3. Objective(s):

1. Identify and communicate hazards and conduct actions only when risks have been mitigated to acceptable levels.
2. Maintain an elevated awareness of current COVID-19 precautions and best infectious disease control measures to ensure the health of fire personnel and the public.
3. Implement strategies and tactics, with the highest probability of success, that keeps the fire within the existing containment lines and minimize the impact to the cultural, heritage, and natural resources.
4. Provide timely and accurate information to the public, stakeholders, cooperators and the adjacent incident management teams (East & West zones) about fire status, fire management strategies and tactics, repair efforts, and any potential fire-related safety and health concerns.
5. Implement and/or account for the repair of fire suppression-related activities as specified in the Dixie Fire Suppression Repair Plan.
6. Maintain fiscal accountability and keep costs commensurate with values at risk.
7. Provide safe and efficient initial attack within the established TFR perimeter for the West Zone and the current fire footprint of the East Zone.



Weather Discussion:

Colder and wetter conditions are arriving in the fire area today as a frontal system slowly passes over northern CA. Winds will be gusty today and weaker but still gusty on Thursday. Moisture will cause extensive cloud cover along with high RH. Showers can start today but will be light if they do occur. Thursday will see further showers which will be heavier with the best chance of occurrence in the afternoon to evening. Wetting rains will be possible starting on Thursday. If precipitation falls during the overnight hours it can be as snow due to the cold conditions. Also any wet surfaces can freeze overnight as the temperatures falls below freezing. The mornings are just getting colder and colder so dress warmly.

SKY/WEATHER: Cloudy, slight chance for sprinkles to brief light rain showers.

High Temperature: 62-69. **Min RH:** 29-36%

20 ft Level-WINDS: Valleys: Valleys: Southwesterly winds 4-6 mph gusts to 12 mph, increasing by 1100, to 8-12 mph with gusts to 25 mph. **Ridges:** Southwesterly winds 5-10 mph gusts to 16 mph, increasing by 1100, to 10-15 mph gusts to 30 mph.

Transport Winds: Southwesterly 25 to 30 mph. **Mixing Height** 6,000 ft.

SKY/WEATHER: Cloudy and colder, chance for light rain showers.

20 ft Level-WINDS: Valleys: Upslope winds 0-3 mph, becoming by 1100, to 4-8 mph with gusts to 20 mph. **Ridges:** Southwesterly winds 3-7 mph gusts to 10 mph, increasing by 1100, to 8-12 mph gusts to 25 mph.

Transport Winds: Southwesterly 15 to 25 mph. **Mixing Height** 5,000 ft.

FUEL ASSUMPTIONS: The fuels involved on the Dixie fire consist primarily of conifer timber litter with a shrub or grass understory. Fuel model TU 5 (timber/shrub) best represents these conditions. There are also areas of fuel model GS 2 (shrub/grass) especially on the eastern side and lower elevation areas.

Consider all fuels available to contribute to fire spread. Grass fuels are completely cured, and live fuel moistures in shrubs and canopy are at levels that will easily carry fire.

WEATHER SUMMARY: Reference fire weather forecast for specifics. Increasing clouds with cooler temps and humidity levels that are on the upswing. Remaining breezy but fire weather is declining.

General Fire Behavior Forecast: Fire danger begins to moderate substantially today - Inside the fire perimeter fire activity will remain minimal. Reburn potential decreases today as moisture levels rise. Isolated smokes will remain visible.

Outside the fire footprint, fuels remain dry however, they are not as volatile today as humidity and clouds will increase fuel moistures. Probability of Ignition decreases noticeably today. Rates of spread will be reduced today as well. Initial attack success is much more likely today than in previous days.

Specific:

DIV UU – Minimal fire behavior expected inside the footprint. Isolated smokes likely. Reburn potential decreasing as the day progresses.

DIV RR – Minimal fire behavior expected. An isolated smoke possible along Grizzly ridge and mine site.

DIV WW/XX- Minimal fire behavior expected. An Isolated smoke possible. Reburn potential is declining.

DIV NN/QQ/PP/OO – Minimal fire behavior expected. Potential for reburn is decreasing.

Initial Attack – IA today could not be ruled out, but potential is decreasing. Weather conditions will discourage fire starts and fire behavior. In the event of a new start – expect much more manageable spread rates and flame lengths today.

Fine fuel moisture today is – 8 to 9%	Rates of Spread in Timber- 6-10 chains per hour
Probability of Ignition today - 40 or <	Rates of Spread in Grass- 12-20 chains per hour
Spotting Distance Today - 1000 feet	Flame Lengths- 3 -6 feet on the surface

AIR OPERATIONS: Overcast skies today with chance for precipitation. No lightning expected. Will be breezy once again however.

FIRE BEHAVIOR SAFETY: Fire behavior threat has diminished somewhat today as weather conditions have moderated quite a bit. It is transition day to a new team and fireline leadership will be changing. Make sure you know who you are working with/for and whom to communicate with.

Today is Transition Day

The incoming California Interagency Incident Management Team #14 will be shadowing the SA Gold Team today before taking over the fire at 1800. This has historically been a time where missed communications or the lack there of can lead to an undesirable outcome. Make sure you have good instructions and communication with your supervisor before engaging in the work area.

Check and make sure your fire line supervisor has informed you if leadership will be changing on your division. New resources don't have the benefit of knowing what has happened on the incident so take the time to learn the new faces, watch for changes in tactics (if any) and help get the new folks up to speed. Connecting with your new team members is imperative for a smooth transition, if you have questions ask someone for clarification.

Four Critical Errors that are made While Driving

1. Eyes not on the task – Texting while you drive or looking at the scenery.
2. Mind not on task – Talking on the phone or radio while driving.
3. Being in the line of fire – The oncoming vehicle is in your lane.
4. Losing our balance or traction – We are driving too fast for the road conditions.

Resource Advisor Message

- Resource advisors will continue to work with operations staff to coordinate the big picture of where equipment is best allocated over time.
- Remember to follow Regional guidelines on hazard tree removal; REAFs will have copies of those. Guidelines state no tree removal from more than one tree length from the road and 1.5 tree lengths on the uphill side of the road. Trees removed should be dead or showing sufficient mortality to be removed.
- Fuel breaks should retain large trees for shade. Valuable logs should be decked; smaller logs and branches should be chipped. Fuel breaks should not be wider than one tree width. Shrubs and smaller trees can be masticated. Avoid leaving bare soil.
- Repair on suppression lines on private land will be evaluated on a case by case basis, based on highest Fire and Forest priorities. REAFs can document suppression damage and prepare a report if requested by the private landowner. If a landowner requests a repair, document on a General Message (213) with the name, contact info. and any other relevant information and pass this on to your Division.
- REAFs will help facilitate involvement and guidance from Forest personnel on the repair effort; i.e. continue to coordinate on fire lines to be left open.
