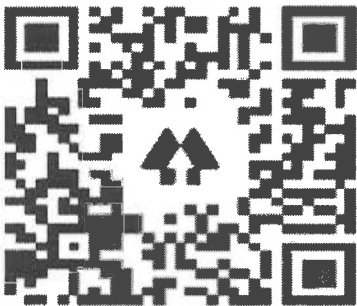


Our Incident Management Team endorses and supports an attitude of mutual respect for all personnel and the public we serve.

Safety <p style="text-align: center;">WORKING AROUND HEAVY EQUIPMENT</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Have a clear line of site between you and the operator, blind spots are common in the seat of a piece of equipment. • If you can't see the operator, they can't see you. • Operator should idle down machine, engage brake, lower attachment and make eye contact before you approach the machine. • Approach the machine from the side, never from the back. • Debris falling and limbs can jet out on impact of trees falling. • Masticators have been known to throw debris more than 200 feet and injure/kill people. • Tops of trees can break and fall back onto machinery. <p><i>A true leader has the confidence to stand alone, the courage to make tough decisions, and the compassion to listen to the needs of others. WEATHER DISCUSSION: Northerly winds will overspread the region with sustained speeds around 8 mph and gusts to near 14 mph. Minimal shading will allow temperatures to climb into the 50s and 60s with mid-slope and higher elevation minimum afternoon humidity values falling down to around 25%. Tonight will feature cold conditions again with lows in the 30s. **Red Flag conditions and very cold conditions are possible early next week.** Please see the extended outlook below for the details.

TODAY: Mostly sunny with a few fair weather clouds possible.

High Temperatures: Valley/Drainages: 63-68° Mid-Slope (4500-5500 FT): 57-62° Ridges (> 5500 FT): 52-57°
Minimum Relative Humidity: Valley/Drainages: 20-25% Mid-Slope (4500-5500 FT): 25-30% Ridges (> 5500 FT): 25-30%

Interior heat islands (near DP-301): Terrain driven flow will become increasingly northeasterly through mid-morning with speeds of 2-4 mph. Wind speeds will increase into the 4-8 mph range with gusts around 14 mph during the afternoon hours.

Branch 13: Terrain driven flows under 3 mph will continue until about mid-morning. Thereafter, winds will increase into the 3-6 mph range with gusts up to 10-14 mph in the afternoon.

Hazard Tree Group Working Area: Terrain driven winds under 3 mph will intensify and turn more northeasterly by noon with speeds of 3-6 mph. Gusts to 12 mph.

Branch 16: SE winds at 3-6 mph will become increasingly westerly through mid-morning. Speeds will increase into the 4-8 mph range with gusts around 10-14 mph during the afternoon hours..

Stability: Strong inversion lifting by noon with mixing heights to around 4500 FT AGL.

Chance of Rain: 0% **LAL:** 1 **Transport Winds:** NE at 10 mph.

TONIGHT: Mostly clear and cold.

Low Temperatures: Valley/Drainages: 33-38° Mid-Slope (4500-5500 FT): 32-37° Ridges (>5500 FT): 29-34°
Susanville ICP: 35-38 ° **Hat Creek Spike:** 33-36°
Relative Humidity Recovery: Valley/Drainages:60-70% Mid-Slope (4500-5500 FT): 50-55% Ridges (> 5500 FT): 50-55%

Interior heat islands (near DP-301): Downslope/down-valley flow likely developing by 2000 PDT with speeds largely under 4 mph, possibly becoming calm around sunrise Sunday.

Branch 13: Downslope/down-valley flow expected around 2000 PDT with speeds near 2 mph. Calm winds probable by 0400 PDT Sunday morning.

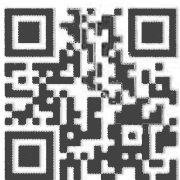
Hazard Tree Group Working Area: Downslope flow probable by 2000 PDT with down-valley flow around 0600 PDT Sunday. Speeds will remain under 4 mph.

Branch 16: Easterly downslope flow around 2000 PDT with speeds between 4-8 mph through 0400 PDT Sunday. Terrain-driven winds will subside down to the 2 to 4 mph range thereafter through sunrise.

Stability: Strong inversion developing around 2000 PDT.

Chance of Rain: 0% **LAL:** 1 **Transport Winds:** WNW at 5 mph.

Extended Outlook (Sunday through Tuesday): **Red Flag conditions possible next week.** A strong cold front will plow through the incident late Sunday into Monday.. An abrupt wind shift to the north, cold air, and a low chance for a light rain/snow mix should be expected Monday morning. Skies will likely clear Monday afternoon resulting in significantly windier and drier conditions. Ridgetop winds are forecast to gust to near 40 mph with afternoon humidity falling down into the teens. During the overnight periods, temperatures will plummet into the low to mid 20s. ***Even light winds will result in brutal wind chill or feel like temperatures in the teens.***

- Passing ridge will bring fair weather with sunny skies and light winds
- Max. Temp.: 63-70°
- Min. RH: 22-29%. Maximum nighttime RH: 65-75%
- Winds: Upslope becoming 2-5 mph with gusts to 10. Ridges: Northerly becoming 3-7 mph with gusts to 12

FIRE BEHAVIOR

GENERAL:

Northeast California Energy Release Component is about 55

- **Expect very little fire activity** with smoldering and creeping in unburned interior islands, dozer berms, stumpholes and post-burn needlecast.
- **Fuels are grass, brush and timber** - Scott and Burgan fuel models GS2, SH3/4/9, TU1/5 and TL 6/9. 1000-hour fuel moistures are < 10% and live fuels are 60 – 70%.
- **Topography is varied** and includes mountains, hills, drainages, benches and meadows. The elevation ranges from 4000' to over 8000' in Lassen Park. All aspects are represented and slopes range from 0 to 80%.

SPECIFIC FIRE BEHAVIOR:

Very low fire behavior and potential due to frontal passage and wet fuels on portions of the fire. Expected fire behavior includes smoldering and creeping and very low if any rates of spread in unburned pockets of vegetation and fuel. The West Zone remains the most active portion of the fire.

West Zone: There are a few remaining isolated hotspots, mostly in unburned interior islands in Lassen Park and Lassen Forest/Prospect Peak/Cluster Lakes areas.

East Zone: Very little heat evident. There may be a few remaining hot stumpholes and buried heat in dozer berms.

Maximum Fire Behavior (both Zones, assuming no rain):

- Surface Flame Lengths 3-6'
- Rate of Spread 12-20 chains/hour grass and 6-10 chains/hour in timber
- Spotting Distance up to 1000'
- Probability of Ignition < 40%

AIR OPERATIONS

- No weather or fire behavior related limitations are anticipated for aviation operations

SAFETY

- Size-up work areas for fire weakened trees near containment lines. Watch for hot stumpholes and snipes.



We are all in this together. Let's treat each other with mutual respect.

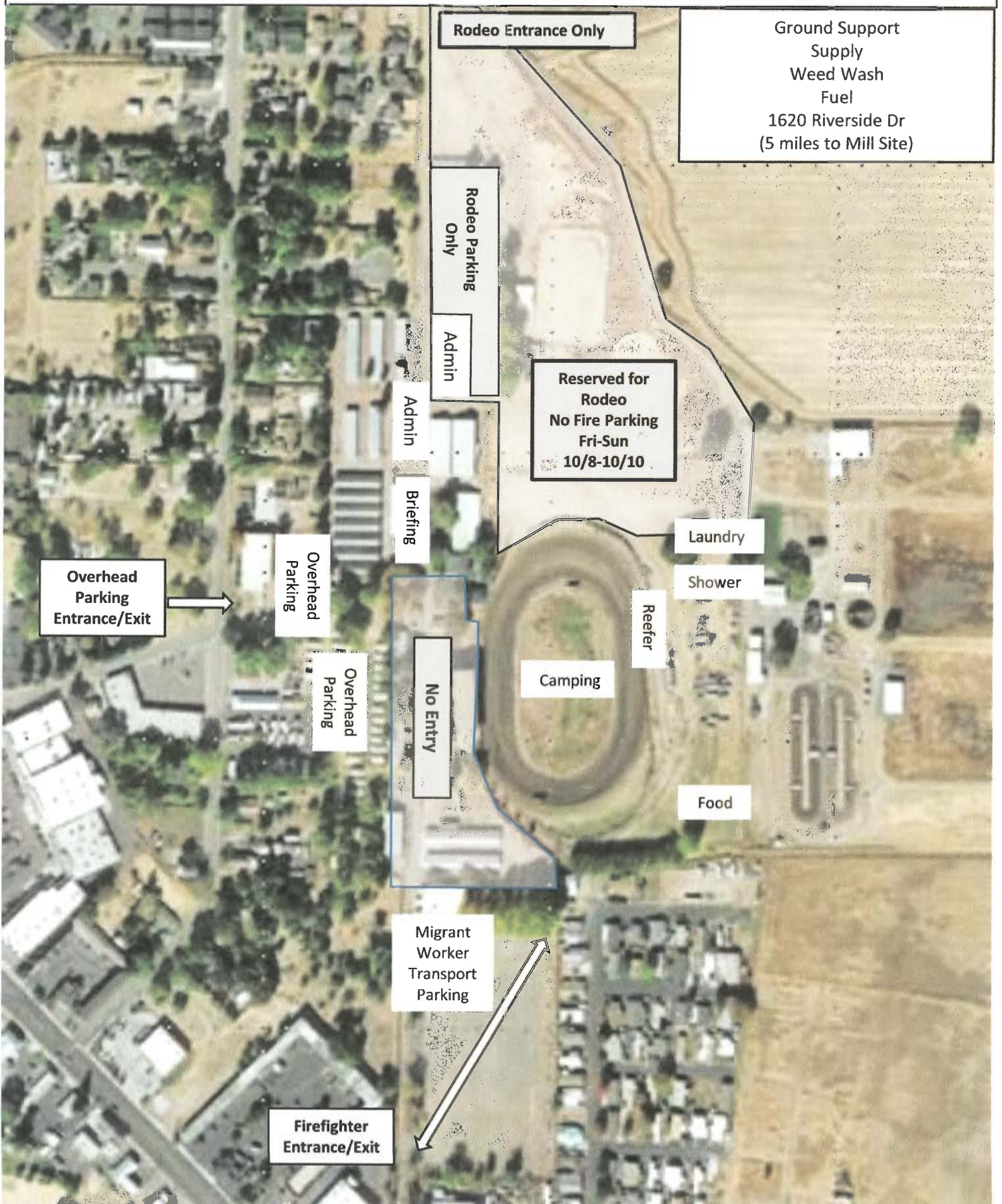

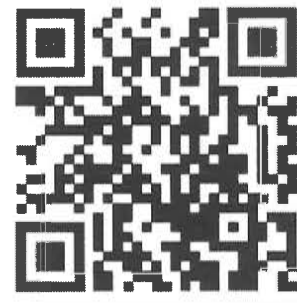
