week with a chance of weekend rain.

WEATHER FORECAST:

WEATHER: Mostly sunny and hazy.

TEMPERATURE: Ridge high 75 to 80. Valley high 80 to 88.

HUMIDITY: Ridge minimum 13 to 18 percent. Valley minimum 11 to 18 percent.

20 FT WIND:

RIDGETOP – Variable up to 5 mph, by 1200 becoming SW 5 to 10 mph gusts to 15 mph. By 1400, ridge wind WNW increasing to 8 to 12 mph gusts to 25 mph.

SLOPE/VALLEY – Down valley/downslope 2 to 4 mph, becoming upslope/up valley 5 to 10 mph gusts to 16 mph by noon.

HAINES INDEX: 4 low

LIGHTNING ACTIVITY LEVEL: 1.

MIXING HEIGHT/TRANSPORT WIND: Rising to 7000 to 8000ft AGL, SW 18 mph.

STABILITY/INVERSION: Inversion top near 5500ft elevation, breaking 1200.

OUTLOOK FOR TONIGHT: Clear. **Low temperature:** Ridges 50 to 59. Valleys 40 to 52.

Maximum humidity: Ridges 36 to 40 percent. Valleys 45 to 70 percent. **Ridge wind** ridge wind SW 8 to 12 mph gusts to 25 mph through 2200, becoming south southwest 4 to 8 mph with gusts to 14 mph. **Valley wind** up valley/upslope down slope/down valley 5 to 10 mph gusts to 18 mph becoming downslope/down valley 2 to 5 mph. **Haines Index** 4. **LAL** 1. **Mxg Hgt/Trans Wind:** Inversion top around 3000ft elevation, SW 10 mph.

OUTLOOK FOR THURSDAY: Mostly sunny. **High temperature:** Ridges 72 to 79. Valleys 74 to 83.

Valleys 12 to 18 percent. **Ridge wind** SW 2 to 6 mph, by 1400 becoming SW 9 to 13 mph gusts to 25 mph. **Valley wind** down valley/downslope 1 to 4 mph, becoming upslope/up valley 4 to 8 mph gusts to 18 mph. **Haines Index** 4 Low. **LAL** 1. **Mxg Hgt/Trans Wind:** Rising to 6000-8000ft AGL, SW 16 mph.

EXTENDED FORECAST: **Thu Night/Fri:** Partly cloudy. Low 40 to 55. High 72 to 83. Afternoon ridge wind SW 7 to 14 mph gusts 25 to 30 mph. **Fri night/Sat:** Partly cloudy. Low 40 to 53. High 70 to 80. Afternoon ridge wind SW 10 to 17 mph gusts 25 to 35 mph. Increasing humidity. **Sat night/Sun:** Mostly cloudy. Low 39 to 51. High 66 to 75. Higher humidity. A chance of rain showers. Afternoon ridge wind SW 9 to 16 mph gusts to 30 mph.

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FIRE BEHAVIOR

GENERAL:

- **Minimal activity most areas.** Heat can hide in stump holes and roots. Be careful to check these near control lines, near edges of unburned islands, and edges of riparian areas that have the potential to flare up and spot. Majority of fire activity will be in stumps, stump holes and root systems. To a lesser extent in hollows and catfaces of standing trees.
- **Current fire environment conditions meet some of the critical thresholds that support rapid fire growth with a high resistance to control.** These include extreme to exceptional drought conditions, fuel moistures that are at or near extremely low or exceeding minimums, and energy release component (ERC) indices exceeding or near critical level for fire danger index.
- **New starts outside of recent fire footprint(s) will establish readily and spread rapidly with moderate to extreme fire behavior** (torching, individual/group tree torching and passive/active crown fire with spotting 0.1-0.5 miles, with potential for spotting distances 1-4 miles if plume dominated.

SPECIFIC:

DIV NN/OO/WW/XX: Minimal fire activity expected.

DIV UU: Minimal fire activity, except for some in area on steep slopes west of Devils Punchbowl. Steep slopes and difficult access make finding heat holding in stump holes, roots and catfaces. Forecasted winds this afternoon will test this area. Potential holdovers not found or interior islands have potential to flare up, torch trees and spot.

DIV RR/QQ: Wind test this afternoon for activity from Dixie Mt. down to Dixie Valley, but stump holes can hold on to heat for a longtime without showing smoke when underground. Grizzly, Turner and Horton ridges have minimal activity, but wind test this afternoon will should wake up any sleeping heat there.

DIV PP: Minimal fire activity expected. Escarpment winds will not favor any fire along the rim and downslope.

Honey Group: Minimal fire activity expected. Southern flank will be wind tested with WNW winds today.

Night Ops: Fire activity depends on area be worked. Most areas have minimal activity, but winds tonight should affect areas that still have active heat. **Most activity will be stumps, stump holes and roots in berms and roads.** Lower temperatures, poor-to-moderate humidity recovery ridgetop and midslope, and increased wind speeds will increase fire activity overnight where pre-existing heat exists.

AIR OPERATIONS: Clear air today. Expect minimum fire activity impacts due to smoke to air operations.

SAFETY: Fire weakened trees can burn in the upper portions. Look up! With forecasted winds today, make sure to look up and evaluate overhead hazards to assess risk to yourself and your crew.

- **Communicate Hazards to Others** – Hazards not communicated cannot be mitigated.
- **Acknowledge messages** – Ensure messages are understood.
- **Ask if you do not know** – Ask questions in unfamiliar situations. The only dumb question is the one you did not ask.

Installation of Waterbars



Construct waterbars when natural contour cannot be reconstructed, and slope exceeds 10% for dozer lines and hand lines.

Where possible, restore lines to natural contour and vegetation/duff cover; if this can be achieved and is approved by READ, waterbars are not needed.

- Spacing-
 - These spacing distances should be used as a guide. Judgement should be used in locating waterbars to minimize erosion potential. Install waterbars at the following recommended intervals:

Fire line Gradient (% of slope)	Distance between Waterbars (in feet)
0 to 10	No waterbars needed
11 to 20	100
21 to 40	75
41 to 60	50

- Location-
 - Locate waterbars at natural slope breaks or take advantage of natural features when possible. Direct water to unburned areas and/or resistant surfaces with high vegetation cover when possible. Waterbars should discharge into undisturbed areas and preferably rocky ground or filtered areas well protected with slash and vegetative cover.
- Width-
 - The waterbar channel will be wide enough to handle the expected waterflows and to avoid plugging when a normal amount of sloughing or sediment movement occurs.
- Angle-
 - Place waterbars at an angle relative to the fire line. The angle will be between 30-45 degrees.
- Depth-
 - Dozer Lines
 - ✓ Cut waterbars at least 6" into compact soil. The total height from the bottom of the waterbar to the top should average 18" and not to exceed 24".
 - Hand Lines
 - ✓ As a general rule, cut waterbars at least 4" into the compact soil. Total height from the bottom of the ditch to the top of the waterbar should average at least 8" and not exceed 12".

- **Remember repair includes removing hazard trees, chipping along roadsides, repairing trails, extracting logs, repairing fences, repairing archaeological damage, repairing staging areas and safety zones, seeding to avoid invasives, and other treatments in addition to repairing dozer lines**
- **We are very fortunate to have Tribal resources such as the Chumash and other engines/crews for repair. Their special cultural skills are invaluable for assessing archaeological and heritage resources and their repair. 

