**DISCUSSION:** A weak disturbance will brush the area on Monday, resulting in a few rain showers, particularly during the afternoon hours (but possible anytime). In general, a few tenths of an inch appear likely for most areas, with little to no impact. Snow levels will be high, so no snow accumulations are expected. Drier conditions are expected by Tuesday.

**Discussion:** Dry weather is expected Wednesday between the two storm systems. The second, stronger system will impact the area beginning after midnight Wednesday night, with rain showers much of the day on Thursday. The heaviest precipitation is currently expected during the morning hours, although this may change as the event nears. Snow levels will be high, so no snow accumulations are expected. Total accumulations close to 0.50" are currently forecast for Quincy, with higher amounts of 0.75-1.00" possible for western portions of Dixie East near the Feather River Canyon, and lower amounts closer to 0.25" due east (e.g. Milford area). A few heavier showers will be possible, however the probability of thunderstorms is decreasing, so the overall threat for debris flows/mudslides will be low. Expect drier weather into Friday and Saturday, with gradual warming.

**LINE "MEDICAL-EMERGENCY" PLAN:**

A. Crew Supervisor will contact Task Force Leader/Group Leader:

- Patient Complaint, Condition and Location via Tactical or Command frequency. **Priority 1/Red Tag** or **Priority 2/Yellow Tag** trigger Incident within Incident (IWI).

B. Task Force Leader/Group Leader contacts East Zone Communications: **If Red Priority Request "Emergency Traffic/Clear Channel" command**

- Task Force Leader or POC\* will run "Medical – Emergency" on the Command frequency.
- Task Force Leader or POC\* to use "Medical Incident Report" on back/next page of 206

**EMERGENCY DURING OPS. BRIEF:**

- If you have an emergency while briefing is going on over the command channel. Wait for a break and transmit your emergency traffic.

**LINE "NON-EMERGENCY INCIDENT" PLAN:**

A. Crew Supervisor to contact Task Force Leader/Group Leader with:

- Patient Complaint, Condition and Location via Tactical or Command frequency. **Priority 3/Green Tag Patients only** trigger an Incident within Incident (IWI) if they are being transported to a medical facility.

B. Division Supervisor contacts East Zone Communications:

- Division Supervisor or POC\* will run "Non-Emergency Incident" on the Command frequency.
- Division Supervisor or POC\* will use "Medical Incident Report" on back/next page of 206

Medical Incident Report

FOR A **NON-EMERGENCY INCIDENT**: WORK THROUGH CHAIN OF COMMAND TO REPORT AND TRANSPORT INJURED PERSONNEL AS NECESSARY.

FOR A **MEDICAL EMERGENCY**: IDENTIFY ON SCENE INCIDENT COMMANDER BY NAME AND POSITION AND ANNOUNCE **"MEDICAL EMERGENCY"** TO INITIATE RESPONSE FROM COMMUNICATIONS

Use the following items to communicate situation to communications/dispatch.

**1. CONTACT COMMUNICATIONS / DISPATCH** (Verify correct frequency prior to starting report)  
 Ex: "Communications, Div. Alpha. Stand-by for Emergency Traffic."

**2. INCIDENT STATUS:** Provide incident summary (including number of patients) and command structure.  
 Ex: "Communications, I have a Red priority patient, unconscious, struck by a falling tree.  
 Requesting air ambulance to Forest Road 1 at (Lat./Long.)  
 "This will be the Trout Meadow Medical Incident, IC is TFLD Jones. EMT Smith is providing medical care."

Severity of Emergency AND Transport Priority (priority 1, 2, 3)	<input type="checkbox"/> <b>RED / PRIORITY 1 Life or limb threatening injury or illness.
