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3. Objective(s):
Strategic Objectives
Implement a full suppression strategy on the Dixie Fire. Strategy and tactics implemented on the incident are to be prioritized utilizing life safety, community infrastructure defense, and natural / cultural values as a guiding principle. Minimize acres burned on all lands by effective and efficient firefighting efforts that offer the highest probability of success while maintaining safety first.

Leaders Intent:
Work effectively with cooperative partners towards a common goal of protecting values in a safe and efficient manner. All incident assigned personnel should be prepared to take appropriate actions regarding:

- Professional behavior, conduct timely / effective communications.
- Personal safety and the safety of others, including driving safely and defensively while implementing tactics that offer a high probability of success.
- Manage fatigue by taking breaks and maintaining work rest guidelines.
- Ensure all personnel have been briefed in operational strategies and tactics.

Management Objectives

- Utilize the risk management process to identify and mitigate hazards to protect first responders and the public. Emphasize strategies and tactics that have the highest probability of success and the least exposure to first responders and the public.
- Develop proactive strategies to protect life, residential properties, communities, businesses and infrastructure. Employ tactics that fulfill these strategies while being mindful of the necessity for contingency and emergency plans. Ensure strategies account for incidents priorities, applying resources to those protecting life and residential properties first.
- Follow COVID-19, CDC and established local, state and federal guidance to limit virus spread within the incident and surrounding communities near fire area.
- Provide timely and continuous incident information to affected agency partners, cooperators, CIIMT 14; and CAL FIRE as well as the public.
- Utilize social media and all other communication tools to keep the public well informed of the fire conditions and other pertinent information.
- Coordinate with Resource Advisors to implement suppression repair according to the plan and agency policy.
- Maintain fiscal accountability and keep costs commensurate with values at risk.

Control Objectives

- Keep the fire within the current footprint.

General Situational Awareness:
Utilize IRPG checklist to support management decision making. Provide clear and concise directions, ask clarifying questions when needed.



WEATHER DISCUSSION: Cool in the morning, then warm, sunny and dry. There will be breezy southwesterly winds this afternoon, gusting 25 to 35 mph over ridges, 18 mph in valleys. Sunny the afternoon, with temperatures rising into the 70s to lower 80s. Afternoon humidity levels will drop into the teens. Winds shift back to the northeast on Thursday bringing lower humidity.

WEATHER FORECAST:

WEATHER: Partly cloudy morning, becoming sunny with light haze.

TEMPERATURE: Ridge high 70 to 79. Valley high 80 to 85.

HUMIDITY: Ridge minimum 14 to 19 percent. Valley minimum 15 to 20 percent.

20 FT WIND:

RIDGETOP – SW 5 to 10 mph gusts to 15 mph until 1200, then increasing to SW 9 to 17 mph, gusts to 30 to 35 mph in the afternoon.

SLOPE/VALLEY – E 3 to 5 mph until 1100, then WSW 5 to 12 mph with gusts to 18 mph.

LIGHTNING ACTIVITY LEVEL: 1.

MIXING HEIGHT/TRANSPORT WIND: Rising to 6000 to 8000ft AGL, SW 21 mph.

FIRE BEHAVIOR *Fall Equinox Today – 1st day of Autumn*

GENERAL:

- **Fuel moistures will continue to decrease (dry out) in smaller diameter vegetation, fuels that are less than 3 inches in diameter (<3”), as poor to moderate relative humidity (Rh) recovery at night and low daytime Rh’s continue during the day.** This will increase potential fire activity the next couple days. Especially where heat still exists, such as stump holes, heavy dead and down, snags, and duff. Fuel-limited areas where there is no grass, needle-cast, or timber litter will limit fire spread from increased activity in heavier fuels.
- **High winds out of the SW with gusts to 33 mph will increase existing fire activity.** This will be most visible in the afternoon when solar heating coupled with peak burning period and low Rh occurs. Fire activity will range from smoldering/creeping to open flame, there is some potential for isolated torching and crowning where fuels are available.

SPECIFIC:

DIV NN/OO/PP & WW/XX: Minimal fire activity. Some interior smokes from heat in stump holes, logs and some snags may be visible as thing warm up.

DIV RR/UU: Most areas will have minimal fire activity. Interior smokes from heat in stump holes, logs and some snags may be visible.

DIV QQ: Minimal fire activity. Heat holding-over in stump holes can hold on to heat for a longtime without showing smoke.

Night Ops: Fire activity depends on area assigned. Fuels are drying out, persistence activity at night will occur. Depending on the percent of nighttime humidity recovery, most activity will be stumps, stump holes and roots in berms and roads. Lower temperatures, moderate to good humidity recovery will continue to decrease fire activity overnight where pre-existing heat exists.

AIR OPERATIONS: Clear air today. Little impact to air operations due to smoke. Sunrise: 6:51am, Sunset: 7:00pm

SAFETY: High winds and gusts today. Watch out for trees that have fire weakened boles and root systems. Especially in areas that have had recent fire activity.

CREATING A LEARNING CULTURE IN WILDLAND FIRE

A learning culture sees unintended outcomes as valued opportunities to learn, grow and to be better. Leaders can treat accidents and other unintended outcomes as opportunities to look into our operations to better understand how firefighters perceive and manage risk. This view enables learning and with it, an accident can become a learning opportunity for those involved to share their story. Consider these important points:

- **A safety culture is dependent upon being a learning culture.**
- **A learning culture is dependent upon a culture of reporting.**
- **A culture of reporting is dependent upon trust; that is, firefighters willing to share openly because of the certain knowledge that leadership will respond in the best interest of the greater wildland fire community.**

Resource Advisor Message

- Resource advisors will continue to work with operations staff to coordinate the big picture of where equipment is best allocated over time.
- Remember to follow Regional guidelines on hazard tree removal; REAFs will have copies of those. Guidelines state no tree removal from more than one tree length from the road and 1.5 tree lengths on the uphill side of the road. Trees removed should be dead or showing sufficient mortality to be removed.
- Fuel breaks should retain large trees for shade. Valuable logs should be decked; smaller logs and branches should be chipped. Fuel breaks should not be wider than one tree width. Shrubs and smaller trees can be masticated. Avoid leaving bare soil.
- In general we are not repairing lines on private land. REAFs can document suppression damage and prepare a report if requested. Consult a REAF if you have questions. In cases where a line goes in and out of NF we will repair the line. Consult with the Agency Administrator if needed.
- REAFs will help facilitate involvement and guidance from Forest personnel on the repair effort; i.e. continue to coordinate on fire lines to be left open.




Medical Incident Report

FOR A NON-EMERGENCY INCIDENT, WORK THROUGH CHAIN OF COMMAND TO REPORT AND TRANSPORT INJURED PERSONNEL AS NECESSARY.

FOR A MEDICAL EMERGENCY: IDENTIFY ON SCENE INCIDENT COMMANDER BY NAME AND POSITION AND ANNOUNCE "MEDICAL EMERGENCY" TO INITIATE RESPONSE FROM IMT COMMUNICATIONS/DISPATCH.

1. CONTACT COMMUNICATIONS / DISPATCH (Verify correct frequency prior to starting report)

2. INCIDENT STATUS: Provide incident summary (including number of patients) and command structure.

Ex: "Communications, I have a Red priority patient, unconscious, struck by a falling tree. Requesting air ambulance to Forest Road 1 at (Lat./Long.) This will be the Trout Meadow Medical, IC is TFLD Jones. EMT Smith is providing medical care."

Severity of Emergency / Transport Priority

RED / PRIORITY 1 Life or limb threatening injury or illness. Evacuation need is IMMEDIATE

Ex: Unconscious, difficulty breathing, bleeding severely, 2° - 3° burns more than 4 palm sizes, heat stroke, disoriented.

YELLOW / PRIORITY 2 Serious Injury or illness. Evacuation may be DELAYED if necessary.

Ex: Significant trauma, unable to walk, 2° - 3° burns not more than 1-3 palm sizes.

GREEN / PRIORITY 3 Minor Injury or illness. Non-Emergency transport

Ex: Sprains, strains, minor heat-related illness.
