1. Identify and communicate hazards and conduct actions only when risks have been mitigated to acceptable levels.
 2. Maintain an elevated awareness of current COVID-19 precautions and best infectious disease control measures to ensure the health of fire personnel and the public.
 3. Implement strategies and tactics, with the highest probability of success, that keeps the fire within the existing containment lines and minimize the impact to the cultural, heritage, and natural resources.
 4. Provide timely and accurate information to the public, stakeholders, cooperators and the adjacent incident management teams (East & West zones) about fire status, fire management strategies and tactics, repair efforts, and any potential fire-related safety and health concerns.
 5. Implement and/or account for the repair of fire suppression-related activities as specified in the Dixie Fire Suppression Repair Plan.
 6. Maintain fiscal accountability and keep costs commensurate with values at risk.
 7. Provide safe and efficient initial attack within the established TFR perimeter.

Weather Discussion:

A ridge will continue to bring fair weather across the whole region through the rest of the week. The warming trend continues which will see the highs return to the 80s and the lows return to the 40s. Dry conditions will persist through the rest of the week as dry air blankets northern CA. The winds remain out of a northeasterly direction for today before shifting back to a more standard southwesterly direction on Friday. The winds will be light for today and Friday allowing the local terrain winds to take over for at least the lower elevations. Friday will see a small enhancement of the cloud cover as a weak upper level trough briefly passes over northern CA.

FUEL ASSUMPTIONS: The fuels involved on the Dixie fire consist primarily of conifer timber litter with a shrub or grass understory. Fuel model TU 5 (timber/shrub) best represents these conditions. There are also areas of fuel model GS 2 (shrub/grass) especially on the eastern side and lower elevation areas.

Consider all fuels available to contribute to fire spread. Grass fuels are completely cured, and live fuel moistures in shrubs and canopy are at levels that will easily carry fire. 1000 hour fuel moistures are still in the single digits – recent precip had little effect on them.

WEATHER SUMMARY: Reference fire weather forecast for specifics. We are in a warming and drying pattern. Temps near 80 with RH's in the low teens today. Light NE winds are expected.

General Fire Behavior Forecast: Expect minimal fire behavior inside the fire footprint again today. A few visible smokes are likely. Reburn potential should remain low for another day or so. Sites with needle cast on an open, sunny slope might carry fire to a small degree. Fuels outside the footprint are drying and might carry fire in light fuels to a small degree. Activity inside the perimeter is not expected to have enough intensity to spot outside the perimeter today.

Night Shift: Minimal fire behavior expected. Some smoldering or isolated smokes may continue.

Specific:

DIV UU – Minimal fire behavior expected. Isolated smokes likely. Smokes in Devils' Punchbowl may have wind/slope alignment in its favor, but wind is light and unlikely to put pressure on containment lines.

DIV RR – Minimal fire behavior expected. Wind direction is in perfect alignment towards containment lines on Grizzly Ridge but are light and unlikely to pressure the line.

DIV WW/XX- Minimal fire behavior expected. No heat showing on satellite data.

Div NN/ QQ/PP/OO – Minimal fire behavior expected. Heat still exists in dozer berms along the west side of Milford spot. Wind direction today might pressure the control line somewhat. This line bears watching today.

Initial Attack – IA could occur in a light fuel situation (needles/grass) on an open sunny site. Fire spread could be moderate in an uphill run.

Fine fuel moisture today is - 3 to 4%	Rates of Spread in Timber- 4 to 7 chains per hour
Probability of Ignition today - 84%	Rates of Spread in Grass- 8 to 14 chains per hour
Spotting Distance Today- 1/10-mile	Flame Lengths- 2 to 7 feet

AIR OPERATIONS: Aviation activities should not be impacted by smoke or clouds today. Expect clear sky.

FIRE BEHAVIOR SAFETY: Don't be fooled by recent precip. Burning conditions have moderated, but live fuels and heavy fuels have recovered very little. They could cause a more intense fire than might be expected.

Power line Safety Tips

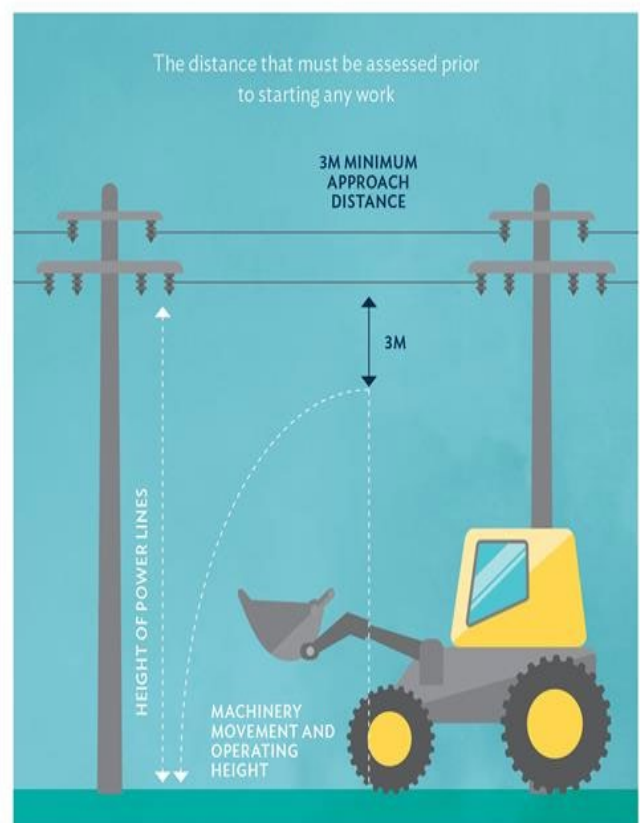
- **Always consider power lines “live” or energized. Only trained electrical workers can determine when it’s safe to be around power lines and wires. Never touch or even approach a power line.**
- **If you see a downed power line, move away from it and anything touching it. The ground around power lines – up to 35 feet away – may be energized.**
- **The proper way to move away from the power line is to shuffle away with small steps, always keeping your feet together and on the ground. This will minimize the potential for a strong electric shock.**
- **If it looks like power lines will be in your way, contact PG&E at 1-800-743-5000**

At your daily briefing, review these tips for staying safe around electricity on the job.

- Point out nearby power lines
- Keep everyone and everything far away from overhead power lines
- Select a spotter to help you stay clear of power lines and other safety hazards
- Mark boundaries to keep everyone and everything safely away from overhead power lines

If someone gets a shock from a line

- Your first step is to call 911 and inform the operator that it’s an electrical emergency.
- Don’t touch anything or anybody that’s been in contact with energized equipment and keep others away.

Resource Advisor Message

- Resource advisors will continue to work with operations staff to coordinate the big picture of where equipment is best allocated over time.
- Remember to follow Regional guidelines on hazard tree removal; REAFs will have copies of those. Guidelines state no tree removal from more than one tree length from the road and 1.5 tree lengths on the uphill side of the road. Trees removed should be dead or showing sufficient mortality to be removed.
- Fuel breaks should retain large trees for shade. Valuable logs should be decked; smaller logs and branches should be chipped. Fuel breaks should not be wider than one tree width. Shrubs and smaller trees can be masticated. Avoid leaving bare soil.
- Repair on suppression lines on private land will be evaluated on a case by case basis, based on highest Fire and Forest priorities. REAFs can document suppression damage and prepare a report if requested by the private landowner. If a landowner requests a repair, document on a General Message (213) with the name, contact info. and any other relevant information and pass this on to your Division.
- REAFs will help facilitate involvement and guidance from Forest personnel on the repair effort; i.e. continue to coordinate on fire lines to be left open.

Communication:

High performing teams demonstrate seamless communication when fulfilling the mission. Communication is used to express your thoughts, goals, and personality to the team. *Keep this in mind: 93% of all communication is through body language (facial expressions, body posture, and tone). Only 7% of a conversation is the actual verbal part.* Communication begins with your internal thoughts and is relayed to others when you are clear about your interests rather than your perspective. The non-verbal portion of communication is what either keeps or distracts a person involved in the conversation. Communicating properly improves the willingness of your team to cooperate and accomplish the mission.

Take Home Message:

**Remember, the more you focus on controlling your body language and tone of voice
the more your team will understand what you are saying.**
