#### Weather Discussion:

Change remains the name of the game as a frontal system impacts northern CA. This will bring stronger winds across the fire area today, especially along the ridges. This system is also bringing ever increasing moisture to the region raising the RH and producing cloud cover. However, the fire area is coming off a prolonged dry period and will still be somewhat dry, which coupled with the winds is creating enhanced fire weather conditions for today. While the winds remains gusty for Wednesday the moisture will have increased enough that fire weather conditions will finally subside. Some light showers can form over the fire area as early as Wednesday but they will be more common on Thursday and Friday. Temperatures are also falling so dress warm for the morning is going to get real cold real fast.

**FUEL ASSUMPTIONS:** The fuels involved on the Dixie fire consist primarily of conifer timber litter with a shrub or grass understory. Fuel model TU 5 (timber/shrub) best represents these conditions. There are also areas of fuel model GS 2 (shrub/grass) especially on the eastern side and lower elevation areas.

Consider all fuels available to contribute to fire spread. Grass fuels are completely cured, and live fuel moistures in shrubs and canopy are at levels that will easily carry fire. Fuel moistures remain low today!

**WEATHER SUMMARY: Reference fire weather forecast for specifics**. Increasing winds with cooler temperatures and higher relative humidity.

General Fire Behavior Forecast: Fire danger remains high but begins to moderate early in the burn period today! - Inside the fire perimeter fire behavior should remain minimal with isolated stumps, berms, and heavy fuels smoldering and producing light white smoke. Reburn potential decreases today as moisture levels rise. Outside the fire footprint, fuels remain extremely dry. Probability of Ignition decreases today but remains high. Be extra careful with equipment and dozer berms. Rates of spread will be moderate, but spotting will likely be a major challenge. Fires will display moderate resistance to control. Burn period likely to be moderated with the arrival of clouds and moist air early in the afternoon.

#### Specific:

**DIV UU –** Minimal fire behavior expected inside the footprint. Isolated smokes likely. Reburn potential decreasing as the day progresses.

**DIV RR** – Minimal fire behavior expected. Isolated smokes likely along Grizzly ridge and mine site.

**DIV WW/XX-** Minimal fire behavior expected. Isolated smokes likely with reburn unlikely.

**DIV NN/QQ/PP/OO** – Minimal fire behavior expected. Hidden heat likely still exists in dozer berms along the west side of Milford spot. Creeping reburn likely to continue near unburned island in Black Mtn area.

Initial Attack – IA could easily occur today. Dry fuels, and high wind speeds will be moderated by higher RH and clouds later in the day. Terrain and wind could align for increased ROS and flame lengths. Spotting will remain a problem. Fire growth in an uphill run could be substantial.

**AIR OPERATIONS**: Morning haze should clear by mid-day for good afternoon visibility, Gusty winds in the afternoon could impact aviation operations.

**Driving Hazards** – Driving is the most hazardous task on the incident at the present time. As you buckle up in your equipment for the day and drive down the highway at speeds in excess of 40 mph, think about all the hazards you may encounter along the way. Sleep iness, spilled coffee, gadget distractions, animals, other drivers and of course, road conditions, can turn a good day into a bad day in a millisecond. Be sure to always drive defensively, stay alert, buckle up, and don't be complacent. Driving complacency kills or injures thousands of people every year.

There is increased traffic in division UU on the China Grade just North of DP 220. Be advised that this road is shut down at any given time during daylight hours and can be closed for up to 2 hours. Find an alternative route if you need to travel into the Taylorsville area.

#### Five Communications Responsibilities:

- Brief—use briefings to ensure accurate situation awareness.
- Debrief—use After Action Reviews to build accountability and learn from experience.
- Acknowledge and understand messages acknowledge and ensure clarity of received communications on conditions, assigned tasks, intent, and other important information.
- Communicate hazards to others—use hazard identification, a key component of risk management, to identify personal, tactical, situational, political, or organizational hazards. Good leaders ensure that team members are vigilant for hazards and communicate identified hazards effectively.
- Ask if you don't know—guard against making false assumptions when the picture is not clear.

# Resource Advisor Message

- Resource advisors will continue to work with operations staff to coordinate the big picture of where equipment is best allocated over time.
- Remember to follow Regional guidelines on hazard tree removal;
   REAFs will have copies of those. Guidelines state no tree removal from more than one tree length from the road and 1.5 tree lengths on the uphill side of the road. Trees removed should be dead or showing sufficient mortality to be removed.
- Fuel breaks should retain large trees for shade. Valuable logs should be decked; smaller logs and branches should be chipped.
   Fuel breaks should not be wider than one tree width. Shrubs and smaller trees can be masticated. Avoid leaving bare soil.
- Repair on suppression lines on private land will be evaluated on a case by case basis, based on highest Fire and Forest priorities.
   REAFS can document suppression damage and prepare a report if requested by the private landowner. If a landowner requests a repair, document on a General Message (213) with the name, contact info. and any other relevant information and pass this on to your Division.
- REAFs will help facilitate involvement and guidance from Forest personnel on the repair effort; i.e. continue to coordinate on fire lines to be left open.

#### **HUMAN RESOURCES MESSAGE**

October 5, 2021

#### Fitness for Duty:

High performing teams are always prepared and ready to go at a moment's notice. Changing conditions and transitions have become the norm this season sometimes with little to no predictability. It is imperative that you and your crew are fit for duty in the event of a sudden change. As your crews time out and return, remind everyone of the importance of their behavior when off assignment as well that every person on this assignment is required to follow the zero tolerance for drugs and alcohol use policy. Consider explaining the following guidelines using the techniques of servant leadership, shared vision accountability and building on differences:

Non-prescription, unlawful drugs and alcohol are not permitted at the incident: Possession or use of these substances will result in disciplinary action.


During off-incident rest periods, personnel are responsible for proper conduct and maintenance of fitness for duty. Drug or alcohol abuse resulting in unfitness for duty will result in disciplinary action.
