FROM THE ROCKY MOUNTAIN INCIDENT MANAGEMENT TEAM
Troy Hagan, Incident Commander

Thanks to all of you who have worked hard on this incident and welcome to those who may be new. The information presented below is intended to introduce you to some of the principles and protocols under which our Team operates.

- First of all, we regard you as part of our team. For us — including you — to work effectively, we must communicate—up, down and across.
- We take our job very seriously, but try not to take ourselves too seriously. Let's not let the little stuff bother us and detract from the job at hand.
- Safety is our first concern every time and in all situations. If you find a situation in which we don't seem to practice what we preach, let us know. We'll fix it.
- Your health and welfare are also important to us—this fire season has already been long and continues in to autumn. Please be sure to wash your hands before meals and remember those other sanitation efforts that will reduce your chances of getting sick.
- Face coverings/masks and physical distancing requirements on wildland incidents have been strengthened since vaccination status is not systematically tracked. It is recommended that everyone follow COVID-19 prevention and mitigation guidance for un-vaccinated individuals regarding physical distancing and mask/face covering use in fire camp unless outdoors and able to maintain at least six feet of distance, alone in an enclosed space or actively engaged in firefighting on the fireline.
- Please offer a wave, a smile or a kind word to area residents and visitors. Let's leave the relationships better than we found them.
- You will notice that our regular team members don't wear agency uniforms. That's because we are a team of many agencies and represent our region, not particular agencies. We encourage folks on our incidents to forego wearing agency uniforms unless there is a particular need for identification (e.g. law enforcement).
- Sexual harassment and other inappropriate behavior will not be tolerated. Such behaviors do not contribute to the accomplishment of our objectives.
- If you see unescorted media on the fire, contact your DIVS immediately. All media must be escorted by incident staff and must wear PPE.
- One of our most important functions as a Team is to support you in the fire suppression effort—to provide equipment, supplies, good food, adequate sleeping accommodations and the like. If there is something we can do better for you, please let us know.
- If we have misspelled your name or unit in the IAP (or have other similar errors), please let us know so we can correct it.

We are committed to providing a healthy work environment where we treat one another with respect. To accomplish this, we must each take responsibility for our conduct and speech. And it's OK to laugh and have fun! Thanks, folks. We hope you have a safe and productive assignment with us.

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- 3. Objective(s):**
- Identify and communicate hazards and conduct actions only when risks have been mitigated to acceptable levels.
 - Maintain an elevated awareness of current COVID-19 precautions and best infectious disease control measures to ensure the health of fire personnel and the public.
 - Implement strategies and tactics, with the highest probability of success, that keeps the fire within the existing containment lines and minimize the impact to the cultural, heritage, and natural resources.
 - Provide timely and accurate information to the public, stakeholders, cooperators and the adjacent incident management teams (East & West zones) about fire status, fire management strategies and tactics, repair efforts, and any potential fire-related safety and health concerns.
 - Implement and/or account for the repair of fire suppression-related activities as specified in the Dixie Fire Suppression Repair Plan.
 - Maintain fiscal accountability and keep costs commensurate with values at risk.
 - Provide safe and efficient initial attack within the established TFR perimeter.

- 4. Safety**
- Transition**
- Risks to fireline personnel increase significantly during transfer/transition periods regardless of the size or complexity of the incident. Many fatalities, serious injuries or incidents with potential have occurred during transition periods. Be proactive in mitigating the risks by proper implementation of LCES—Lookout, Communications, Escape Routes, and Safety Zones.
 - Factors for increased risks to fireline personnel during transition periods include:
 - No, or poor, briefing of incoming personnel
 - Lack of fire weather and behavior information, both forecast and observed
 - Communications; face-to-face briefings may not be possible and radio frequencies may be overextended and/or changing due to the increased demands on the system.
 - Initial attack resources may not have checked-in and the Incident Commander may not be aware of the number, type and location of all resources.
 - Location of safety zones and escape routes may not be known and communicated to all resources.
 - Mitigation actions to take:
 - Lookouts: Post and maintain your own lookouts.
 - Communications: Maintain existing communications with your own and adjacent resources while you are developing communications with incoming adjacent resources and your new supervisor.
 - Escape routes and safety zones: Identify escape routes and assure incoming resources are aware of their locations; be aware that your original escape routes and safety zones may no longer be accessible due to changing fire behavior or your increased distance from them.

FIRE BEHAVIOR

GENERAL:

Northeast California Energy Release Component is near 70 and climbing

- **Expect mostly low to moderate fire behavior** under warming weather and southwest winds with smoldering, creeping and flaming, primarily on interior unburned islands. Isolated interior torching possible in areas with heavier or more continuous fuels.
- **Fuels consist of grass, brush and timber** - Scott and Burgan fuel models GS2, SH3/4/9, TU1/5 and TL 6/9. 1000-hour fuel moistures are < 10% and live fuels are 60 – 70%.
- **Topography is varied** and includes mountains, hills, drainages, benches and meadows. The elevation ranges from 4000' to over 8000' in Lassen Park. All aspects are represented and slopes range from 0 to 80%.

SPECIFIC FIRE BEHAVIOR:

Mostly low fire behavior expected.

Maximum fire behavior potential in unburned interior islands or if fire escapes. Assumes dry fuels and sustained winds 5-20 mph.

With southwest winds, large interior unburned islands in Lassen Park and Lassen Forest Prospect Peak areas will continue to burn down favorably with potential for isolated single and group tree torching. Any hotspots near the north portion of the fire could flare up under southwest winds. Escapes into dry receptive vegetation to the north could fuel high fire behavior and rapid spread toward Hwy. 44.

AIR OPERATIONS

- Light inversion expected during morning hours.
- Sunrise 0656 hours, Sunset 1859 hours

SAFETY

- Drying conditions increase the likelihood for flareups and potential slopovers/spotfires during afternoon breezy winds.

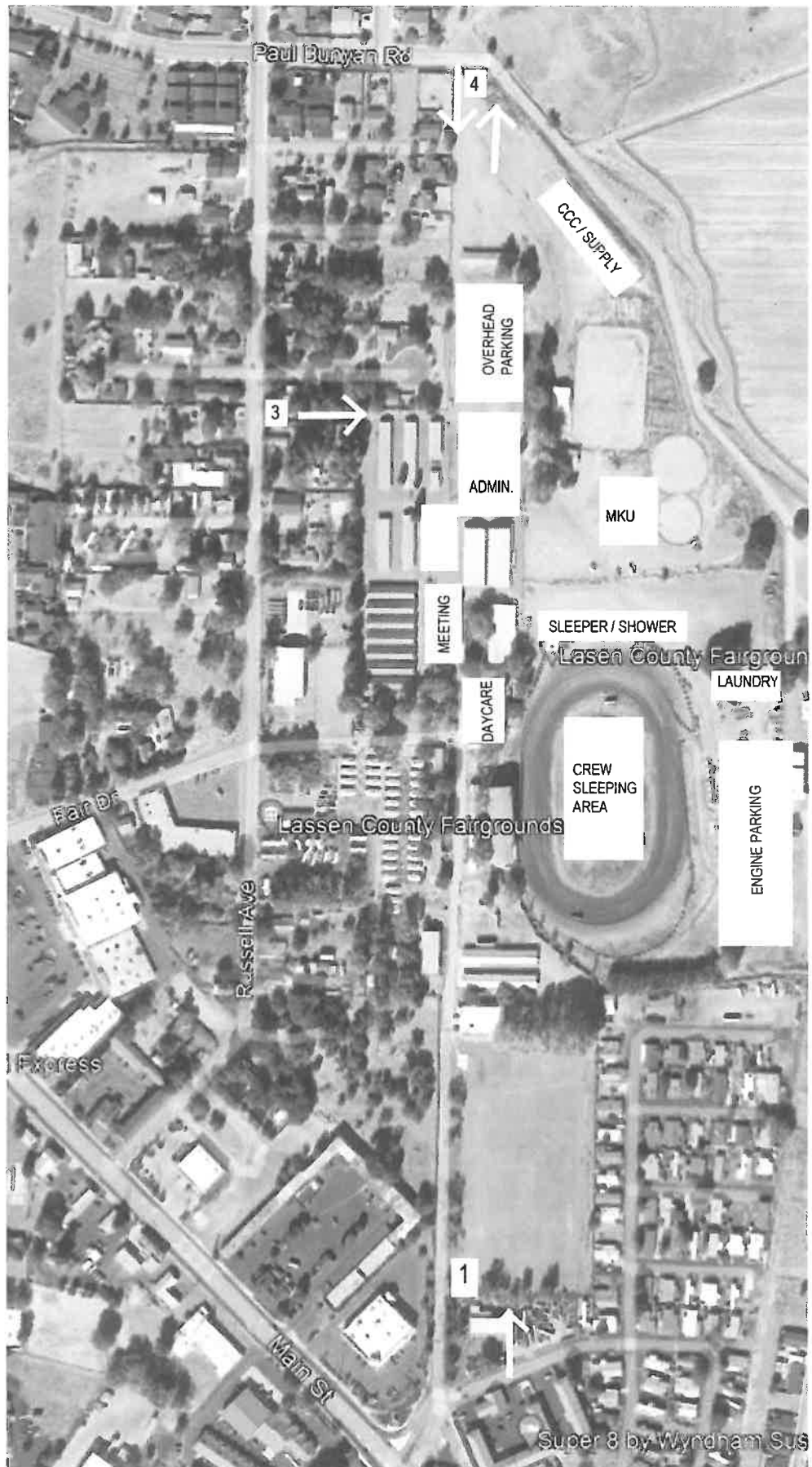

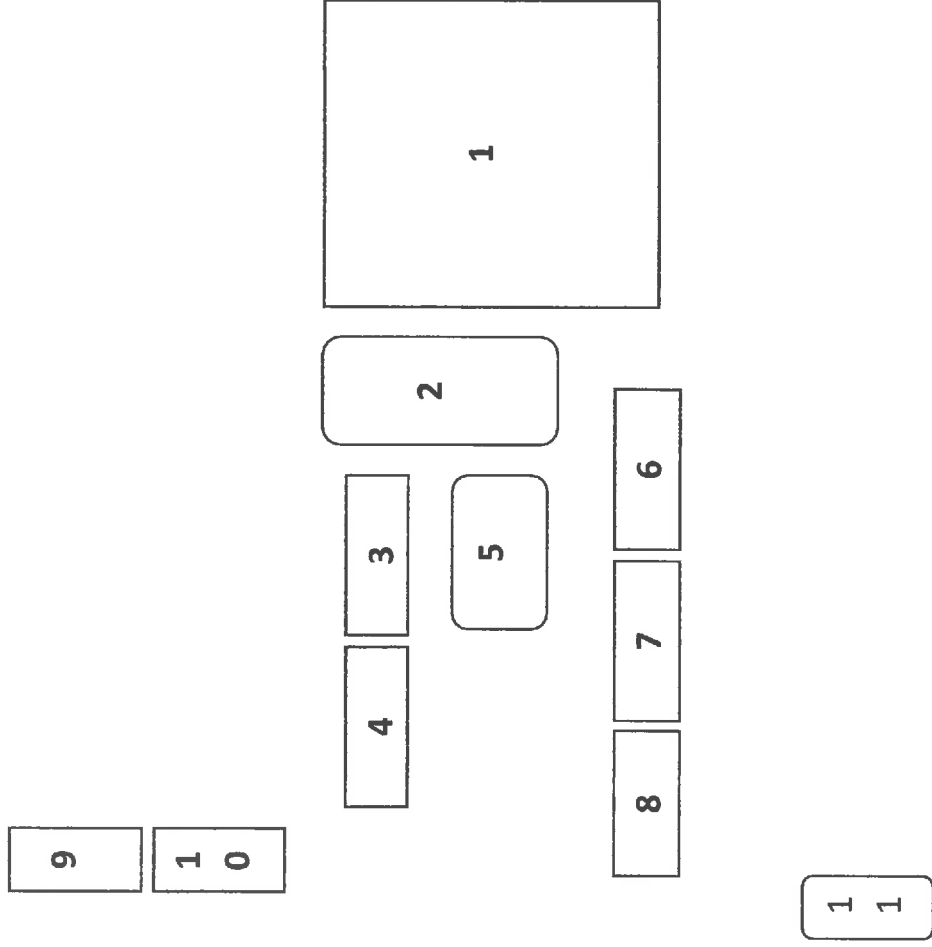
FEDERAL FAIRGROUND BASE CAMP
