...Red Flag Warning through 1100 Tuesday Morning for Area West of Twain...**

WEATHER DISCUSSION: Cold temperatures expected this morning, dropping into the low to mid 30s. Sunny skies today with temperatures rising into the 60s to low 70s in the afternoon. Gusty northeast winds continue into early Tuesday, with drying and gradual warming. Critical fire weather conditions are possible for the area around Twain westward due to the gusty northeast winds and low afternoon humidity dropping into the teens.

WEATHER FORECAST:

WEATHER: Sunny.

TEMPERATURE: Ridge high 60 to 69. Valley high 63 to 73.

HUMIDITY: Ridge minimum 18 to 24 percent. Valley minimum 19 to 26 percent.

20 FT WIND:

RIDGETOP – NE 5 to 10 mph gusts to 17 mph until 1200, then ridge wind ENE 6 to 12 mph, gusts to 25 mph in the afternoon.

SLOPE/VALLEY – E 4 to 6 mph until 1200, then 5 to 8 mph with gusts to 12 mph.

HAINES INDEX: 3 very low

LIGHTNING ACTIVITY LEVEL: 1.

MIXING HEIGHT/TRANSPORT WIND: Rising to 4000 to 6000ft AGL, NE 22 mph.

FIRE BEHAVIOR

GENERAL:

- Fire activity will primarily be in hold-over heat in stump holes and roots, logs, and in deep organic matter in timber litter, meadows, and riparian corridors. A unique location where heat tends to hold-over well is in log/chip landings due to the amount of woody material that gets buried in the soil. Watch out for and monitor needle-cast accumulations near homes and control lines from Sunday's winds. Continuity and density of will allow for fire spread.
- Over the next couple days with direct sun (solar heating), dryer winds and lower humidity we will start seeing increase in smokes and fire activity. Overall, the number smokes that appear will be less than that experienced during the warm, dry, and windy trend last week before the cold front.

SPECIFIC:

DIV NN/OO/PP & WW/XX: Minimal fire activity expected. Some interior smokes from heat in stump holes, logs and some snags may be visible as thing warm up.

DIV RR/UU: Most areas will have minimal fire activity. Interior smokes from heat in stump holes, logs and some snags may be visible.

DIV QQ: Minimal activity, area from Dixie Mt. down to Dixie Valley, where heat is holding-over in stump holes can hold on to heat for a longtime without showing smoke. Keep in mind that Monday-Tuesday after the front passes, winds are forecasted to switch 180°s and come out of N-NE-E.

Night Ops: Fire activity depends on area assigned. Cold front significantly affected fire activity. Depending on the amount of precipitation or not and humidity recovery, most activity will be stumps, stump holes and roots in berms and roads. Lower temperatures, precipitation, very high humidity recovery will significantly decrease fire activity overnight where pre-existing heat exists.

AIR OPERATIONS: Clear air today. Expect minimum fire activity impacts due to smoke to air operations.

SAFETY: Look Up, Look Down, Look All Around – when approaching new work areas or going to assess-suppress new smokes or heat. Winds from the last 48 hours (cold front), could have altered existing conditions. These are new conditions since you were here last or new to area. Such as hung up a tree, hung up limbs in trees (widow-makers), or stump holes.







Redundancy Systems

Can you think of a few simple things in your day-to-day life that are redundant but make things better? How about that spare tire in the trunk of your car? Or the battery in your smoke detectors? These are simple duplication and backups that keep the system running in case of a failure.

In wildland firefighting we use checklists, the IRPG and reassessments as a redundant back up to our training and experience. This can mean duplication of critical evaluations before engaging in a hazardous task. On a long fire like the Dixie, many safety topics have been briefed over the course of your assignment, but as a crew boss it is useful to review previously discussed hazards. Below are some topics already touched upon that you can use in your tailgate briefings to review with your crew members:

- Hazard Tree and Snag Safety.
- Driving and hazardous Road Conditions.
- Mop up and fire line repair.
- Radio Communications.
- Working around heavy equipment
- Trips and falls working on steep slopes
- Ash pits and stump holes
- Medical emergencies and preplanning the 206 information.

Safety and redundancy are not the same, but increasing redundancy has the effect of increasing safety in most cases. Even if you think you have already covered these topics enough, review and recap those that most apply to your work area. It never hurts to hear important information more than once.

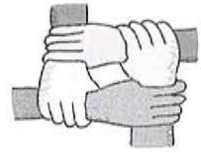

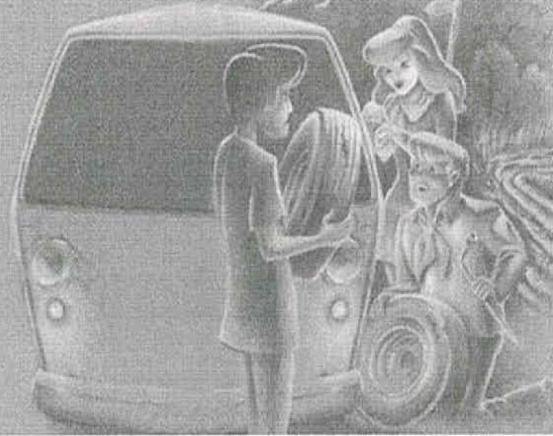

Resource Advisor Message

- Resource advisors will continue to work with operations staff to coordinate the big picture of where equipment is best allocated over time.
- Remember to follow Regional guidelines on hazard tree removal; REAFs will have copies of those. Guidelines state no tree removal from more than one tree length from the road and 1.5 tree lengths on the uphill side of the road. Trees removed should be dead or showing sufficient mortality to be removed.
- Fuel breaks should retain large trees for shade. Valuable logs should be decked; smaller logs and branches should be chipped. Fuel breaks should not be wider than one tree width. Shrubs and smaller trees can be masticated. Avoid leaving bare soil.
- In general we are not repairing lines on private land. REAFs can document suppression damage and prepare a report if requested. Consult a REAF if you have questions. In cases where a line goes in and out of NF we will repair the line. Consult with the Agency Administrator if needed.
- REAFs will help facilitate involvement and guidance from Forest personnel on the repair effort; i.e. continue to coordinate on fire lines to be left open.

Medical Incident Report

FOR A NON-EMERGENCY INCIDENT, WORK THROUGH CHAIN OF COMMAND TO REPORT AND TRANSPORT INJURED PERSONNEL AS NECESSARY.

Ex: "Communications, I have a Red priority patient, unconscious, struck by a falling tree. Requesting air ambulance to Forest Road 1 at (Lat./Long.) This will be the Trout Meadow Medical, IC is TFLD Jones. EMT Smith is providing medical care."

Severity of Emergency / Transport Priority

RED / PRIORITY 1 Life or limb threatening injury or illness. Evacuation need is **IMMEDIATE**

Ex: Unconscious, difficulty breathing, bleeding severely, 2^o – 3^o burns more than 4 palm sizes, heat stroke, disoriented.

YELLOW / PRIORITY 2 Serious Injury or illness. Evacuation may be **DELAYED** if necessary.

Ex: Significant trauma, unable to walk, 2^o – 3^o burns not more than 1-3 palm sizes.

GREEN / PRIORITY 3 Minor Injury or illness. **Non-Emergency transport**

Ex: Sprains, strains, minor heat-related illness.
